 A Discourse of the Planets and Signs of the: Zodiack, with Observations upon their power and influence on the Bodies of Men,, Women, and Children.



Overning the body of man, as fecondl Caufes, fubfituted as it were by the wife Creator and Governor of all hings, are 7 Planets, called wandering Stars, whofe influence greatly operates in all Seaans, and difpofes the mind to act and do, as well as urging or puthing on their good or bad Fortune, and the higheft of these is Saturn, a Planet difpofing men to flownefs im bufinefs, melancholy, danger, and fuch ways as expose them to many Misfortunes. The next in

n order is Jupiter; whose influence is more nild and benign, giving a chearful heart nd profperous progrefs in affairs, whofe kind fpect many times qualifies and allays the nalignity of his superiour Planet. Mars is eneath him, who predominates over fiery pirits, ftirs up to rafhnefs, war, wranglings, roils, and the like ; but he again is temperaed by the Sun's influence, who moves beneath im, and in men creates chearfulnefs, difpong them to be healthful and vigorous, and nose that are born under the Domination of his glorious Planet, for the most part attain onour and high preferment. Venus moving ext beneath the Sun, difposes those o're hom the has a peculiar influence to a gentle, ild, and loving temper, difpelling wrath nd hatred. Mercury is next, creating leviand ficklenefs of mind, where he has domion. Beneath him, and moving nearest the erreftial Globe, is the Moon, which immeately governs all watery bodies and flegmack humours, her powers the Ocean feels in Ebbs and Flows, as does the blood of man. any other things are attributed to thefe anets as fecundary caufes, difpofing the boes and minds of men, rendering them fornate, or unfortunate, of which I shall have cafion to difcourse hereafter. Their chief its in man's body are thefe, and are known by

by these Characters, viz. Saturn 5 in th left Foot, Jupiter & in the Stomach, Man & in the Genitals, the Sun () in the Hean Venus 9 in the left Arm, Mercury § in th right Arm, the Moon) in the Head; an from these Parts their influence moves II turns, as they are predominant throughow the whole Body, and have more or lee force according to the fign they are in, respect to the time of the Party's Nativity which Signs of the Zodiack, or Imaginar Circle, are known by these Characters, vii Aries y, Taurus &, Gemini I, Cancer se Leo S., Virgo m, Libra =, Scorpio m, SS gitarius 7, Capricorn vs, Aquarius == Pisces X. Through the twelve Signs, th Suns progrefs makes our Year, and render the Seafons to Mankind, diffributing Hee or Cold as it afcends or retrogrades. thus much at prefent for the Planets and (Jeftial Signs.


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CHAP. II.

A Description of the Lines in the Hand, and Mounts their Scituate. How they communicate with the other parts of the Body, and by what Planets they are chiefly governed.



Having given you, Reader, fome infight into this great and myfterious Science, I fhall now come nearer to the material mat-B 3 ter,

ter, and let you understand by what mean the Fates of Mortals may be forefeen, am many eminent dangers prevented by a timel imploration of that God, in whole hand is all the breath of Life, and on whom alon our fafety depends. And first you must un derstand, that of all the members of the bod dy, none fo plainly exposes our Fortunes a Fates as the Hand; for in that the God of N: ture has ingraven legible Characters," to h read by the fludious and industrious, it whom it is his pleafure to reveal fuch Secre And those are the Lines and Joynts, & apparent in the Palm, Thumb and Finger which have an immediate intercourfe, thoug by devious ways, with the chief feats of life having divers Names, derived partly from the place of intercourse. But for the more eafy understanding, I shall give you only their ufual and proper Names. As, 1. The Line constant Life, or Line of the Heart, governed by this Sun. 2. The Cephalique or middle Natura Line, governed by Jupiter and the Moon. :: 101 In The Line of the Brain, governed by Mercury 4. The Table Line, or the Line of Fortune governed by Jupiter. 5. Venus's Girdle, go verned by that Planet. 6. The Line of Death or Sifter to the Line of Life, governed by Saturn. 7. The Percuffion, governed. by Mars and the Moon. 8. The Circle of the Wrift

Wrift is left to Mars in Aries. Befides thefe are divers other Lines, not common to all Hands: As the way of the Sun, and milky way, and way of Saturn, and therefore are called uncertain Lines, not greatly taken notice of in Chiromancy.

