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### REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE.

The Committee have much pleasure in being able to report to the overnors a continuance of the satisfactory results of the operations the Asylum, in respect of those persons for whose care and relief it as founded.

Since the date of the last report, 19 patients have been admitted; and 14 discharged, of whom 9 were recovered; while 7 have died, all som ordinary causes.

The recoveries have amounted to 47.4 per cent. upon the adissions; and the deaths to 6.2 per cent. upon the number resident the former considerably above, the latter as much below, the general rerage in mixed Asylums.

Many improvements of a substantial character have been effected uring the past few months. Full particulars of these will be found the accompanying report of the Superintendent.

It having been thought desirable that the various accounts of the sylum should be closed simultaneously, and at the end of the year, ne Annual Report will in future be presented shortly after the 31st becember in each year.

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### REPORT

OF THE

### MEDICAL SUPERINTENDENT.

GENTLEMEN,

The alteration in the date at which the accounts of the asylum are in future to close entails upon me the duty of presenting a report for the seven months ending December 31st, 1870, which I now beg leave to submit.

It will, however, be convenient for purposes of comparison that I should also place before you the results of treatment for the whole year which has elapsed since the 1st of January.

The following table combines the statistics of the two periods:

The per centage of recoveries upon the admissions for the whole year was 50 per cent.; for the seven months, 47.4 per cent. That of deaths upon the average number resident was 7.1 per cent. during the former, and 6.2 during the latter period. The

recoveries and deaths for the year ending May 31st, 1870,

amounted to 48.7 and 6.2 respectively.

Of the 32 patients admitted during the year, and the 19 admitted during the seven months, only one-third were received under conditions the most favourable to recovery, that is, within three months after the commencement of the first attack of Insanity. Even with this great drawback, the recoveries have been seen to amount to nearly 50 per cent., and it may, therefore, be assumed that the per centage would have been materially higher, and have probably amounted to 60 or 70 per cent. at least, if the patients generally had been placed under treatment at an earlier period of the attack. It cannot be too earnestly or frequently enforced upon public attention that, speaking broadly, the probability of recovery bears an inverse ratio to the period which is permitted to elapse between the commencement of the attack and the adoption of proper measures of treatment.

Beyond the fact thus referred to, and the circumstance that 63 per cent. of the cases admitted had associated with them a decided suicidal tendency, the admissions have presented no

feature which calls for special mention in this report.

The deaths have resulted from ordinary causes in every instance, and I am spared the painful duty of recording a suicidal, sudden, or accidental death.

No inquest has been held since the date of my last report.

A similar immunity has, I am thankful to say, been maintained as respects accidents of a serious nature, escapes, and attacks of epidemic disease, although the latter has, at various times since the Summer, prevailed extensively throughout the

adjoining city.

The general management of the institution has been conducted upon the principles which have regulated it during previous periods. No restraint has been used or required, and seclusion has formed an unimportant, and very occasional, item in the treatment which has been adopted. Constant out-door exercise, associated, as far as possible, with productive industry, has been alternated with, and has relieved from monotony, both the ordinary daily life of the patients, and their weekly meetings for recreation and amusement. For assistance in maintaining the latter we are indebted, quite as largely as heretofore, to the ready and kindly co-operation of friends in the city and neighbourhood. No one who has not had actual asylum experience can possibly comprehend, to its full extent, the importance, in their influence for good upon the patients, of these regular meetings for recreational purposes. Not only are they anticipated with eager interest, and thoroughly enjoyed when they arrive, but they also afford subjects of agreeable conversation and discussion for long afterwards. So essential have they become to the

successful treatment of Insanity that the provision of means for their proper development now ranks highly in the building of new asylums, and in all contemplated improvements in old ones. A commodious recreation hall would materially increase the capabilities for good of the Institution over which you preside. In increasing such capabilities this asylum has not stood still during past years, or even the past few months.

Many important improvements have been effected since the date of my last report. The Church has been thoroughly cleaned, and the walls have been painted to a height of 5 feet, and decorated by a stencilled border running round the painted edge and surrounding each of the windows; the East end has been improved by the addition of a painted Reredos; and means of lighting and warming have been increased by the introduction of gas, and the erection of handsome 12-light Coronæ.

The general cheerfulness of the house has been promoted by the graining and varnishing of the walls to a height of 5 feet, and the addition of a bright stencil border along the line of

separation.

An increase has been made in the means of warming the

passages, and a new steam boiler erected in the laundry.

Many minor, but, in their effect, important, structural alterations have been made, the influence of which has already borne

good fruit in increased comfort to the patients.

