CHAP. I.

Aqua Regulata, Our Eye Water.

Ake Fennel Water, or White or Damask Rofe Water five quarts; Salt of Vuriol balf an Ounce. Saccharum Saturni, two drachms and an balf: Difolve, digest ten days, and filter through brown Paper : Then take rectified Spirit of Wine fix or Seven Ounces, difolve therein fine Alo:s, choice Opium, of each five drachms; Let it fettle, then decant the clear, and filter it; in this filtred liquor diffolve Campbire five drachms: joyn these two-Liquors together, and add thereto Regulus of Antimony, or Crocus Metallorum in very Jubtle Powder, five Ounces: Shake all well together three or four times a day, for ten or twelve days; then let it feitle, and keep it quiet upon the faces for uf?.

11. This is inferiour to no Eye-Water extant, but is one of the beft Remedies yet known for Blindnefs, dimnefs of the Sight, Pin and Web, Pearls, and moft other Infirmities of the Eyes; it cafes all manner of Pains, and cures Difeafes of the Eye to a miracle.

111. It takes away Suffusions , Clouds Pearls, Bloodthot, only by walking therewith three or four times a day: It cures fore Eyes, running Eyes, falt, hot and tharp Rheums in the Eyes, Ulcers, Fiftulas. Sc. having made feveral fee, who to my knowledge have been long blind. It is a power-

IV. If there be any Sores or Ulcers in the Eyes, you will find the Water the more beneficial, if you diffolve a little Virgin Honey therein, and then use it as aforefaid.

V. It cures all forts of Ulcers in the Mouth, Throat and Noftrils, or in any other part of the Body, whether Scorbutick or Venereal; you may wash the Ulcers with Cotton or Lint dipt in the Water.

VI. It is a moft excellent thing for Ulcers and Sores in the privy parts of Man or Woman, it eafes the Pain, cleanles the part, aftringes, and in a little time compleatly heals the Ulcer only by walking, or injecting of it with a Syringe(fit for those parts) three, four or five times a day.

VII. It is of fingular ufe in eating Pains of the GOUT, repelling of the Humors, and refolving of the tartarous matter, by bathing the part affected therewith Morning and Evening, and applying Stuphes wet therein to the fame.

VIII. It is of excellent ufe againft all manner of Scabs, Puffles, breakings out, Tetters, Ringworms, Morphew, Scurf, Spots, and other deformities of the Skin, by wafhing them with

it fix or feven times a day, for foune days, and applying Cloaths wet in it, over the faid Defects for a few Minutes. Bay-Berries, Funiper-Berries, Gentian, Winter - Cinnamon Famaica Pepper, Black Pepper, Ginger, of each three Ounces: Saf-

IX. Being drawn up the Noftrils, or caft up with a Syringe, it is a good *Errbine* to purge the Head of Flegm, Wind and Water, and eafes the vehement Pains thereof : You may ufe half an Ounce at a time, or more, an hour or an hour and an half before bed-time; it purges ftrongly by the Nofe all watry humors; helps the Lethargy and noife in the Ears, and brings away Catarrhs.

X. The Temples being bathed therewith, and then linnen Cloaths dipt in the fame, and applyed to the part, gives prefent cafe in the moft vehement Headach, allays the force of Frenzies and Madnefs, takes away Watchings and Reftlefinefs, and provokes Sleep and Quietnefs.

XI. Laftly, after due purging, it cures the Gonorrhœa in Men, and the Whites in Women, being injected into the Yard or Womb with a fit Syringe, five or fix times a day. Price twelve pence an Ounce.

CHAP. II.

Aqua Bezoartica, Our Cordial or Plague Water.