The fcituation or place of the Lines abovenamed, I thus discover, viz. The Line of Life incloses the Thumb, separating it from the plain of Mars. The middle Natural Line, takes its beginning at the rifing of the fore-

takes its beginning at the riving of the fore-finger, near the Line of Life, and ends at the mount of the Moon. The Line of the Brain, commonly called the Liver-line, reaches to the Table-line, making a Triangle thus: The Table-line, or Line of Fortune, begins under the mount of Mercury, and ends near the Index and the middle finger. The Girdle of Venus begins near the Joynt of the little finger, and ends between the fore-finger and middle finger. The Line of Death, &c. when it plainly appears, is a counter-line to that of Life, and therefore is called it's Sifter, ending as it ends. The Percuffion is fter, ending as it ends. The Percuffion is between the mounts of Venus and the Moon. The Wrift-Lines, commonly called Refeetta, are no other than those Joynts that part the Hand.

As for the mounts before-mentioned, they are no other than the fleshy parts, or little · B4 rifings

rifings at the Roots of the fingers, Erc. And are called by the Names of fundry Planet: that rule them; nor are they infignificant in him this Science. As for the Fingers and Thumb. there are divers marks on them worthy on confideration, and are governed, viz. thu Thumb by Venus, the Fore-finger by Jupiter the middle by Saturn, the third by the Sum the last by Mercury, and of all others than has the nearest communication with the Heart. As for the hollow of the Hand it in attributed to Mars. according to the follow ing Verfe :

To Venus rule the Thumb we do commit, The Finger first to rule mild Jove thinks fit, The next old Saturn does difpose and guide, To Sol's bright rule the third is ever ty'd, The Brawn the Moon with watery Beams directs. . The Hollow Mars with pointed Rays affects, The least Finger has Mercury's Aspetts.

And thus much at prefent for the Line: Sc. of the Hand; from difcourfing of which I shall proceed to other Marks worthy co Obfervation.

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
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CHAP. III.

An Explanation of Marks, or Sacred Charaters, on the Hands of Men and Women, as they signific either good or bad Fortune.



IN the Hands of many perfons, as well men as women, are observed oftentimes Letters or Sacred Characters, imprinted by Na-B 5 ture -

ture to demonfrate their good or evil Fort tune; and these ought greatly to be observed for their fignifications will have their eventss And into the Mystery of Explanation in this cause, for the fake fuch as bear them, 11 shall dare to wave.

In this cafe the Hand must be imagined In Eaft, Weft, North, and South : The little times finger fide being accounted the East, the fim with gers ends the South, the Thumb the Weft int and the Wrift-joynt the North. Now if is af met happen that an A be found between the mount of the Moon and hollow of the Hand it denotes a fickly body, fubject to loffes, croff fes, imprisonment, banishment, and diverse other misfortunes; but on the contrary, ii the Letter appear fair in North part of the Hand towards the Mount of Venus, it figni fies happy Marriages, Prosperity, Joy, delight in beauteous Women, and rich Matches. But again on the contrary, if A be found on the mount of Saturn, it fignifies delay in Bufinefs lofs of Law-fuits, and Effate, Imprifonment Sicknefs, and the like, and over and above threatens the Party with a fhort Life. If A be in lower part of the plain of Mars, in denotes Death by Arms, or in fome Broil but if there be a Triangle above the Wrift. it denotes the Party thall be Murthered : And if it fland near the mount of Venus in a man Hand

Hand, it denotes he shall fall a Sacrifice to the revenge of a Woman, or in her quarrel. If a touch upon the mount of the Moon, it threatens the party with great imbecillity and defect of Judgment, naturally, or occasioned by ficknefs, as likewife a fickly conftitution.

