TO THE COMMITTEE OF VISITORS.

GENTLEMEN

The number of Patients remaining in the Asylum on the 31st of December

^{*} Rule 25.—[of the General Rules of the Asylum]. The Superintendent shall submit to the Committee of Visitors, at their first Meeting after the Epiphany Quarter Sessions annually, a Report in writing, of the general condition of the Asylum, and the number and character of the Patients; distinguishing the numbers who have been received and discharged as cured; the number of re-admissions; the number employed, and in what manner; the deaths which have occurred in the preceding year, and also the total number of discharges, cures, and deaths since the opening of the Institution, and specifying the sexes in each statement; with such other facts as the Superintendent may think desirable, or which the Visitors may have suggested.

1869, was 493, of whom 223 were Males, and 270 were Females.

The admissions during the year 1870 were 159, of whom 77 were Male and 82 were Female Patients.

There were, in addition, 60 Littlemore Patients returned partly from the Worcestershire Asylum at Powick and partly from the Dorsetshire Asylum at Charminster. Of these 22 were Males and 38 were Females.

The discharges of Patients during the past year were 82, of which number 35 were Male, and 47 were Female Patients. 70 of these were discharged as recovered, 30 of them being Males, and 40 Females.

There were also 40 Patients removed to the Berkshire Asylum at Moulsford, of whom 20 were Males, and 20 Females.

The number of deaths was 63; of whom 32 were Males and 31 Females. This includes one Male and one Female who died

at Charminster, and one Female who died at Powick.

The number of admissions during the past year has only been exceeded in two former years; namely, in 1867 and 1869; whilst if to this number be added the number of Patients returned from Powick and Charminster in 1870, the total is 52 in excess of any year since the opening of the Asylum.

The bodily health of Patients on admission, has been, as a rule, far from satisfactory; for Paralysis existed in 37 new Patients; General Paresis in 12; and Epilepsy in 24.

On the other hand there has been a marked improvement in the period during which Insanity had befallen Patients prior to their being sent to the Asylum.

More than half of the number in question (82) were admitted after being insane for a month or less. Of these 28 were discharged during the year of their admission, and 4 died.

The discharges of Patients recovered, amounted to 14 per cent. on the average number resident, and to 10 per cent. of the whole number under treatment.

The deaths have been 12 per cent. on the average number resident; 10 per cent. on the number under treatment; and 10 per cent. on the admissions of the year.

The proximate causes of death may be thus enumerated:—

During the year two Inquests were held by the Coroner of the Oxford District. One of the Inquests was upon a Patient who died of disease of the heart; and the other upon an Epileptic found dead in her bed. The average age of all the Patients who died, was 51.

The general health of the Patients has been good. No Epidemic has occurred, and I have pleasure in again recording that there has been no case of suicide during the year.

The total number of Patients belonging to the Bodies in Union (exclusive of those at the Berkshire Asylum at Moulsford), is 578; and they are distributed as follows.

The average number of Patients daily resident during the year has been 507; of whom 231 were Males, and 276 Females; being an average excess of 17 of any previous year.

The total increase of Patients during the year has consisted of 11 Males and 21

Females (total 32); whilst the decrease by the opening of the Berkshire Asylum at Moulsford, has been 86.

There still remain in the Littlemore Asylum 168 Berkshire and Reading Patients; of whom 60 of the former and 25 of the latter will eventually be removed to Moulsford.

The escape of John Wood, a Criminal Lunatic, occurred on the 26th of June; and he has not since been heard of.

Seclusions,—generally for short periods,
—have been more frequent throughout the
past than in former years; 9 Males and 6
Females having been subjected to this treatment. The total number of occasions on
which seclusion was resorted to, was 21.
The increased number of seclusions has solely
arisen from the accident of a proportionate
increase of violent cases on admission.

Occupation for the Male Patients in the Garden and Shops; and for the Females in

the Laundry and at needlework, continues regularly.

Some few additions have been made to the Library, and a Bagatelle board has been added to the Female side.

The windows on the Male side in each of the Infirmaries have been lowered in a manner similar to those on the Female side, and are highly appreciated.

It is due to Dr. Skelton, who succeeded Mr. Marsh as Assistant Medical Officer in March last, to say that he has proved to be a valuable and agreeable Colleague.

Frequent changes have taken place during the past year amongst the Junior Attendants; and there has been great difficulty in finding Persons of suitable requirements to replace them.

It is with great pleasure that I have again to mark my sense of the zeal and ability which all the Officers, and the head and senior Attendants of the Institution have displayed in the execution of their duties; often onerous and perplexing.

The usual statistical Tables required of the Superintendent, as well as those prepared by Mr. Andrews, the Clerk and Steward, are appended.

In conclusion I desire respectfully to thank the Committee of Visitors for their kind consideration and support during the past year.