I. T Ake Virginia Inake root, Contrayerva, Zedoary.of each fix Ounces: Cinnamon, four Ounces, Cloves, Mace, Nutmegs, Cubebs, Cardamoms, Caraways,

Gentian, Winter - Cinnamon Famaica Pepper, Black Pepper : Ginger, of each three Ounces : Saffron, Cochenele, Limon Peels, Orange Peels (the yellow only) of each two Ounces: Rosemary and Lavender Flowers, Angelica, Barom, Mint, Pennyroyal, Sage, Savory, Time, Sweet Marjoram, of each three bandsfuls: Spirit of Wine three gallons : bruife what are to be bruiled; and digest all together for twelve or fourteen days : then put thereto white Wine four Gallons : distil all in a proper Alembick with its refrigeratory, and draw off three gallons of pure Spirit, which referve: then change the Receiver and draw off two Gallons of a Cordial water. which keep by it felf, and make one half of it into a yrup with fine Sugar. Then take Venice Treacle, Mithridate of each three pounds and a balf, which difforve in the above referved Spirit: digest twenty days, (baking it two or three times a day; then let it fettle, and decant off the clear Tinsture : to the Magma put the other half of the Cordial Water, mix, digest and shake it for twenty days, then decant and mix it with the former Tincture. Mix these Tinctures with the above prepared Syrup, and keep them in a Glass close flopt for use. This if you so please you may perfume with Musk, Ambergrife of each a Scruple.

II. This Water is good in Sadnefs, Melancholy, and dejettion of Mind; is profitable againft Pains and afflictions of the Spleen and Hypochondres. It is a very great Cordial revives all the Spirits, exhilarates, and makes merry a fad and drooping Heart. A 3 III. It

III. It powerfully refifts Poyfon, Plague, fmall-Pox, and all forts of malign Feavers: it cures the biting of all forts of Serpents and other venemous Beafts: it ftrongly provokes the Terms, and is of profitable use in the fits of the Mother.

IV. It is a good Stomachick, comforts the Head, Brain, Nerves and Bowels, by warming them: it caufes a good Appetite to Food, and a ftrong Digeftion, by ftrengthning the internal faculties of the Stomach, expelling Wind, eafing the Colick, and taking away ficknefs at Heart and Stomach.

V. It is a very admirable thing againft Difeafes of the Head and Nerves, as Head-ach, Megrims, Vertigo's, Lethargies, dulnefs, Drowfinefs, Palties, Apoplexies, and the like: and it may be of good ufe, to be continually drunk by fuch as are affected with the Falling Sicknefs, or have any Diftemper proceeding from cold and moilture of the Brain.

VI.At is very profitable againft the flupefaction of the Senfes, Catarrhs, defluxions of Rheum, Rheumatifms, Faintings, Swoonings, fuffocation of the Womb, or Fits of the Mother: it provokes Urine, and is very good againft the Stone, Gravel, or Slime in the Reins and Bladder.

VIII. It cures the biting of Mad Dogs, expels the Poyfon of Vegetables or Animals, quickens the Senfes, reftores the decays of Nature, comforts the Brain, clears the Eye-fight, repairs the weaknefs of the Memory, and brings again the loft Speech.

apart in double Aqua fortis, or the best spirit of Nitre: make a precipitation of the Calces, which you Shall free from the corrofive Spirits of the A.F. or Spirit of Nitre according to Art. These Galces diffolve again apart in Spirit of Honey, or Spirit of Salt; precipitate again and sweeten as aforesaid; from which being mixed together, you Shall three times burn off reltified Spirit of Wine. The Calces thus freetned and dryed, you shall put into a Glass Matrass, upon which you shall affuse our universal Men-Struum fourteen Ounces (which is the Menstruum of the World, and a true difolvent ;) fot them in a philosophick beat, or the Fire of Nature, for twenty four Hours ; fo will it radically diffolve the Calces, and bring them into their first matter : this Difolution decant, filter, and keep it for use Upon the remaining Calx undiffolved (if any be) affuse more of the Men-firuum, which digest, decant and filter as aforefaid. Thus continueing the affusion of new Menstruum, fo long till the mbole Cals is diffolwed, you will have at last, an almost colourles, melles, tafles Liquor, especially if it be mixt with any other Vebicle?? has sad at a soil II. Here is to be noted, that this Menftraum adds little of vertue to the Medicine, but only by accidents, as more perfectly diffolving and opening the Bodies of those feveral Calces, whereby their potestates of powers more

6168 1111 eafily mingle themfelves with the fanguineous mais, and thereby fix their Character upon the habit of the whole Body.