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If T happen to be on the mount of Venus, it denotes fuccefs in Love and happy Marri-The ages, if it be not follow as to cut the Line of Wet Life; for if it do, let the parity certainly ex-The pett great croffes in Love and Bufinefs, and if he marry, to live an unquiet and unhappy life. ethn. If it appear between the Thumb and the Finger, it denotes Joy and Content, a Wife with Beauty and Riches, &c. If it be in the middeft of the mount, it fignifies much good For-AW. E tune, and that he thall raife himfelf by rich i figit Idigit Marriages, If it be in the extremity of the mount towards the Wrift, it denotes the paralt ty much inclinable to Luft and lawlefs Love; if it appear on the back-fide the Thumb, it denotes the party more defirous of Male than Female Copulation. If the T be on the little Finger, or the mount of the Moon, it fignifies the perfon will fuffer much by the occafion of a Woman, and that he is likely to fall by Poylon or Affafimation, his Children fhall. die untimely, and his Goods be imbezell d by fuch as he fhall intrust. If it be on the plain of Mars, it fignifies Fortitude, and a. War-Land Land likes

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like fpirit, the party fo marked shall be fubject to quarrel, and in the end in fighting for the shall a woman, shall obtain her, and be thereby many enriched: but if it happen on the little fingers as the it fignifies bad fuccess in all undertakings. It has in the Girdle of Venws, it is a certain fign on the the parties being extream debaucht and lan fcivious, be it a man or woman; or if there be the an L in the fame place, the product will be marked equal.

As for G, it fo happens that it produces that good or evil effects, according as it is polition ted: As when it is found upon the mount co *Venus*, it prefages good fuccefs, love, and many friends: but if it be found in the plain of *Mars*, it fignifies ftrife and trouble, created ted through rafhnefs or an unruly temperature of in a place under the domination of *Saturn* of *it* is a fign of morofe dulnefs, and evil conditions. But happening in any part under the domination of the Sun, it betokens fudden accefs to riches, by the retrieving combined hidden treafure.

If any perfon having the Letter C on the middle finger, in the inclofure of Venus Gindle, it betokens him or her greatly abound ing with luftful defires, and much given to profligate and vicious life. If the C be in the branch of the line of life, it denotes in men great wickednefs, and an evil end; an

tu

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in women lasciviousness, and an infatiate defire of fatisfying their lust: Nor according to our Art can we think her chaste, though at times the appear demure, and much pretend to Religion.

If the Letter L appear on the mount of the Ittle finger, it betokens prosperity, ftore of riches and honour; but being near the Wrift, it predicts the contrary, threatning the party with difgrace and misfortune. If L appear ndurs at the top of the line of life, it fignifies croffes in marriage, poverty, jealoufies, and that the perfon thall commit Adultery, and beget many natural children imperfect in their timbs, Ec. If in a woman, the thall proftitute herfelf to vile perfons, break her marriage vows, difhonour and difgrace her Huf-Sand band, E'e. And if it be in the Wrift advanin cing to the Thumb, it denotes the like; as int also in the middle of the Thumb, because init Venus governs and disposes to lasciviousmels; but being in the little finger, it betokens wildom and valour; if it be under the little finger, it denotes a mediocrity of fortune; good near Jupiter, bad near Saturn, and near the plain of Mars, or mount of the Moon, threatens ficknefs and death.

If S, called the S of Scorpio, be near the Triangle of the Line of Life, and the Table-Line, and if under it there appear two finall Trian-

Triangles, it denotes Victory in all Attempts and but if it be in the other Triangle towards the Wrift, it denotes Cowardize though a quantum relfome Perfon.

