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

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GENERAL ANNUAL MEETING AT BRADFORD.

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The General Annual Meeting of the Subscribers to the Royal Albert Asylum was held at Bradford, on Friday, September 29th, 1871,

THE RIGHT REV.

THE LORD BISHOP OF MANCHESTER,

IN THE CHAIR.

The proceedings having been opened with prayer by the REV. S. EARNSHAW, M.A., the General Secretary (Mr. James Diggens), read the Reports of the Central Committee, and Mr. Charles France, Honorary Secretary to the Bradford Local Committee, read the Auditors' Report and their Certificates as to the accuracy of the Balance Sheets presented by the General Secretary.

The Chairman then addressed the meeting; after which the following resolutions were unanimously passed :---

- 1.—That this Meeting approves and adopts the Report now submitted; and, whilst gratefully acknowledging the liberal support which the Royal Albert Asylum has so generally received, respectfully urges the Local Committees and the Subscribers in every part of the Northern Counties, to renewed exertions, so that the Asylum may be completed free from debt, and with an adequate provision for its maintenance.

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REPORT.

The Central Committee, in presenting their Seventh Annual Report, wish to remind the Subscribers that the last Annual Meeting should have been held at Bradford, but was altered to Lancaster to afford the subscribers a full opportunity of inspecting the portion of the building then finished and about to be occupied. That anniversary was presided over by His Grace the Duke of Devonshire, who was supported by many distinguished visitors and warm friends of the Asylum. It was then determined that the ensuing meeting should be held at Bradford.

The Central Committee lost no time in making preparations and organising the staff preparatory to the first election of inmates. The Lancashire Election, at which twenty boys were admitted, was held in Manchester on the 16th of December, under the presidency of J. T. Hibbert, Esq., M.P. The Yorkshire Election, at which twelve boys were admitted, was held at Halifax on the 20th of December, the Rev. S. Earnshaw, M.A., presiding.

In connection with the Lancashire Election a Grand Banquet promoted by the Local Committee, was held in the Town Hall, Manchester. The Earl of Derby, who presided, eloquently pleaded the claims of the Asylum in an able and thoughtful address, a report of which has been published in a neat form, and has proved of much value as a concise exposition of the objects of the institution. Mr. John Fernley, with his accustomed liberality, contributed a donation of £1,000; and Mr. Robert Barnes evinced his continued interest in the Asylum by a second donation of £500. The Banquet was the means of adding to the funds a sum of £2,700. Here the Committee desire to acknowledge the generosity of the Local Treasurer, Mr. E. S. Heywood, in defraying the expenses of the Banquet to the amount of £260, so that the institution might receive all contributions free from deductions on that account. To the ability and laudable exertions of the Vice-Chairman of the Local Committee, Mr. J. A. Bremner, the success of the Banquet is largely attributable.

On the occasion of the Yorkshire Election, a Public Meeting was held at Halifax, the chair being kindly taken by the Mayor, in the absence through indisposition, of that noble friend of the Asylum, Sir Titus Salt, Bart. Several liberal contributions were announced.

The county of Chester has been more directly appealed to during the past year. A meeting was held at Stockport on the 8th of May, the Mayor in the chair. On the 9th of August a County Meeting was held at Chester, under the presidency of the Lord Lieutenant, Lord Egerton of Tatton. Previously to the meeting his Lordship made a special visit to the Asylum, and inspected every department, and was therefore the better able to urge the county cheerfully to contribute its quota towards the erection and maintenance of the Institution. His Lordship warmly expressed his approval of the structural arrangements of the Asylum, and of the methods of treatment adopted for the improvement of the patients; and as a practical proof of his satisfaction largely increased his subscription. An influential County Committee has been formed with Lord Egerton as Chairman, and a general appeal to the County is being actively prosecuted with the most gratifying results.

In addition to this work, the Secretary has devoted much attention to a personal canvass for Annual Subscriptions, and in the towns he has visited for this purpose has received the ready and invaluable co-operation of members of the Local Committees. The Committee gratefully refer to the following gentlemen :- Mr. L. J. Crossley and Mr. J. Hodgson Wright, Honorary Secretaries, Halifax; Mr. M. W. Thompson, (Chairman), Mr. Angus Holden, Mr. W. E. Glyde, Mr. C. France (Hon. Sec.), Bradford; Mr. Richard Hurst, Mr. G. T. Kemp (Chairman), Mr. James Ashworth, Mr. John Holgate (Hon. Sec.), Rochdale. To the Rev. R. Bruce, M.A., and Mr. Thomas Allen, Huddersfield; Mr. W. Heaton, Wigan; Captain Ogle, St. Helens, and to other Local Secretaries the Committee also feel indebted for their successful efforts to obtain Annual Subscriptions for the Asylum. The Committee would assure all the Local Committees that their co-operation is most gratefully appreciated, and they would respectfully and earnestly appeal for continued, and, if possible, increased support. An onerous responsibility still rests upon the promoters of the Asylum. A large sum is still required for the General Fund, from which is to be defrayed the cost of Building, Fittings, Furniture, Land, &c. The funds placed for these purposes at the disposal of the Committee are exhausted The Asylum is not yet finished, and if important educational advantages are not to be lost, Farm Buildings must be erected before very long. Farm occupations are very congenial and useful to many of the patients,

especially to those coming from agricultural districts. And, if the benefits of the Asylum are to be extended to a great number of free patients, a large annual income will be necessary. While there is abundant reason to be grateful for past success, the Committee feel that the present is certainly not the time for friends to relax their efforts. Local Committees may also render the institution valuable service by seeking out suitable cases for free admission, and by assisting the Central Committee to obtain reliable information respecting them.

