To Her Majesty's Justices of the Peace for the County of Chester, in General Quarter Sessions assembled.

THE Visiting Justices of Cheshire Asylum in submitting the usual Annual Report have much satisfaction in stating the Asylum to be in a thoroughly efficient condition, and that it has been conducted to their satisfaction during the past year by the various officers connected with its management.

No subject of importance out of the ordinary routine of the Institution has engaged their attention, excepting that of finding the Asylum rapidly filling, and the consequent necessity of taking immediate steps to provide additional accommodation. A Committee was appointed at the October Quarter Sessions to consider this subject, and their Report will be submitted to you. Early in the year the remaining Staffordshire patients were removed to their new Asylum, and the only patients now in this Asylum, not belonging to the County, are those chargeable to the City of Chester; these, also, the Committee have deemed it prudent to make arrangements for discharging in the present month.

This number does not altogether represent the number for which accommodation has been required during the year. Owing to the fluctuations in the number of admissions, as well as of the discharges and deaths, the range between the minimum and maximum numbers has been from 444 to 486. The males have varied from 215 to 240, and the females from 229 to 249; so that whilst, on one occasion, the male division was fully occupied to the extent on its accommodation, on another there were only six vacancies for females.

The Committee regret much having to report the resignation of Dr. Brushfield, consequent on his appointment to the new Asylum and Woking, and are glad to take this opportunity of bearing testimony; to his valuable services during the past thirteen years. The Commmittee have appointed, as his successor, Dr. Henry Lewis Harpert, who for five years has been connected with the Asylum as Assistant Medical Officer.

The Rate charged to the various Unions and Parishes for the cares and maintenance of patients, has been uniformly throughout the year 8s. 2d. per head per week.

REPORT OF THE MEDICAL SUPERINTENDENT FOR THE YEAR 1865.

MY LORDS AND GENTLEMEN,

It is once more my duty to submit to you the customary Annual Statement of the condition of the Asylum and its inmates.

At the close of 1865 there were 459 patients in the Institution. In the course of the year there were 154 admissions, 100 discharges, and 39 deaths; and there remained, on January 1, 1866, 474 inmates.

ADMISSIONS.

Although the number admitted was 24 less than that of 1864, yet a comparison with all the preceding years shows a steady annual increase, with scarcely a hope of a diminution taking place to any material extent. In nearly one-half of the cases the bodily health was weakly or bad; and in several instances the patient was in a very deplorable condition when admitted; *e.g.*, a female was brought from her own home, in March last, having most extensive bed-sores and wounds, caused by mechanical restraint, which undoubtedly hastened her death; again, a male suffering from severe itch was admitted from a workhouse, where he had been an inmate for $3\frac{1}{2}$ years. More than a fourth of the cases were of the ages of 50 and upwards; whilst nearly a fourth of the total number (*vide* Table 9) suffered from epilepsy or general paralysis. The suicidal propensity

was present in more than one-third of the admissions, and amongst them are unusual numbers of those who had attempted self-destruction by cutting the throat. In March an application for the admission of a patient, who had been the recent subject of smallpox, was refused, under the bye-law made by the Committee in 1864. This was the only case of refusal during the year.

The following Table points out the gradually increasing number of admissions annually of Cheshire cases, and also the numbers remaining in the Asylum out of the admissions of each year.

RECOVERIES.

The number of recoveries was 64, being a proportion of $10\frac{1}{2}$ per cent. upon the total number under treatment, and $41\frac{1}{2}$ per cent. of the admissions.

DEATHS.

Both the total number, as well as the proportion of deaths, was much below the usual annual average—the number being 39, and the proportion 6.36 per cent. of the total number under treatment. Nearly one-half occurred amongst cases admitted within the year. In one only was an inquest held—the case of a man who was admitted with fractured ribs, in addition to acute mania. As usual, more deaths occurred amongst the males than the females, there being 24 of the former, and 15 of the latter. This marked difference was owing, as in former years, to the large number (12) arising from general paralysis amongst the males, whilst in one female only was this the assigned cause of death ; so that one-third of the entire number of deaths—and one-half of those occurring in Males—was due to this terrible malady.