If the S of Sagitarius happen in the Line: Life, and Jupiter Predominant, it denott much happiness and health, with length days, and an obedient Off-fpring. But if be on the mount of Jupiter (for those Plana plana that rule the Fingers and Thumb, rule the mounts or flefhy part under them; as likewing the twelve Joynts of the Fingers, are attributin ted to the twelve Signs of the Zodiack, and the Fingers to the four Seafons of the year by Chiromancers) a milder Fortune; butt sugar on Saturn's mount it appear, it denotes es luck ; nor if it be with the Moon or Mercu is it much better; but on the Sun's mou riches and honour are promifed, by it lenge of days, and much felicity. It appeari in the plain of Mars, is the occasion of go Success in Arms, and that the Party shall r to high promotion by Feats of Chivalry.

If the Letter P attributed to Pifces, be fou in the plain of Mars, it fignifies as that j before-mentioned. And fo likewife in oth places, 'tis good and evil, according as in pofited near the Regency of benign or m lignant Planets.

with the vare polited, pretend no harm to the Party, unlefs upon the mount of Saturn, within the Girdle of Venus. Now to Illutrate these Particulars, I might again difcant that these Particulars, I might again different them, according as they are more or lefs that influenced by the Planets, as they progress and reprogress, the twelve Celeftial Signs but defcribed in the first Chapter. But intending.
Planeto lay down nothing but plain and easie Methods, I stall wave it as a flourish used by the Proceed to the Lines of the Hand, and their Predictions of good or evil fortune, from whence I have a little digreful for the Reader a plainer infight into the Mystery.

IN this cafe it is altogether convenient to known, which Hand is the most mater in this Science to be observed, for unless be known, a right judgment cannot be may wherefore those that are skilled in Chirom

The True Fortune-Teller. 17 y or Palmistry, are of opinion, that the left land is most fignificant, and ought to be oberved with much curiofity, becaufe on this land both the Heart and the Brain, being he principal Seats of Life, have the greatest and to the former of them go from his Hand all the Lines and Veins ; wherefore hyficians by it may know the flate of the ody, as well as Chiromancers the difpolition. f the Mind, and impendent fate or good forane incident to mankind. 'Tis in this Hand hat Jupiter and the Sun have the fuperior omination; but take notice that you oberve when you make your Infpection, the arty be in good temper, not overcome with vine, fear, anger, excefs of joy or forrow, ver-heated by travel, or debauched by excefs f venereal exploits or the body diftempered y gluttony, for in these cases no true judgment can be made, by reason the blood reiring or difperfing diforderly, an extenuation of the natural heat is exhaufted, and the conftitution of the body alterable, fo that he Lines will neither appear in their proper order or colour. Nor can a true judgment me made on a hand brawny and unfailhionable with hard labour, by reafon the Lines are flouded and difforted, and therefore the beft udgment may be made upon children of four or fix years of age, whole tempers the Moon makes

makes flexible and fluid; but to come near to our purpofe; as for the Lines of the Han I have already defcrib'd them, and now I flh proceed to give their true fignification, it Rules above-mentioned being taken noticee at the time of Infpection, and of thefe: their order.

CHAP. V. Of the Wrist Lines, and the good and bad F tune they predict to Men and Women, &co

I.

I. IF it happen the party infpected have four Lines on the Wrift, perfect and well-coloured, then do the Fates flhew themfelves propitious, in allowing him length of days; for he or flhe fo having them, flhall live to extream old Age, and if there happens two inall bows above, making a flharp Angle, they promife a Heritage, or other Riches, by the Death of Relations or others, and that in heir old Age they flhall arrive to honour and preferment.

2. When there appears three plain Lines, if they be broad, they portend the party hall live to fixty years of age, gathering nuch riches in his youthful days, but by nisfortune be reduced to poverty in his riper veats, but that he fhall again be profperous. 3. Two Lines in the Wrift, fignifies the pary fhall linger out many days in fickness and vexation, and may arrive, if no fatal accident happen, at fixty years.