The Committee wish to have the benefits of the Asylum equitably participated in by all parts of the Northern Counties. Of the 66 patients in the Asylum at present, 31 belong to Lancashire, 19 to Yorkshire, 4 to Cheshire, 4 to Cumberland, 1 to Westmorland, 4 to Durham, and 2 to Northumberland. One full payment patient belongs to Lincolnshire, and here the Committee would wish it to be generally understood that, while there is ample accommodation, paying patients will be received from any part of the kingdom.

In some of the Counties, where from lack of applicants there was no necessity for a competitive election, a few subscribers have expressed disappointment at being deprived of their privilege of voting. In accordance with the rules of the Institution, the only course open to the Central Committee seemed to be to authorise the County Committees, where the applicants were deficient in number, to elect at once all their eligible candidates. But such objections suggest whether the present complicated and laborious system of elections might not with advantage be superseded by *general* elections held half-yearly, at which subscribers should be entitled to vote for candidates belonging to any part of the Northern Counties. Any alteration or modification of the existing system requires, however, grave consideration.

The public are permitted to visit the Asylum every Monday, on the recommendation of any subscriber, and it is gratifying to acknowledge that this privilege is much appreciated. Many visitors of distinction have recently inspected the Asylum, and foremost among them may be mentioned the Emperor and Empress of Brazil and suite, who expressed their unmistakeable approval of the objects of the Asylum, of its general construction, of the cheerfulness of the inmates, and their surprise at the progress the children were making. The Emperor was minute in his enquiries into all details, and, on leaving the Asylum, entered the following remark after his name in the Visitors' book :---

"C' est un charitable et superbe établissement, que Dieu benira."

No less valuable have been the remarks of visitors whose scientific

attainments, or whose practical acquaintance with the treatment of Imbeciles give great importance to their testimony. Among these may be mentioned Dr. Charlton, President for the past year of the British Medical Association; the Society of Architects, Liverpool; Mr. Millard of the Eastern Counties Asylum; Dr. Ireland of the Scotch Asylum at Larbert, and others. Many, too, of the generous supporters of the charity have been led to extend their liberality after a careful inspection of the Asylum.

The Committee invite the attention of the subscribers to the report of an official visit made to the Asylum on the 26th of April by the Commissioners in Lunacy.

Lancaster, 26th April, 1871.

We have, this day, made our first official visit to the Royal Albert Asylum for Idiots and Imbeciles of the Seven Northern Counties, which was registered as a Hospital on the 16th August last, and into which Patients were first received on the 14th December. The site, which comprises about 67 acres, and is rather more than a mile from Lancaster, is elevated, and commands extensive and pleasing views. The style of the Building is Gothic. The only portions completed are the Central Block, wherein are the Residences of the Medical Superintendent and Matron, and the Southern Wing, which is appropriated to the Male Patients. The Asylum was designed for 500 Patients, viz., 300 of the Male, and 200 of the Female sex; but it is expected that it will ultimately afford proper accommodation for 600 Patients. The contract for the Building was £43,000, which has been exceeded, and the cost, including the Lodge and Cottages, will, it is estimated, on the whole, amount to £50,000. To this will have to be added about £10,000, for fittings, furniture, and apparatus. The energetic and persevering efforts of Dr. de Vitre, and the gentlemen associated with him in establishing the Institution, have been attended with signal success, the receipts from various sources, for the General Fund, have amounted to nearly £58,000. The sum of £14,000 has been invested as a Sustentation Fund, to which will shortly be added a Legacy of $\pounds 2,000$. The Annual Subscriptions already exceed $\pounds 1,260$. The Asylum is not intended for Epileptic, Paralytic, or Insane persons. The numbers of Patients maintained gratuitously, and admitted by election for seven years, are allotted rateably to the several contributing counties. The Scale of Payments, which varies with the accommodation, attendance, and special privileges and arrangements, commences at 50 guineas per annum, and rises by increments of 50, to 200 guineas. The children of persons in narrow circumstances, who cannot afford the full payment of 50 guineas, are receivable at 20 guineas per annum. The Patients, all of the Male sex, are now 51 in number. There has not as yet been any discharge or death. The sanitary condition of the Asylum is good. The Patients at present registered as under medical treatment are 10 in number. We only found one in bed. Personally the state of all was most satisfactory, and they are evidently treated with kindness and good judgment, and are very happy. We saw 38 Patients assembled in the General Hall, at dinner, which consisted of boiled mutton and potatoes, with Yorkshire pudding. At present the meat is cut up in the kitchen. We trust that, when the arrangements are more complete, in order to ensure the dinners being hot, the joints will be carved in the Hall. The Patients are under the immediate charge of a Chief Attendant and a Teacher, and six Male and two Female ordinary Attendants. There are a number of domestic servants, but at present the Ward-work is done by the Attendants, which we think undesirable, as interfering with their special duties. We think that, as far as practicable, Female Attendants should be employed in the Boys' The arrangements for Employment and Instruction, Exercise and division. Recreation, are satisfactory, but, of course, as yet incomplete. About 30 of the

Patients attend family prayers, and 10 go to Places of Public Worship. The rooms already occupied are well furnished, and, as well as the beds and bedding, which are of the best description, were found by us in excellent order, and the atmosphere throughout was untainted. Having regard to the number of inmates of faulty habits, we strongly recommend the adoption of a system of special night nursing. The hot water pipes struck us as requiring protection. Some progress has been made in laying out and planting the grounds. We recommend that the walk round the Estate be formed of good width, shaded by trees as an avenue, and furnished with seats at convenient distances. It is expected that the Northern, or Female wing, will be completed and ready for occupation in the course of next year. The Offices and Stores, which are upon a large scale, and well arranged are finished and in use. The progress made in organising the Institution, and its present condition and management, reflect great credit upon the Committee, and Dr. Shuttleworth, as Superintendent.

