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

Per centage of Recoveries, calculated on admissions, 46.6 ; last year they were 40.3. Per centage of deaths, calculated on average Number of Patients Resident, 9 ; last year they were 12.3.

The Asylum has been more crowded than it ought to be for the comfort or well-being of the Patients. It was so full that it became absolutely necessary not to admit any more, and in consequence the Unions have been obliged to send their Pauper Lunatics elsewhere, at a great cost and inconvenience. To remedy this as soon as possible, it was deemed advisable to erect a Temporary Building, principally of wood, at a cost of £468 11s 5 $\frac{3}{4}$ d, to accommodate 70 Patients during the Erection of the permanent Building. As soon as this was completed, Pauper Patients were re-admitted. This building is found to effect the purpose for which it was designed, and is well adapted to the comfortable accommodation of the Patients.

Plans for the permanent addition to the Asylum, capable of accommodating 300 Patients, have been made and submitted to the Lunacy Commissioners, who have approved of them generally; but suggested alterations in the details. At their request, Mr Crozier, the County Architect, went to London, and had an interview with them, at which the Chairman (Mr Burdon) was present.

As the Commissioners and Visitors are entirely agreed as to the General Plan and principle of the proposed addition to the Asylum, there is no doubt that the Plans will soon be completed satisfactorily. The reasons for making so large an addition to the Asylum were given on a former occasion to this Court, and the Plans were explained as far as was then practicable, and were approved of by the Bench. They are now laid before the Bench, and no time will be lost in carrying them out when completed; but as the Building will cost probably more than £10,000, it is most important to take every precaution to make them as perfect as possible before the work is begun. We are glad to be able to report that notwithstanding the overcrowded state of the Asylum, and the great imperfection of the Hospital, no serious illness has occurred. The worst consequence has been, the obliging Pauper Lunatics to be sent elsewhere, at a cost of more than 17s a week. The overcrowding must, however, if continued, affect the health of the Patients, and their chance of recovery, as it certainly interferes greatly with their comfort.

The property of which this Court sanctioned the purchase last January, has been bought for £3,100.

The Visitors cannot omit a reference to the loss which they, in common with the Bench, have to deplore in the death of Mr Bramwell, whose residence near the Asylum enabled him to attend to it, and whose benevolence made him anxious for the welfare of its inmates.

# REPORT OF THE MEDICAL SUPERINTENDENT

TO THE

## VISITING JUSTICES.

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DURHAM COUNTY ASYLUM, *January, 1867.*

GENTLEMEN,—

I HAVE the honour to submit to you the Eighth Annual Report of this Asylum.

One hundred and twenty-one Patients were admitted into the Asylum during the year 1866, making, with the 383 resident on the 1st of January of that year, a total of 504 Patients under treatment.

During the same period, 20 men and 36 women were discharged Recovered ; 1 man and 5 women were discharged Relieved or Not Improved ; and 20 men and 16 women Died—leaving, at the end of the year, 406 Patients resident, being 23 more than at the same date the previous year.

The Admissions were fewer in number than in any year since the opening of the Asylum. This was partly owing to the Asylum having been closed against all admissions in the months of July and August, during which period Patients were sent to other Asylums, where many of them still remain. The reason for the ~~slow~~-reception of Patients during these months was that, towards the end of spring, the wards became greatly crowded, and it was deemed expedient to diminish the numbers as much as possible during the warmest months of the year. In autumn and winter, the admissions were confined to urgent cases ; but as soon as the temporary building sanctioned by the Committee of Visitors was finished, this order was relaxed, and all applicants for admission were received. The temporary building is erected of wood and covered with felt, and is intended for the night accommodation of 70 Patients. The rooms, three in number, are cheerful, comfortable, and convenient.

The Recoveries have been upwards of 46 per cent. on the admissions. Considering the number of Paralytic Patients, and those labouring under incurable organic diseases, admitted, this proportion must be considered satisfactory.

The Deaths were rather under the average, having been 9 per cent., calculated on the mean numbers resident. There were no unusual causes of death. Of the 36 who died, 22 died from diseases of the nervous centres, 4 from diseases of the heart or

blood-vessels, 5 from diseases of the lungs, 4 from disease of abdominal organs, and 1 from a series of abscesses from which the Patient suffered on admission.

We have great reason to be thankful that, though cholera appeared within four miles of the Asylum, it did not appear amongst us ; indeed, during the past year, the general health of the inmates has been good. One peculiar case, which presented all the symptoms of miliary fever, deserves notice. A woman, under middle age, who had for several months been an inmate of the Asylum, and who was demented, was found one morning to be in a high state of fever—pulse rapid and of moderate strength ; respiration hurried and irregular ; skin hard, dry, and hot ; temperature, 105 ; face somewhat dusky. Next morning, she had profuse and offensive perspiration and dejections. Towards evening, acute pain and tenderness of the joints supervened. Two days afterwards, small patches of minute pustules appeared on the surface of the joints, and gradually extended over a considerable portion of the limbs. Shortly after the appearance of the pustules, the tenderness of the joints disappeared, and the fever lessened, but more gradually. About seven days after, desquamation occurred ; and the cuticle which came from the surface where the pustules were most abundant, presented a beautifully perforated appearance, the pustules still remaining on the body after the desquamation had taken place, and it was some time before all trace of these had disappeared. The patient gradually improved in her mental condition, and was discharged a few months afterwards, recovered.

I must again mention to the Visitors the kindness of Miss Manning, of Colchester, who has of late years been most attentive in sending numerous Periodicals for the use of the Patients. She also most kindly sent a box containing contributions to our Christmas Tree. Mr W. Scurfield Grey has kindly continued to supply a copy of the London *Illustrated News*.

I have to report favourably of the conduct of the Attendants and Servants.
