A Proclamation for a generall Fast to be kept thorowout the Realm of England.

He Kings most Excellent Majestie, observing the correcting hand of God upon the Kingdom is many years Pestilence, the piesent interruptions of that long continued blessing of Peace, and other signes of his anger for the sins of the Land, and seriously considering the weighty affairs of State now in azitation in the high Court of Parliament, out of his truly Religious heart to God, and his tender care of his Kingdom and peoples welfare according to the practise of pious Kings and Princes in some ages, in times of common calamities, which concern both Prince and people) hath resolved (with the humble abbite of the

Looks and Commons now aftembled in Parliament) by a folemn and publike Fall, i.. the first place to have recourse to the Divine Pajeske, to imploze his mercy and favour to him and his people, as well for removing the present Judgements, as for a blessing upon the great Assairs and businesses in hand concerning his Pajeske and the Publike. And therefore his Pajeskie both hereby traitly charge and command that a general and publike Fall be kept and holden, as well byabsimence from Food, as by publike Prayers and hearing the mord of God, and other sacred Duties, in all Cathedrall, Collegiate, and Parish Churches and Chappels within the City of London, the Suburbs thereof, and the adjoining Parishes of Saint Clement Danes, Saint Gles in the fields, Saint James at Clarkenwell, Saint Katharine Tower, Saint Leonard Shoredisch, Saint Martins in the fields, Saint Mary Whitechappell, Saint Magdalene Bermond, and Savoy Parish, upon Tuesday the seventeenth day of this instant Robember: And mall other Cathedrall, Collegiate, and Parish Churches and Chappels within the Bringdom of England, and Dominion of Wales, upon Tuesday the eighth day of December next ensuing the date hereof: All which his Pajestic both expressely tharge and command shall be Rederendly and Deboutly personned by all his loding Subjects, as they tender the favour of Almights God, and would aboth his just indignation against this Land, and upon pain of such punishments as his Pajesty may justly instict upon all such as shall conterm or neglect so religious a work.

Given at the Court at Whitehall theeleventh day of November in the fixteenth yeer of His Majesties Reign.
