## SEVENTH ANNUAL REPORT

Of the Managers of the State Lunatic Asylum, for the  
year ending November 30th, 1849.

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### TO THE LEGISLATURE.

Pursuant to the act organizing the Asylum, the undersigned respectfully submit the following

#### REPORT :

§ The annual report made to us by the acting superintendent, and which is herewith presented, contains full statements of the operations and results of the institution during the year which has just closed. From this it will be seen, that eight hundred and fifty-seven patients have been under treatment in the course of the year—four hundred and forty-nine of whom were remaining in the asylum at the end of the year.

The whole number received into the asylum since it was opened, on the 16th January, 1843, for the admission of patients, is 2,376 ; ten hundred and seventeen of whom have been discharged, recovered ; four hundred and nineteen have been discharged, improved ; two hundred and twenty-two, unimproved, and two hundred and sixty-nine have died.

In the early part of last summer, the managers and superintendent entertained fears that the cholera, which prevailed so fatally in some parts of the State, might make its appearance in the asylum. Under this apprehension, they believed it was their duty to adopt every reasonable precaution to guard against its appearance, and to make suitable preparations for the proper treatment and care of those who might suffer from its attacks. Pains were accordingly taken,

not to have the asylum two crowded during the summer months, and every means of precaution which experience or medical skill could suggest, were adopted to guard against the approach of the disease, as well as to mitigate its severity, in case it made its appearance ; but through the protecting care of an over-ruling Providence, the asylum, as well as the city of Utica, were wholly exempted from the ravages of this mysterious pestilence.

It has been our painful duty to record the death of our late superintendent, Dr. A. Brigham, who died after a brief illness, on the 8th of September last. His physical energies and general health had become impaired by his too close and long confinement, and devotion to the discharge of his responsible and onerous duties, so that he fell an easy and unresisting victim to the fatal, but not severe, attack of the disease which terminated his earthly labors.

Doct. Brigham was appointed superintendent of the Asylum on the 9th of September, 1842, and on him devolved the great labor of organizing the institution, and directing and superintending the fitting up of the various conveniences and fixtures necessary to adapt it to the uses for which it was intended. He applied himself to the task with untiring and unyielding devotion. He performed labors and surmounted difficulties of which the public know but little, but which might well have disheartened a less determined man.

By his published reports as superintendent of this Institution, as well as by his other writings and labors, he has done much to enlighten the public upon the subject of the worst of human maladies, to mitigate the sufferings which it brings, and to discover and apply the means of its cure. Those who have been associated with him in the management of the Asylum, as well as many who through his skill, care and attention have been restored to health, will long hold his memory in grateful remembrance, for the many virtues that adorned his character, and the enlightened philanthropy, and eminent ability with which he conducted the Institution committed to his care.

On the demise of Doct. Brigham, the duties of the place he filled devolved on Doct. George Cook, the first assistant physician, who continued, with great fidelity and devotion, to discharge the duties of superintendent of the Asylum, until the 8th of December, when Doct. N. D. Benedict, of Philadelphia, who had been appointed by

us on the third day of November, superintendent to fill the place made vacant by the death of Doct. Brigham, entered on the performance of his duties.

We also, herewith submit to the Legislature the annual report made to us by the treasurer of the Asylum, from which it will be seen that the current receipts from all sources have been adequate to defray all the current expenses of the year. The report shows a balance of \$10,444.38 in the treasury on the first of December, a considerable portion of which was required to pay bills, which had accrued up to that period, but which had not then been presented for payment.

It is provided by the 35th section of the act to organize the asylum that the price to be paid for the keeping the poor, or any persons in indigent circumstances, until the first of April 1843, shall be \$2.50 per week, and that thereafter, it shall be annually fixed by the managers, and shall not exceed the actual cost of support and attendance, exclusive of officers' salaries; the price charged for keeping the poor, and persons in indigent circumstances supported by towns or counties, was \$2.50 per week to the 1st of February, 1844, and from that period, it has been fixed at \$2.00 per week. We have not determined precisely the average cost per week for the last year of the support of the patients in the Asylum, but we apprehend from the increased cost of provisions and fuel, that the actual cost may have exceeded the price charged, and that we shall be obliged to raise the price, to the sum originally charged. We shall, however, for the current year, continue the price to this class of patients at \$2 per week, as heretofore charged.