A well digested code of Bye Laws has been drawn up, and is now awaiting the approval of the Home Secretary, to whom they are submitted as required by Act of Parliament.

The Girls' Wing is rapidly approaching completion, and early next summer the Committee hope to present the Asylum to the subscribers, and through them to the Seven Northern Counties, in a finished state, and equal to all the requirements of a large and well-appointed hospital for the treatment of the feeble-minded. A Public Demonstration commensurate with the importance of opening such a noble Institution is contemplated, and efforts will be made to secure Royal Patronage on the occasion. To the present date the contributions of the Seven Associated Counties to the General Fund are-Lancashire £34,532 13s. 0d.; Yorkshire, £16,616 3s. 11d.; Westmorland, £2,486 1s. 10d.; Cheshire, £2,009 8s. 6d.: Durham, £1,944 18s. 11d.; Cumberland, £1,033 10s. 6d.; Northumberland, £724 4s. 8d.; total, £59,347 1s. 4d. To the Maintenance Fund (Annual Subscriptions): Lancashire, £583 17s. 6d. : Yorkshire, £557 6s. 0d.; Westmorland. £55 3s. 6d.; Cheshire, £67 10s. 0d.; Durham, £183 6s. 6d.; Cumberland, £73 18s. 0d.; Northumberland, £54 10s. 6d.; total, £1,575 12s. 0d. It is shewn by this report that whilst a large sum is required on Building account, the Annual Subscriptions are altogether inadequate to justify any large increase of free cases. The Committee are, however, sanguine that the contributions to both the Building and Sustentation Funds will enable them to meet all legitimate demands, and that those who have had the liberality to make such a provision for their feeble and weak-minded fellow creatures will never permit the charity to languish for want of permanent Sustentation Fund now amounts to funds. The £16,434 6s. 4d., for which the Committee cannot feel too thankful, and they gratefully acknowledge the additions made to this fund from time to time.

The exertions during the past year of numerous friends deserve the best thanks of the Committee. Among these friends may be included the different members of Local Committees, the Ladies who take purses, many of which have already been received for presentation at the opening ceremony, the Clergy of all denominations, private individuals who take an earnest interest in the cause, the working men's societies, and though last not least the cordial support received from the press which at all times has been ready to afford its able advocacy.

The Committee would earnestly appeal for extended assistance in this direction. If only half the churches and chapels throughout the Seven Northern Counties followed the good example already set, there would be little occasion for further appeals to the public on Building account. The appeal can be legitimately made before any congregation, as every parish and district is more or less interested in the success of the charity, and every collection so made entitles the preacher to at least one life vote.

Many valuable presents have been received during the year, including Grand and Cottage Pianos, a Bath Carriage, a Perambulator, Toys of all kinds, Live Animals, Pictures, Books and Magazines, and a variety of useful articles, for all of which the Committee are most grateful.

The Committee cannot close this report without allusion to the lamented death of Mr. James Brunton, whose liberality in the first instance led to a result most gratifying to him, and whose heart was gladdened by the knowledge that the Asylum was in active operation during his lifetime.

It is also painful to record the death of the Rev. Dr. Bedford Hall, a most earnest and energetic friend of the Asylum, who was ever ready to promote its interests.

The Committee had some anxiety in organising a staff of attendants, &c.; the more so as they were conscious that the nature of the occupation was novel in its character. Advantage resulted from not taking in too large a number of patients at first, and having obtained the services of a respectable class of servants, they have pleasure in recording the satisfactory way in which the various duties of the establishment had been performed. Dr. Shuttleworth's unwearied kindness and attention to the patients are deserving of praise, and to him as well as to the Committee it is a matter of thankfulness and congratulation that the establishment has been free from any prevalent malady.

MEDICAL SUPERINTENDENT'S GENERAL REPORT.

To the Central Committee of the Royal Albert Asylum.

GENTLEMEN,

I have the honour to submit my first General Report of the condition and progress of the establishment, and of the various measures adopted for the care and treatment of the Patients.

Three Boys were admitted into the Asylum on the fourteenth of December last, and further admissions have from time to time been made, so that the present number of Patients resident is 64, all of the male sex. Two Patients have been discharged, one on account of his friends' inability to continue to pay for him, the other in consequence of the persistence of epilepsy of a severe type. No death has as yet occurred.

The general sanitary condition of the establishment has been exceedingly good, and although the physical infirmities of many of the Patients have required constant medical care, there has happily not been any illness of a serious character. Incessant watchfulness and attention have of course been necessary to correct faulty habits and to ensure the due observance of the laws of hygiene.

So short a period having elapsed since the opening of the Asylum, many of the existing arrangements are necessarily of a merely provisional character. A classification of the cases according to their respective ages, physical condition, and mental capacity, has, however been made; and those whose example might have a prejudicial effect on the progress of the others have been placed in a class apart, while the younger and more feeble cases form a separate division under the care of female nurses. The scholastic education of the Boys has hitherto been conducted with very encouraging results by a Female Teacher, Mrs. Mills, (the wife of our zealous Chief Attendant,) while the arrangements for physical training, upon which equal stress is laid, have been superintended by a competent Gymnastic Master. The beneficial effect of methodical instruction in School, both as an agent in developing latent intelligence, and as an essential means of discipline preparatory to industrial training, is so evident as to leave no doubt of the expediency of the early appointment of a well-qualified Schoolmaster.

