

CHANGE OF NAME.

The most important event during the year has been the culmination of many discussions over a long period by the Medical Committee and the Committee of Management as to a change in the title of the Hospital. Unanimous agreement in both Committees was finally reached, and a Special Meeting of the Governors of the Hospital was held on February 15th, 1938, and the following resolution unanimously passed:—

Resolved that the name of the Hospital be changed to

MAIDA VALE HOSPITAL FOR NERVOUS DISEASES.

The necessary steps are now being taken with the Board of Trade and the Registrar of Joint Stock Companies to give effect to this resolution.

FINANCE.

The Hospital was not fortunate enough to receive any large donations during the year to compare with the anonymous

gift of £1,000 last year.

The Committee are pleased to report that the legacies received in 1937 were above the average, and included one of £1,000 from the late Mrs. Leonowens, who bequeathed the sum for endowment under the title of "Lewis T. Leonowens Memorial Fund," the income to be applied for the benefit of the nurses. Mrs. Leonowens was a V.A.D. Nurse at the Hospital during the War, and from then up to the time of her death she subscribed £12 a year to purchase small extras for the nurses' table, and the Committee gratefully record their appreciation of her kind thought.

Once again the year has proved an expensive one for the Hospital. The general rise in prices accounts for many of the increases, and during the year a considerable sum of money has been spent on the very necessary work of replacing the basement, providing an adequate linen and sewing room, a maids' sitting room, cook's sitting-room and installing refrigeration in the meat larder.

During the year the Committee were faced with replacing the whole of the cooking apparatus in the kitchens, the equipment being 35 years old and completely worn out, and the new installation is giving great satisfaction.

AURAL DEPARTMENT.

The number of patients referred to this department was 234, who made 345 attendances. The types of cases treated included facial and laryngeal palsies, vertigo, tinnitus, deafness and chronic ear infections, focal sepsis of the throat and nasal sinuses. Facilities for operative treatment were provided, and 30 cases were operated upon during the year.

DENTAL DEPARTMENT.

The work of the Department this year has continued satisfactorily. The number of new patients was 51 and the total number of attendances was 99. There were 2 cases of extraction of teeth under nitrous oxide, and 91 cases under general anæsthesia.

Patients are sent from the physicians of the Hospital and the other special departments for an opinion as to the state of the mouth and for treatment.

It is impossible to give adequate conservative treatment in the department, but a certain number of dressings for relief of

pain and scaldings are carried out.

The relationship between general nervous diseases and mouth infection is always noted, the removal of septic foci being considered by the physicians of considerable importance in the treatment of nervous conditions. An improvement in the general health of the patient is practically always noticed.

Patients who would benefit by conservative treatment or dentures are advised to go to their own dental surgeon or to a

dental hospital.

OPHTHALMIC DEPARTMENT.

The ophthalmic surgeon saw 206 patients, who made 291 attendances in the clinic, and the closest co-operation has existed between the physicians and the ophthalmic surgeon.

PSYCHIATRIC DEPARTMENT.

The number of patients referred to the department has shown a further increase, and 319 Out-patients and 40 In-patients were seen as compared with 289 Out-patients and 40 In-patients the year before.

It has only been possible to deal with this increase in number owing to the help given by Dr. C. P. Blacker, who has now been appointed as Second Honorary Psychiatrist to the Staff of the

Hospital.

The activities of the Department have been much handicapped by lack of space, so that it has not been possible to have the Clinical Assistants which have now really become necessary.

DEPARTMENT OF PSYCHOTHERAPY

The official statistics show that nearly 50 per cent. of the patients who attended the Hospital during the past year were suffering from some form of mental ill-health; of these cases 435 were treated in the Department of Psychotherapy, where there have been 1,305 attendances.

The aim of the work has been to help the patients to understand and deal with the mental difficulties which have handicapped them in their relations with the outer world, and have given rise to neurotic symptoms, such as irrational fears, hysteric paralyses, compulsive actions, etc.

Admission as an in-patient is often beneficial. Certain cases require much more than care and sympathetic treatment. In other cases, more active treatment, has to be undertaken.

The work of the department has been carried out by four medical psychologists, and would be greatly facilitated by the services of a trained social worker.

POST-GRADUATE MEDICAL SCHOOL.

During the whole year regular clinical demonstrations have been held at the Hospital by members of the staff for the benefit of medical practitioners. These demonstrations are much appreciated, and medical men and women from various parts of the country attend. In addition, in conjunction with Maudsley Hospital, two courses of instruction in neurology have been given to postgraduates studying for the Diploma in Psychological Medicine.

ALMONER'S DEPARTMENT.

This department has had another year of increased activity. The Committee desire to thank the authorities of The Children's Home, Forest Hall, Woodford Green, the Leonard Stewart Forster Memorial Convalescent Home, Ottham and St. Andrew's Convalescent Hospital, Folkestone, for their extreme kindness to the Hospital's patients.

