To the Chairman and Members of the Workington Port Sanitary

Authority.

Gentlemen,

During the year 1904, no case of Infectious Disease has

arrived in the Ports of Workington or Harrington.

Ten foreign steamers and one foreign sailing vessel

together with eight hundred and forty one coasting vessels arrived

at Workington. At Harrington fifteen foreign steamers with six

hundred and seventy coasting vessels arrived.

All the foreigners were duly inspected together with a

considerable number of the coasters and found in a satisfactory

condition.

Want of cleanliness in some instances had to be pointed

out, but this was at once attended to when the attention of the

Master was called to it.

The Harbours and docks are kept in a good sanitary

condition. With the exception of the quays on the north side of

the Harbour, everything is satisfactory.

I have great pleasure in testifying to the able manner

the Port Sanitary Inspector has performed his duties and to his

ever readiness to assist me at all times.
