



Notes on the French Hospital and Dispensary

This Institution was opened on the 1st December, 1867, for the benefit of distressed foreigners of all nations requiring medical relief, and amalgamated with the French Dispensary, founded by Dr. Vintras in 1861. It was enlarged in 1878. The new hospital, inaugurated in 1890, and still further enlarged in 1893, and in 1910, now includes 17 wards, containing altogether 70 beds—besides an operating theatre, three consultation rooms, a dispensary, an X-Ray Department and a laboratory. It is attended by eminent medical men, by two resident medical officers, and by Sisters of Charity, who act as nurses.

The admissions since the foundation (1867) were up to the 31st December, 1932, 41,035 in-patients, and 871,273 out-patients' attendances (consulta-

tions), divided among the natives of the following countries:-

STATUTES

OF THE

French Hospital & Dispensary

- The French Hospital is established for the purpose of affording Medical aid to poor French subjects, and to all poor foreigners speaking French irrespective of creed or nationality.
- 2. In-patients shall be admitted at the hours fixed for the Doctors' Consultations. Urgent cases may be admitted at any time by one of the Resident Medical Officers, but all such admissions shall be subject to the subsequent approval of the Physicians or Surgeons under whose care they may have been placed.
- Gratuitous consultations will be given to Out-Patients daily (Sundays excepted). The medicines prescribed by the Doctors will be supplied free of charge.
- 4. The French Hospital shall have Patrons—or Life Governors—Governors, Directors, Physicians and Surgeons, Nursing Sisters, and the requisite Staff of *Employés*.
- A donation of Twenty-five Pounds shall constitute a Patron or "Life Governor," and an annual subscription of Two Guineas shall constitute a Governor.
- 6. The management of the Hospital is entrusted to a Committee composed of at least Twelve, or, at most, Twenty-four members elected from amongst the Governors. The Committee shall elect from its members a Chairman, an Honorary Treasurer, and an Honorary Secretary. They may also appoint an "Econome Honoraire." The appointment of such Committee shall be for three years, at the expiration of which a fresh election shall take place. All members are re-eligible. The Committee shall have power to elect additional members at any time, provided they do not exceed the number above mentioned.
- 7. The services of the Physicians and Surgeons are gratuitous. The Honorary Medical Staff form a Committee called the "Medical Committee," to which will be referred all questions relating to the hygiene of the Hospital and the general care of the patients.
- Whenever occasion arises for the appointment of honorary Physicians or Surgeons, such appointments shall be made by the Committee of Management in conjunction with the Medical Committee.
- 9. The Committee of Management shall appoint the Secretary, the Resident Medical Officers, the Nursing Sisters, and the necessary staff of *Employés*, and shall fix their remuneration.
- 10. The Committee of Management shall meet on the third Wednesday of every month, to decide on all questions relating to the Hospital. They shall elect from their number a Sub-Committee of four Members, who shall undertake the active part of the Hospital Management, and meet for that purpose at least once in the interval of the monthly meetings. The Sub-Committee shall decide matters of urgency, but questions of extraordinary expenditure exceeding Twenty Pounds sterling must be referred to the Committee of Management.

- 11. The President, the Honorary Treasurer, and the Honorary Secretary, shall constitute a Finance Committee, to which the Committee of Management shall refer any special question of Finance whenever necessary.
- 12. The Freehold of the Hospital Buildings is conveyed to Trustees for the benefit of this Hospital, and the personal property of the Hospital, including Subscriptions, Donations, Legacies and Bequests, is also held by such Trustees, under the terms of a *Declaration of Trust* executed by them. The Trustees have full power to pass and sign all necessary deeds and receipts for collecting the legacies made to the Hospital.
- 13. The available funds belonging to the Hospital shall be deposited in a Bank, in the name of the "French Hospital and Dispensary," and all cheques drawn for expenses must be signed by the Honorary Treasurer and Honorary Secretary, or in their absence by one or more of the Trustees. By special decision the Committee have power to authorize the Secretary of the Hospital to sign the cheques conjointly with the Honorary Treasurer, Honorary Secretary, or one of the Trustees.
 - 14. All accounts shall be audited by Chartered Accountants.
- 15. A General Meeting of the Governors shall be convened once in each year. The Committee, at its January sitting, shall fix the date of that Meeting, to which they shall submit the accounts of the Income and Expenditure for the preceding year, the Report stating the services rendered and the principal events that took place during that period, as well as the important questions for decision.
- 16. Should there be any alterations to be introduced in the Statutes, they shall be examined at the next General Meeting after notice has been given to the Chairman of the preceding General Meeting. Such modifications can only be sanctioned by a majority of two-thirds of the Governors present or represented, the Chairman having a final or casting vote.

Annual General Meeting of the Governors of the French Hospital and Dispensary, held in the Board Room on the 8th March, 1933

On the proposal of Mr. J. L. Riéter, seconded by Mr. A. Spitzer, Mr. C. Pierret was unanimously elected President of the Meeting.

The President having given notice of the Agenda, the Secretary proceeded to read the Minutes of the General Meeting held on the 8th March, 1932.

