### SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT.

SIR.

#### Broadmoor Criminal Lunatic Asylum, 30th May 1879.

I HAVE the honour to submit to you, for the consideration of the Council of Supervision, the following Report, showing the general condition of this asylum during the year 1878.

The changes that occurred in the number of the patients were as follows :---

Upon the 1st of January 1878 there were in the asylum Number of 380 men and 101 women, making a total of 481. During admitted, the year, 26 men and 16 women were admitted; 6 men and discharged, and died. 4 women were discharged upon recovery; 17 men and 3 women were transferred to other asylums; and 9 men and 1 woman died; thus leaving in the asylum, upon the last day of the year, 483 patients, of whom 374 were men, and 109 were women.

The daily average number of patients resident during the Daily year was 479.

Brief notes with respect to the whole of the patients ad- The admitted during the year will be found in the Appendix to this Report, at page 45. The total number of admissions was, as above stated, 42, a number which closely corresponds with the average of the last five years. Amongst those included in this number were 3 re-admissions, and 2 transfers from other asylums.

The circumstances under which the re-admissions occurred were these :---

and ordered by the Secretary of State to return into custody in consequence of having committed an assault upon his wife; (2), another man, who had effected his escape in the year 1873, and who, having been recognised in the streets of Birmingham by an attendant belonging to this asylum, was thereupon re-arrested; \* and (3), a woman, who had been transferred to a county asylum in the year 1877, and who, having been discharged from thence, afterwards committed a fresh offence, and was sentenced to a fresh term of penal servitude, and was re-admitted into this asylum from Millbank Prison.

Transfers from other asylums. With respect to the patients who were transferred from other asylums, one was transferred from a private asylum on financial grounds, and the other two were transferred from a county asylum on account of their dangerous propensities. and of the insufficient number of attendants to protect other patients from their violence.

Offences committed by the persons admitted. Of the 42 persons who were admitted during the year, 16 men and 11 women were received under orders of detention during Her Majesty's pleasure, as it is termed, whilst 10 men and 5 women were received under sentences of penal servitude.

The offences which had been committed by the persons belonging to the former class, excluding re-admissions, were as follows :---

\* When this man was admitted on the first occasion, he was undergoing a sentence of penal servitude; and at the time of his escape, in 1873, he was convalescent. When he was re-admitted he did not exhibit any symptoms of insanity, and it was ascertained that he had been working steadily, and earning his living as a stonemason during the interval. The period of penal servitude to which he had been sentenced expired in 1876. Under these circumstances a warrant for his discharge was issued by the Secretary of State.

#### Superintendent's Report for 1878.

With respect to the persons admitted whilst under sentences of penal servitude, the offence was larceny in all the cases except two; and, in those two cases, the offence was housebreaking in one instance, and was described simply as felony in the other. The 5 women who were admitted during the course of the year from convict prisons whilst undergoing sentences of penal servitude were all transferred to this asylum as soon as their insanity was recognised; but, with respect to the men, their transfer to this asylum did not take place until the terms of penal servitude to which they had been sentenced had nearly expired.

The particulars with respect to the 10 persons who were Discharges. discharged upon their recovery, are given in the Appendix, at page 29.

Discharges from this asylum, it is almost unnecessary to Total numsay, do not take place in the same ratio as they do from ber dis-asylums of a different character; however, from the opening of the asylum, in the year 1863, down to the end of the year the asylum. 1878, the number of persons discharged out of custody amounted to 95, of whom 49 were men and 46 were women. In the majority of instances the warrant of discharge contained the proviso that the person to whom it related would be liable to be ordered to return into custody upon its being shown to the satisfaction of the Secretary of State that he or she was no longer a fit person to remain at large. In a few cases the warrant of discharge was unconditional.

Of the 95 persons thus discharged, 4 men and 3 women have, at various times, been re-admitted, in consequence of being unfit to remain at large.

In addition to the persons who have been discharged out Total num-of custody, 50 men and 9 women have, since the opening to prisons of the asylum, been returned, upon their recovery, to the covery. prisons from whence they came. Three of these men and one of the women have at different times been re-admitted.

