Report of the Medical Officer of Health for the year ended 31st December, 1970

Mr. Chairman, Ladies and Gentlemen,

I have the honour to present the annual report for 1970.

The Registrar General's estimated mid-year population was 18,230, which is a decrease of 490 on the previous year. Births numbered 258. Deaths totalled 198. A natural increase of 60. Cancer and diseases of the heart and the circulatory systems were the main causes of death. 87 of the 198 deaths occurred in people 75 years and over. 177 of the total deaths occurred in persons 55 years and over.

The District Council ceased to operate the agency agreement with the North West Norfolk Water Board on the first of April 1970, and the officers of the board became responsible for the supply of water in the whole of the Council's area.

Immunisation against German measles was offered by the County Council to girls in their thirteenth year. Immunisation took place in the secondary schools in the Rural District. The immunisation of pre-school and school children against measles continued during the year. Supplies of vaccine were adequate.

I should like to thank the Chairman and Members of the Public Health Committee, and the staff of the Public Health Department and the Local Health Office for their interest, support and help throughout the year.

Live Birth Rate

The crude birth rate was 14.2 per 1,000 population. The corrected birth rate (using a comparability factor of 1.01) was 14.3 per 1,000 population. The birth rates for England and Wales, and the Administrative County of Norfolk, were 16.0 per 1000 and 16.1 per 1000 respectively.

Illegitimate Births

The number of illegitimate live births was 14. The percentage of illegitimate live births to the total live births was 5.

Still Births

There were 3 stillbirths in 1970, giving a stillbirth rate per 1,000 total live and stillbirths of 11. The rate for England and Wales was 13, and for the Administrative County of Norfolk 13.

Infant Deaths

Two infants under one year of age died in 1970.

Infant Mortality Rate

This is calculated as the total infant deaths under one year of age per 1,000 live births, and for 1970 was 8. The rate for England and Wales was 18, and for the Administrative County of Norfolk 15.

Legitimate Infant Mortality Rate

This is the number of deaths in legitimate infants per 1,000 legitimate live births, and for 1970 was 8.

Illegitimate Infant Mortality Rate

This is the number of deaths in illegitimate infants per 1,000 illegitimate live births, and for 1970 was zero.

Neonatal Mortality Rate

This is the number of deaths of infants under four weeks of age per 1,000 live births. Of the two deaths of infants under one year, both were in infants under four weeks. The rate for 1970 was 8.

Early Neonatal Mortality Rate

This is the number of deaths of infants under one week of age per 1,000 live births. Of the two deaths of infants under four weeks of age, both were under one week of age, giving a rate of 8.

Perinatal Mortality Rate

This is combined stillbirths and deaths under one week of age per 1,000 total live and stillbirths. The rate for 1970 was 19.

Maternal Mortality Rate

No deaths occurred in 1970, therefore the rate was zero.

Deaths

The total number of deaths at all ages in the District during 1970 was 198 (males 100: females 98).

Ischaemic Heart Disease, with 49 deaths, caused 25% of all deaths. Vascular lesions of the nervous system, with 26 deaths, equals 13.1% of all deaths.

If all deaths due to diseases of the heart and circulatory system (which includes vascular lesions of the nervous system) are totalled, a figure of 101 is attained, equal to 51% of all deaths in the District.

Cancer caused 53 deaths, giving a figure of 27%. Cancer of the lung and bronchus caused 15 deaths (males 12: females 3), or 28% of deaths from all types of cancer.

Three deaths were due to accidents, and one to suicide or self inflicted injuries.

Two deaths occurred in infants under one year.

One dairy in the district was the subject of a prosecution for supplying milk in dirty bottles which resulted in a fine.

SEWERAGE AND SEWAGE DISPOSAL

Work was commenced during the year on the Sculthorpe Sewerage Scheme which is scheduled for completion in 1971.

Work also started at Hindringham on the provisions of sewers which should also be completed in 1971 and which will discharge into the existing sewage disposal works at Langham.

Investigations commenced on the Field Dalling and Great Ryburgh schemes and detailed preparations were made for the scheme to serve Gt. and Lt. Snoring and Kettlestone which it is hoped will commence in 1971.

Preliminary negotiations took place with Mitford and Launditch R.D.C. with a view to Colkirk and Whissonsett being sewered to the Fakenham Sewage Disposal Works.

GENERAL IMPROVEMENT AREA

The Council decided to declare a general improvement area in Melton Constable. When the area is confirmed two separate issues will be undertaken. One which concerns the public health committee concerns the progressive improvement of the houses to modern standards and the other which is the province of the plans committee is a scheme for the general improvement of the village as a whole at a cost of about £20,000 for which a grant will be obtained from the Government.

SLUM CLEARANCE

For some years houses which have been condemned have been dealt with individually.

During 1970 primarily as a result of the installation of sewers at Briston a Clearance Area in three parts containing sixteen houses was declared.

WATER SAFETY - BLAKENEY AND MORSTON

A Committee was formed to consider the provision of equipment at Blakeney and Morston to improve the inshore rescue service.

REFUSE COLLECTION AND DISPOSAL

A new tractor and trailer units were obtained for the maintenance of refuse tips and the disposal of sewage sludge.

WORK STUDY

A Consortium of Authorities was established to investigate the provision of Work Study and Bonus Schemes following a decision of the National Joint Council for Manual Workers.

PUBLIC CONVENIENCES

Following the opening of the new car park at Queens Road, Fakenham, negotiations commenced for the acquisition of a small area of land near the Rampant Horse Inn for the provision of public conveniences.

CAR PARKING

New Car Parks were constructed behind Norwich Street at Fakenham and at Bridewell Street, Little Walsingham.

Investigations commenced into the possibility of the provision of a further car park at Hall Staithe, Fakenham.