These Minutes were unanimously approved and signed by the President.

Mr. Jean Knecht, Secretary, read the following Report of the Committee for the past year:—

GENTLEMEN,

We again have pleasure in submitting for your approbation our Report for the past year.

The financial and economical crisis, which we have all been facing for some time, unfortunately shows no appreciable sign of improvement and our hopes in this direction have not yet been realized. We strive to overcome our difficulties but the task is not an easy one when one remembers that the French Hospital and Dispensary is a free Hospital in the strict sense of the word. We have to meet all expenses and yet everything is given free to the patients. Careful economy is essential to success and the Committee make a special point of studying this, but they are glad of the opportunity of being able to express to all subscribers and donors to the Hospital their deep appreciation of their kind support without which, of course, their work and its beneficial results would be impossible.

The Income and Expenditure Account published in this Report shows on the 31st December last a small excess of receipts amounting to £640. 17s. 3d. It should, however, be mentioned here that this does not imply that our income has been correspondingly high; it means that our expenses have been judiciously limited to meet the requirements of the times. Our expenses in 1932 were less than those of the preceding year by £517. 8s. 8d.

We deemed it advisable, for reasons of economy, to postpone our scheme, mention of which was made in our last Report, of installing a new lift; other expenses also were either avoided or postponed for the same reason, but we wish to emphasize that the patients are never made to suffer, in any way, from the consequences of such economical measures. In the Report we published last year mention was made of a scheme we had in view of creating a smoking room for our patients. This is now completed and is much appreciated by the patients. Urgent repairs were carried out such as repainting the outside woodwork, window frames, doors, etc., and a number of rain-water pipes, being old and perished, were renewed.

At the beginning of 1932 Dr. R. L. Dodds was appointed Gynæcologist to the Hospital to replace Dr. S. Sunderland after his resignation. Dr. Dodds takes a most active interest in his work and we have every reason to congratulate ourselves on selecting such a worthy successor to Dr. S. Sunderland.

Dr. Campbell McClure, Senior Physician to In-patients, was appointed President of the Medical Committee and he attends regularly the meetings of the Lay Committee, thus bringing a closer co-operation between the two Committees.

Last February, Mr. Georges Dormeuil, Member of the Hospital Committee, tendered his resignation; being a resident in Paris and his visits to London few and far between, he preferred to leave his seat vacant. In spite of having been asked to reconsider his decision, Mr. Dormeuil insisted on relinquishing his duties for the reason stated and we had, much to our regret, to accept his resignation.

Mr. Dormeuil, in recognition of the good work done by the Hospital, very generously sent us, in his name and in that of his wife, a cheque for £200.

We take this opportunity of conveying to them our grateful thanks for this most generous gift. The name of Dormeuil having been associated for so long with that of the Hospital it became the unanimous wish of the Committee to appoint, as a successor, his son, Mr. Pierre Dormeuil, and we are glad to say that Mr. Pierre Dormeuil accepted our invitation to become Member of the Committee. Mr. Pierre Dormeuil, although being also a resident in Paris, comes to London frequently and is able to attend our meetings; we are indebted to him for the marked interest he shows in the work of the Hospital.

Mr. Paul Duran, who was recently appointed Honorary Treasurer to fill the vacancy left by Mr. John Holman, also tendered his resignation as Treasurer, having been called upon to fill a highly responsible post in Paris. This resignation, which we very much regret, deprived us of a most active colleague whose short collaboration, in his capacity of Honorary Treasurer, proved to be so fruitful. On leaving London Mr. Duran, whom we are glad to say remains a member of the Committee, expressed his willingness to continue to help us as much as possible.

The choice of a new Honorary Treasurer was a simple matter. Mr. A. Spitzer, the present Manager of the Comptoir National d'Escompte de Paris, in London, very kindly accepted the responsibility of this task and he was duly appointed Honorary Treasurer to the Hospital. Mr. Spitzer has already given us ample proof of the interest he takes in the Hospital and we only hope that his collaboration in our work may be as long as possible.

We have the painful duty of informing you of the death of Mr. Isidore Dreyfus. It will be remembered that Mr. Dreyfus was, until ill-health obliged him to retire to the South of France a few years ago, one of our most active colleagues in collecting important donations and subscriptions for the Hospital and he used to attend, most regularly, all our meetings. We take this opportunity of conveying to his family our deepest sympathy.

You will hear, with great pleasure, that the French Government gave recognition to the long services to the Hospital of Mr. Mortimer E. Ruffer by conferring upon him the Cross of the Legion of Honour. Mr. Mortimer Ruffer is the son of Mr. Ernest Ruffer, formerly President of the Committee.

Mr. Mortimer Ruffer, like his father, has devoted not only much of his time to the Hospital but his constant generosity to both our Hospital and our Convalescent Home has been highly appreciated. The honour which he has just received, at the hands of the French Government, is well deserved and we seize this occasion to convey to him again our very heartfelt congratulations.

