REPORT
OF THE
GENERAL COMMITTEE OF GOVERNORS
OF
ST. LUKE'S HOSPITAL,
FOR THE YEAR 1869.

To the Court of Governors of St. Luke's Hospital.

Your Committee beg leave to submit the following Report.

The Burial Ground obtained from the Parochial Authorities at a rent of £30. per annum, has been converted into an Airing Court to the great advantage of the Male Patients, but the expense of the alteration, so strongly urged by the Commissioners in Lunacy, together with setting back the wall in Bath Street, has been greater than was anticipated, viz., about £1,500.

To increase and improve the supply of hot water throughout the Hospital, two new Cornish Boilers have been substituted for the old ones at a cost of £288.

The vacancy announced in the last Report in the office of the Resident Medical Superintendent, was filled up on the 9th of April, by the appointment of Dr. J. THOMPSON DICKSON.

A Sub-Committee was appointed on the 9th April to make the required arrangements consequent on the union of the offices of Chaplain and Secretary, which was then decided upon. In the following month, the Rev. T. H. COLE, M.A., was elected to the combined offices of Chaplain and Secretary, and entered on his duties on the 1st of July.

The Benefactions during the past year amounted to £647. 2s. 5d., against £709. 6s. in 1868, and the Annual Subscriptions amounted to £160. 8s., against £166. 4s. in 1868.

The amount received from the friends of Patients towards their maintenance was £533. 8s. for Curable Cases, against £399. in 1868 ; and £1,617 for Chronic Cases, against £1,481. 11s. in 1868.

The amount received for Incurable Cases was £1,449, against £1,416. 9s. in 1868.

Under the Will of the late Lord HENRY SEYMOUR, the sum of £400. has been received as a portion of the Legacy.

The sum of £1,000. Reduced 3 per Cent. Stock bequeathed by the late W. HOLLINS, Esq., has also been received and transferred into the names of three Trustees as required by the Will.

The Expenditure in 1869 was £11,517. 10s. 8d., against £10,763. 14s. 2d. in 1868.

Your Committee regret to state that during the past year they were obliged to sell £4,000. Consolidated 3 per Cent. Annuities, more than one-half that amount being required to meet the cost of Improvements in and about the Hospital.

In accordance with the sanction of the Annual Courts of 1858 and 1859, your Committee have made such alterations in the scale of charges for Patients not on the Free List, as will, in their opinion, both improve the finances of the Hospital, and meet the requirements of every class of Patients seeking admission.

The details of this are set forth in a scheme prepared by the Secretary.

There have been received into the Hospital, between the 1st January and 31st December, 1869, 120 Patients deemed Curable.

During the same period there have been discharged Cured, 60; Uncured, 25; unfit, 15; at the request of friends, 11; and there have died, 8.

The average number of Patients in the Hospital throughout the year has been 132.

The total number of Patients remaining on the Books on 31st December, 1869, were 141, viz.: 60 Patients deemed curable, and 81 Boarders, including Mr. Whitbread's Patient.

Five Governors have died since the last Meeting of the Court, viz., the MARQUIS OF WESTMINSTER, RICHARD BAGGALLAY, Esq., NATHANIEL CLARK, Esq., T. MUSGRAVE MUSGRAVE, Esq., and W. NOCKELLS, Esq.

The following new Governors have been nominated, viz.: the Right Hon. Earl COWPER, CHARLES PERCIVAL TITT, Esq., and EDWARD C. HEALEY, Esq.

Your Committee cannot close this Report, without protesting against the many unjust strictures on the management of the Hospital, which have from time to time appeared (chiefly anonymously), in various Newspapers.

So strongly did your Committee feel the injustice of these statements, and so desirous were they that a full investigation as to the accuracy of those reports should take place, that they applied to the Lord Chancellor to institute an independent enquiry into the entire management of the Hospital, but they regret to say that his Lordship declined on the ground that the case was not within his jurisdiction.

Although your Committee thus failed to obtain an authoritative investigation of their alleged mismanagement, they have the satisfaction of knowing that the false statements of which they complain have not deterred the friends of Patients from applying for admission, for the number received of those whose friends contribute to their support have doubled since the beginning of last year; and your Committee confidently expect that a further increase in the number of Patients will result from the financial scheme proposed by the Secretary, and adopted by your Committee.

Your Committee recommend as follows:—

That the Lord OVERSTONE be re-elected President of this Corporation.

That the Right Honourable the Earl of ABINGDON, D.C.L.; the Right Honourable the Viscount EVERSLEY; Sir EDMUND WILLIAM ANTROBUS, Baronet; SAMUEL CHARLES WHITBREAD, Esq., F.R.S.; W. FOSTER WHITE, Esq.; be re-elected Vice-Presidents of this Corporation; and that Earl COWPER be elected a Vice-President in the place of JAMES BENTLEY, Esq., who has resigned.

That HENRY FRANCIS SHAW LEFEVRE, Esq.; be re-elected the Treasurer.

That Messrs. FULLER & Co. be re-elected the Bankers.

Your Committee submit a List of Governors, as fit and proper persons to act as the General Committee for the year ensuing, and recommend that the number of that Committee be increased from 30 to 40.

You will also have to elect a Committee of Audit.

REPORT
OF THE
PHYSICIANS & MEDICAL SUPERINTENDENT,
FOR THE YEAR 1869.

*To the President, Vice-Presidents, Treasurer, and Governors
of St. Luke's Hospital.*

MY LORDS, LADIES, AND GENTLEMEN,

WE beg to present our Annual Report for the year 1869.

The average daily number of Patients resident was 132.

On the Curable List 44 males and 76 females were admitted, and 22 males and 38 females were discharged as recovered.

Of 93 Patients whose treatment was completed, 60 were discharged as recovered, giving the average of recoveries as 64.51 per cent.

On the Boarders' List 6 males and 20 females were admitted, and 4 females were discharged as recovered.

From the Curable List 10 males and 17 females were sent out on trial, and out of that number 5 males and 10 females were discharged recovered, and are included in the List of Recoveries; 4 of the remaining number were discharged as relieved, 1 died, 1 returned to the Hospital, and 4 males and 1 female are still absent on trial.

There were 11 deaths—5 male and 6 female, all from natural causes.

On the 1st January of the present year there were, (on the Hospital books) on the Curable list 22 males and 38 females; and on the Boarders' list 31 males and 50 females, including 4 males and 1 female absent on trial.

The Commissioners in Lunacy made their Annual Statutory Visit in April last, and recorded in the Visitors' book the state in which they found the Hospital.

In the month of June last your Committee appointed an additional night-watch on each side of the establishment, and we are pleased to state that the result is satisfactory.

The Committee also introduced Dent's system of Tell-tale in order that the night-attendants might register their visits the more accurately. We have pleasure in reporting also that the operation of this change is satisfactory.

The Committee further have erected two new steam boilers of greater capacity than those formerly in use, also two additional hot-water tanks. The supply of hot water is now ample, and sufficient for all emergencies.

The ground used as a drying-ground for the Laundry, has been levelled and turfed to form a croquet-ground, where, during the summer, the Patients daily have the opportunity of taking exercise and amusement.

The skittle alley, which was removed for the purpose of building the new wall on the male side, has been replaced, and is a source of considerable amusement to the male Patients.

Numbers of the Patients take exercise beyond the Hospital boundaries; as many as twenty, and sometimes even more, are allowed in the same day to take walks in the streets in charge of attendants.