4. To have but one Line, fignifies many Cafualties and a short duration of Life.

5. If the Lines be wide and fcattered, the party has no great underftanding, nor will te gain any promotion; he may live to 39 n moderate health and profperity, but let lim look to the fucceeding year, for theren is he threatned with death.

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6. If

6. If the lines cross each other, let the party be circumfpect in his ways, left he fail by the hand of an Executioner.

7. If the lines fpread abroad, and wave it and out, paffing crookedly, they denote man of great Wildom, but that his Ambitt on fhall be his Ruin.

8. When a line croffes the wrift, and m meandering extends it felf towards the limits of life, it denotes ficknefs, if it appear en and ceeding pale, death will be the iffue of that ficknefs, if black, the party is endangered to min fome bruife, and retains within him muc corrupted blood.

9. If a crooked line bent-wife traverse this lines of the wrift, it betokens flavery or en the tream hardship; if two do the like, his Fau will be a Gibbet.

10. If so it happen that the line of th hand-wrift be double towards the mount (the Moon, and if one afcend towards the lin of life uneven, it fignifies an uneafie and un quiet continuation upon Earth, and that th party shall be in continual danger of fecra Enemies.

11. If in the wrift the upper line be twiff ed or linked in manner of a chain, it denoted the party born to a fervile and laborious liff yet fortunate in gaining riches.

12. When many lines fpread themfelve toward

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the party bent to travel by Sea and Land, a perfon of a rambling conftitution, or a Va-

13. If it happen that a line paffes the lines of the Wrift, as fometimes it happens, and reaches to the mount of the Sun, then the party may look for Honour, Favour and the Riches, which will flow upon him by un-

14. If there happen on the hand of a Woman a Triangle, beginning at the Wrift, and reaching near the Moons mount, then will fhe prove a common Proftitute.

15. If there fall out to be croffes upon the hand of aWoman, it denotes fhamefacedness, chaftity and vertue, and if one be found in the plain of *Mars*, it denotes the will be married young, and become a widow before the thirtieth year of her age.

16. When the lines of the wrift bear up to the flat of the hand, it fignifies Ficklenefs, Inconftancy and Falfhood.

17. To conclude as to the wrift. The long wrift without interfection, denotes ftrength and conftancy, the fhort wrift diffected, weaknefs of body and mind. If the lines be turned towards the mount of *Saturn*, vain imaginations, vanity and vexation. But branching towards *Jupiter*, it denotes honour and dignity,

dignity, with great riches. When it caffit its branches between the fore-finger and Scattelin turn, in a Man it denotes he shall be in darr ger of Death by wounds in his Head; am the like happening to a woman, prefages hee dying in Child-bed. If there happens Croffee and Stars upon or between the Lines, honour and peace shall conclude the parties old age but if Stars appear alone, to the Female Sen it denotes Infamy and Difgrace. If the Writh Lines tend to the mount of Venus, the parts is lascivious, and subject to many Vices: II to the Heptick they bend, then the party ii just in his dealings, and has a prospect on long and profperous days: And thus much for these most remarkable Lines.



6. If the line be fected or cut where it encount between the mount of *Jupiter* and *Venus*, to party fhall be grieved oft with ficknefs, occ. fioned by trouble and vexation. But if Triang

CHAP. VII.

Who fo has lines thwarting this line, is ill, inbject to many afflictions, as ficknefs, troumile, loss of estate, and the like; or, if it appen in the youthful days, it denotes crofmis in love; if the lines or dents happen on which e middle of the Finger, it denotes the man flatterer and inconftant; yet in the end by ___ ch his Folly, shall ruin himfelf.

If it fo happen, that the line be double, or , vided into three parts into any of the exmemities, it fignifies, the party shall be forhate, and of a generous temper, liberal in mation, and of a courteous and modeft at aviour.

The line being forked at that end that exds towards the line of Jupiter, it denotes und quiet of mind upon frivolous occasions, the like diffurmence, riches got by deceit and violence, ich will not be long kept, especially, if the line begins towards the mount of the lon.

f this line towards the mount of Jupiter hear.plain, and any Star appear therein, enotes a contented poverty.