GIFTS OF CONVALESCENT HOME LETTERS AND SURGICAL AID LETTERS WOULD BE GREATLY APPRECIATED, AND THE LETTERS

CAREFULLY BESTOWED.

LADIES' GUILD.

The Committee wish to record their appreciation of the help they have received from the Ladies' Guild during the past year, and would refer the Governors to the report of the Annual

Meeting of the Guild which appears on page 17.

They specially desire to thank the Ladies' Guild for organising Occupational Therapy, in the Wards, which has been of the greatest help to the Medical Staff in the treatment of patients, and they are glad to report that it will be placed on a permanent basis in the coming year.

The Ladies' Guild have also secured the co-operation of the British Red Cross Library in re-organising the library service for

the patients.

The Committee desire to thank the Guild for their very successful organisation of the sale of clothes, and to reiterate the Guild's appeal for gifts of clothes and men's women's and children's clothes and shoes, and soft furnishings of all kinds for sale at the hut, and for subscriptions which should be addressed to the Honorary Secretary of the Ladies' Guild.

COMMITTEE AND STAFF.

The Committee record with pleasure that a Viscounty was conferred on Sir John Davidson, the Hospital's President, and desire on behalf of the Governors to record their congratulations.

The Committee regret to report that they have lost the services of Mr. Bernard Cuddon, who has resigned and who had been a member of the Committee since 1926 and Chairman since 1932. The Committee desire to record their best thanks to Mr. Cuddon for his services to the Hospital, and their great appreciation of the help they have derived from his guidance and wise counsel. Mr. Bernard Cuddon has been elected a Vice-President.

The Committee have pleasure in announcing that Mr. Cuddon's son, Mr. Eric Cuddon, accepted an invitation to join the Committee.

The Committee regret to report that they have lost the services of Mr. Eric Dunstan, who resigned on account of inability to attend Meetings owing to frequent absences from England.

The Committee have pleasure in announcing that Lt.-Col. R. Tristram Harper, O.B.E., F.C.A., has joined the Committee

and has been elected Chairman.

The Hospital has lost the services by resignation of Dr. Elkington on his appointment to another Hospital, and on the recommendation of the Medical Committee no steps have been taken to fill the vacancy.

On the recommendation of the Medical Committee Dr. C. P. Blacker has been appointed Physician in the Psychiatric

Department.

The Committee of the Maida Vale Hospital Ladies' Guild present their first Annual Report.

Just over a year ago Mrs. McAlpine, assisted by Mrs. Longland, arranged for a weekly clothes sale. The results have been most satisfactory, and the sales are much appreciated by the outpatients and visitors to the Hospital. The Hut where these sales take place was given to us by Sir Malcolm McAlpine, and the Committee would like to tender to him their best thanks for his most generous gift.

Last May a meeting was held at II, Chester Terrace, when Dr. Wilfred Harris and others spoke on Occupational Therapy. The Medical Committee were much in favour of starting an Occupational Therapy Department, and the Ladies' Guild offered to equip it and finance it for six months.

In October a Hospital Library was started and a bookcase and trolley were purchased. The Librarian, Mrs. Stuart Mackenzie, was introduced to the Guild by the Secretary of the Red Cross Library Association. She has proved invaluable, and her work is much appreciated by the patients.

Miss Muir Mackenzie arranged with the Winter Distress League to tidy and improve the garden, and great success has attended their efforts.

The appointment of Mrs. Fettes to represent us on the Committee of Management is of the greatest assistance to the Ladies' Guild, and has proved most useful on many occasions.

The appended Account will show that during the last year we collected £222. This year we hope to improve considerably on this figure as we intend, if possible, to finance the Occupational Therapy Department, which will cost probably £180. In addition we are hoping to provide enough money to pay for some much-needed renovations in the Hospital.

We have started this year well with a very successful Bridge Tournament, which has brought in over £80, and we wish to thank Mrs. Elphick, Mrs. Farquhar and Mrs. Stephens for their valuable assistance in its organisation.

Our last innovation is a stall in the entrance hall of the Hospital for the sale of cigarettes, chocolates and many other items useful to the patients and their friends. This already promises to bring our funds a useful profit. In conclusion, as Chairman, I should like to tender to all the Committee my very best thanks for their untiring energy and help on all occasions. That we should have achieved as much as we have done during the past year could not have been accomplished without very hard work on the part of the Committee. May I remind everyone that we urgently require more clothes and shoes of every description, children's as well as adults, with which to supply the Hut.

REGISTRAR'S REPORT.

