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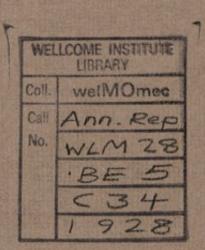

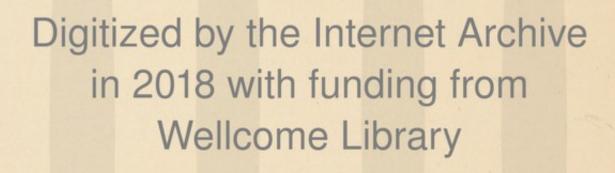

NINTH ANNUAL REPORT OF THE FINANCE SUB-COMMITTEE ON THE ACCOUNTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31st DECEMBER, 1928.

THE Finance Sub-Committee have pleasure in submitting their Ninth Annual Report on the Accounts of the Hospital for the year ended 31st December, 1928.

The number of beds available during the year was 59, of which 57.27 have on average been occupied, as compared with 54 available beds with an occupied average number of 52.35 for the preceding year. Following the completion of the New Sisters' Home in January, 1928, 5 rooms in the main building became available for additional patients. The increased accommodation has, throughout the year, been fully utilised.

During the year the improvements and redecorations to the Property under the supervision of the Architect included:—

- (a) Repairs and Redecorations to 13 Patients' Rooms (First floor) Bathrooms, Corridors, Staff Cubicles, and Cottages.
- (b) Restoration of Glasshouses and Renovations of Farm Buildings.
- (c) Replacement of Positive Plates to Electric Light Batteries.

The total expenditure during the year on improvements and repairs to the Property and Plant, including the Furniture and Equipment for the New Sisters' Home, amounted to £3,842 12s. 5d., and following the usual practice has been charged against the Renewals and Repairs Fund.

With the exception of the purchase of £1,264 3s. 11d. $3\frac{1}{2}$ % Conversion Loan at a cost of £1,000, no alteration has been made by the Trustees in the Invest ments. The various Investments are enumerated in the Balance Sheet submitte with this Report.