III. By means of this Men-

ftruum, the purging of the Medicine is not only certain, but determined to a certain time; for whereas without this Diffolution, the Particles of the Calx might too clofely adhere to the Tunicles of the Stomach, caufing a continual working, fometimes for two, three or four days together; now no fuch thing can be, by reafon of this liquid form, whereby it is feldom known to work above two, three or four hours at moft.

VI. This Silver-Purge opens all Obstructions of the Bowels, A 4 as

as Lungs, Liver, Spleen, Reins, Womb, Mefentery, and lacteal Veins: but here is to be noted. That it ought to be given in Obftructions of the Lungs for twelve or fixteen days, in fuch a proportion, as it may neither vomit nor purge, and that in all the Liquor the fick drinks, five or fix times aday. In other cafes you may give it in the largeft proportion, that is ht for the Age and ftrength of the perfon.

VII. It cures Agues and Feavers of all forts, at two, three or four times taking, and I have oftentimes cured an Ague with it, at once taking, yea Tertians and Quartans.

X. It carries off the impurities of the Stomach, cleanfes the Blood, reftores it to its courfe and circulation, cherifhes the Heart, revives the vital Spirits, reftores the functions of all the Parts adding to the Body firength and vigour.

XL it perfectly cures the Goar, given in the paroxyfm, fo as it may not work; but when the Paroxyfm or Fit is over, fo as that it may work ftrongly; exhibiting alfo every Night (in the intervals of purging) a Dofe of our Cordial Pills, in Chap. 50 following.

X11. It cures the Scurvy, Dropfie, and Kings-Evil, almoft to a Miracle : fo alfo the Jaundice, Sciatica, Worms, Rickets, in Children ; Confumptions cccafioned through manifold Obftructions, Fits of the Mother, and most other flubborn Difeafes not to be cured by vulgar Medicines.

XIII. It is also eminently good in the cure of all running Sores, old Ulcers, Fiftula's, Pox, &c. in any part of the Body, or proceeding from what caufe foever. It cleanfes the Body, difcharges it of its reculencies, and removes or deftroys the most permicions fymptoms,

XIV: The Dofe and manner of taking in. It is commonly given either as a Diet, whereby the Body is only altered soor with an intention to purge of an a Diet, give two's three, four fix eialit or tendrops at a time, four, five or fix times a day, in Beer, Ale or Wine, according as the fick is in Age and Strength, the XV. If is be given with an intention to purge, give to Infants (quoad capax) from five to ten drops. To Children of four fix, eight, ten or twelve years of Age, from ten to fifteen drops. To Yourb, from ten to fixteen years of Age, from filteen to twenty drops. From fixteen or eighteen to forty fifty or fixty years of Age, from fifty to a hundred drops; which is from about

Tincture of Coral Compound.

I. Ake levigated powder of Coral, affuse thereon most Tharp Spirit of Honey (made of Honey p. j. Jand p. ij. distilled in a (and Furnace) and in twenty four bours the Spirit will be tinged of a deep yellow : decant , and put on more Spirit of Honey, and digest as before, reiterating this till it will tinge no more : then filter the Tinctures, and gently distil off the Spirit to dryness: upon the dry mat ter put the best rectified Spirit of Wine, which digest till it is red : decant and put on fresh, digesting to dryness as before ; this reiterate till all the Tinsture is extracted. Filtrate these Tinclures, and abfract the Spirit by diffillation; then upon the magma affuse new Spirit of Wine, so will you have a pure Tincture, as deep as the redest Wine

a quarter (of the weight of Coral) of pure Oriental Bezoar : Levigate it into a most subtil Powder; and make a Strong Tincture thereof, in the same manner, as before you made the Tincture of Coral. These two Tinctures referve. 3. Take an eighth part (of the weight of Coral) of Saffron, and with the bighest rectified Spirit of Wine extract a very strong and deep tinsture in fix or Jeven days ; filtrate it, and then mix it with the referved tincture of Coral and Bezoar; digest and circulate twenty days, then filtrate it again through brown Paper: fo will you have a glorious tran parent tincture, and as red as Blood, which keep in a Glass close Ropped for use.