During the year 9 men and 1 woman died. Calculated Deaths. upon the basis of the average number resident, the rate of mortality was, therefore, 2.08 per cent. for the year.

The deaths were all due to ordinary causes. An inquest was, as usual, held in every case, and the following verdicts were returned :---

good, and the asylum was free from infectious disorders. In the month of April a male patient was successfully operated on for cataract by Mr. Henry Power, of St.

A good report can also be made of the condition of the the patients. wards, and of the conduct of the patients. There were no serious accidents, and no suicides. The only untoward event, of any moment, was the escape, on the 12th of October, of a male patient, who, however, was re-apprehended, within a few hours, whilst making the best of his way to his home. It is satisfactory to be able to record that no other instance of escape had occurred since the year 1874.

Mechanical restraint.

No form of mechanical restraint was used in any part of the asylum during the year.

The 483 patients remaining in the asylum at the close Classificaof the year may be thus classified :-

Amongst those who have been admitted whilst undergoing Patients whose sensentences of penal servitute there were, at the end of the tences have year, 29 men whose sentences had then expired, but who appear to be not removable, in the ordinary course, under the provisions of the Criminal Lunatics Act, 1867, because their offences were committed at places not within the limits of England and Wales. This is felt to be a hardship by the men who are thus detained, and the matter has been alluded to in several previous reports. The particulars relating to these 29 men are stated in the 25th table, appended to this Report, which will be found at page 36.

It will be seen that the cases may all be ranged under Patients two classes. One class consists of persons who were tried Scotland. in Scotland, of whom, at the end of the year, there were 10; and the other consists of soldiers who were tried at foreign stations, of whom, at the end of the year, there were 19. Had the persons who were tried in Scotland happened to be inmates of Perth Prison, instead of being at Broadmoor, at the time of the expiration of their respective sentences, they would have been transferred from thence, in due course, to the several district asylums in Scotland to which they belong; but, as they had been sent from Scotland into England during the currency of their sentences, and as they were in England at the time when their sentences expired, they still remain inmates of a criminal lunatic asylum, for want, apparently, of the legal power to re-transfer them from England to Scotland.

No change occurred during the past year with respect to the occupation and recreation of the patients; and, with regard to these matters, I have only to report that the plan, by which working patients receive a small proportion (varying from a twelfth to an eighth) of the value of the work done by them, continues to yield good results.

The whole of the clothing of the patients, including the boots and shoes, is made upon the premises.

The existence of a dual authority in the management of the building department having been found to be attended with many disadvantages, the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury have been pleased to direct that the charge of the works connected with the maintenance and repair of the buildings should be transferred from Her Majesty's Office of Works and should again be committed to the Council of Supervision. This alteration took effect on the 1st of April 1879.

Annual expenditure.

A statement, in detail, of the annual expenditure is given in the 32nd table, at page 62. This table is made up for the 12 months ending on the 31st of March 1879, in order that it may correspond with the parliamentary financial year, and that the figures may agree with those published in the Appropriation Accounts which are annually laid before Parliament by the Comptroller and Auditor General.

It will be seen that the yearly cost was at the rate of 471.17s. 6d. for each patient, calculated upon the basis of the average number resident. This sum includes all charges, excepting new buildings, repairs of buildings, and articles supplied by the Stationery Office. The charges connected with the buildings were included, in the year now under review, in the vote taken by Her Majesty's Office of Works, but in future they will all be included in the vote for this asylum. The whole expenditure of the asylum will thus be clearly shown in each annual vote, with the sole exception of the cost of the supplies furnished by the Stationery Office.

It is important to call attention to this point, because comparisons are sometimes drawn between the statements of cost published by this asylum and those published by establishments for criminal lunatics in other parts of the United Kingdom. Before, however, accepting such comparisons as just, it would be well to inquire how many items of charge are included, and how many are not, in the statements referred

to; and also whether the figures are in agreement with the Annual Appropriation Accounts, approved by the Comptroller General.