Fthe line be crooked, it denotes danger fe, by fome mad or furious Beaft, or a en mischief by some distracted or difored Perfon. If

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

Two croffes upon that line, one being; on the fide of the fore finger, and the other: bending towards the little finger, denote: virtue, meeknefs, and a modeft behaviour, one often tempted to unlawful Actions, butt with deteftation declining them; and by this mark, ought wife men to choofe their wives, for in women it is more fignificant than in man. In brief, this line fignifies those that have it, for the most part to be defirous off carnal Copulation and of a hot Constitution, which is the Original of fuch defires, both in men and women, for thereby the blood being foon rarified, receives more Spiritual Influence, and is thereby quickly difinified from the brain, heart and liver, to the feminal Veffels, and preffes for evacuation; nor farther think I convenient to give judgment on this line, becaufe it portends for the moft partt

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CHAP. XI. Fudgments, or Chiromantial Observations on the Milky-way.

If the Girdle Venus happen to cut this line, the party uft beware of Marriage, leaft he live in ntinual contention.

If this line happen to be crooked, meanring in and out, it betokens a fhort Life, accompa-

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accompanied with ficknefs and croffes. Iff Virgins it appear much branching towair the Girdle of Venus, it betokens early Maria riage, and many Children, with indifferent profperity, but that they will be apt to aftray, and promote their Husbands to the dignity of the Forked Order.

If it hay pen to be forked near the Table line, wifdom and much activity is thereby fignified. conclude, if there be a Triangle betwee this line, the line of Life, and of the Live happy fortune, a profperous life, much in genuity, and riches are promifed : If th Angle be blunt, it denotes Diseases, a sickl Conftitution, and weaknefs of Body: If. happen to be exceeding fhort, it denotee Boafting, Prodigality, Beggary, Folly, and breviation of Life. And thus have I taken full observation of the lines of the hand, usu ally regarded in Chiromancy, and made a trun judgment upon every particular, worthy on Obfervation; from whence I shall proceed to fay fomething of the Plain of Mars, and the Moons Mount, and fo regularly proceed! for the better and more easie understanding of the Reader.

I in the middle of the Triangle, there appear other fmall Triangles towards the Wrift Duels and Combates are thereby denoted which often end in death, or difgrace; but, in they appear full towards the Table line, fame and a profperous life will happen to the part ty. If the Party have a crofs deep and large in the middle of the Plain, it fignifies him zealous in Arms for the defence of his Religion, and that he will gain renown thereby ... If Stars appear in the Plain, poverty and misfortune:

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nisfortune are threatned, as alfo many fecret nemies that will endanger his life.

The *Moons* place is between the hollow of *Mars* and the Wrift, called the Hypothenar, r Brawn of the Hand, and on these two, the Cannons and Aphorisms affixed, and what is ence to be observed, take according to the Dpinions of the skilful in *Chiromancy*, as foloweth.

If the lines appear pale or black, and groß n the Lunar Regions, the Party is threatned with many misfortunes, and improfperous uccess in all his undertakings; but, if they are fair, of a lively colour, fuitable in proportion, the party shall have good fuccefs, especially in diftant Land, as well in Commerce as Negotiation on the behalf of his Prince; and women wherein they fo appear, Thall be fortunate in marriage, and be exceeding fruitful, eafie in delivery, and free from death on that occafion. If a Star happen in the Trind mingle of a womans hand, fhe is prone to unremain awful love and luft, and will thereby be endered miferable in the end; but if it ream with a tail like a Comment, it denotes woman to out-live four Husbands, and yet ot arrive at any confiderable age, especially that mark happen before the 20th year. our lines crofs-wife in the Triangle. denotes ne evil and malicious, fubject to theft and aud. A Star near the right Angles, denotes man perfidious, and much the fame as the. ormer. When in a mans left hand, lookg towards the mount of Mercury, the Ane contains three small parallels, they fignifie velinefs, health, and the like.