II. You may also otherwife extraff a tincture of Coral, by digest. ing the levidated powder thereof in Cyl of Citrons or Limons; which being tinged you may dram off the Oyl, and with the best rectified Spirit of Wine, or Spirit of Wine nitrated, or vitriolated (viz. by digesting equal parts of S. F. and Oyl of Vitriol together, and diffiling in an Alembick in fand with a gentle fire, and then with a ftronger, that they may pass together, reiterating this thrice, and then circulating for forty days :) you may draw the pure red tincture of Coral, for the purpose aforesaid. III. This compound tincture

III. This compound tincture of Coral is fo ftrong and powerful, that it takes away all Impurities from the blood whatfoever, is a great Cordial, and of Wonderful Virtue against all difeases proceeding of putrefaction, being used for fome days: it is fo wonderful an enemy to putrefactorial

You may if you please prepare it with tinsture of Salt of Tartar instead of the restified Spirit of Wine, and it will be yet more excellent and powerful, but a great deal the dearer.

II. This tincture is Cephalick, ftomachick, Cardiack and Hyfterick; alfo fudorifick, carminative, alexipharmick, diuretick, and Anodyne. Decant the clear Opiate tincture into a great Glass holding about fix quarts, which referve. To the Magma of the Opium, put the clear decanted tincture of Saffron, Shaks them well together twice a day for three days, then let the Glass Stand, (as also the third Glass containing the tin-Sture of Castor) three days without Shaking; after which decant the clear tindure of the Saffron from the Opiate Magma, and put it to the tincture of Opium in the great Glass. D looke filings of Steel in Oyl of Vitriol one part, mixed with Water two parts: filter it bot and crystalize: exficcate the Crystals, stirring them continually, fo have you a purple Crocks: extract therefrom a Tinthure with distilled Vinegar; then in Balneo Marix abstract the Vinegar, and edulcorate the remainder, by often drawing from it fair Water, and extract with Spirit of Wine.

II. Or thus: Difolve Filings of Steel in purified juice of Limons, digest for a Month, then filter into a glass Veffel, and in a Sand heat inspifate to the confistence of a liquid Extrate.

III. Or thus: Take Filings of Steel one pound: Sal Armoniack two pound: mix and distil in a Retort, with a gentle Fire at first, then with a stronger: the Magma remaining edulcorate by much washing: then put it into a Cucurbit, and with Spirit of Wine extract a Tincture: decant and put on new Spirit, till the Magma will yield no more Tincture; then abstract the half of the Spirit by an Alembick,

bick, and the Tinsture remaining filtrate through brown Paper, and keep it for use.

IV. Or thus. Take reverberated Filings of Mars one pound; dulcified Spirit of Nitre three pounds; digest them together for two days, or till the Spirit is tinged of a rubicund colour; decant and keep it for use.

V. Or thus. Take filings of Mars a pound; fair Water eight ounces; Oyl of Salt one ounce; digest all together two or three days, Stirring the matter troice a day; then add Crystals of Tartar three ounces, mixed by degrees with a Sufficient quantity of Spring Water; boyl all for two hours, in an iron Pot, always adding fresh Water, as the other evaporates. Being settled, filtrate the clear, and evaporate to the confistence of a thin Syrup; add a balf part of rettified Spirit of Wine, and keep the Tin-Sure for ule.

VI. Or thus. Take ruft of Iron made by dew, twelve ounces; white Fartar two pounds; powder and mix them together, boyl them in a great iron Pot, with two gallons of rain Water for twelve hours; stir with an iron Spatula from time to time, and put in more Water (but boyling bot) as the former confumes; at length let it settle a while, so have you a black Liquor, which is the Tincture. Filtrate and evaporate it in an earthen Pan over a fand heat, to the thickness of a Syrup, or till a pellicule shall arise.

VII. All these preparations of Steel are fingularly good, fo that here is fcarcely any preference: but if one may make an Effimate, the third, fourth and fixth Recipe's are thought to have the precedence, the one being a pure red Tincture; the other a noble Extract, of an admirable fweetnefs in itstaft, being reduced to fuch a thicknefs, that it might keep the better; but the three preferipts, yea, all of them are of one and the fame vertue.

VIII. The Tincture or Extract of Steel, is a very great Aperitive, opens the moft inveterate Obstructions of the Liver, Spleen, Pancreas, Mesentery, Reins and Womb; is a most excellent thing against Cachexies, Dropsies, and stoppage of the Terms, for it sweetens the acid humor, which is the cause of all Obstructions.