The amount of the Parliamentary vote for the financial year was 25,7561, whilst the actual expediture amounted to 23,1291. 17s. 9d., so that there remains an unexpended balance of 2,626l. 2s. 3d., which will be returned into the Exchequer.

The number of patients towards whose maintenance con- Contributributions were made, during the year, was 272. The parishes. contributing sources comprised counties, boroughs, unions, parishes, the India Office, and, in some cases, the trustees of property belonging to patients. The ordinary amount contributed for each patient was 14s. a week, this being the rate in 225 out of the 272 cases; whilst in the other 47 cases the rate varied from 7s. to 17s. 6d. a week. These amounts are collected quarterly by the asylum staff, and are paid into the Exchequer under the head of "Exchequer extra receipts"; and the sums thus paid in do not in any way affect the amount of the Parliamentary vote taken annually for the maintenance of the asylum. A new regulation came into force last year by which the sum of 4s. a week on account of each patient is repaid to the contributing unions and parishes upon certificates given by the Local Government Board.

The total amount collected and paid into the Exchequer during the financial year ending on the 31st of March, under these regulations, was 7,260l. 13s. 8d.

Sundry modifications of the staff, having for their object Changes in the staff. the reduction of expenditure, came into operation during the course of last year. The chief of these changes were, the abolition of the office of matron, and the appointment, instead, of a chief attendant; the abolition of the office of schoolmaster; a reduction in the number of the clerks by one; and a reduction in the number of the male attendants by six.

The cost of the dietary of the patients was also diminished by the substitution, on four days of the week, of four ounces of pudding instead of one ounce of cooked meat.

A statement of the present dietary scale will be found at page 73.

The general conduct of the attendants throughout the General year was good, and there were but few changes in their the attenranks.

The following table shows the length of service of the attendants at the present time :---

It will be seen from the foregoing figures that more than 80 per cent. of the male attendants have been in the service for periods above five years, and that more than 50 per cent. have served more than 10 years. With respect to the women, it will be seen that not far short of one half have served for periods above five years. The fact that the women when they marry cannot, as a rule, remain in the service, whilst the men can be allowed to marry and can still be retained, accounts entirely and sufficiently for the average period of service being longer amongst the men than amongst the women.

The rates of pay of the different classes of attendants will be found stated in detail at page 66.

The arrangements for leave of absence continue unchanged. Every attendant is relieved from duty one day in ten, and has, in addition, one week's leave in the course of the year.

No changes occurred in the medical staff, and my best thanks are again due to my medical colleagues, Dr. Nicolson and Dr. Isaac, for the efficient assistance rendered by them throughout the year in the management of the asylum as well as in the compilation of the medical tables appended to this Report.

To the other officers of the asylum I desire to return also my thanks for the hearty co-operation rendered by them in their several departments.

Retirement of Sir W. Hayter from the Council. I cannot close this Report without adverting to the very great loss that the asylum sustained by the retirement of Sir William Hayter, who had filled the office of Chairman of the Council of Supervision from the time at which the Council

was originally appointed in the year 1861, and who relinquished that office in the month of November last, in consequence of failing health, and whose death occurred a few weeks afterwards.

Any words of mine could but very inadequately express the extent of the obligation under which the asylum must ever lie towards him for all that was done by him during those 17 years. His wide experience, his large stores of knowledge, and his clear and keen judgment inspired confidence in the minds of those whose good fortune it was to serve under him; whilst his geniality, his courtesy, and his kindness could not fail to win their hearts. The spirit that animated him in the performance of the duties of his office is so well exhibited in a letter written by him, to his successor in the office of chairman, shortly after his retirement, and but one day before his death, that I venture to quote the following extract from it : -

" I receive with sincere and unaffected gratitute the too Extract from kind and flattering expressions embodied in the minutes of Sir W. Haythe Council which you have been so good as to forward to me. I have endeavoured to do my duty as chairman to the best of my ability, and I have always been supported and assisted by the frank and generous co-operation of my colleagues. If we have together had the good fortune to give satisfaction to those who entrusted to us the duties of supervision, and have at the same time consulted the well-being of the unhappy objects of our care, the result has been attained not by the individual action of any one member of the Council but by the united action of all, and by the cordial good will which has always actuated our councils."

