SIR,

I have the honour to present herewith my Annual Report for the year 1917.

The returns of the General Sanitary Work, which is carried out by Inspector Russell and his two Assistants, shows that 7,903 vessels arrived in the Tyne Ports during the year. Of these vessels 5,711 were inspected, and includes all the important arrivals from Foreign Ports.

Under instructions from the President of the Local Government Board a survey of the Ports of England and Wales was carried out, and the duty of visiting the River Tyne Port was allotted to Dr. McEwen. On January 22nd and 23rd an inspection of the Tyne Ports was made by Dr. McEwen, who was accompanied by the Medical Officer and Chief Inspector on board the Steam Ambulance Launch, "George C. Coates."

On February 23rd Dr. McEwen attended a Meeting of the Authority at the Newcastle Office, and expressed his pleasure in stating that at his recent inspection of the Tyre Ports your Officers appear to perform their work in a most efficient manner, and the Sanitary Administration of the Port seems to be very satisfactorily carried out.

There were no cases of Plague, Cholera, or Smallpox during the year.

Regulations as to Food Act, 1908.

Inspector Russell has regularly inspected the cargoes of vessels arriving in the Tyne and Albert Edward Docks, and at the Dunston Co-operative Flour Mills.

Tyne Dock.

The foodstuffs imported into this Dock during the year by steamers from the United States, Canada, Argentine, Australia, Norway and Sweden have been inspected:—Grain, 54,192 tons; Condensed Milk, 3,000 cases; Onions, 120 tons. The consignments were found in good condition.

Unsound Food.

1 Cwt. of Salt Beef and 21 6lb. tins of Soup and Bouilli were examined on board the s.s. "Baymano," annd found in a putrid condition. By consent of the Master was removed, and sent to sea by one of the Commissioners' hoppers for destruction, under the superintendence of Inspector Russell.

Albert Edward Dock.

Cargoes consisting of 1,000 cases of Condensed Milk, 772 bags of Onions, 2,300 cases of Margarine, 5 tons 12 cwts. of Tomatoes, 1 ton 13 cwts. of Vegetables, 569 boxes of Cucumbers, and 102 bushels of Fruit from Rotterdam, were inspected in this Dock, and found in good condition.

Dunston Flour Mills.

Wheat cargoes consisting of 6,634 tons were inspected at the wharf of the above Mills from Canadian, American, Indian and Argentine ports. They were found in good condition.

Mill Dam Wharf, South Shields.

No Cargoes of Potatoes from Scotland have been inspected during the year.

Fish Quay, North Shields.

Vessels arriving with White Fish and Herrings have been inspected occasionally at the Fish Quay. The fish landed from the boats were found to be of good quality.

Special Cargoes Inspected.

1 Emigrant has passed through the Port during 1917, en route to America via Liverpool, Southampton, Bristol and Glasgow. He was found well before leaving this Port.

In addition to the daily routine inspection of the sanitation of vessels, several special visits have to be made to many vessels on reports on sickness, and in some cases extensive precautions are required in dealing with actual cases of infectious diseases.

540 Revisits have been made by our Inspectors during the year, in order to have the above defects remedied to our satisfaction on written or verbal notice.

Water Boats and Water Supply to Ships in Port.

The water-boats, 18 in number, have been examined as usual, and the tanks found in good condition.

In 10 cases the *drinking water* of ships, which came from Ports infected, or suspected to be infected, with cholera, has been changed, and the purification of the tanks has been seen to by the Inspector, acting under the direction of the Medical Officer of Health.

Advice as to Sickness.

on shipboard, and other matters, continue to be received from and forwarded to the Health Departments of other British Port Sanitary Authorities.

Clothing and Bedding.

24 Vessels and several lots of clothing or bedding have been disinfected. 35 Old beds have been burnt, and 1 lot of filthy clothing has been destroyed, on account of infection.

Passenger Steamers.

The Passenger Steamers arriving continue to be regularly visited and examined.

Smoke Nuisance.

The Inspector reports that it has not been necessary to take any action against Masters of Steamers for the evolution of dense smoke during 1917.

Fishing Boats.

The total arrival of fishing vessels at the Quay, North Shields, steam and sailing, is 6,735*; 1,473 Trawlers and 5,262 Herring Boats, as compared with a total of 4,390 in the previous year. 6 Of these, in a foul condition, were cleansed and deodorized on notice from the Inspector. The rest were in good order.

Regulations.

Copies of Regulations issued have, as usual, been posted on all ferry landings, and delivered on board of vessels in the Port.

Cholera and Plague.

No cases of Cholera occurred in the Port during the year 1917. One vessel has been fumigated on account of coming from a plague-infected port, and 140 dead rats were found after the fumigation, and cremated in the vessel's furnace.

Floating Hospital.

In February the Authority agreed to admit Scabies cases occurring in ratings of the Royal Navy, and during the year 79 cases have been treated, and after steam disinfection of their bedding and clothing, all were discharged cured and sent back to their ships.



Launches.

The Steam Ambulance Launch "George C. Coates," has done good work for both the Authority and the Admiralty, in the transport of both sick and wounded from ships to hospital. The Admiralty appreciate the patriotic action of the Port Sanitary Authority in placing their equipment at their disposal, under the direction of your Medical Officer, during the War.

A new Motor Boat was purchased by the Authority, and has proved to be an efficient, economical little craft. She has saved the Steam Launch from the risks of damage in visiting ships in the congested parts of the river at the tiers, and facilitated the work of the Inspector in the mid-river district.

H.M. Customs.

I wish to record our thanks for the valuable and willing assistance given by H.M. Collector of Customs and his staff, which has been greatly appreciated by all the Officials of the Port Sanitary Authority.