The Quadrangle fair and well coloured, notes riches and health, a found judgment, id large memory, with much liberality and mpatiion, but little and difforted the conary: and most whose hands are subject to embling, have the latter fort of Quadranes. If a *Star* happen in the middle, it detes the party a lover of justice, and one at rejoyceth at the prosperity of his Neighbours,

hours, a patriot of his Country, and a proto Religion; the like fignification has a croffif it be large and fair in the place aforefaic. Hifiognomy is a Science that has been of high efteem by Emperors, Kings and "rinces, who fludied it with care and dilimanuferce, as defirous of nothing more than by in his Art, to read men, and by the External university, know and difcover the inmoft fecrets impose their hearts, according to their natural oging nelinations; as likewife the conftitution of me heir bodies, in relation to the humours, difis meafes, or death, fignified or foretold by funand dry marks and fymptoms; nor can any man uffly pretend to skill in Phyfick, if he be leficient herein; and in this cafe the Signs and Planets are greatly fignificant, and have domination and influence chiefly in the fucceeding parts of the body, as thus, the Forehead is governed by Mars, the right Eye by Sol, the left Eye by the Moon, the right Ear by Jupiter, the left by Saturn, the Nofe by Venus, and the Mouth by Mercury. 

Mars Lord of the Afcendant in the Natity of the cholerick, caufes a dusky rednefs, round face, bluith or yellowith eyes, a reatning countenance, a middle ftature, the G_2 fore-

fore-part of the head big, the noftrils flar ing out, going lightly, and taking fhort I ces, of a fiery temper, given to quarrels aa diforders. Mars in the Radix of the Flegm tick, caufes a yellowifh, or rather fomewll inclining to a reddifh countenance, a middl fized vifage, fharp eyes, a broad forehead and a big nofe, inclining to flatnefs, mus given to difcourfe, and inclinable to difco ders. Mars ruling in the Nativity of th Melancholy, caufes a threatning countenance with fundry marks on the face, or on for other part of the body, the hair chefnu colour, the eyes large and yellow, rather clinable to rafhnefs then wifdom. If Man be in the Sanguine Nativity, a thing th rarely happens, it appears by flaxen ha greenish eyes, the features well composed to face round, a bold refolution, large work and much defirous of great atchievement and covetous of fame.

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A Treatife of Fiery Meteors, and their Generation.

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THE Generation of the fiery Imprefio of feen in the Air, called burning Stall ble, or fparkles of Fire, is on this kind, via When the matter of the Exhalation being a Unctious or Oily Vapour extracted from the Earth, by the influence of the Stars, or Beam of the Sun into the higheft Region, and ther being in all parts alike thin, one part take fire before the other can arrive, fo kindled the degrees, it flies abroad like fparkles, or failed ling Stars.

The flying Dragon, or fiery Drake, and the

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her fort of fiery Meteors, is a Body of a raporous matter, afcending to the Region of cold, but by reafon of its grofnefs, not rapable to pafs it; fo that being driven down by the vehementnefs of its agitation, takes ire, forming it felf into the Ihape of a Drason, very fearful to behold, and in the like nature are generated and kindled fires in the Air, refembling Shields, Globes, Bowels, Lamps, Pyramids, and the like, according is they fall into fathion, by reafon of the oppofition they meet, or their fooner or later kindling.

There is a Light feen upon the Earth, caled, Will with the Wish, which in Moorifh or Marshy ground, is feen to go before men in a lark Night, called by the Latins, Ignis Fatuws, or foolifh fire, which is indeed no other but a Vapour kindled by vehement agitation, moving and skipping up & down by the moion or direction of the Air, when through the darkness of the Night, men many times ixing their eyes upon it; they are so dazled is they loose their way, which they foolishy attribute to the power of this Vapour, which indeed has no fuch operation.