Simple industrial occupation has from the first been provided; and more recently the trades of shoemaker, tailor, and joiner have been introduced, 10 boys being at the present time under instruction in these handicrafts. 4 boys are regularly employed in the garden; 2 others assist in the care of the pigs and poultry; and the hay-crop from five acres of land has recently been gathered in by the combined labour of patients and staff. Other boys usefully assist in the various domestic departments; and the total number daily employed in some form of useful industry now amounts to 22.

Family prayers have been attended daily by a majority of the boys and about twenty of the more intelligent have been taken on Sundays to church or chapel in Lancaster. Their conduct at public worship has always been exemplary.

The provision of suitable means of recreation and amusement has not been lost sight of. Music exerts a remarkable and beneficial influence upon this class of children, and has here, under the direction of Mr. C. Godfrey Jones, the Gymnastic Master, who is also an accomplished musician, been cultivated with considerable success. A small Band has been formed from amongst the attendants, (the cost of the necessary instruments for which is to be defrayed from the special fund for amusements kept up by the donations of visitors), and its performances are always listened to with the utmost delight. Three Pianos have been presented to the Institution, and are found very serviceable; and a Harmonium for sacred music, as well as a Barrelorgan playing cheerful tunes, would now be useful acquisitions. Much

pleasure was given to the inmates by a choral society from Farnworth, who were good enough to sing (under the direction of Mr. Alfred Barnes) a choice selection of glees on the occasion of their visit to the Asylum. Pictures, both in frames and scrap-books, domestic pets, toys, bagatelle boards, and other means of amusement have been liberally contributed, and have been duly appreciated. A magic lantern entertainment of superior character, kindly given at the Asylum in April last by Messrs. R. Mansergh and Geo. Ingall, of Lancaster, was so intensely enjoyed as to induce me to take the opportunity of suggesting that the possession of a good magic-lantern with amusing and instructive slides would be of much value to the Institution. Indoor amusements were periodically arranged for the winter evenings, while sports and pastimes in the playfield, with music, have occasionally been held during the summer months. Several excursions beyond the Asylum Grounds have been made, the most notable being one to Morecambe, in which 35 Patients participated. Some of the more intelligent have also been taken to public amusements in Lancaster.

In the Staff (which has necessarily been large in proportion to the number of patients) but few changes have occurred. The attendants and servants hitherto appointed have been without exception persons unaccustomed to the work of an Institution for Idiots; and it gives me much pleasure to record the hearty interest and good spirit generally evinced by them in the performance of their important but sometimes trying duties. I cheerfully recognise the able and experienced assistance I have at all times received from the Matron, Miss Bryan.

A general retrospect, even at this early period, enables me to speak with confidence and thankfulness of good results already obtained, and to look forward hopefully to an extended sphere of usefulness for the Institution, when the arrangements shall be more complete. The mere influence of residence in a healthily-situated and well-appointed Building, with methodical yet varied daily employment, speedily produces a marked improvement in the aspect of a majority of the Patients, whilst very encouraging results have in several instances followed the employment of special treatment adapted to individual cases. Gratifying testimony of appreciation of the benefits derived from the system pursued in the Institution has been frequently recorded in the Visitors' Book.

In conclusion, I beg leave to tender to the Committee my thanks for the kind consideration at all times accorded to me, and gratefully allude to the valuable aid and counsel in every department of the work constantly received from the Chairman. I desire also to acknowledge the hearty co-operation invariably afforded to me by the Secretary, Mr. Diggens.

AUDITORS' REPORT.

26, KING STREET, MANCHESTER, 27th September, 1871.

We have completed the audit of the accounts of the Royal Albert Asylum to the 30th June last, and have examined carefully the different accounts, and the summary of them, which were submitted to us, and have pleasure in testifying to their accuracy. The securities and vouchers were also produced to us.

The Institution having now been opened for the reception of Patients, the sum of $\pounds 1046$ 4s. 0d. which we referred to in our last Report, has been transferred to the Maintenance Account.

The total amount of donations to General Fund promised up to the 30th June last was £58,110 12s. 4d., and of this sum £57,604 8s. 10d.

had then been received, only £506 3s. 6d. remaining unpaid. This result is highly satisfactory.

During our visit to Lancaster for the purpose of this audit, we had the pleasure of seeing the excellent arrangements of the Institution, and of observing the well cared for appearance of the children. It must be a source of great satisfaction to the subscribers to think of the magnificent Institution which has been raised by their generosity, and they, knowing the sad need there is for it, will, we are assured, be stimulated to further action in order that the Institution may be used to the fullest extent.



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

PROSPECTUS.

The ROYAL ALBERT ASYLUM is intended for the education and training of Idiots and Imbeciles of all classes belonging to the Seven Northern Counties, viz.: Lancashire, Yorkshire, Cheshire, Westmorland, Cumberland, Durham, and Northumberland. In soliciting support to this Institution, the Central Committee respectfully submit a few particulars as to its necessity, origin, and proposed organisaton.

The number of Idiots and Imbeciles in England and Wales has been approximately estimated at 50,000, whilst the entire asylum accommodation yet provided is insufficient for 1,000. Statistics relating to the prevalence of idiocy are necessarily wanting in fulness and precision; but this estimate will not be considered excessive, when it is known that the number of Pauper Idiots in receipt of relief on the 1st of January, 1866, was not less than 10,210; and that the pauper class forms about one-twentieth part only of the entire population. Unfortunately, there can be no question that the Northern Counties have their full proportion of this afflicted class; and in the mountainous districts some of the worst types of idiocy are to be found.