Our late superintendent, Dr. Brigham, brought with him to the Asylum, a valuable library of medical and miscellaneous books, which he kept in the Institution, for the use of its officers and others, from 1842 to the period of its death. The library contains in all, 1136 volumes, exclusive of unbound pamphlets. Among the volumes, are many rare and valuable books, relating to the subject of insanity, and which, with many of the other medical books, will be always useful, and some of them, indispensable in such an Institution. The Asylum has had the use, and enjoyed the benefits of the library for seven years without charge. One of our number, Dr. Beck has made an examination of the library and estimates it to be well worth

\$1,500, and we respectfully recommend its purchase at that sum. Such purchase, is an act of justice to the widow and children of our late superintendent; and in our judgment is demanded by a just regard to the wants and interests of the Asylum. The first cost of this library, we are informed, was not less than \$3,000.

Complaints have formerly been made, that the power given to county judges, by the 26th section of the act to organize the Asylum, (chapter 135, Laws of 1842,) to send persons in indigent circumstances, but *not paupers*, to the Asylum, at the charge of the county, has been in some instances, too liberally, or improvidently exercised.

The 26th section of that act, provides, that when a person in indigent circumstances, *but not a pauper*, becomes insane, application may be made in his behalf to the first judge of the county where he resides, and the said judge shall call two respectable physicians as witnesses, and fully investigate the facts of the case, if the judge certifies that satisfactory proof has been adduced, showing him insane, and his estate insufficient to support him, and his family, or, if he has no family, himself under the visitation of insanity, he shall be admitted into the Asylum and supported there, at the expense of the county, until he shall be restored to soundness of mind, if effected within two years.

The design of this provision was doubtless to relieve a very deserving but unfortunate class, who are not reduced to the condition of paupers, but who are in indigent circumstances and yet possessed of some little property, with which, and their own labor and that of their families, they can support themselves when in health, but who when overtaken by the severe misfortune of insanity, are unable to bear the necessary expenses incurred in being placed in a curative institution for the insane, and who, if deprived of the advantages of such an institution would probably become confirmed and incurable lunatics, to be supported at the public expense as soon as their little property is exhausted. To consign this class of insane persons to a county poor house before any fair trial for their cure is made, by giving them the benefits of an institution created for the cure as well as the care of the insane would, as it seems to us, be unwise as well as unjust.

More than one-fourth of the patients admitted into the Asylum, have been sent by county judges under the provisions of this section. That some have been sent not entitled to support from the public bounty is probable, but in general the power has been wisely and discreetly exercised by the county judges.

A circular was by our direction addressed, more than a year since, by the superintendent to the county judges, stating what was supposed to be the intention and object of the Legislature in the adoption of this section of the law, and requesting the judges to confine, as far as practicable, the exercise of the powers conferred on them, to cases where the patients had become insane within a year prior to making the order. Since this, there have been few or no complaints of the improper or indiscreet exercise of this power. More cures have been effected in the class of patients sent by county judges than in any other, and if the law should be so amended as to limit the power of the county judges to cases where the patient had become insane within one year before the order is made, we think all complaints on the part of county officers and others would be avoided. There is no officer in the county in whom this power can be so safely and properly lodged as in the county judge. He can better investigate the facts of each case by the examination of witnesses on oath than the superintendents of the poor or any other county officer.

Some provision should be made for the removal of this class of patients after they have remained in the asylum two years and have not recovered. There is now no county officer whose duty it is to see to their removal, and in case their friends will not voluntarily take them home, there is no legal mode of defraying the expense of sending them to the counties from which they came.

