



MEDICAL REPORT.

At the commencement of the year 1867, there were three hundred and eighty-six (386) patients living in the Aberdeen Asylum.

From the 1st of January to 31st December, there were admitted, one hundred and forty-four (144) additional inmates.

For the year, therefore, there was a gross number of five hundred and thirty (530) under care and treatment in the house.

This number has been lessened by the removal of one hundred and thirty-five (135) during the twelve months reported on; one hundred and ten (110) of these were discharges or removals, five (5) are at present out on probation, and twenty-two (22) represent the number of deaths.

The number of residents varied from four hundred and seven (407) to three hundred and seventy-one (371), and the daily average for the year was three-hundred and ninety-one. At the end of the year the number of patients in the house was three hundred and ninety-five (395), or an increase of nine inmates on the whole period. Of these, one hundred and eighty-three (183) are males, and two hundred and twelve (212) females, giving an overplus of twenty-nine females, which, in an Institution of nearly symmetrical construction and accommodation, has tended to embarrass, by occasioning difficulties of arrangement.

The body of patients is in this Hospital divisible, also, into private patients, who are one hundred and eleven (111) in number, and public or parochial cases amounting to two-hundred and eighty-four (284); showing a gain of twenty-one on the latter class, and an increased pressure by parishes on the resources of the Institution.

The medical history of the year has been very satisfactory on the whole, and the results of treatment more than usually gratifying. No fatal accident has occurred, and no epidemic disorder has increased anxiety and augmented mortality. The suicidal complication of the disorder has been rather more rife than usual in this quarter, but still much less common than the statements from other similar hospitals would lead to the belief that it is elsewhere. In the majority of instances medical treatment has overcome the morbid desire, where it existed, and careful watching has either prevented or frustrated all attempts which have been made. Some injuries have occurred, but of a slight kind;

mostly all of them accidental, and not one from homicidal or malicious intent. Destructiveness has been a less prominently marked feature in the cases than it used to be, and the ordinary tear and wear of the establishment has not been much supplemented by damaged furnishings, torn clothes, destroyed bedding, broken glass, &c., as the results of maniacal excitement or of melancholic irritability and discontent.

The admissions, although numerous, are not quite so many as last year. Twenty of the cases were above sixty years of age, and one of them above eighty. As a body they did not differ materially in character from those of former years. In number they were sufficient to comprehend almost every type of the disorder, Maniacs, Melancholics, Epileptic and Paralytic Lunatics, Dements, Suicides, Homicides, Dypsomaniacs, and some less intellectually than morally deranged. The list contains all the ordinary modes in which the diseased mind displays its loss of voluntary control-in excitement, disorder, incoherence, altered feelings, loss of judgment, and wild imaginations, exhibited in numerous delusions of high rank, great wealth, immeasurable ability, and even of special inspiration, or, on the other hand, of being despised, accused, persecuted, condemned, or already dead and altogether lost. Some were in poverty, in starvation, in despair, in anguish from bodily sensations, of being racked, gnawed, bitten by serpents, &c., or from mental distress from exaggerated emotions of grief, jealousy, and fear.

The treatment employed with this variety of suffering has been attended with excellent results. The number of recoveries which has been effected has been equivalent to about fifty per cent. of the admissions of the year; seventy-three patients have been discharged cured, after periods of residence, ranging from six years to five weeks; and thirty-seven others have been removed in various conditions, but in the majority of instances with important ameliorations in the more troublesome features of their disease. The mortality has also been so small as to be remarkable, in an hospital making no selection of patients, and never discharging any case on account of the difficulty of its management, or the hopelessness of its symptoms. Such favourable results, although characteristic of the present year's medical work, are not peculiar to 1867, but are only in harmony with the past history of the Asylum, as may be verified by a study of its statistics. They differ considerably from the experience of some similar Institutions, and are worthy, however arising, of being occasionally pointed out to the public.

While insanity has to be held as a disorder tending to lessen the average duration of life, the chronicity of it sometimes in Hospitals is also well marked in the Aberdeen Asylum. While 79 of its present inhabitants have not been in it so much as a year,

When it is borne in mind that but a small proportion of individuals become insane under twenty years of age, such a return as the foregoing, from an Institution calling itself in any sense an Hospital for disease, may be received as a remarkable corroboration of its claim to efficiency in the care of its inmates.

Little change has taken place during the year, either in the establishment itself, or in the ordinary occupations and amusements of the patients, so frequently referred to in past Annual Reports. The new laundry does its work in a very satisfactory way, and gives employment to an increased number of females. The airing-ground in connection with the east wing has been doubled in size, a change much approved by the visiting Commissioners, and helping to reduce an amount of irritability and excitement which overcrowding in that part of the house had been gradually increasing. This improvement externally, is intended to be followed up by such arrangements or extensions internally, as will still farther remedy deficiences in that quarter of the house, and lessen the difficulties and anxieties connected with its superintendence.