The Lunacy Commissioners, and the medical profession generally, condemn the association of Idiots with Lunatics, as in all respects very objectionable and mutually injurious. Idiocy being generally accompanied by an abnormal or imperfectly developed physical organization which retards the growth of the intellectual and moral powers, Idiots require a distinctive treatment in separate institutions, where the resources of the skilful physician can be best employed for the modification or correction of those defects which obscure the mind. The education must be of the must specific and practical character, embracing such rudimentary Scholastic instruction as is appropriate to their feeble capacities, combined with suitable industrial and moral training. Referring to the ROYAL ALBERT ASYLUM, the Lancet (June 20th, 1868) says :--- "We hail the establishment of this Asylum as another proof of the more scientific therapeutics to which the insane are now subjected. Till within the last few years the Idiot or the Imbecile child was invariably accommodated, not only in the same building, but in the same ward, with the victims to dementia, melancholia, or chronic mania. The effect of this indiscriminate classification and treatment were most pernicious. The young Idiot or Imbecile, at the impressible and plastic period of his life, suffered from daily and nightly contact with those confirmed or aggravated cases of lunacy, and the only opportunity available for his rescue was then allowed to slip, until his case also became aggravated or confirmed. The benefits of the new system have been signally satisfactory."

That much may be done to render the poor Idiot's life more tolerable to himself and less burdensome to his friends, has been abundantly demonstrated by the success of existing asylums. Dr. Down, the Medical Superintendent of the Earlswood Asylum, calculates that of the cases admitted into that Institution, "10 per cent. become self-supporting; 40 per cent. become so far improved as to cease to use up a sane life in their care, and become contributors to the common stock; and the remainder, all but 6 per cent., are invariably improved in their habits, and become greatly lessened burdens on their families and society." Dr. Duncan and Mr. Millard, in their recent work on the "Classification, Training and Education of Idiots," thus describe the success of the treatment adopted in the Eastern Counties' Asylum:—"Weak physical powers have been strengthened, uncleanly habits have been cured, the spiteful and irritable have become calm, the dependent self-depending; the idle have been rendered useful, the untutored have learned to read, write, count and draw; the ability to earn much towards

their own livelihood has been acquired by some, while in a few instances the capacity for earning sufficient for a maintenance and laying it out for themselves has been gained; and the moral and religious feelings have been aroused and fostered, so that excellent characters have been produced, and deeds of simple kindness have been performed by those who were once selfish, sensual, and depraved." Dr. Seguin, the distinguished French physician, who may be regarded as the pioneer in this noble work, says, after thirty years' practical experience in the education and training of Idiots, -" Idiots have been improved, educated, and even cured; not one in a thousand has been entirely refractory to treatment; not one in a hundred who has not been made more happy and healthy; more than thirty per cent. have been taught to conform to social and moral law, and rendered capable of order, of good feeling, and of working like the third of a man; more than forty per cent. have become capable of the ordinary transactions of life, under friendly control, of understanding moral and social abstractions, of working like two-thirds of a man; and twenty-five to thirty per cent. come nearer and nearer to the standard of manhood, till some of them will defy the scrutiny of good judges when compared with ordinary young men and women."

Deeply impressed with the need and utility of such institutions, a benevolent gentleman, residing at Lancaster, generously offered £2,000 as a nucleus for the establishment of an Asylum. The movement was formally instituted at a public meeting, held in the Shire Hall, Lancaster, on the 21st of December, 1864, under presidency of the then High Sheriff, Sir J. P. Kay-Shuttleworth, Bart. Since then the most gratifying progress has been made, public meetings have been held, and influential Local Committees formed in the leading towns of Yorkshire, Lancashire, Cheshire, Westmorland, Cumberland, Durham, and Northumberland. Sixty-seven acres of land, in a most eligible and salubrious situation, have been purchased for $\pounds 10,000$; and an Asylum for the accommodation of 600 inmates, exclusive of staff, is in course of erection, the cost of completing and furnishing which, and providing Farm and Outbuildings, Lodges, Cottages, &c., is estimated to amount to £75,000. Towards the £85,000 thus required, the sum of £76,000 has been contributed. Whilst the Committee are very desirous that this deficiency should be supplied, so that their beneficent operations may not be impeded by a heavy debt, they are now extremely anxious to provide for the maintenance of the Institution. Several Elections of Free Patients have already been held. The varied staff required in such institutions must be comparatively complete even at the commencement of the work, and the initial expenses are, therefore, disproportionately heavy. The Boys' Wing of the building is now finished and affords accommodation for 300 patients, but the number admitted must, of course, be regulated by the funds provided for the purpose by the public. Annual Subscriptions and Donations to the Sustentation Fund are now most urgently solicited.

The following are some of the principal features of the Rules which were adopted at the General Meeting of Subscribers, held at Lancaster, December 21st, 1866:—

- OBJECT-The object of the Institution is the education and training of Idiots and Imbeciles, so as to fit them, as far as possible, for the duties and enjoyments of life.
- PATIENTS—The Institution is intended to receive the children of all classes, provision being made for the admission of free patients by the votes of Subscribers, and of paying patients at such charges, &c., as the circumstances of the friends may warrant.
- ADMISSION—Applications for admission must be made, in the first instance, to the Central Committee, who will institute inquiries to ascertain if there be a reasonable probability that the candidates will be benefited by the system adopted in the Asylum, and decide the terms on which they ought to be admitted. Previously to the election, a list of approved applicants from each county will be sent to the Subscribers entitled to vote for the admission of patients.
- MODE OF ELECTING PATIENTS.—In order to meet the various opinions entertained as to the proper mode of electing patients, subscribers have the option of voting directly, by means of voting papers; or of transferring their votes permanently or provisionally to their respective Local or County Committees.