The managers or superintendent might properly be authorised in such cases to cause them to be taken home at the expense of the proper county; or their friends might be required, as a condition of their admission, to give security to be approved by the county judge, to remove them at the end of two years in case they do not recover by the expiration of this period, or to pay for their support in the asylum in case they are suffered to remain beyond the two years now allowed by law.

Since the asylum has been enlarged and has become filled with patients, the duties of the superintendent and the two assistant physicians have been very arduous. The superintendent has, besides the duties devolving on him as the acting physician of the institution, the general superintendence of the entire establishment, and is also obliged to attend to and conduct an extensive correspondence.

We think he cannot with two assistants, without greater labor and confinement than is compatible with the preservation of health, perform all the medical and other duties required of him in the general supervision of the entire establishment, in prescribing for and taking care of between 450 and 500 insane persons. We therefore recommend that authority be given to appoint another assistant physician, with such salary as may be fixed by the board of managers and State officers, to be paid in the same manner as the other resident officers of the Asylum.

By reference to the treasurer's reports for the present and former years, it will be seen, that we have been obliged to expend from the ordinary income, a considerable sum for furniture. The average annual expenditure for this purpose, for the last three years, has been \$2,693.00. Although the unavoidable wear and destruction of furniture in such an institution, is very great, making it necessary to replenish it constantly, at considerable expense, yet there has been a larger drain upon the current resources, than would have been required, if the Asylum had originally been completely furnished.

With the exception of the specific appropriation of \$2,000.00 in 1844, the appropriations for furniture have been connected with those for stock fixtures, and furnaces, which have consumed so great a portion of the funds, as to compel the managers and superintendent to exercise a rigid economy in the furnishing of the several departments of the institution, and to defray a portion of the cost of originally furnishing the Asylum, from the current income.

There has always been a deficiency of furniture in the bed and sitting rooms.

The Legislature, as we believe, originally intended to appropriate sufficient funds to furnish the institution, and not to require any portion of the ordinary income, for that purpose. The furniture is now

so deficient, that \$5,000 ought to be expended for that object. The ordinary income of the Asylum, at the prices now charged for the support of patients, is not sufficient to warrant us in making this expenditure, at the present time, from that source, and we therefore respectfully submit to the Legislature, the propriety of making an appropriation of that amount, for furniture.

## REPORT

Of the Acting Superintendent of the New-York State  
Lunatic Asylum, at Utica; for the year ending No-  
vember 30th, 1849.

Eight hundred and fifty-seven patients have been under treatment in the Asylum in the course of the past year, as is seen by the above table; of whom four hundred and thirty-three were men, and four hundred and twenty-four women.

There were remaining at the close of last year, four hundred and ninety-five, of whom two hundred and forty-one were men and two hundred and fifty-four women. Admitted during the year, three hun-

dred and sixty-two : one hundred and ninety-two men, and one hundred and seventy women. Number remaining in the Asylum at this date, four hundred and forty-nine : two hundred and twenty-six men, and two hundred and twenty-three women.

There have been discharged four hundred and eight, of whom two hundred and seven were men, and two hundred and one, women. Of these there were discharged recovered, *two hundred and three*: one hundred and thirteen men, ninety women; improved, sixty-six: thirty-seven men, twenty-nine women; unimproved, seventy: twenty-two men, forty-eight women; died, sixty-nine: thirty-five men, thirty-four women.

The number of discharges has been unusually large, and has exceeded the admissions by forty-six, thus reducing the total number of patients to four hundred and forty-nine. This reduction was occasioned by the dismissal of a large number of old incurable cases, and took place early in the season, for the purpose of enabling us to vacate the apartments in the basement of the front building, which are greatly deficient in ventilation. These apartments are yet unoccupied and we think ought to remain so, at least until some plan for their more complete ventilation is adopted and carried into effect. Without them we can comfortably accommodate about four hundred and sixty-five patients and hope with this amount of room to receive all for whom application may be made.

During the past summer, while the epidemic cholera pervaded so large a portion of our country, we, through the kindness of an overruling Providence, were spared from its ravages; and with the exception of some cases of dysentery in the months of August and September, the general health of our household was good. But in the month of December last, the Asylum was visited by the small pox, a disease scarcely less to be dreaded, and which continued to prevail amongst us for several weeks, and in a number of cases proved fatal.

