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HARLES by the grace of God, King of England, Serfland, France, and treland, Defender of the Faith, &c. TO all to whom thefe Prefents thall come, greeting. WHEREAS the Lords Spiritual and Temporall, now affembled in Parliament vpon the fixt day of this inftant moneth of Angult, entring into a due and Chriftian confideration of the Wants and Extremities, which many poore people inhabiting in or neere the Cities and Suburbs of London and Weitminfler doe vndergoe by reafon of the grieuous vifitation of the Plague, and the want of neceffarie reliefe 3 made an order, the tenor whereof followeth in these words, viz. In Parliament, Oxin. 6. of Auguft, e-Anno primo Regis Caroli. The Lords having this day taken into their charitable confideration the lamentable difficient of the poore people, Inhabiting in the Cities and Suburbs of London and Weitminfler, and in the Out parilhes adjoyning, and in the Parith of Stepney, who in this time of the great contagion of the Plague now rageing in those parts, are leffe fubject to good orders, being left defitute of convenient reliefe, in respect that the rich and able Citizens, and other Inhabitants of all forts, being departed thence for avoiding the infection, have not taken fufficient order, for reliefe of the poore people remaining behinde, have thought fit, and doe now order, aduife, and direct, that ouer and befides all provision already made, there be this further added for their better reliefe, viz. That all perfons taxed or taxable in the limits and places aforefaid, either for houfes, lands, goods, or otherwife towards the reliefe of the poors, being not fo impouerilhed themfelues by this vifitation as they fhall be found requifite by the Magiftrates, luftices of Peace, or other Officers be taxed to be are adouble proportion of taxe at the leaft, during the time of this Vifitation, and more if it thall be found requifite by the Magiftrates, luftices of Peace, or other Officers there abiding for the time = And after notice given to any perfor for taxed, or left at his houfe, wherelocuer he fhall be remaining, he is hereby ordered to make due paiment, weekely, or monthly as fhall be required : And becaufe it is conceiued, that very many are remooued fo farre from *Lundon*, as that notice cannot be contained with fuch fpeed as may prefetly fupply the necefficie of the poore ; Their Lordfhips doe defire the Chamber, or Bridge-houfe of *Lendon*, to lend and disburfe a thoufand pounds at the leaft for this purpole. And it is ordered that they, or any charitable and able Inhabitants, laying out that fummie, or any farther fummes which fhall be wanting. fhall be furely repayed whatfoeuer they fhall disburfe, out of the fumme fo taxed, fo foone as they may be leuied, and out of a general Collection which His Majeftie at their Lordfhips humble fuite, hath to recommend throughout the whole Kingdome for the reliefe of the faid Poore : Wherein their Lordfhips new affembled, will themfelues fer an example for incouragement of others. And to the internst, that the Moneys to be raifed by way of taxation (as is first aboue-mentioned) may be the pay the faid Taxation, and to punil them fo exemplarily, as fhall be a terrour toothers. And wee alfo will and require, you the Churchwardens and ouer feers of the poore, to make diligent collection of the charitable deuotion of the people in the faid Church or Chappell fo affembled : And that after collection for made, they doe publikely declare in the Church, the whole fumme of the faid Church or Chappell I and then procure the faid colucritor of users, or one of them, after the receipt of the faid money collected, shall deliver the fame : And the Bilhop of curry Dioceffe is hereby authorized, to name and appoint a Minifter of the Daanery to receiue the faid collections accordingly.