The Tinctures may be given from ten drops to forty, and it they be given in a greater Dole, as from half a drachm to a drachm) they move to vomit, expelling both Choler and Flegm; the beft way is to begin with ten or twelve drops, and fo to increase two drops every day; till it moves to Vomit. The laft prefcript may be given from half a drachm to a drachm. Let them be given in Beer, Ale, Wine, or fome convenient Syrup, ievery morning fafting. Price two Shillings fix pence an Ounce.

Take Hyacinth Glass of Antimony levigated one ounce, Spirit of Venus three ounces, digest in a Glass close stopt for fourteen days; Ibaking it once or twice a day, till the Spirit is of a langui neous Colour : decant fo as it may be free from the faces, and distil by a Retort, till it is of the thickness of Oyl; (some say, to dryness) with a gentle fire. To the rubicund matter at bottom put Alchool of S.V. or Philosophick S.V. to overtop it three Inches : digest in a warm place for ten or twelve days; then decant, evaporate to one half, and keep the remaining, (which is the true tin-Eure of Antimony) close Stopt for. Ule. Margrave.

III. Or thus. Take Hartman's Sulpbur of Antimony, extract a tincture from it with spirit of Salt, abstract the Spirit; and extract again with Philosophick S. V. or Tinture of falt of Tartar, till the tincture is deep; then abstract the superfluous part of the Spirit. Salmon.

IV. Or thus. From Antimony in powder, extract a red Tincture with Spirit of Vitriol by digestion in Ashes; then decant and abstract the Spirit in B. M. with a gentle Fire, till the drops be yellow: to the remaining add S.V. rectified; digest, and abstract in B. M. with a gentle Fire, till the drops are yellow again. Faber.

V. Or thus. Take Vitriol calcined to redness, q. v. put to it the Strongest spirit of Vinegar, digest three days in a gentle beat, and decant the Tincture: in this liquor put Crude Antimony q.s. digest till the Menstruum becomes yellow, decant and put on new, mix the Tinctures, and abstract to the thickness of Honey: Then extract the Tincture with the best restified S.V. which abstract in part; keeping the remainder for use. VI. The Tincture of Antimony is one of the moft excellent of Medicines ; and all these are excellent preparations of the same, and indeed the best yet known : but of these the first three excel.

VII. It opens Obstructions, attenuates flime and Tartarous humours in any part of the Body, and ftrongly provokes fweat. bobate the distilled Spirit, and repeat the cohobation three or four times in like manner. So have you a Spirit most wonderfully volatile, and most fragrant and odoriferous, which kept in a Glass very close stopt for use; being taken pro Circulato majori Paracelsi.

I.T Ake powers of Amber, or of Limons, or of Anifeeds, a gallon: Thebian Opium eight ounces: choice Camphir fix ounces: diffolve the Opium and extract the Tincture thereof with the powers first, which being very clear settled, decant off into another Glass, and if you please filter it: in this clear Tincture diffolve the Camphir, by degrees, by grinding it in a pure clean glass Mortar, then mix all together, and keep it for use.

11. This Medicine receives its name from the admirable faculty B 4 which

which it has of eafing Pain, in any part of the Body: and this it performs as well by outward application, as by inwardly taking of it, or upon occasion by both these ways together.

III. In this distillation you must be cautious that your fire be not too great, for if it be, it will force over all the Magma or faces with the Spirit, and then your labour will be lost, and all your work spoiled.

II. This Spirit is of most fubtil and volatile Parts, and a Specifick in all difeates of the Brain whatfoever, as well as in difeates

of the Stomach, Lungs, Liver, Spleen, Reins, Bladder and Womb. It is a Specifick not only against the Stone whether in the Reins or Bladder, which by the assiduous use of it, it radically diffolves, but most powerfully opens all Obstructions in what part of the Body soever.