The most careful inquiry was made for the purpose of ascertaining the manner in which it was introduced, but all our efforts in this direction proved fruitless. No person who came here had the disease at the time of admission, or as far as we could learn, had come from a section of country where it was prevalent. It made its appearance in the south, or female division of the Asylum, and the first case occurred in a patient who had been here about seven months. The dis-

ease in this case was very mild, there being only a few conical pimples, which at the time attracted no attention. The second, third and fourth cases were similar, the persons affected having been some months in the Asylum; the fifth, a severe case of the confluent form, had also been with us several months.

Those attacked were immediately removed to the hospital rooms in the rear building, where suitable nurses were provided to attend upon them, and all communication with other parts of the establishment, as far as possible, prevented. We also had all who were then here, attendants and assistants, as well as patients, carefully vaccinated, and those who were received into the Asylum while the disease continued, were vaccinated as soon as they came.

Of four hundred and ninety patients who were in the house at the time, and who were more or less exposed, forty-eight took the disease, viz: twelve men and thirty-six women. Thirty-three had it in a mild form, of these six were men, and twenty-seven women; fifteen had the confluent or severe form, of these six were men, and nine women. Fourteen died in the course of the disease, or soon after its termination; viz: five men and nine women, of whom eleven died in consequence of the disease; and in the other three cases death was only perhaps a little hastened by it.

The above however does not include eight attendants who had the disease, two of whom died. These we believe are the first deaths that have occurred among those employed in the institution since its organization.

By far the largest number of cases occurred in the south division of the Asylum, and among those who were exposed before they were vaccinated here, but persons were attacked in nearly every part of the house, and among them, many who were not known to have been in any way directly exposed to the exciting cause of the disease.

In addition to the deaths from the cause above mentioned, fifty-five died of the following diseases: 14 of dysentery; 7 of meningites; 6 of consumption; 5 of exhaustion following long continued excitement; 4 of general paralysis; 3 of epilepsy; 2 of marasmus; 2 of diarrhea; 2 of inflammation of the lungs; 1 of general dropsy; 1 of hydrothorax; 1 of suicide; 1 of puerperal fever; 1 of

disease of the spinal cord ; 1 of erysipelas ; 1 of apoplexy ; 1 of serous diarrhœa ; 1 of exhaustion from old age ; and 1 of peritoneal inflammation from perforation of the intestines.

It is seen by the above, that our table of mortality is again increased by a number of fatal cases of dysentery, a disease that prevailed to so great an extent, and carried off so many of our household the preceding year. Of the deaths from this cause, four occurred in the course of the last winter, and ten during the months of August and September ; with two exceptions, those who died were from among the old and debilitated class of patients, of whose recovery from their mental malady we entertained no hope.

The foregoing and following information is obtained from the records of the Asylum, in which frequent entries are made of all facts connected with the admissions and discharges of patients ; and also of their condition and treatment while they remain here. When a patient is admitted, an entry is made in one of our case-books of the name, residence, age, sex, civil condition, place of nativity, occupation, duration of the insanity, supposed cause, hereditary predisposition, &c., of each person, and on the first of every month thereafter, or oftener in cases requiring especial care and attention, a record is made of the health and treatment of the patient the month previous. Six of these books have been filled since the opening of the asylum, and the seventh has now been some time in use.

We have in addition to these, a register, in which the name, date of admission, number of the case, together with the most important features of the mental disease of each patient is recorded. In this book is also kept the list of discharges, and the condition of each individual on leaving the Asylum.

We have also a record showing the number from each county, and how supported, whether by the friends, State, county or town, with the price per week for board in each case. In another book is made a daily entry of the admissions and discharges, and the total number remaining at the close of each day.

From these records are obtained the facts and statistics presented in this report.