In conclusion I desire again to gratefully acknowledge the continued personal kindness and support which I have received from the Council of Supervision in the discharge of my duties.

## CHAPLAIN'S REPORT.

SIR,

Broadmoor Asylum, 29th May 1879.

THE abolition of the office of schoolmaster at the beginning of the year 1878 was the cause of some changes in connexion with duties which devolve upon the Chaplain.

The musical parts of the services in the chapel had been conducted by the Schoolmaster; and the patients had been taught by him to sing. He had also assisted me in the management of the library, and in the distribution of the books for the use of the patients.

Other arrangements, therefore, were made for the discharge of these duties.

The services of Miss Borritt, the daughter of the Gatekeeper, were secured by a temporary engagement, for playing the harmonium in the chapel on Sundays; and under her instruction the children of the school for the families of the officers and servants of the asylum have taken a more prominent part in leading the singing of the congregation. At Morning Prayer on other days of the week it was found necessary to discontinue chanting.

In the management of the library I have been assisted by an educated patient; and no serious inconvenience has been experienced in the circulation of the books.

The asylum band, which had been trained and conducted by the Schoolmaster, was placed under the management of an attendant.

The appointed services of the Church were held during the year on all Sundays and on Good Friday; and in the forenoon on Ash Wednesday, and on Christmas Day. On the eve of St. Andrew's Day a special service was held for intercession in the behalf of foreign missions, in accordance with the use now generally followed in the Church of England.

Formerly, in the event of my occasional absence from sickness or any other unavoidable cause, Morning Prayer was said by the Schoolmaster. During the past year, the duty was on these occasions undertaken for me by one of the clergy of the neighbourhood; or, if I was not able to have this help, the Morning Service was omitted.

The Lord's Supper was celebrated monthly, and on the three principal festivals of the Church; and once privately for the communion of sick patients. The number of patients admitted to Holy Communion during the year was 28.

The number of patients present at any one service on a Sunday ranged from 51 to 86 men, and from 13 to 36 women. On other days of the week the average attendance of both men and women was 22.

Evening Prayer continued to be said daily in each of the several blocks into which the asylum is divided, according to a form which has been in use now for some years.

The supply of books was amply sufficient to meet the wants of the asylum. They continue to be highly valued by many of the patients.

The 'examination of the school for children of servants was held on the 26th November. There were present 46 children for examination in standards, and 17 infants. The average attendance for the school year had been 69. The grant was 58*l*. 19*s*.

By a letter from the Education Department, dated 12th December 1878, the managers received the following summary of the report of H.M.'s Inspector :--

" All is, as usual, highly satisfactory throughout."

It will not, I trust, Sir, be deemed by you unduly presumptuous in me, if I tender an expression of respectful regard to the memory of Sir William Goodenough Hayter, the late Chairman of the Council of Supervision. His excellence in the discharge of higher duties of office is better known to those under whom, and with whom, he gave his services freely to his country. But he had virtues which were fully known only to those who, like myself, served under him. The interests of every officer of this asylum were his interests; and that rare and urbane bearing which had long distinguished his official intercourse with the highest, characterized him not less when any of those officers, however subordinate, approached him. He had retired from the Council of Supervision a short time before that lamented event, nevertheless, all felt that by his death we had lost one, who, if occasion had required, would have been found a ready and a sincere friend.

In the discharge of my duties, I have received the most eordial support from the Superintendent and from all the officers of the asylum.

