of the Superintendent be printed and circulated.

^{*} Rule 25.—[of the General Rules of the Asylum]. The Superintendent shall submit to the Committee of Visitors, at their first Meeting after the Epiphany Quarter Sessions annually, a Report in writing, of the general condition of the Asylum, and the number and character of the Patients; distinguishing the numbers who have been received and discharged as cured; the number of re-admissions; the number employed, and in what manner; the deaths which have occurred in the preceding year, and also the total number of discharges, cures and deaths since the opening of the Institution, and specifying the sexes in each statement; with such other facts as the Superintendent may think desirable, or which the Visitors may have suggested.

TO THE COMMITTEE OF VISITORS.

GENTLEMEN,

The number of Patients in the Asylum on the 31st of December 1870, was 524, namely 233 Males, and 291 Females.

The admissions during the year 1871 were 123, namely 52 Males, and 71 Females.

There were also 4 Males returned from Stone, and 3 Males from Fisherton.

The discharges during the year were 182, (84 Males, and 98 Females), of whom 11 Males and 26 Females (total 37), were discharged as recovered, and 7 Males and 13 Females (total 20), were discharged relieved.

Eighty three Patients have been removed to the Berkshire Asylum at Moulsford, of whom 35 were Males and 48 were Females.

Fifty nine deaths have occurred during the year; of whom 40 were Males and 19 were Females.

The average age at death was 57, 19 being above 60 years of age, of whom 4 exceeded 80 years. The youngest was 26, and the oldest 90 years.

The bodily health of Patients on admission is far from satisfactory, and shews there is still room for improvement by their more speedy removal from home to the Asylum, when Insanity is found to exist.

Paralysis existed in 16 Patients, General Paresis in 10, and Epilepsy in 23.

One half of the Patients who had been ill a week before admission to the Asylum, were discharged recovered in the same year, and none of them died, whilst less than one third were returned home who had been ill more than one week and less than a month, and one in seven of them died.

Of the 123 admissions, 40 were discharged and 13 died during the year.

The discharges on recovery were 6 per cent. on the number under treatment, and 7 per cent. on the average number resident.

The Deaths were nearly 12 per cent. on the average number resident, and 9 per cent. on the number under treatment.

The proximate causes of Death may be thus enumerated:—

No Inquest has been held during the year.

The general health of the Patients has been good. No Epidemic has occurred, and I have pleasure in again recording that there has been no case of suicide during the year.

The average number of Patients daily resident during the year has been 492; namely 214 Males and 278 Females.

The decrease of the year is 118.

The Berkshire Patients have been removed to Moulsford, with the exception of 83 to be retained by agreement, and all Patients in other Asylums belonging to the County of Oxford, the City of Oxford, and the Boroughs of Abingdon and Windsor have returned to Littlemore.

No Berkshire Patient has been admitted since the 13th of July last.

John Smith, a Criminal Lunatic, escaped on the 30th of September, and has not since been heard of. Seclusion was resorted to in the cases of 6 Males, 3 of whom were labouring under Acute Mania and 3 under Epileptic Mania. The total number of occasions on which seclusion was resorted to, was 18.

Occupation for 154 Males continues to be found in the Garden, Workshops, and Wards, and for 183 Females in the Laundry, Kitchen, and Wards.

The increase of amusements during the year has been highly appreciated in the Asylum.

The rent of a field for Cricket and Football; the addition of a Piano, two Bagatelle Tables, a Skittle Alley, Croquet, Bowls, Chess, Draughts, Dominoes, Cards, Books, Periodicals, and Papers; and more frequent walks beyond the Asylum, materially add to the health and comfort of the Patients.

In March last, in anticipation of an Epidemic of Small Pox,—at the request of the Commissioners in Lunacy and with the approbation of the Visitors, -the Officers, Attendants, and Patients, amounting to 550, were, with the assistance of the Consulting Surgeon. Mr. E. L. Hussey, vaccinated. And here it is observable that, of the 400 Patients who were re-vaccinated, the operation was successful as to 300. On this occasion also, a Ward was isolated on either side of the Asylum, for the reception of cases of Small Pox, should the disease make its appearance, or to meet the emergency of any case of the admission of a Patient afflicted with a contagious disease.

One Female on admission was placed in quarantine for a period of 12 days. Her Husband, recently recovered from Small Pox, was allowed to accompany her in the Fly to the Asylum. Her infant died of the disease a few days before.

Small Pox has visited the surrounding Villages, and many fatal cases have occurred in them. The census of the Asylum taken on the 3rd of April, numbered 574.

Dr. James Marshall Skelton, whose valuable services were highly appreciated, was, on his election to the Metropolitan Asylum at Leavesden, Herts, succeeded, in June last, by Dr. John Hoysted, a most efficient and gentlemanly Colleague.

The sudden death of the Rev. E. W. R. Pulling on the 9th of June last, cast a gloom over the Institution, and, though he had retired from the office of Chaplain 3 years, his kindness was not forgotten. His loss was severely felt, and I had much pleasure in speaking to his Widow of the heartfelt sympathy of those amongst whom he so assiduously laboured for a period of 21 years.

The Coal siding in connexion with the Railway has been completed, and the Coal (820 tons) brought direct on to the Asylum

premises, at a probable saving of about £25.

During the year, 5 Children have been born of Patients recently admitted, 4 of the Children being Females, and one a Male. In one case the Mother was an Epileptic, and the Child has inherited the disease.

The Hydrate of Chloral has been in constant use during the year, and cannot be too highly spoken of. The dose appears to be 20 or 30 grains, which will produce from 2 to 5 hours sleep, and I have not seen any unpleasant or injurious results.

Less frequent changes in the Staff of Attendants have, throughout the year, been a great comfort to your Superintendent and his Patients.

The addition of one Fernale Attendant greatly facilitates the working of the Institution.

Two of the Commissioners in Lunacy (Mr. Forster and Dr. Nairne) visited the Asylum on the 11th of October.

The general conduct of the Officers and Attendants throughout the year has been highly satisfactory.

The usual statistical Tables required of the Superintendent, and the Clerk and Steward, are appended.

In conclusion, I desire respectfully to thank the Committee for their kind consideration and support during the past year.