Much additional carpeting, papering, and ornamentation has been supplied. Bookcases have now been placed in all the galleries, and large additions made to the library. Thus the patients of all classes have constant access to books of an interesting and amusing character. The abrogation of differences in matters of this kind between patients labouring under various degrees, and forms, of insanity, and the extension of such means of recreation and amusement, have, in my experience, not only tended greatly to the general well-being, but shown unmistakeably that constant acts of destruction usually depend upon the absence of articles worth preserving, and that the surestmethod of making insane persons destructive is to lower their surroundings to the level of their apparent mental condition.

Two circumstances have forced themselves, with unusual prominence, upon my attention during the past few months. I refer to the absence of legal provision for the care and custody of habitual drunkards, and of an easy and inexpensive process by which the property of insane poor persons can be applied for

their benefit.

Upon both these points numerous applications have, from time to time, been made to me for advice and assistance. As respects the former, I have, unfortunately, been compelled to reply that the lunacy, and general, law of this country in no way provides for the care of such persons, although they are clearly unable to take proper care of themselves, and exercise over themselves, their families, and their homes, all those devastating influences which so frequently follow in the track of mental disease; but that health, reason, and property may be alike wasted, without the State thinking it necessary to interfere. That such is the case appears to me to be anything but conducive to the general well-

being of the community.

The law recognizes the obligation on the part of every ablebodied man to provide for the maintenance of his family, and to abstain from attempts at the commission of suicide; and visits with penalties any infraction of either of these duties. It would surely, then, not be unreasonable to demand that he shall not wilfully pauperize his family, and hand over his obligations towards them to those who already have imposed upon them similar responsibilities; and that his attempts at suicide, which are none the less determined, because they are not conducted upon ordinary principles, shall, at all events, confer upon the State the right to adopt measures for attempting their repression.

I, therefore, cannot but hope that at no distant period the difficulty may be met by the enactment of laws having these objects, but carefully guarded so as to secure the *legitimate* liberty of the subject, and that thus a legal basis may be given for the establishment of inebriate asylums similar to those which have

achieved such a marked success in America.

The Washington Home in Boston, which was opened in 1857, is a type of these institutions, and the results which have followed its operations have been of the most satisfactory character. It is stated, upon undoubted authority, that, since it was opened, upwards of three thousand inebriates have been received, and nearly two thousand of them discharged apparently permanently cured. Similar results seem to have attended the treatment in the New York State Inebriate Asylum at Binghampton. In 20 months 310 persons were received, and 50 per cent. discharged, having, to all appearance, reformed after a single probationary trial.

An attempt at legislation in this direction was made last session in the House of Commons by Dr. Dalrymple, but the difficulties attending some of the provisions of his bill, and the late period of the Session when it was introduced, induced him to withdraw it.

It is true that provision was made by the 6th section of the Act 16 and 17 Vict., chap. 96, for the reception into licensed houses of boarders, "who being conscious of a want of power of self-control, or an addiction to intemperate habits, or fearing an attack or a recurrence of mental malady, and being free agents in all respects, are desirous of residing as voluntary boarders in an institution for the insane, with a view to medical treatment

and supervision;" and that this provision was extended to asylums and hospitals by the Lunacy Acts Amendment Act of 1862; but not only does the previous application to the Commissioners in Lunacy, which is requisite in each case, with its consequent delay, and the fact that the applicant must have been under care as a lunatic within five years previously, interfere materially with the value of the enactment; but its purely voluntary character, which enables the boarder to discharge himself when he most urgently requires control, effectually deprives it of all value to the majority of those to whom some power of control, legally conferred upon their friends or others, would prove an invaluable benefit.

The second point to which reference has been made is pro-

ductive of difficulties of a no less serious character.

The utmost embarassment constantly arises to the representatives of persons under care in asylums, in consequence of the impossibility, in the absence of legal status, of gaining possession of the requisite funds, even where their amount is sufficient, for the necessary maintenance and clothing of the patient while in the asylum, and of the family at home. Public bodies, and individuals, holding securities, very properly refuse to hand over the interest accruing from them to any other than the legal representatives; thus application to the Court of Chancery becomes necessary, and the issuing of a commission, or, under exceptional circumstances, of a summary order, are but steps in a course of procedure which always entails considerable, and frequently ruinous, expence.

It would, I think, be greatly to the benefit of the lunatic, and remove a great and pressing hardship if, after due enquiry by the committee of a hospital, and by the justices in the case of a licensed house, the Commissioners were empowered by law to issue such provisional orders as should confer legal status and responsibility upon the next of kin, as respects the receipt and payment of monies for specified purposes, during the continuance of the patient in an asylum, or in a condition of mental un-

soundness.

In conclusion, permit me once more to acknowledge, with grateful thanks, a continuance of that courtesy and confidence with which you have hitherto favoured me, and without which the successful superintendence of this asylum would be impossible.