Application is frequently made to us by letter, for information as to the manner of committing patients to the Asylum. We therefore give the following extracts from the laws relating to this subject, with such comments as seem to be needed, and trust they may be of service.

The laws of the State in reference to the confinement of lunatics, are contained in title 3, chapter 20, part 1, of the Revised Statutes, and in an act passed April 7, 1842, entitled "An act to organise the State Lunatic Asylum, and more effectually to provide for the care, maintenance and recovery of the insane."

According to these acts the *superintendents* of the poor of counties and in counties where the towns support their own poor, the *overseers* of the poor of towns, may send patients to the Asylum. They are to send the paupers and persons committed to their charge by justices of the peace, as dangerous to be at large. Patients may also be sent by the county judge, but he is to send only those in indigent circumstances who become insane. The law we think does not contemplate that he shall send paupers, or old incurable cases of insanity.

Section 26 of the act of 7th April, provides that "when a person in indigent circumstances, not a pauper, becomes insane, application may be made in his behalf to the first judge of the county where he resides; and said judge shall call two respectable physicians, and other credible witnesses, and fully investigate the facts of the case, and either with or without the verdict of a jury, at his discretion, as to the question of insanity, shall decide the case as to his indigence. And if the judge certifies that satisfactory proof has been adduced, showing him insane, and his estate is insufficient to support him and his family (or if he has no family, himself,) under the visitation of insanity, on his certificate, authenticated by the county clerk and seal of the county courts, he shall be admitted into the Asylum and supported there at the expense of said county, until he shall be restored to soundness of mind, if effected in two years. The judge, in such case, shall have requisite power to compel the attendance of witnesses and jurors, and shall file the certificate of the physicians, taken under oath, and other papers with a report of his proceedings and decisions with the clerk of the county, and report the facts to the supervisors, whose duty it shall be, at their next annual meeting, to raise the money requisite to meet the expenses of support accordingly."

According to section 27, "when an insane person in indigent circumstances shall have been sent to the Asylum by his friends, who have paid his bill therein for six months, if the superintendent shall

certify that he is a fit patient and likely to be benefited by remaining in the institution, the supervisors of the county of his residence, are authorised and required, upon an application under oath in his behalf, to raise a sum of money sufficient to defray the expenses of his remaining there another year, and pay the same to the treasurer of the Asylum. And they shall repeat the same for two succeeding years, upon like application, and the production of a new certificate each year, of like import from the superintendent."

The act of April 7th, 1842, section 22d, directs: "In every case of confinement under the statute, title three, aforesaid, whether of a pauper or not, after the passage of this act, neither justices, superintendents or overseers of the poor, shall order or "approve" of such confinement, without having the evidence of two reputable physicians, under oath, as to the alleged fact of insanity and such testimony shall be reduced to writing, and filed, with a brief report of all the other proofs, facts and proceedings in the case, in the office of the county clerk; and said clerk shall file said papers and register, with date, the names and residence of the lunatic and officers severally, in tabular form, in the book of miscellaneous records kept in said office; and the certificate of said clerk and the seal of the court, verifying such facts shall warrant such lunatics' admission into the Asylum." Since the passage of the act to organize the Asylum, the superintendents of the poor are "required to send to the State Lunatic Asylum, or to such public or private Asylum as may be approved by a standing order or resolution of the board of supervisors of the county, within ten days, every case of lunacy committed to their care, and provided for by title 3, chapter 20, part 1, of the Revised Statutes." If the mental disease commenced previous to the passage of the act mentioned above, the superintendents are authorised to send them to the Asylum without taking measures to prove their insanity.

Justices of the peace are also required to direct the apprehension of any person so far disordered in his senses as to render him dangerous to himself, or the persons and property of others, if permitted to go at large; but there is no law authorising them to send patients directly to the Asylum. Their warrant for the arrest and confinement of a lunatic, should be directed to the superintendents of the poor of counties, or the overseers of the poor of towns, whose duty it is to take charge of all lunatics thus committed to their care, and see that they are placed in a Lunatic Asylum within ten days.