- VOTES-Donors of Five Guineas have a Life Vote, and Annual Subscribers of Half-a-Guinea an Annual Vote for each vacancy due to their respective counties. The right of voting, as regards higher sums, increases in the same proportion.
- Votes of MINISTERS-Any minister preaching, or lending his pulpit for, a Sermon on behalf of the Institution, has a Vote for Life.
- PERPETUATION OF VOTES—On the demise of a Donor, a vote for every Ten Guineas of his gift is vested in perpetuity in the Committee of the County to which the gift was originally made. This voting power is never to exceed one-fourth of the entire voting power belonging to the Donors and Subscribers in the County.

GOVERNMENT-The Government of the Institution is confided to-

- (a) A Central Committee, meeting at Lancaster, which consists of Representatives from each of the Local Committees, and of Fifteen Subscribers resident in the neighbourhood of Lancaster, to be chosen at the General Annual Meeting.
- (b) County Committees, constituted by the Members of the Central Committee forming themselves into Sub-Committees for promoting, in their respective Counties, the interests of the Asylum.
- (c) Local Committees for the purpose of obtaining funds, and generally promoting the interests of the Asylum. Every Local Committee is entitled to send one Representative to the Central Committee, and an additional Representative for each entire Thousand Guineas in Donations after the first Thousand Guineas, and for each entire Fifty Guineas in Annual Subscriptions after the first Fifty Guineas contributed in that district. The Representatives are annually elected.
- DISTRICT—The district, for the benefit of which the Institution is established, comprises the Counties of Lancashire, Yorkshire, Cheshire, Westmorland, Cumberland, Durham, and Northumberland,

The object being one of broad Christian philanthropy, challenges the sympathy of all classes, and the Committee now confidently appeal for help to raise the poor Idiot from his state of wasteful sloth, physical deterioration, and mental and moral darkness. The Eastern Counties have for several years had their Idiot Asylum at Colchester; and the Western Counties, under the leadership of the Earl of Devon, have recently established one near Exeter. Surely, then, the Northern Counties, so far exceeding the other divisions in wealth and population, and certainly not inferior in point of benevolence and Christian enterprise, will carry this noble work to a successful issue. As each county will participate in the management of the Institution, in proportion to the amount of its contributions, Subscribers will always have a guarantee that their wishes and interests will be duly considered.

GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS.

Interpreting clause :-- The word "Subscribers," occurring by itself, in Rules 3, 8, 13, 24, 26, 34 and 39, shall be held to mean "Donors and Subscribers;" in other Rules, to mean Annual Subscribers only.

I.—That the name of this Institution be "The Royal Albert Asylum for Idiots and Imbeciles of the Northern Counties."

II.—That the object of the Institution shall be the education and training of Idiots and Imbeciles, so as to fit them, as far as possible, for the duties and enjoyments of life.

III.—That such Idiots and Imbeciles as are not able to pay, and belong respectively to the counties of Northumberland, Durham, Cumberland, Westmorland, Lancashire, Yorkshire, and Cheshire, shall be admitted and placed on the foundation by the Votes of the Subscribers and the Committees to whom the Subscribers may have transferred their votes as hereinafter provided; but that such as can pay shall be admitted by and upon the sole authority of the Central Committee, upon payments and conditions to be determined from time to time by such Committee.

IV.—That the number of Election Cases which the Institution is capable of accommodating, shall be apportioned among the several Counties, according to the amount of the contributions derived from each County.

V.—That the cases admitted into the Institution by election shall be received for seven years, and be supplied with board, lodging, and clothing during that time; and that this period may be extended or reduced at the discretion of the Central Committee.

VI.—That, as a general rule, the age of applicants shall be between Six and Fifteen; but this rule may be modified by the Central Committee.

VII.—That all applications for free admission shall be made in the first instance to the Central Committee, who, before determining the eligibility of any case for election, shall subject it to careful inquiry and medical examination; and that no case be approved, unless there shall be a reasonable probability that it will derive benefit from the treatment proposed to be adopted in the Institution.

VIII.—That before each election, a list of approved applicants from each County shall be sent to the Subscribers entitled to vote for the admission of patients; and this list shall also be sent through their respective Chairmen or Secretaries, to such County or Local Committees as have any perpetuated or transferred votes vested in them.

IX.—That before any case be actually admitted, one or more responsible persons, approved by the Central Committee, shall enter into a written engagement to remove the case from the Institution, if required by the Central Committee to do so, and to defray all expenses which may attend the removal or burial.

X.—That the Elections shall occur annually or oftener, according to the number of applicants, and the funds of the Institution; and they shall be held in such principal towns of the associated Counties as may be determined from time to time, by the Central Committee.

XI.—That, if at any time, it shall appear to the Central Committee that the election of any case has been secured by misrepresentation, or has proceeded on erroneous information, such election shall be declared void.

XII.—That, in case of an applicant being unsuccessful at the first election, credit shall be given for the number of votes received at that and the three next succeeding elections, after which no further application shall be allowed. XIII.—That all persons subscribing Five Guineas at one time shall have a Life Vote, and Annual Subscribers of Half-a-Guinea, an Annual Vote for each vacancy due to their respective Counties, and that the right of voting as regards higher sums shall increase in the same proportion. Subscribers shall have the option of voting directly by means of voting papers, or may, by a declaration in writing to that effect, transfer their votes permanently or provisionally to their respective Local or County Committees.

XIV.—That all persons subscribing a Hundred Guineas at one time, or Ten Guineas annually, shall be Governors, and have the right of attending the meetings of the Central Committee.

XV.—That, in consideration of assistance rendered to the Institution, every Secretary of a Local Committee shall have two Life Votes in addition to what he may be entitled to for his donations or subscriptions.

XVI.—That any Minister who shall preach, or lend his pulpit for, a Sermon on behalf of this Institution, shall have a Vote for Life.

