

1861, 178 men and 164 women—total 342. Of those discharged 27 men and 23 women had recovered. The remainder is reported to the authorities, one satisfactory, being of men 22.5 per cent; of women 18.4 per cent—both under 5 per cent below the average of the Asylum in the year 1860. Deaths have occurred through accident, but the Asylum has been attended no blame to any one.

## GENERAL COURT OF QUARTER SESSIONS ASSEMBLED.

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The Committee of Visitors have to Report,

That during the past year the Asylum has been conducted in a satisfactory manner.

Dr. Smith continues to display peculiar talents and great zeal in his office as Medical Superintendent. Mr. Macklin, out of numerous applicants and after strict enquiry, has been appointed to the situation of House Steward; and satisfies all the expectations that we had been led to form of him.

The number of patients remaining in the House in December, 1860, was 152 men and 139 women—total 291. There were admitted during the past year 82 men and 71 women—total 153. There have been discharged during the same period 35 men and 41 women—total 76. Within this time there have died 21 men and 5 women—total 26; leaving in the Asylum on the 31st December,

1861, 178 men and 164 women,—total 342. Of those discharged 27 men and 33 women had recovered. The recoveries, in proportion to the admissions, are satisfactory, being of men 32·93 per cent.; of women 46·48 per cent.—both sexes 39·21. The total number of deaths have been 7·9 per cent., which is about 3 per cent. below the average of the Asylums in the kingdom. Two deaths have occurred through suicide, but the Coroner's juries have attributed no blame to any one.

The Committee have paid great attention to the economical management of the Establishment, which is producing favourable results.

The cost of maintenance of each patient per week during the year has averaged 8s. 7·94d., but this does not include repairs. And we have good hopes that this may be further diminished if there should be no rise in the price of provisions.