Section 29 of the act to organize the Asylum refers to the admission of patients supported by their friends and is as follows: "Whenever there are vacancies in the Asylum, the managers may authorise the superintendents to admit under special agreements, such recent cases as may seek admission under peculiarly afflictive circumstances, or which in his opinion promise speedy recovery."

In all cases where a patient is admitted into the Asylum under the above section, a bond for the payment of his expenses, and for his removal when requested by the managers, is required, and those who accompany him here, should come prepared to give such a bond, and if strangers, bring evidence of their responsibility.

Patients are sometimes brought to us by persons with whom we are wholly unacquainted, and without any evidence whatever of their ability to fulfil the required obligations. In such cases, we have sometimes been compelled to refuse admission to the patient, but this is always painful to us, and we would urge those who send friends to the institution, not to neglect to provide themselves with the necessary letters of reference.

#### FARM AND GARDEN.

These form a very important part of our establishment. The labor, as in former years, has been mostly performed by patients, a large number of whom are by occupation farmers, and they most cheerfully avail themselves of every opportunity offered them for engaging in this kind of employment. In addition to this, they have rendered us much assistance in improving the grounds, and in the ordinary work about the house and yard.

The following is an account of the produce for the past year.

Winter squashes 1,000; these were raised on a piece of ground nine rods long, by four wide. Some of them weighed upwards of eighty pounds, and the average weight was about fifty pounds each.

In addition to the above, we have kept six horses, fifteen cows, eighteen store hogs, and fattened nine thousand pounds of pork.

The green-house now contains two thousand plants, and presents a very fine appearance, especially in winter. It is then much resorted to by our patients, and contributes greatly to their pleasure and enjoyment.

#### *Shops and Labor.*

The shops have been conducted on the same plan as during the preceding year, and the results have been altogether satisfactory. In all of them patients are more or less employed. In the tailors' shop we now keep a tailoress, who has the general charge of the shop, and gives out work to those who wish it, or who are likely to be benefited thereby. The following list of articles made in this shop and the other sewing rooms, will give some idea of the amount of labor performed by the female patients in the course of the year :

The *religious services, schools and amusements*, have been so fully described in previous reports, that it is unnecessary for me to go into details here. I would only say that no essential change has been made in regard to them. Rev. Chauncey E. Goodrich, who for several years has officiated as chaplain, has continued to discharge his duties with faithfulness and ability.

The following table of suicides which have been committed in this State, during the last five years, is taken from our book of records, and having had access to about fifty of the most widely circulated journals, we think it will be found to contain nearly all that have occurred. The assigned cause in more than three-fifths of the entire number of cases, was mental derangement; thus showing the great danger of trusting persons who are known to be partially insane, with the means of accomplishing self-destruction. The most careful observation is necessary in such cases, and the "constant care of a judicious friend, or what is still better for recovery, residence in a lunatic asylum," are the only means of security.

### CONCLUSION.

We cannot conclude this report, without referring to the great loss which this institution has recently suffered, in the death of its late superintendent, Dr. Brigham. From the opening of the asylum, in January, 1843, up to the time of his decease, he devoted himself with untiring industry to its organization, and the advancement of its interests. The arduous duties devolving upon him, were faithfully performed, with little regard to his own health, which for years was such, as would lead many men to abandon all active pursuits. Notwithstanding this and the remonstrance of friends, he persevered in the great work of humanity in which he was engaged, until the commencement of his fatal illness. It may truly be said, that he sacrificed health, and even life, to the advancement of the interests of the insane. There are but few, whose usefulness has been more extended, and whose loss will be more deeply felt by the community, and his memory will long be cherished by many, who, through his instrumentality, have been restored to health and happiness.

The many and arduous duties, which this sad event devolved upon me, have kept me constantly occupied, and left me but little time to prepare this statement of the condition of the asylum, during the year just closed. This, I trust, will be a sufficient explanation of its meagre and imperfect character.

To the editors and proprietors of newspapers, and all others, who by their donations, have contributed to the relief of the unfortunates here assembled, we desire to return our most sincere thanks.