GENERAL HEALTH.

The general health of the patients has been very satisfactory throughout the year.

ACCOMMODATION FOR PATIENTS.

Of the 459 inmates in the Asylum on January 1, 1865, 25 were chargeable to the county of Stafford, and were removed in the early part of the year; nevertheless, the number of Cheshire cases increased so rapidly, that I felt it my duty, in July, to call the attention of the Committee to the subject by a special report, which was subsequently printed and circulated amongst the county magistrates. This was, afterwards, in an enlarged form, and with accompanying tables, laid before a special committee of magistrates, held in November, to inquire into the necessity, or otherwise of providing additional accommodation for patients. The following Table, copied from this Report, shows the annual numbers sent from each Union since the year 1848. 10

The wards have recently undergone a thorough survey, and they were found to afford ample provision for 240 males, and 255 females. On December 31, 1865, the number of male inmates was 229, and of females 245, so that there were only vacancies for 11 of the former, and 10 of the latter. As, however, the patients chargeable to the city of Chester will shortly be removed, there may perhaps be sufficient accommodation to last during the present year. Should, however, the admissions approach in number to those of 1864 and 1865, the Asylum will be crowded before the end of December next. This will point out the urgent necessity for providing increased accommodation for county cases at as early a date as possible.

EMPLOYMENT AND RECREATION.

The employment, as well as the recreation, of the patients have been continued in the same satisfactory manner as alluded to in former reports, and therefore require no further mention here.

CONCLUSION.

As this is the last Report I shall have to make of the condition of this Asylum, with which I have been connected for nearly 14 years, I take this opportunity of returning my grateful acknowledgments for the many acts of kindness shown me by the Committee of Visiting Justices, and of the confidence which they have reposed in me throughout my tenure of office. I beg, also, to thank the various officers, with whom I have been associated, for their cordial co-operation in the management of the Institution.

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REPORT OF THE CHAPLAIN FOR 1865.

COUNTY ASYLUM.

My LORDS AND GENTLEMEN,

March 21st, 1866.

I have the honour to lay before you a Report of my duties in connection with the Asylum, for the past year. There necessarily can be very little variation in my Annual Report, for the duties of the Chaplain are, for the most part, of a routine and uniform character.

The Services of the Church have been regularly conducted throughout the year. Two full Services every Sunday, and Daily Pravers each morning of the week. The Holy Sacrament has been administered Quarterly, and I hope with good effect. The number of our communicants have increased in a small ratio-of necessity there never can be many, as none are admitted who I have reason to suppose, are not in a fit state of mind to receive it reverently. The general conduct of the patients during Divine Service has, as usual, been extremely good, any disturbance being a circumstance of rare occurrence. We have a very good Choir, composed of attendants and a few patients, many of the patients join heartily in the chanting and singing, and I believe that it has a very beneficial effect upon them, and tends to lead their minds to the real sourse of comfort under their trials. The Church is completely filled every Sunday, the congregation numbering on an average 300 persons.

The School on both sides of the House continues to progress very satisfactorily. In the Men's School there is an average attendance of 25. There are on the books about 30, but of course they all cannot attend on each occasion. The new Master is very efficient in his duties. In the Women's School the average attendance is 35, with about 40 on the books. The Bible is read and writing taught, and in some instances arithmetic also. The progress in both Schools being very considerable, and doing much credit, both to the Master and also to the Nurses who, under my superintendence, conduct the Women's School.

Books and periodicals have, as usual, been distributed regularly through the House. I need hardly add, that a large portion of each day has been spent by me in the Asylum, and it gives me great pleasure to bear testimony to the good feeling that manifests itself between the Patients and Attendants generally, a presumptive proof of the kindness and attention with which the Patients are treated.

The Charitable Fund for assisting needy cases has been very useful, and I only hope that by the kind voluntary contributions of those interested in the welfare of these real objects of sympathy, we shall always be able to do a little towards restoring them to comfort and happiness.