The above estimate includes only the work done by patients, and is exclusive of the work performed by the attendants and journeymen in the various wards and shops. In addition to the above, 6 male patients were employed, with 2 attendants, under the direction of the Office of Works, in papering, painting, and whitewashing the wards; and the value of their labour (including in this case the labour of the attendants), by measurement, is stated by the Office of Works to have amounted to 213*l.* 1*s.* 7*d.* 

Note.—Many patients are employed in more than one description of work, and the total of the foregoing figures would be, therefore, in excess of the number of patients employed at any one time. The actual number of patients usefully employed during the year that ended on the 31st of March 1879 was 164 men and 81 women, besides a large number who occupy themselves with reading, writing, music, and other pursuits.

#### Notes of the Admissions in 1878.—Males.

- 930. J. G., aged 30, unmarried; stated to be of no occupation. Tried November 3rd, 1877, at the Stafford Assizes for an attempt to murder and found not guilty on the ground of insanity. Admitted on the 11th of January 1878, from the Stafford County Prison. Probably insane from birth; is subject to epileptic fits and recurrent attacks of mania; and was previously an inmate of the Stafford County Asylum. Had been drinking freely during the day on which he committed his offence.
- 931. J. B., aged 30, unmarried. A labourer. Tried at the Dorchester Sessions on the 3rd of July 1877, for breaking into a dwelling-house, and found to be insane and incapable of pleading. Transferred on account of his dangerous propensities from the Dorset County Asylum to Broadmoor on the 17th January 1878. An epileptic, subject to attacks of maniacal fury, when he becomes dangerous and threatening.
- 932. F. P. K. Draper's assistant, married, aged 34. Re-admitted on the 28th February 1878, having been convicted of assaulting his wife. Had, on a former occasion, been an inmate of Broadmoor, having been admitted in 1864 from Newgate Gaol, for killing a fellow patient in Hanwell Asylum. Was discharged from Broadmoor, conditionally, in June 1874, to the care of his mother, who has since died.
- 933. W. W. G. A grocer, aged 28, married. Tried at Hull on the 11th of January 1878, for wilful murder, and found insane and unable to plead. For some time before the murder he was subject to attacks of strong religious excitement; said he was a prophet from God, became a teetotaller, and said that thousands of souls were lost yearly through drink. This mental excitement increasing day by day eventually culminated in the delusion that his brother-in-law (wife's brother) who was a spirit dealer, was endeavouring to induce his wife to take to drink. Actuated by this delusion, he provided himself with a revolver, and shot his brother-in-law in his own shop on the 5th November 1877.
- 934. G. F. A., aged 39. A grocer. Tried at Ipswich Borough Sessions for felony after previous conviction. Was found guilty, and sentenced to five years penal servitude. On admission here from Woking Prison on the 19th March 1878, was found to be in a state of dementia, consequent on previous attacks of mania. Was in India during the matiny, and says he had sunstroke and delirium tremens while there, and apparently he was invalided on account of mental disease. Transferred to the Ipswich Borough Asylum on the 12th of April.

