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THIRTEENTH ANNUAL REPORT

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MEDICAL SUPERINTENDENT OF THE LUNATIC ASYLUM FOR THE COUNTIES OF SALOP AND MONTGOMERY,

AND THE ASSOCIATED BOROUGHS OF

MUCH WENLOCK, SHREWSBURY, & OSWESTRY.

ON the first of January, 1857, the number of Patients in the Asylum was 324 (viz: 155 Males and 169 Females.) In the course of the year 113 Patients (viz: 51 Men and* 62 Women) were admitted; 55 [viz: 27 Men and 28 Women] were discharged Recovered; 6 (viz: 3 Men and 3 Women) were discharged Relieved; 1 Man was discharged not improved; and 46 (viz: 23 Men and 23 Women) died.—The number of Patients remaining in the Asylum on the 31st of December, 1857, was consequently 329 (viz: 152 Men and 177 Women.]—This shows an aggregate increase on the number of those remaining at the end of the previous year of 5, although an actual decrease on the number of Men to the extent of 3, and necessarily an increase on the part of the Women alone of 8.

The daily average number of Patients resident during the year was 329 [viz: 154-134 Men, and 174-865 Women.]

Among the admissions in the course of the year are enumerated the cases of 27 individuals, [viz: 12 Males and 15 Females,] who had previously been under treatment in this Institution, and having been discharged, were re-admitted after periods of absence varying as below:—

^{*} No person was admitted twice in the course of this year, excepting one Woman. This circumstance reduces the number of Females received to 61 individuals, and the aggregate number of individuals of both Sexes admitted during the year 1857 from 113 to 112.

Of the Patients whose cases are enumerated in the foregoing Table, 1 Man had been discharged not improved; 1 Man and 3 Women had been discharged Relieved; and all the others had been discharged Recovered.

Comparing the number of Recoveries with the average number of Patients resident during the year 1857, the proportion is found to be 16.717 per Cent., or 17.419 on the Men, and 16.091 on the Women.—The general average per centage of Recoveries during the preceding 12 years being 19.81 upon both sexes; or 16.55 per cent., on the Men, and 23.33 per cent., on the Women. [See Table A.]

With respect to the Mortality during the past year, the general per centage of Deaths on the average number of Patients of both Sexes was 13.98; that of the Men being 14.93, and that of the Women 13.21.—This per centage of Deaths is above the aggregate average proportion of the 12 preceding years, which amounts to 13.56 Men, and 7.95 Women; or a total per centage of 10.73, on the average number of Patients resident during that period. On the 31st of December, 1857, the proportion of those Patients who were deemed Curable was 10,3 per cent., whilst that of those who were deemed Incurable amounted to not less than 89,7 per cent., the estimate being on 15 out of 152 Men, and upon 19 out of 177 Women.

Such are the statistical circumstances of the Institution for the past year. Other important considerations relate to the changes which have been gradually taking place in the domestic accommodation of the Patients, in the means for securing the salubrity of their habitation, and in the permanent establishment of other arrangements which cannot fail to be of great use in the future management of the Institution.

The unfortunate failure of the Main Sewer, which was constructed about seven years ago, having rendered it necessary to establish another channel for carrying off the sewage, very considerable inconvenience was caused during a period of many months by the consequent necessity for raising the offensive liquid by means of a Hand Pump, so as to let it reach the uninterrupted part of the first Main Sewer, and thus be conveyed to the River. irksomeness of the labour, required without intermission for this purpose for more than a whole year, was not the only evil produced by this circumstance. In certain states of the Atmosphere, and always when the Wind was in the South East, an offensive odour, exactly resembling that which was given out by the adjacent Tank, was perceptible in the Women's Infirmary, and as regularly were there observed to occur, in that part of the Building, cases of Gastric Irritation for the most part accompanied by Diarrhea. completion of the Brick Culvert, about the latter end of November, was felt to be a great relief by the few men who had been employed so long at the Pump; and now that there is no likelihood of any future failure in this way, and that means may easily be made available for the application of the Sewage Water to the newly inclosed land, in any quantity that may be required, there is every reason to hope that that which has heretofore been the cause of so much annoyance and injury will be productive only of benefit.

Besides the steps taken for establishing a free outflow from the Drains, measures have been adopted for raising in a more effectual way than has yet been practicable, such a supply of water as is requisite for the complete operation of the new arrangements. The means of generating Steam for the general purposes of the Institution have been at least doubled; the old Steam Engine has been removed, and a new one, having not less than three times its power, has been constructed in its stead. A Cistern capable of containing twelve thousand Gallons of Water, has been so placed, and pipes communicating with it have been so arranged, that if necessary, in case of accident from Fire, a full stream could be conducted by means of a Hose over the Roof of any part of the Pumps of a larger caliber than those which were previously in use have been placed in the Well, and the only thing which appears to be still required for affording at all times an unlimited supply of Water, is an enlargement of the Chamber into which the spring naturally flows, in order to store more Water in that situation than the New Pumps can readily exhaust. Some satisfactory steps have been taken with the view of improving the ventilation in certain parts of the Institution where much improvement in this respect was required; and the application of the method adopted for removing vitiated Air has thus been shown to be both easy and efficacious. The means of regulating the temperature of the Wards have been placed upon a better footing than they were; and on the principle of economising heat, so as to diminish the expenditure for Fuel, Pipes have at length been laid down for the purpose of conveying the condensed Steam, which has been employed in warming the various Wards, back to the Engine Boiler, instead of allowing it to run to waste, as formerly, in the drains,

So far as the general sanitary necessities of the Institution are concerned, it will thus be seen that much has been done in the way of amelioration during the past year.

Other important considerations remain to be noticed; but as the Medical Superintendent, whilst unassisted in the discharge of his general duties, has found it impossible to devote so much attention to these matters as would enable him to complete the statement which he intended to lay before the Visiting Justices, the greater portion of the observations which he wishes to make on the general state of the Institution, must be postponed until he can find a convenient opportunity for stating, in a supplement to this Report, that all the New Wards have been occupied.

The subjoined tabular statements will show the amount of work done by the Patients in the year 1857.