XVII.—That any Corporation, or Society contributing Five Guineas at one time, shall be entitled to one vote at each election for the period of twenty-five years, and a donation of Ten Guineas shall confer a vote at each election so long as such Corporation or Society shall remain in existence; the right of voting in respect of higher sums to increase in proportion to the contribution. As regards Annual Subscriptions, Corporations or Societies shall have one vote at each election for every Half-Guinea subscribed.

XVIII.—That any Firm subscribing Half-a-Guinea annually, shall have one Vote at each election; and a donation of Five Guineas shall entitle a Firm to a vote for twentyfive years.

XIX.—That anonymous Donors or Subscribers shall have the same privileges as others, through the Agents paying their donations or subscriptions.

XX.—That all persons collecting the sum of Five Guineas, shall be entitled to one Life Vote, and an additional vote for every additional Five Guineas so collected.

XXI.—That votes may be given to one or more Candidates, not exceeding the number to be elected.

XXII.—That at the death of a Donor, a vote for every Ten Guineas of his gift shall be vested in perpetuity in the Committee of the County to which the gift was originally made; and Legacies shall confer the same privilege. This voting power shall never exceed one-fourth of the entire voting power belonging to the Donors and Subscribers in the County.

XXIII.—That no Subscriber or Donor shall exercise any right or privilege, unless his Subscription for the year, or Donation, shall have been paid. Annual Subscriptions to be due on the First day of July in each year.

XXIV.—That the Central Committee shall consist of Fifteen Subscribers resident in the neighbourhood of Lancaster, to be annually elected by the General Meeting, and of Representatives to be annually elected by the Local Committees; that such Committee shall be charged with the entire management of the Institution, and shall have power to appoint and dismiss all officers and servants, and to fix their salaries, wages, and other payments. The Central Committee shall comprise not less than forty members, six of whom shall form a quorum; and the members shall be eligible for re-election. In case of the death or resignation of any member, the Central Committee shall have power to fill up such yacancy from among the Subscribers to the Institution until the next General Meeting.

XXV.—That the Central Committee shall divide themselves into County Committees, for the purpose of promoting, in their respective Counties, the general interests of the Institution.

XXVI.—That Local Committees, for the purpose of obtaining funds and generally promoting the interests of the Institution, shall be formed at such places as the Central Committee may, from time to time, determine, but afterwards be annually elected by the Subscribers residing in their district. That every Local Committee be entitled to send one Representative to the Central Committee; and an additional Representative for each entire Thousand Guineas in donations after the first Thousand Guineas, and for each entire Fifty Guineas in annual subscriptions after the first Fifty Guineas contributed in that district.

XXVII.—That a General Meeting of the Donors and Subscribers, convened by public advertisement, shall be held on the last Wednesday in September in each year, at such place as the General Meeting may from time to time appoint; at which meeting the Central Committee shall present a Report of the proceedings of the past year-together with the Auditors' financial statement,—and other general business shall be transacted.

XXVIII.—That the Central Committee, upon the requisition of any Thirty Donors or Subscribers to the Institution of more than one year's standing, being contributors of not less than Five Guineas at one time, or One Guinea annually, shall call a Special General Meeting, provided that the requisition, stating the object for which such Special General Meeting is required, be delivered to the Secretary not less than fourteen days prior to any Ordinary Meeting of the Central Committee; that no Special General Meeting be duly constituted unless at least seven clear days' notice be given to the Donors and Subscribers, and to the Secretaries of the Local Committees, by post-letter; that in all cases the object of such Special General Meeting shall be stated in the notice, and no other business shall be transacted thereat; and that not less than Twenty Donors or Subscribers having the aforesaid qualification shall constitute a meeting.

XXIX.—That, without the aforesaid requisition, the Central Committee shall have power—by resolution passed at some meeting thereof, called specially for the purpose,—to convene a Special General Meeting, provided that at least seven clear days' notice be given by post-letter to the Donors and Subscribers and to the Secretaries of Local Committees, that the form of notice sent state the object of such meeting, and that no other business be transacted thereat. That not less than Twenty Donors or Subscribers to the Institution of more than one year's standing, being contributors of not less than Five Guineas at one time, or One Guinea annually, shall constitute a meeting.

XXX.—That the Central Committee shall meet quarterly, or oftener, as they may determine; but that a Special Meeting be held at any time, upon a requisition, addressed to the Secretary, of any three members of that Committee, provided that not less than one week's notice of such meeting be given by post-letter to all the members of the Central Committee, that the form of notice sent state the object of such meeting, and that no business be transacted thereat which shall not be mentioned in the notice.

XXXI.—That all questions before any Meeting held in pursuance of these Rules, be decided by a majority of votes; that the Chairman may vote, and in case of equality of votes, may have a casting vote in addition.

XXXII.—That the Central Committee shall have power to make Bye Laws, from time to time, for the government and the general management and direction of the Institution, which shall have all the force of the Rules now adopted; but such Bye Laws shall in no instance be at variance with, or in any way contravene, the General Rules of the Institution.

XXXIII.—That the Central Committee be empowered to discharge any of the Pupils of the Institution, who, in the opinion of the Medical Staff, ought to be removed from the Institution.

XXXIV.—That the accounts of the Institution be made up annually to the 30th day of June; and that two Auditors, one of whom shall be eligible for re-election, be appointed by the Subscribers at the General Meeting, to examine all the accounts for the current year, and report thereon to the next General Meeting. In case of the death or resignation of either of the Auditors, the Central Committee shall have power to fill up such vacancy from among the Subscribers to the Institution until the next General Meeting.

XXXV.—That the Lands belonging to the Institution shall be vested in the Trustees, who shall not at any time be fewer than four in number, and any vacancy by death or resignation shall be supplied at a General Meeting. It shall be in the power of any General Meeting to elect additional Trustees.