During the year 1937 the Hospital has treated 5,915 Outpatients, compared with 6,274 in 1936. The general classification of these remains much the same as for the previous years, and the congestion of all departments remains considerable. The main difficulty is lack of accommodation for the additional medical officers whose services are now necessary to assist the member of the Honorary Staff in charge. The new Outpatient department with its additional consulting rooms is a medical necessity.

During the year a new system of record keeping has been planned and put into operation. The patients now no longer have access to their own case-sheets, but are merely handed a prescription sheet. This enables the physician to write a frank history and diagnosis without fear of the patient reading it, and also eliminates the absorbing and deleterious perusal of their own and other patients' notes, which served to while away the period of waiting. Certain improvements have also been made in the indexing and storage of records.

The number of In-Patients has increased to 824 as compared with 734 last year, and the number of cerebral tumours has risen from 66 to 72.

The work of Mr. Grey Walter on electroencephalography continues, and is proving of considerable practical value to the medical staff in the localisation of tumours, and the diagnosis of epilepsy and certain other diseases of the brain.

The treatment of Parkinsonism by decoctions of the root of the Bulgarian species of Belladonna has been claimed on the Continent as an important therapeutic advance. This Hospital has been fortunate enough to obtain a supply of the root, and a number of patients are receiving the treatment. It is as yet too early to assess the results.

An important addition to the Hospital's armamentarium is the new Department of Occupational Therapy which, by teaching the patients new crafts, and hobbies, is not only giving them new interests but helping to re-educate disused limbs and muscles. The importance of this work in the treatment of neurological and psychiatric patients cannot be over-estimated.

Regulations

AS TO THE

ADMISSION OF PATIENTS

(Application for the admission of Patients should be made to the Secretary.)

REGULATIONS RESPECTING THE ADMISSION OF IN-PATIENTS WITH GOVERNORS LETTERS OF RECOMMENDATION.

(Paying Patients are also Received.)

- 1.—Letters of Recommendation entitle suitable patients to free treatment, for 8 weeks if necessary (at a cost of about £12), and as such they should be strictly confined to those who are found upon careful inquiry, to be unable to pay for adequate Advice and Treatment. They may be given to Patients who can pay towards the cost of their Board, &c., upon the amount of the payment being stated.
- 2.—When the Letter of Recommendation is completely filled in it should be forwarded to the Secretary of the Hospital, who will inform the sender when the application has been considered by the Medical Committee.
- 3.—In the event of the Patient appearing to be suitable for admission, an Order for admission (without which no Patient can be received) will, in due course, be sent for the Patient to attend for personal examination and admission, if approved by the Physician in attendance.
- 4.—Should the Patient recommended not be suitable, information of the fact will be sent to the Contributor, with a fresh letter, and should the Patient be prevented by any circumstance from eventually entering the Hospital, the Contributor will be entitled to a fresh Letter of Recommendation.
- 5.—A Letter of Recommendation for an IN-PATIENT continues in force for two months from the date of the Patient's admission, provided the Physician under whose charge the case may be, thinks it desirable for the Patient to remain that length of time.

- 6.—No free patient can remain beyond two months without a fresh Letter being obtained, and permission being granted by the House Committee, on the advice of the Physician; and no Patient can stay beyond six months unless with the special permission of the House Committee.
- 7.—Patients are not admitted a second time within Twelve Months, unless in special cases.
- 8.—Patients when admitted into the Hospital, are to bring change of Linen, Towels, Soap, Brush, Comb, Fine-tooth Comb, Tooth-brush and a pair of Slippers.
- 9.—Patients are required to pay their travelling expenses to and from the Hospital, and to arrange for the washing of their personal linen.
- Three o'clock in the afternoon on Wednesdays, and on Sundays from Three until Four, but not more than two visitors are allowed to see each IN-PATIENT at one time. Friends of Patients are not to give presents of food or refreshment to Patients, or presents of any kind to Nurses or Servants.

OUT-PATIENTS.

Out-Patients are seen daily (except on Saturdays and Sundays) at Two o'clock.

It is requested that each Patient on attending at the Hospital be accompanied by a friend or relation.

Patients must bring their own bottles, with good corks, for their medicine.

PAYMENT BY OUT-PATIENTS.

The Committee believe that all those who receive the benefits of treatment at the Hospital are willing to pay according to their means.

They would therefore urge upon all Patients to do their utmost in this direction, and to consider carefully what payment they can make.

PRIVILEGES OF GOVERNORS AND SUBSCRIBERS IN RECOMMENDING PATIENTS.

Donors of Thirty Guineas in one sum are Life Governors and entitled to recommend two In-patients and six Outpatients each year for Life.

Donors of Twenty Guineas in one sum are Life Subscribers, and are entitled to recommend one In-patient and four Outpatients each year for Life.

The privileges of Corporations, Public Companies, and Firms under these two rules are limited to five and three years respectively.

Donors of Ten Guineas are entitled to recommend one Inpatient during the year in which the donation is paid and three Out-patients each year for Life.

