In the Borough there is one School Clinic, a Tubercular Clinic, a General Hospital, an Infectious Diseases Hospital and an Orthopædic Clinic held bi-monthly at the North Cambridgeshire Hospital.

Excellent Motor Ambulance facilities are provided free of cost, whilst in needy cases, Diphtheria Antitoxin and Pathological and Bacteriological examinations are provided when necessary.

PUBLIC HEALTH STAFF.

The duties connected with this are carried out by the M.O.H. who is a part time Officer, the Borough Surveyor, the Borough Senior and Additional Sanitary Inspectors, all full time officers, together with those of the Council's employees who are specially needed for sanitary work.

INFANT AND CHILD WELFARE.

The Infant and Child Welfare Clinic is held weekly in Park Hall, Ruby Street, and is well attended.

Sanitary Inspector's Report for the Year 1945.

PUBLIC HEALTH DEPARTMENT,

NENE QUAY, WISBECH.

To the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Wisbech.

GENTLEMEN,

I have the honour to present to you my report for the year 1945, being my twenty-sixth Annual Report.

The report again shows that regular attention is being given to the many matters coming within the purview of your Public Health Department and the accompanying summaries give the number of inspections made and work executed under notice.

The scarcity of building materials and building labour has presented difficulty in getting repairs to dwelling-houses executed, but I am able to say that progress has been made and in addition to the essential repairs to drains and sanitary conveniences, 46 houses have been generally repaired during the year. There is much of this work, however, remaining to be dealt with which has accumulated during the war and this will be proceeded with when materials and labour are available. 31 families have been housed in requisitioned houses taken over by the Council and consist chiefly of evacuees remaining from the Evacuation Scheme.

The number of cases of infectious disease notified has again been very low. The cases as they have occurred have been investigated and the houses have been disinfected.

Regular inspections are made of the town's food supply and the various premises where food is prepared for sale. The centralised slaughter of animals is still in progress at the slaughter-houses in Bartlett's Yard and inspections are made of all dressed carcases which entails daily visits for that purpose.

During the year rodent control has been added to the work of the department. A system of extermination of rats and mice has been evolved by which these rodents are exterminated by the Council's Rodent Operator and a charge is made to the owners or occupiers of various infested premises. It is remarkable that when the system of charges was commenced the complaints of infestations which had previously been numerous, almost ceased. The following is an indication of the work carried out.