XXXVI.—That all Legacies amounting to or exceeding Fifty Guineas, Presentation and Life Interest Payments, and Donations and Subscriptions to the Sustentation Fund, shall be invested, under the direction of the Central Committee, in the names of not less than Four Trustees (to be chosen at a General Meeting, from time to time, as occasion may require)—in Government Securities, or in the Stock of the Bank of England, called Bank Stock, or upon mortgage of any hereditaments, situate in England (but not in Scotland or Ireland), being freehold or copyhold of inheritance, cr leasehold for any term of years whereof at least sixty years shall be unexpired at the time of the investment, and whether the lessor's title shall be produced or not, or in the Debenture Stock, or Preference Stock, or Preference Shares of any Railway, Canal, or other Company in Great Britain, incorporated by Act of Parliament or Royal Charter, or in or upon any preference stocks, funds, or securities guaranteed by the British Government, or in the stocks, funds, or securities of the Government of India or any British Colony, or in or upon the debentures, stocks, or shares of any Railway or other incorporated Company in India or any British Colony, wherever a paid minimum rate of interest or dividend is guaranteed by the Government of India or of the Colony where such railway or other incorporated Company is situate; or shall be invested in the purchase of Land, convenient to be held with the Land already belonging to the Institution, such Land being vested in the Trustees in whom other Lands belonging to the Institution are vested: and the same shall be held by the said Trustees upon trust as a Permanent Fund for the Institution, the interest, dividends, or rents arising therefrom to be applied by the Central Committee towards the annual expenses of the Institution, provided that such Permanent Fund or any part thereof may, from time to time, with the consent of a Special General Meeting, be applicable and applied to the general purposes of the Institution.

XXXVII.—That when the money in the hands of the Treasurer, shall, in the opinion of the Central Committee, exceed what may be necessary for the general purposes of the Institution, it shall be invested according to the directions in the preceding Rule.

XXXVIII.—It shall be lawful for the Central Committee to purchase or take in exchange, or by way of lease, any hereditaments, whether freehold, copyhold, or leasehold, for the use and benefit of the Institution, and also to sell, give in exchange, or grant by way of lease, or to mortgage, or otherwise encumber, or to grant any easements upon, or in respect of any hereditaments which have been or shall be purchased or taken in exchange, or by way of lease, as aforesaid; and to give or take any money for equality of exchange, and to cause to be inserted in any mortgage or incumbrance any power of sale, or any other powers or provisions, which to the Central Committee may seem reasonable; and the receipts of any person or persons who may, by a resolution of the Central Committee, be authorised to receive any purchase or mortgage money, or any money to be taken for equality of exchange, or any other money which may belong to the Institution, shall be effectual discharges for the same, and exempt the parties paying the same from all obligation to see to the application thereof; and for the purposes mentioned in the Rules, or in anywise relating thereto, a certificate signed by four Members of the Central Committee and the Secretary, for the time being, shall be absolute and sufficient proof to purchasers, mortgagees, and all other persons, that any Resolution set out in any such certificate was a resolution of the Central Committee duly passed. This Rule, so far as the same gives power to sell, exchange, lease, mortgage, or encumber, shall apply to any land purchased with the proceeds of the Fund created by Rule xxxvi., and in case of any sale or transfer of the whole or any part of the Securities or Estates subject to such Rule, the proceeds of such sale or transfer shall be again invested as directed by such Rule, and the new investment shall be held as a part of the Permanent Fund of the Institution.

XXXIX.—The making, rescinding, and altering of the Rules shall rest entirely with a General Meeting, or a Special General Meeting, of the Subscribers; and no Rule shall be proposed, rescinded, or altered, without fourteen days' special notice to the Central Committee of the nature of any additional Rule, or amendment of an existing Rule, or of the Rules proposed to be rescinded.

XL.—That any minute made of the proceedings at General Meetings or Special General Meetings of the Donors and Subscribers, or at Meetings of the Central Committee, if signed by any person purporting to be the Chairman at the General Meeting, or at the Special General Meeting, or at the Meeting of the Central Committee, at which such proceedings took place, or at the next ensuing General Meeting, Special General Meeting, or Meeting of the Central Committee, shall be receivable in evidence in all legal proceedings without further proof; and, until the contrary is proved, every General Meeting, Special General Meeting, or Meeting of the Central Committee, in respect of the proceedings of which minutes have been so made, shall be deemed to have been duly convened, and held, and all the members thereof to have been duly qualified to act.

GENERAL SUBSCRIPTION LIST.

VOTING REGULATIONS.

The number of Votes is regulated by the amount of the Contribution. Donors and Life Subscribers contributing the sum of Five Guineas are entitled for life to one Vote for each vacancy due to their respective Counties, and to an additional Life Vote for every additional Five Guineas. An Annual Subscriber of Half-a-Guinea has one Annual Vote, and an additional vote for every additional Half Guinea subscribed. See also Rules 13-24.

Annual Subscriptions will be considered due in advance on the first day of July in each year, and will be supposed to continue unless the Subscriber gives notice to the contrary.

Previously to an Election, an official Voting Paper, containing a description of the eligible candidates, with full directions as to voting, is sent to each contributor entitled to vote.

An asterisk (*) is prefixed to the names of those Donors or Subscribers who do not wish to receive voting papers, but who surrender their votes to their respective Local or County Committees.

On the demise of a Donor, a vote for every Ten Guineas of his gift will be vested in perpetuity in the Committee of the County to which the gift was originally made; and Legacies will be similarly perpetuated. This voting power shall never exceed one fourth of the entire voting power belonging to the Donors and Subscribers in the County.

The General Subscription List contains, to date of publication, the names of all the Contributors who are entitled to Vote for the admission of patients belonging to their respective Counties.