- 935. H. S. A bricklayer, aged 24, single. Was tried at the Leeds Assizes in January 1878, for unlawfully wounding with intent to murder, and was found not guilty on the ground of insanity. Admitted into Broadmoor from Leeds Gaol on the 22nd of March 1878. In a state of chronic mania, and of a sullen and dangerous disposition.
- 936. H.J.D. Clerk in Holy Orders, aged 52 years, married. Was tried at the Central Criminal Court in March 1878, for assault, viz., firing a pistol at the Master of the Rolls, and was found by the jury not guilty on the ground of insanity, and was ordered to be detained during Her Majesty's pleasure. Admitted from Newgate Gaol on the 30th of March 1878. Chronic mania, with delusions.
- 937. J. H. Printer, aged 26, single. Was tried for larceny at the Middlesex Sessions, in April 1871, and sentenced to 7 years penal servitude. Admitted into Broadmoor from the lunatic wards of Woking Prison. Had three previous convictions recorded against him. Was ascertained to be insane about 15 months after conviction. Mania with delusions. Transferred to Colney Hatch on the 1st of May.
- 938. T. J. Aged 24, chain maker. Tried 19th March 1878 at Stafford Assizes for shooting with intent to murder, and found to be insane on arraignment. Admitted into Broadmoor 11th May 1878 from Stafford County Prison. On admission, was in a state of acute melancholia, easily moved to tears, refusing his food, and saying he would rather die than live.
- 939. C. H. Tailor, aged 28, single. Was tried at the Middlesex Sessions in May 1871, for larceny, was found guilty, and sentenced to seven years penal servitude. Admitted from the lunatic wards of Woking Prison. Of weak mind, with delusions as to his identity. Transferred to Colney Hatch Asylum on the 6th of June.
- 940. W. W., aged 26. Labourer. Admitted from Woking Prison, 16th May 1878. Tried 22nd May 1871 at Middlesex Sessions for larceny. Sentenced to seven years penal servitude and seven years police supervision. A general paralytic, with numerous and exalted delusions. Says he is the best singer and actor in the world, and if at liberty would earn thousands of pounds. Removed to Colney Hatch Asylum 6th June 1878.
- 941. J. H. Collier, aged 27, widowed. Was tried at Worcester in March 1878, for the wilful murder of his wife and two children. Was found not guilty on the ground of insanity, and was ordered to be kept in custody during Her Majesty's pleasure. Had been discharged from an asylum only a few weeks previously. Suspicion and jealousy of his wife led to the crime. On admission to Broadmoor from Worcester

Prison on the 16th of July the symptoms of the attack of mania had not worn off.

- 942. C. R. Labourer, aged 36 years. Tried at Cardiff Sessions, in July 1878, for stealing an ass; found insane, and ordered to be detained during Her Majesty's pleasure. Admitted into Broadmoor 22nd July 1878, from Swansea Prison. Had been an inmate of an asylum on a former occasion.
- 943. J. M., aged 25. A labourer. Tried for larceny at Knutsford 14th August 1871. Sentenced to seven years penal servitude and seven years police supervision. Admitted into Broadmoor from Woking Prison 7th August 1878. Chronic mania with delusions. Transferred to Chester Asylum 26th September 1878.
- 944. C. T. F. Engraver, aged 51, single. Tried at Surrey Sessions in April 1878 for indecent assault. Acquitted on the ground of insanity, and ordered to be detained during Her Majesty's pleasure. Admitted into Broadmoor from New-ington Prison. Congenitally of weak mind.
- 945. O. U. Labourer, aged 44, widower. Tried at the Surrey Assizes in July 1878, for the wilful murder of his daughter, aged 12 years. Found guilty and sentenced to death. Being afterwards certified to be insane the sentence was not carried out, and he was transferred to Broadmoor from Newington Prison on the 10th of August 1878. Very melancholy and suicidal. Had formerly been a soldier, had been under treatment four years ago as a lunatic, and had on two occasions attempted to commit suicide.
- 946. W. H. H., aged 32. Baker. Tried 12th July 1878 at the Assizes, New Sarum, for wilfully drowning a boy at Wootton Bassett, on the 12th of June previously. Acquitted on the ground of insanity. Admitted into Broadmoor from Devizes Prison 19th September 1878. There is a strong family history of insanity. One maternal uncle committed suicide by hanging, one of his brothers is at present in the Asylum at Devizes, another maternal uncle died in an epileptic fit. He himself confesses to having been frequently intoxicated.
- 947. J. W., aged 42. Stone mason. Effected his escape from this asylum on the 7th August 1873, while under a sentence of 10 years' penal servitude, having been tried at Warwick for burglary in 1866, and found guilty. He was arrested by an attendant belonging to this asylum, in Birmingham, on the 28th September 1878, and was conveyed next day to Broadmoor. Was found to be sane on admission. He had been working quietly for nearly four years in Birmingham as a stone mason, and earning good wages. He was discharged by Secretary of State's warrant on the 19th of October.

