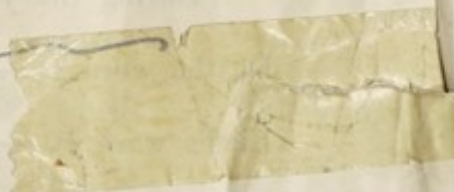

Deaths were 34 :— 17 Males, 17 Females.

Death rate 11.15 per 1,000.

Births were 70 :— 35 Boys, 35 Girls.

Birth rate 22.95 per 1,000.

Compared with the National Death rate, 12.2 per 1,000.

17 Deaths occurred in people over 70, of whom 7 were over 80 and 1 over 90, these figures were the same as 1924. Of the 34 deaths 3 occurred in the Poor Law Institution. The causes of death were :—
