Recoveries 37.5 per cent. on admissions ; deaths 9.7 per cent. on daily average ; daily average 410 ; the cost per head is 9s 4.25d.

Two additional Cottages for attendants, with apartments between them, capable of accommodating ten patients, are completed. The cost has been £450 ; the sum of £6 10s for each Cottage will be charged for rent, so that the cost incurred for the Patients will be only about £225 or £22 10s per patient.

The Medical Superintendent anticipates much benefit from the means thus afforded of separating some of the Patients from those kept in the Asylum.

The number of Patients has continued to increase rapidly during the year till last month when the admissions have been less numerous in proportion to the dismissals. This has occurred every year since the opening of the Asylum, but its cause is not obvious, nor is the Superintendent able to account for it.

The Farm has given constant and beneficial employment to many of the Patients, and its produce has paid a good interest on its cost, and has fully met our expectations. A portion $10\frac{1}{4}$ acres of grass land through which iron pipes with hydrants 100 yards apart were laid to supply it with sewage, was grazed very close to the 13th May : it was mown six weeks after and produced nearly $2\frac{1}{2}$ tons of Hay per acre, and this in an unusually dry season when land near it of similar description, but not irrigated, did not produce 1 ton per acre. This proved the advantages of the application of sewage so clearly that we have not hesitated to extend the system to $11\frac{3}{4}$ more acres of Grass Land and to 10 acres of Garden. The cost is £11. 7s. 4d. per acre for the Grass Land and £14. per acre for Garden. We think that the increased amount of produce and saving in Manure will amply repay the expenditure.

The Reverend W. H. Walter resigned the office of Chaplain in September last. We have appointed, with the sanction of

the Rector of the Parish of Sedgefield, two of his Curates to act as joint Chaplains, with a salary of £50 each. The result of this arrangement is quite satisfactory.

We have to pay the same tribute, as on former occasions, to the uniform kindness and attention of Dr. Smith and his Medical Assistant.

The comfort of the Patients is thoroughly cared for ; the condition of the Asylum and of the Grounds prove the attention and good management of their respective officers.