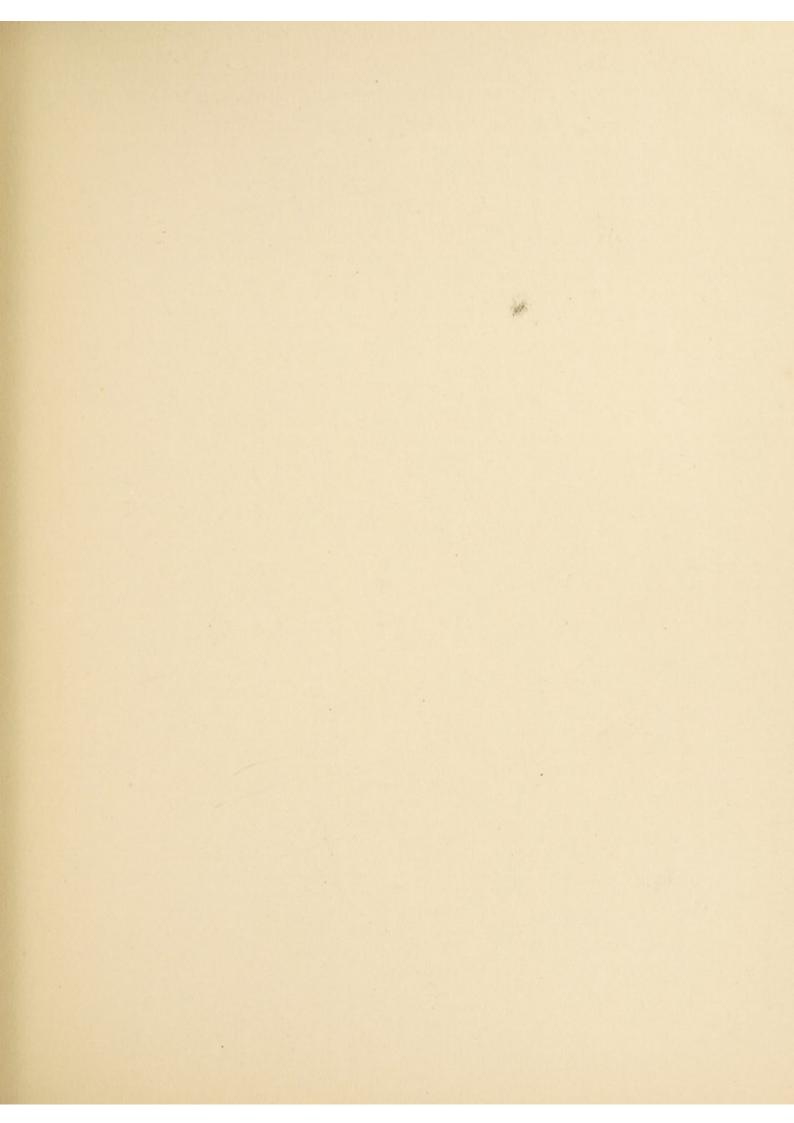

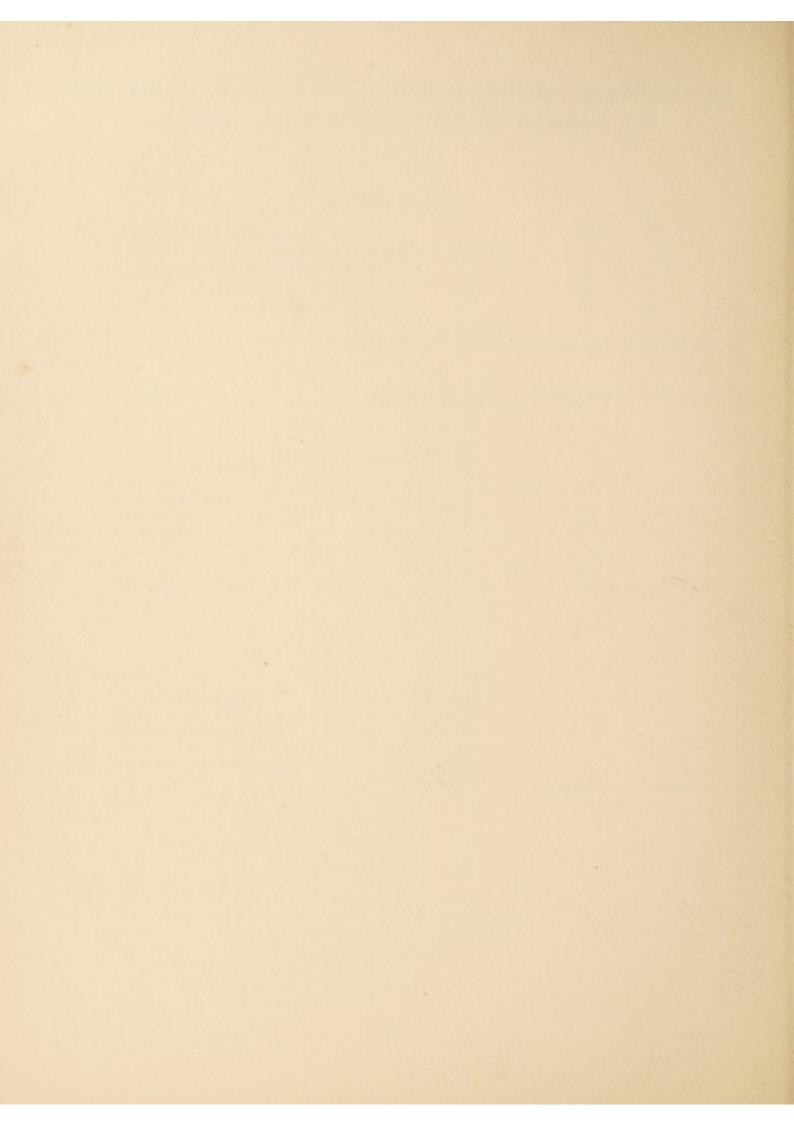

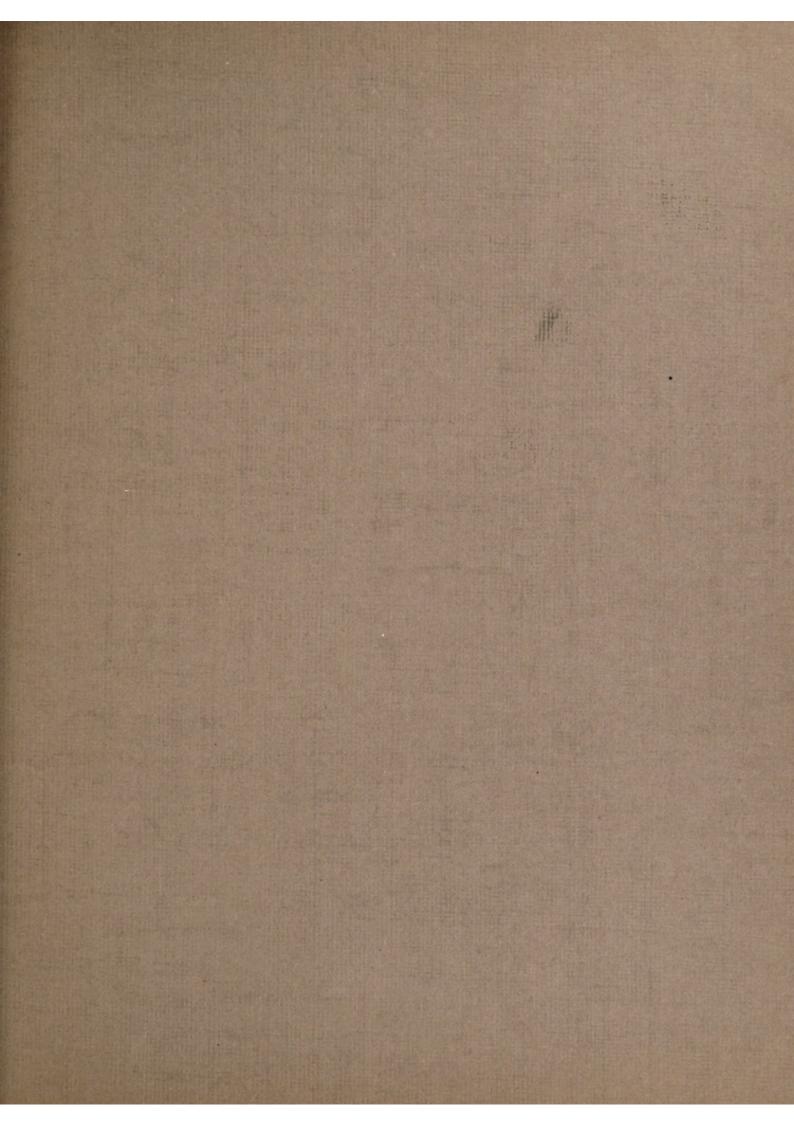