Last July, Sister Céline, after more than fifty years' devotion to the Hospital as Superior, asked to be released from her duties, the responsibility of which had become too trying for her. The Reverend Mother General of the Order of the Sisters of the Sacred Heart decided, conjointly with the Committee, to grant Sister Céline her wish in order to give her the opportunity of resting after her long years of tiring work which she fulfilled so admirably and for which we can never thank her enough. Having gathered that the wish of Sister Céline was to remain in her present surroundings, the Committee were only too glad to accede to it and offer her to remain at the Hospital with her Sisters, thus affording her the opportunity of retaining her connection with the Institution to which she has been attached for so many years. The hope is here expressed that she may long remain with us.

Sister Pauline has now been appointed Superior; for thirty years she was Assistant to Sister Céline and her knowledge of the inner workings of the different departments, together with her marked devotion to the patients and the competency with which she has always fulfilled her duties render her particularly suitable to take Sister Céline's place. We congratulate her once again.

In 1932, 989 (123 more than last year) In-patients were admitted into the Hospital. These consisted of 395 men, 470 women and 124 children. Their total days of maintenance were 18,295. The number of Out-patients was 8,694, to whom 24,609 consultations were given.

2,352 In and Out-patients were treated in our X-Ray Department.

343 Convalescents, of whom 163 were French, were treated at our Convalescent Home at Brighton, and their total days of maintenance were 7,420.

We express our very grateful thanks to Messrs. Cooper Brothers & Co., Chartered Accountants, for kindly verifying and signing the Accounts of the French Hospital and the Convalescent Home at Brighton, as Honorary Auditors.

We are much indebted to Viscountess Louis de la Panouse for helping us again in enlisting the assistance of a number of rose sellers on the occasion of Alexandra Day. All these ladies are entitled to our full gratitude, for it is their effort on our behalf which enables the Hospital to share in the annual distribution of funds by the Alexandra Day Committee.

It will be remembered that Mr. A. R. Monks, who acted as Honorary Solicitor to our Hospital for many years, retired at the close of 1931, and Messrs. Slaughter & May, Solicitors, very kindly accepted to take his place and advise the Hospital Committee and the Trustees of our Convalescent Home in all matters of legal importance. We are already much indebted to them for their invaluable assistance.

We thank Messrs. Wilcox Jozeau who supervise the work of our pharmaceutical department; Dr. Robert Pierret, of Paris, who spares no efforts in helping us to obtain suitable candidates to replace our Resident Doctors whenever there is a vacancy and also all who, from time to time and especially on such occasions as the 14th July, Christmas and the New Year, send our patients gifts in kind, clothing, fruit, books, papers, etc.

On the proposal of the President of the Meeting, this Report was unanimously adopted.

Mr. A. Spitzer, Honorary Treasurer, then presented to the Meeting the Income and Expenditure Account for the year 1932 and also the Balance Sheet as on the 31st December, 1932, both of which were verified and signed by Messrs. Cooper Brothers & Co., our Honorary Auditors.

These were also approved unanimously by the Meeting.

On the motion of Mr. C. Pierret, seconded by Mr. C. Dumas, Messrs. Cooper Brothers were unanimously reappointed Honorary Auditors to the Hospital for the year 1933. The President, addressing the Meeting, said:

"You will feel, as I do, deeply grieved to hear that our colleague Mr. A. Schupbach, to whom we are so much indebted for his valuable collaboration in our work, has been compelled through ill-health to resign from the Crédit Lyonnais in London where he was Manager, and from the Hospital Committee. Failing health deprives us of one of our most congenial friends, and our feelings of sympathy towards him are all the more enhanced when we think of the reason which separates him from our midst.

"I agree with Mr. Schupbach when he says that the 'work of charity when carried on in collaboration creates indissoluble bonds of friendship,' and I hope that he will keep as faithful

" a remembrance of us as we will of him.

"Mr. Schupbach suggests that his place on the Committee "might be taken by Mr. Robert Cholley, the present Manager "of the Crédit Lyonnais in London. I have no doubt that this "suggestion will be followed, but the appointment will have to

"be put to the General Committee in the usual way.

"You will have noticed in the Report, which has just been read, that Sister Céline has now retired. She has attained her jubilee of services rendered to the French Hospital and Dispensary. Unfortunately her health has now given way, but she continues to take the keenest interest in all matters relating to the Hospital. We express the hope that she may long remain with us as the personification of devotion and courage. I feel sure, Gentlemen, that you will join me in conveying to Sister Céline our most sincere good wishes and the expression of our warmest sympathy."

The President's words were received with unanimous

approbation.

Continuing, the President said:—"Our statistics show a "further increase in the number of our patients; this is not to "be wondered at as we are the only existing free Hospital in "London, but we must not lose sight of the fact that during the "present crisis our funds are likely to fall short of what they "should be, which means that all our efforts will have to be "concentrated on very careful expenditure in order that the "fullest possible benefit may accrue to our patients.

"In conclusion, I would like to express appreciation to our "Secretary, Mr. Jean Knecht, who, with the benefit of his ever-"increasing experience, collaborates so effectively in our work."

The voting papers were then opened for the triennial reelection of the Members of the Committee (Article 6 of the Statutes).

All the present Members were re-elected.

Thanks were addressed to Mr. Pierret for having presided over the meeting, which then closed.




