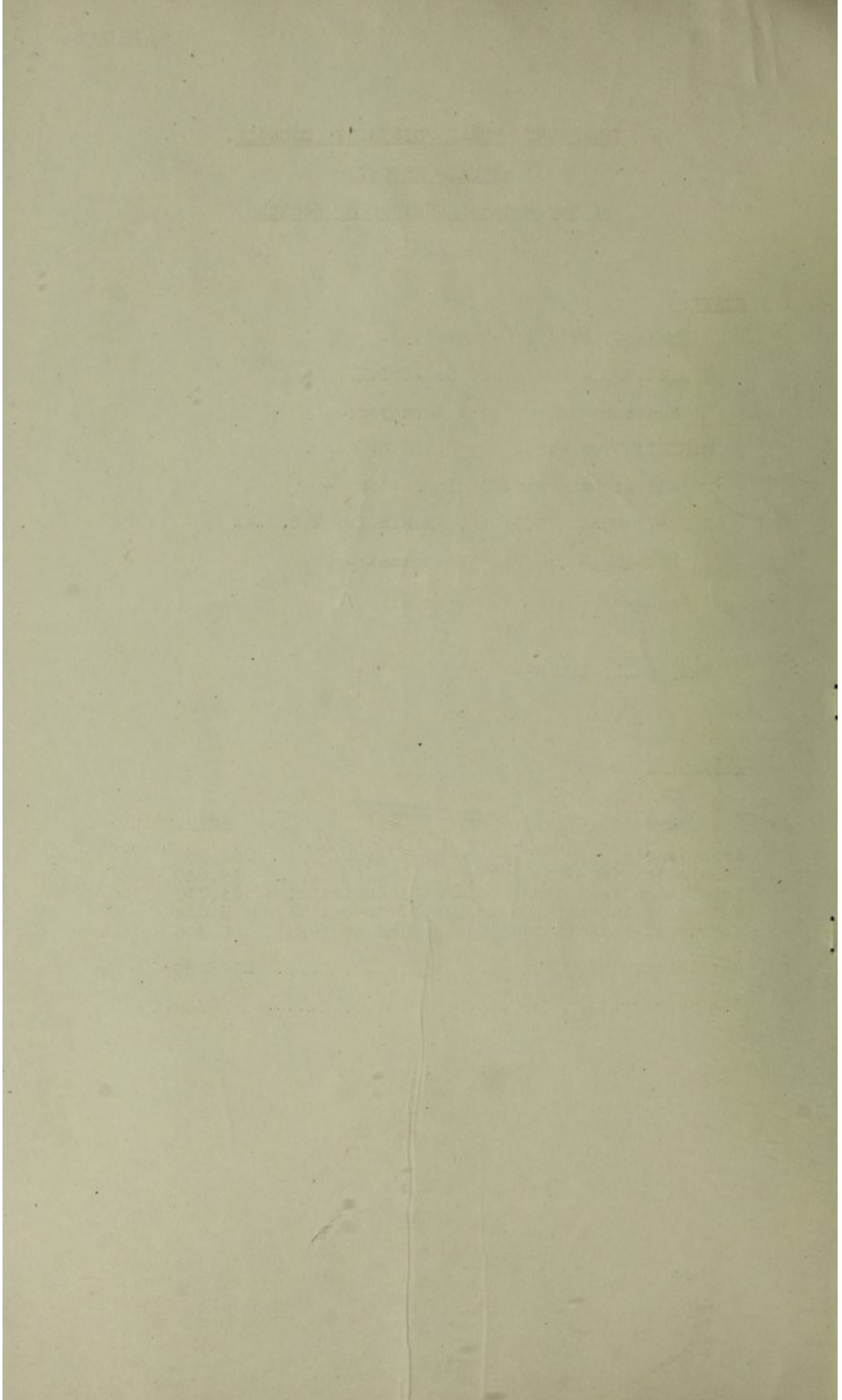

SECTION C.

SANITARY CIRCUMSTANCES OF THE YEAR.

During the year a large part of the staff's time was again employed in work directly attributable to the war activities.

AIR RAID SHELTERS.

The provision of further air-raid protection was confined to the issue of "Morrison" Indoor Table Shelters. Some individual brick built shelters and baffle walls have been removed.

The total protection now consists of:-

- 725 Anderson Steel Shelters, of which 525 are concreted.
- 24 Surface Brick-built Communal Shelters.
- 31 Surface Brick-built Individual Shelters.
- 250 Baffle Walls.
- 264 Morrison Indoor Table Shelters (a number of which were collected and re-distributed).

WAR DAMAGED PROPERTY.

The repair of War Damaged property was the responsibility of the Public Health Dept. Damage was on a smaller scale. Only 11 were affected. First Aid repairs were executed promptly by the employment of local builders and where necessary complete reinstatement was made soon after. The total number of properties affected by War Damage is now 457.

PUBLIC CLEANSING.

The collection and disposal of Refuse and Salvage continued throughout the year. The number of Tips in regular use have been reduced to two.

The value of salvage disposed of during the year amounted to £1,440.

DEALING WITH MOUSE INFESTATIONS.

In compliance with a direction issued by the Ministry of Food, a survey was made with a view to locating infestations of Rats and Mice. The officer of the department undertook a short course of training and with the assistance of a temporary staff, a survey was made. Altogether 10 infestations were found, and one of these was classed as a "Major" infestation. In view of the Statutory Authorities reluctance to delegate powers to the District Council, the whole of the information collected as the result of the survey was forwarded to the County Council for the necessary action.

SURVEY OF UNNECESSARY IRON WORK.

During the year the Ministry of Works carried out the collection of unnecessary iron work and fixtures etc., in accordance with the survey made by this Council in 1941.

21 samples were taken and submitted to bacteriological examination. These were obtained from 10 sources. 14 samples from 6 sources were reported as unsatisfactory.

Action taken.

In 5 cases the source was wells and in 1 case from a rain water system, 2 of which were improved by cleaning out. In 3 cases the conditions were improved, in 2 cases the use of the water was restricted and in the case of the rain water system the defect was rectified.

(c) The water supply is unsatisfactory in quantity in the Northern part of the district (Berkeley, Hinton, Hamfallow, Falfield, Alkington, Charfield and Stone), and at Aust, Elberton and Littleton in the South. Extensions to existing water mains are also required at Alveston, Tockington, Olveston, Thornbury and Milbury Heath.
