REPORT  
OF THE  
GENERAL COMMITTEE OF GOVERNORS  
OF  
ST. LUKE'S HOSPITAL,  
FOR THE YEAR 1870.

*To the Court of Governors of St. Luke's Hospital.*

Your Committee beg leave to submit the following Report :—

The alteration made at the commencement of the year in the scale of charges for Patients not on the Free List, in accordance with the sanction of the Annual Courts of 1858 and 1859, has resulted in a marked improvement in the finances of the Hospital, and at the same time extended its benefits.

For whereas previously to this year Curable Patients, whose friends were unwilling to contribute one guinea per week, were of necessity placed on the Free List to the loss of the Hospital revenues, or the friends were often constrained by a feeling of self-respect to make a larger payment than their means would fairly allow, there being no alternative open to them; the medium scale of 14s. per week has just met the requirements of that class without detriment to their circumstances.

Moreover as regards cases uncured, after a year's treatment, who were formerly obliged to leave the Hospital, unless maintained by their friends at a weekly charge of one guinea, it has been found that the permission to remain at the reduced rate of 14s. has been most gratefully appreciated in every instance.

The introduction of the lower charge has caused no diminution in the higher rate of one guinea as was at first reasonably feared, so that the proceeds of the two new classes at 14s. and 30s. (for Exceptional Cases) have been in addition to the other receipts.

Your Committee are making such revision in the Rules for the admission of patients as will adapt them to these alterations in the scale of charges.

Your Committee regret to report the death, after a short illness, of Mr. C. H. Moore, who held the office of surgeon for three and a-half years, and at the same time to record their high sense of his great professional ability, and his amiable and gentlemanlike conduct during that period. Mr. Alfred Willett, Assistant-Surgeon St. Bartholomew's Hospital, was appointed his successor on the 8th of July.

Dr. J. Thompson Dickson resigned his office as Resident Medical Superintendent on the 1st of July, and Dr. Reginald Eager came into residence on the 2nd of September, the interval having been filled up by the services of Dr. Elphinstone.

The Benefactions during the past year amounted to £702. 2s. 5d., against £647. 2s. 5d., in 1869, and the Annual Subscriptions amounted to £184. 12s., against £160. 8s. in 1869.

The amount received from the friends of Patients towards their maintenance was £1,171. 5s. for Curable Cases, against £533. 8s. in 1869: and £1,878. for Chronic Cases, against £1,617. in 1869.

The amount received for Incurable cases was £1,697. 8s., against £1,449. in 1869.

Of the whole amount £4,746. 13s. received for Patients, against £3,599. 8s. in 1869, £473. 18s. was at the rate of 14s. per week, and £154. 10s. at 30s., in accordance with the new scheme.

The Expenditure in 1870 was £10,510. 2s. 8d., against £11,517. 10s. 8d. in 1869.

The Receipts during the year were £11,681. 10s. 7d., against £9,945. 17s. 5d. in 1869.

Your Committee having had to notice in former years a sensible diminution in their assets from necessary sales of stock, rejoice in being able to call the attention of the Governors to the manifest improvement in the financial position of this charity

of St. Luke's Hospital.*

MY LORDS, LADIES, AND GENTLEMEN,

We have the honor to present to you our Annual Report for the year 1870.

During the past year, 120 Patients have been admitted into the Hospital; 87 have been discharged, and 5 died; which, compared with the year 1869, shews the admissions to have been less by 26; the discharges to be less by 36, and a diminution in deaths of 6.

On the first of January of the present year, 169 Patients remained on the books of the Hospital, classed as:—

The average number of Patients per week has been 46 males and 94 females, making the total average 140.

Of the 87 discharges, there were removed, before the expiration of their year of treatment, 17 Patients, at the request of their friends, and 3 as unfit to remain in the Hospital. Out of the remaining 67 Patients, 45 were discharged as cured; thus giving the percentage of cures as 67·17 on the discharges.

During the past year many of the cases when brought to the Hospital were in a most critical condition, and so exhausted that they have only been kept alive by the most unremitting attention; yet there is great satisfaction in the fact that the number of deaths has been so small.

Another cause of thankfulness is that the year has gone by without a case of suicide or serious accident of any kind.

The usual round of amusements has been held, somewhat interfered with in the latter part of the year by the Recreation Room being used as a Chapel while that building was in a state of renovation.

We have great satisfaction in expressing our appreciation of

the greatly improved condition of the Chapel. The zeal of the Chaplain having been very generously supported by the individual contributions of several of the Governors and friends of the Hospital.

The Commissioners in Lunacy paid their Annual Statutory visit in October last, and recorded in the Visitors' Book the state in which they found the Hospital.