III. lo bave you first a volatile Salt, then] a fweet flegm : diffolve the Salt in the Phlegm, and referve it. 2. Take the Urine of a found man thirty pounds, the best restified spirit of Wine three pounds : let them ferment together for fix weeks, then add Salt of Tartar a pound : distil by a Vefica; then rectify and dephlegmate the Spirit, and referve it alfo. 3. Take Harts-Horn fawed into small bits, as much as you please, put them into an earthen Record luced, and diffil in a naked fire, so bave you, first, a water with a very thin Oyl : Secondly, a Spirit with Volatile Salt: laftly, a thick red Oyl very stinking: the Spirit redify in [and per fe, till it is very subtil and pure. 4. Take of the first referved Spirit of Sal Armoniack a pound : of the referved Spirit of Urine and Harts-born , of each a quarter of a pound, mix them together, and unite them, by drawing them over together in one distillation.

II. I OF the best Nants Brandy eight quarts : Contrayerva, Virginia Snakeroot, of each fix ounces : Celandine, Rolemary, Aron roots dried, of each three ounces; Camphir, one ounce and half, or two ounces: mix and draw off the Spirit, according to Art; cobobate it again upon the faces, and draw off again, and rectify the Spirit till it is fo subtil as to fire Gunpowder, which keep close stopt for use.

II. This is fo abfolute a thing to beautify the Face and Skin, that it has fcarcely any equal to it in the World. It takes away freckles and fpots of the Face (by long ufing of it) all manner of Pimples, Scurff, Morphew, Dandriff, Sun-burning, or any difcolouring of the Skin, as alfo Herpes, Scurvy fpots, and other breakings out; fo that I am fatisfied (confidering it is no Paint) that there is yet no better walh made in the World.

CHAP. XVII.

Potestates Baccarum Juniperi, Fowers of Juniper Berries.

TAke Juniper Berries forty pounds : bruife them well grains and all : affuse upon them a sufficient quantity of Rain Water and with Sugar, Yest, &c. cause them to ferment : being well fermented, distil therefrom a large quantity of Funiper water, which cobobate three or four leveral times. This water reftify and make an inflammable Spirit, by separating from it all its flegm, which Spirit referve. Take again forty pounds more of Berries, bruifing them as before, putrify them in Rain Water for forty days, till they become a kind of Mucilage, mix it with three times its quantity of Water, and distil it in a Capper Vesica tinn'd within, so will the pure Oyl afcend with the Water (in good quantity) and swim at the top thereof, which jeparate with a funnel. From the Magma Calcin'd extract a Salt, which purify and volatilize : mix the referved Spirit with the Oyl, and Volatile Salt, which perfectly unite by circulation and distillation according to Art; Jo have you the Powers of Juniper Berries very pure, clear, transparent and volatile, which keep in a glass close stopt for use.

11. The Powers of Juniper Berries are of admirable use in the Colick, griping of the Guts, Wind, concretions of Sand or Gravel and flime in the Reins, Ureters, and Bladder: they ease vehement pains, and open all man,

Strongly impregnated with the Volatile Salt, draw off the Spirit, and cobobste upon the remaining matter (if any be) [even times, fo will you have a most [ubiil Spirit impregnated strongly with the Volatile Salt: Take of this Spirit twenty ounces, of the Oyl of Hartsborn purely restified five ounses, mix them together, and digest a month in a very gentle heat: then draw them off by distillation in a glass Alembick, in Balneo, jo will they be perfectly united, and the Powers of the Hants-born will be intire, which keep in a Glass close Stopt for uses!

II. I had not inferted this medicament into this Book, had it not been for its admirable excellency/in curing fits of the Mother, the which I have known it do in feveral perfons, only by touching their Noftrils with two or three drops thereof: and in this difeafe it does that in two or three minutes time, which will not be done in fome hours, by another Medicine: it brings out of the fit almost in a moment.

CHAP. XX.

111. They give eafe in the Colick, and gripings of the Bowels, expel Wind, are helpful in the Dyfury, and Strangury provoke the Terms, and haften the birth. They abate tumors of the Spleen, and pains of the fides and ftomach by outward bathing.

CHAP. XXI.

Potestates Lavendulæ : Powers of Lavender.