There are other flames which appear upon mens beards & hair, as likewife upon Beaft's, thefe are caufed by clammy Vapours fcattered in the Air, and taking fire by their fwift and I 3 vehe-

vehement motion which ingenders fuch heat, that in motion many times Arrows have taken fire, and Bullets have melted.

Comets or Blazing-Stars are no other tharr a huge Mafs of vaporous Unctions, which by reafon of its fubtilty reaches the Region of Fire, and there blazes till the matter than feeds it is confumed : the Train or Tail being the blaze, and the round Head the Bodyy of Fire that continues it, and cannot be feen, where the Sun beams make any impreffion, but is very difcernable when the fhadow off the Earth paffes about it, but for the moft part thefe Exhalations threaten mankind with divers Calamities, appearing as the Beacons off Heaven, to warn the finful World to repent.

CHAP. XLI A Treatife of Airy Impressions, their Nature and Generation, &c.



THE caufe of many Suns and Moons appearing at once, that is the reprefentaon of many, though indeed not real, is, as the first, when the Sun casts a full reflex pon finooth and watery Clouds, and in them npreffes its likeness, so that fometimes here appear two, three, or five Suns in this ature, so are produced the Images of many nall Suns like little Stars, and in like maner are produced the Images of the Moon, een oftner than the former, by reason of her earness to the Earth.

Lightning is caufed by a hot Vapour, acending from the Earth and Water, which h its Afcenfion taking fire, yet not being ble to break through the cold Region, it orces its paffages downward, when meeting with watery cold, it plunges into them, and end them in pieces with horrible Bellowng, which is called Thunder, but when no Clouds interpofe, or at leaft very thin ones, nen are flafhes of Lightning only feen, but no hunder heard; the reafon why the Lighting is fo long feen before the Thunder is eard, is, for that the fence of feeing, is more uick and inftant than that of hearing.

Earthquakes are caufed by Winds in the sowels or hollow Caverns of the Earth, fightng with the heat and opposition they meet I 4 with,

with, fo that ftruggling for vent, they often dat in forcing their way, rend and force the Earthand in funder, and fly forth in prodigious Whirldwind, doing great mifchief. Whirlwindss and properly termed fo, is caufed by a ftrong Vau pour, or Airy Contraction that forces its way, in through a flock of Clouds, without any noifee of Thunder, or flath of Lightning. Another fort there are, called fiery Whirlwindss and which is when a Vapour in fuch a cafe takee fire, which fort overthrows and deftroys all and dry things that oppofe it.

Circles about the Sun and Moon are caused fed by the thick and grofhefs of the Air, for the the Beams being flot direct, reverberate, or do are beaten back, making a round Circle or da Halen, according to the roundnefs of the Dibody of Light which occafions it, and fome rimes it fo falleth cut through the Interport of fition of thin Clouds.

The Rain-bow is caufed by the Suna Beams, darting afcance, or in opposition to a thick and watery Cloud, making the Colours lighter or darker, acccording to the deepness of their penetration.

The natural Winds are caufed by the fud dain and violent motion of the Air, and than directed from the turning of the Sphere. A more or lefs according, and the reafon why it fo often varies and changes, is to purge officient and

and hd carry away the groß Vapours, which would otherways infect the Earth, by cor-

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Hail and Snow are moift Vapours, conduterm led by too near approaching the Region of Circle old. If the Vapour be thick, then it is Hail addier Drifle, if thin and expanded, then it is addres now; if thin and clofe Rime or hoar Froft.

CHAP. XLII.


f the perfect Composition which are in the Nature of things, by which the four Elements are to be confidered.

True it is, that under every Univerfakind of thefe, there are divers particular species diffinct the one from the other; for although ftones may properly enough be termed Earthy, yet are they fometimes nominated of some other Element, which most prevaileth in their composition for doubtlefs all the Elements do meet together in the Procreation of them, but chiefly Earth and Wa-

ter,

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
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