Donors of Five Guineas and upwards will be further entitled to the privileges of Donors of Ten, or Twenty, or Thirty Guineas, on increasing their Donations to the above amounts by instalments of not less than Five Guineas.

Annual Subscribers of Five Guineas and of Three Guineas are respectively entitled yearly to the same privileges as Life Governors and Life Subscribers.

Annual Subscribers of from Two Guineas-and-a-Half to Half-a-Guinea are entitled each year to recommend one Out-Patient annually for each half-guinea subscribed.

In-patients' Letters of Recommendation shall continue in force for two months after the admission of the Patient, and Outpatients' Letters for three months from the first attendance, subject to the Letters having been given and signed by the Contributors within the period respectively limited in the preceding and subsequent paragraphs; and provided the Physician, under whose charge or care they may be, thinks it desirable that they should remain under treatment that length of time.

Donors and Subscribers entitled to In-patients' Letters may exchange them for Out-patients' Letters at the rate of six of the latter for one of the former.



DIRECTIONS.

By I Victoria, Cap. 26, Sec. 9, it is enacted, "That no will shall be valid, unless it shall be in writing, and executed in manner hereinafter mentioned: that is to say, it shall be signed at the foot, or the end thereof, by the Testator, or by some other person in his presence and by his direction; and such signature shall be made or acknowledged by the Testator in the presence of two or more witnesses present at the same time; and such witnesses shall attest and shall subscribe the will in the presence of the Testator but no form of attestation shall be necessary."

OCCUPATIONAL THERAPY.

Occupational Therapy is a system of devising occupations, such as various handicrafts, as an occupation or recreation for patients who would otherwise have nothing to do, thus impeding or aggravating their condition of depression or insomnia, and weakening their already weak muscles and mental processes by disuse, for the non-employment of mental faculties or of muscles leads to atrophy. Since the War, occupational methods of treatment have been greatly developed and systematised in many of the large mental hospitals, such as Santpoort, near Haarlem, in North Holland, under Dr. Kraus, and at Chester County Hospital, under Dr. Grylls, where the recovery rate has gone up 4½ per cent. since instituting the treatment. At both these large hospitals of 1,500-1,700 patients, from 95 per cent. to 98 per cent. of the patients are constantly employed in various handicrafts such as weaving, mat or rug making, knitting, sewing and embroidery, book-binding, paper flowers and paper bags, cellophane or string belts, wood-carving, basketry and raffia work, besides kitchen and laundry work and the outdoor occupations of gardening and farm work.


As a result of this intensive system of occupational treatment, it is found that noisy, troublesome and destructive patients become quiet, social and productive, while hypnotics and other sedative drugs are very much less required. It is not only for mental hospitals, however, that occupational treatment is valuable, for it has already been developed in Canada, at the Toronto General Hospital, and at the Astley Ainslie Convalescent In America and Canada and in Institution in Edinburgh. Scotland Associations of Occupational Therapists have been formed, and one is now being formed in England, and schools are being started, such as the Dorset House School, at Clifton, and that of Miss Tarrant and Miss Rivett, in London, where girl students attend lectures and are trained in the various handicrafts for two years before passing for a diploma. A new profession is thus opening out for educated women, for it is necessary to have trained supervision of the patients at their work, to teach them and the nurses the various handicrafts, and to sleect the suitable occupations for different types of patient, whether they require sedative or stimulant methods, or exercises for certain muscles, etc. Co-operation between the medical staff and the nurses, on the one hand, with the Occupational Therapist is essential, and she should be supplied with details of the patients' ailments and their special needs. Games for small classes with the medicine ball, and rhythmical physical exercises to music are an added feature of value to patients able to walk about.

The Hospital for Nervous Diseases in Maida Vale is one of the first hospitals in England, other than mental hospitals, to adopt this occupational treatment, and though there are initial expenses in providing various sizes of looms and materials, when once started the treatment more or less pays its way, as the patients and their friends become interested in the articles which they produce and usually wish to purchase them, and a small shop can be stocked, or outside shops supplied with much of the basketry, woven dress materials, corded stools, rugs, mats, etc., that are not retained in the hospital.

The essence of Occupational Therapy treatment is to exercise the limbs in various ways and to exercise the mind without the patient realising they are doing work or being set a task. Thus it becomes recreation, and instead of hours of boredom recurring daily which leads to increasing depression and misery of outlook for the future, the patients sleep better and naturally, become brighter and happier, and feel that they are accomplishing something definite, making something useful, and possibly may thus even be started in a subsequent profitable trade. Once started in a hospital, after the initial outlay on apparatus and material, the system may largely pay for itself and even help towards the salary of the professional occupational therapist, while at the same time the saving in the cost of hypnotic drugs is no inconsiderable item.