- 948. H. S., aged 27. A tramp. Tried for burglary at Wells on the 1st August 1878, and found insane. Removed to Broadmoor from Shepton Mallet Prison 15th November 1878. Memory defective; incoherent, and subject to attacks of recurrent mania when he becomes excited and dangerous.
- 949. T. H., aged 59. Spinner. Tried for the murder of his wife at the Stafford Assizes on the 4th November 1878. Found not guilty on the ground of insanity. Transferred to Broadmoor 26th November 1878. Subject to epilepsy and epileptic mania.
- 950. T. H. J. Compositor, aged 43, single. Was tried at the Chester Assizes in October 1878 for wounding with intent to murder. Found not guilty on the ground of insanity, and ordered to be kept in strict custody during Her Majesty's pleasure. Appears to have led a wandering and irregular life, both at home and abroad. Had been under restraint with delirium tremens when in Japan. On the present occasion he was labouring under a similar attack from excessive drinking. Admitted into Broadmoor from Chester Castle on the 2nd of December 1878, and had then apparently recovered from his excitement aud delusions. The woman whom he attacked was a complete stranger to him.
- 951. J. McB. Labourer, formerly in the army, aged 65, married. Was tried at Northallerton in January 1872 for larceny, found guilty and sentenced to seven years penal servitude. Not long after his conviction he appears to have been found to be insane. Admitted into Broadmoor on the 12th of December from the lunatic wards of Woking prison. A feeble and demented old man.
- 952. J. H. Metal roller, aged 28, single. Was tried for larceny at Birmingham in January 1872 and sentenced to seven years penal servitude. Appears to have conducted himself very badly whilst in prison and was ultimately found to be insane. Admitted into Broadmoor on the 12th of December 1878 from the lunatic wards of Woking prison. Demented and in feeble bodily health.
- 953. G. C. Metal roller, aged 26 years, married. Was tried at the Bristol Assizes in November 1878 for the murder of his two children. Found not guilty on the ground of insanity and ordered to be detained during Her Majesty's pleasure. Admitted into Broadmoor on the 20th of December 1878. The maniacal attack which led to his committing the crime appears to have been brought on by drink, but there was also a history of insanity in his family. The more prominent signs of insanity had disappeared at the time of admission.

- 954. J. J., aged 38. Labourer. Tried for larceny on the 5th January 1869 at Liverpool, and sentenced to ten years penal servitude. Admitted from the lunatic wards of Woking Prison on the 23rd of December. Chronic mania, with delusions relating to poison.
- 955. R. G. Groom, aged 26, single. Was tried at Manchester in January 1872 for housebreaking and sentenced to seven years penal servitude. Admitted into Broadmoor on the 23rd of December 1878 from the lunatic wards of Woking Prison. Weak minded, and melancholic. Had attempted suicide while in prison.

- 270. E. T., aged 40, married. Was tried at Manchester in July 1877 for the murder of her child by drowning it. Found to have been insane when she committed the act, and ordered to be confined during Her Majesty's pleasure. Had been insane from the time of her pregnancy and for several months was under incomplete supervision at home. Took the opportunity when left alone of drowning her child in a tub where she left it and went to call her neighbours to come and see what she had done. Had been insane after a previous confinement, but never in an asylum. After her trial she was removed to the Royal Lunatic Asylum at Cheadle whence she was transferred to Broadmoor on the 10th of January 1878. At that time the active signs of insanity had disappeared.
- 271. E. H., aged 17, married. Was tried at Exeter in January 1878 for the wilful murder of her child on the day of its birth by strangling it. Found not guilty on the ground of insanity and ordered to be detained during Her Majesty's pleasure. Appears to have been left in the care of a grandmother who was deaf and unfit to look properly after her in her confinement. Admitted into Broadmoor from Taunton prison on the 12th of March 1878.
- 272. J. A. E., aged 36, widow. Tried at Shrewsbury in March 1876 for larceny and sentenced to seven years penal servitude. Was observed to be "eccentric" at the time of her reception as a convict into prison. Admitted into Broadmoor from Millbank on the 26th of March 1878. Maniacal, rambling, and incoherent.
- 273. E. B. B., aged 24, single. Not tried. Found to be insane. Murdered her mother by shooting her with a gun, under a under a delusion that she was told to do so by God. Admitted from the Dorset County Asylum on the 17th of April 1878. Mania with religious delusions of a dangerous character. Health indifferent.
- 274. E. O., aged 31, married. Arraigned at the Central Criminal Court in April 1878 for the murder of her child, aged three weeks, by cutting its throat. Found to be insane and ordered to be detained during Her Majesty's pleasure. Admitted into Broadmoor from Newgate Prison on the 27th of April 1878. Silent, melancholic, and suicidal. Became insane during her pregnancy.
- 275. R. B., aged 25, married. Was tried at Manchester in November 1877 for the murder of her child by drowning, and acquitted on the ground of insanity, and ordered to be detained during Her Majesty's pleasure. Had on previous

occasions been insane during pregnancy and lactation. Admitted into Broadmoor from Lancaster Castle on the 7th of May 1878. Recurrent mania.


- 276. A. A., aged 43. Wife of a sailor. Was tried at the Durham Assizes in March 1878 for the murder of her only child aged two years. Found not guilty on the ground of insanity and ordered to be detained during Her Majesty's pleasure. Admitted into Broadmoor on the 8th of May 1878 from Durham Prison. A woman of weak mind who had led an irregular and somewhat intemperate life.

Had previously been in an asylum and had become intemperate in her habits.
- 280. C. J., aged 33, married. 'Tried at the Carnarvon Assizes on the 11th July 1878 for the murder of her child, aged 18 months, by suffocating it. Was acquitted on the ground of insanity, and ordered to be kept in custody during Her Majesty's pleasure. Admitted into Broadmoor from Carnarvon Prison on the 9th of September 1878. Melancholia. Unable to speak a word of English. Pregnant at the time of admission.
- 281. A. B. S., aged 23, married. Arraigned at the Exeter Assizes in July 1878 for the murder of her child by drowning. Found to be insane and ordered to be detained during Her Majesty's pleasure. Admitted from Exeter Prison on the 10th of October 1878. Mania with hallucinations of hearing.
- 282. C. C., alias K., aged 40. Staymaker, single. Was tried at Manchester Assizes in June 1878 for larceny from person, and sentenced to eight years penal servitude and seven years

police supervision. Admitted into Broadmoor from Millbank Prison on the 24th of October 1878. A woman of great cunning, irritable and eccentric. Has been four times previously convicted and 43 times summarily. #### TEA.

Every day - Males and Females } Tea with bread and butter.

Seed bread is given twice weekly in lieu of bread and butter to those of the patients who like it.

Oatmeal gruel at bed time is supplied to those who wish for it.

The sick are dieted at the discretion of the superintendent.

Working patients are allowed 4 ozs. bread and 1 oz. of cheese for lunch, with oatmeal and water.

Every patient is allowed  $1\frac{1}{2}$  ozs. tea, 7 ozs. sugar, 7 ozs. butter, and  $1\frac{3}{4}$  pts. milk weekly. Bread is unlimited; the quantity consumed averages 17 ozs. for males, and 14 ozs. for females.

## Appendix to Superintendent's Report.

The soup consists of the liquor from the boiling of the meat with the addition of  $12\frac{1}{2}$  lbs. of peas and barley, and 10 lbs. of vegetables, for 100 patients.

Currant puddings consist of flour, 3 ozs.; currants, 1 oz.; suet or dripping, 1 oz., for each patient.

Fruit pies consist of flour, 3 ozs.; fruit, 8 ozs.; sugar, 1 oz.; dripping, 1 oz., for each patient.

Seed bread is made from dough, with the addition of 10 lbs. dripping, 9 lbs. sugar, and  $1\frac{1}{4}$  lbs. carraway seeds for 100 lbs. dough.

Meat pies consist of 4 ozs. meat without bone, 7 ozs. mixed dough, and 8 ozs. vegetables for males;  $3\frac{1}{2}$  ozs. meat without bone, 6 ozs. mixed dough, and 8 ozs. vegetables for females.

Suet pudding consists of flour 4 ozs., suet 1 oz.