I. B Ruife the Herb and Flowers well, and adding a sufficient quantity of Rain Water, with Sugar and Yest, cause it to ferment; which done, draw off an inflammable Spirit after many Cobobations, which perfectly deflegmate, and reserve it. Then take the same quantity of fresh Herbs and Flowers, bruise them, and sleep them twenty four hours or more, in warm Water, adding to every pound of the bruised matter six pounds of Water; then distil by a Vesica or Alembisk,

and separate the Oyl from the Water, which reserve also. Lastly, from both the Fæces calcin'd, extrast a Salt, which purify and volatilize, and mix it with the before reserved Spirit and Oyl, which unite by digestion, Circulation and Distillation: so have you Powers of Lavender.

II. The Virtues of these Powers are many and great, both for inward and outward Diseafes; especially in those distempers proceeding from cold and moisture, whether in the Head, Brain, Nerves, Stomach, Liver, Bowels, Mesentery, or Womb: They cure old Aches, and pains, though of long ftanding. 11

A Ake the Amber into most 1.1 Jubiil powder, put it into the best Philosophick Spirit of Wine; digest in Balneo Mariæ for fifteen days : then distil, first with a gentle fire; so have you a piercing Spirit, afterwards a yellow Oyl which mixes with the Spirit, then a red Oyl which jettles to the bottom, and is to be reltified three or four times. From the Caput Mortuum calcined extract a Salt which purify and volatilize ; then joyn the Spirit, rectified Oyl, and Volatile Salt together, which circulate till they are united, and let them be drawn over in one dift llation.

II. Or thus. Take Amber in fine powder one pound, affuse upon it Spirit or rather Powers of Turpentine two pounds or more, digest in Balneo Marize for fifteen days,

then difil with a gentle fire, and cobobate, digefting four days: diftil again first with a gentle fire, fo will the fubtil Spirit alcend; then increase the fire, and continue the distillation till no more will arise; so will a red Oyl lye at the bottom. From the faces as before extract the Salt, which purify and volatilize, and joyn with the Spirit and Oyl; circulate then for a month, and perfectly unite them by drawing them over in one distillation.

III. Or Thus. Take Amber in fine powder a pound : rectified Spirit of Limons a quart ; put all into a Glass Recort well luted, to which fit a large Receiver without luting, lest the Vapours should break it : give fire gradatim , and at last a fire of suppression, to drive out the Oyl with the Spirit, which continue till no more Clouds appear in the Receiver : rectify the Oyl, and free the Spirit from all imaginable flegm. From the Caput Mortuum extract a Salt, which purify and volatilize : mix the Spirit, Oyl, and Salt together, circulate, and draw them over in one distillation. that they may be perfectly united.

IV. The powers of Amber are moft admirable againft all cold and moift difeafes of the Head, Brain, Nerves, and Womb: They cure head-achs, Megrims, Vertigo's, Lethargies, dulnefs, droufinefs, fleepinefs, and all other pituitous diffempers of the Brain. Elixir Proprietatis noftrum : Our Elixir of Property.

I.TAke Tindure of Antimony, or Philosophick Spirit of Wine, a Gallon: choice English Saffron four ounces : mix and extract therewith a substantial Tincture : In this tincture (drawn off from the Saffron) put Powder of fat Myrrb four ounces: digest ten days, Shaking the glass two or three times every day; being well setled, decant the clear Tincture and referve it. Then take Tincture of Sena made with Spirit of Aniseeds or Caraways, or Philosophick S. V. a quart or more ; choice Aloes Succotrina in Powder two pounds : disolve the Aloes in the Tincture of Sena by degrees, which done, mix it with the former referved Tincture : digest twenty days in a very gentle beat, shaking the Glass two or three times a day : then being well fettled, decant off the clear Tincture into another Glass, and keep it close stops for ue.

II. This is an excellent Medicine, of hot and thin parts, orens all manner of Obstructions,

CHAP. XXXI.

Elixir de Sulphure: Our Elixir of Sulphur.

I. TAke of the best Oyl, of Sulphur per Campanam, exactly restified, and freed from all flegm, twelve,ounces : Of the Strongest and best rectified Oyl of Vitriol fix ounces: Chymical Oyls of Rosemary, Lavender, Limons, Aniseeds, Cloves, Juniper Berries, Sagafras, of each two drachms; mix all together, the Oyls of Sulphur and Vitriol first: then the other Oyls (first mixt together) by degrees let it be done in a large Gally-pot, and slir them continually, till they are united, and of an opacous or dark red colour almost black. Then add thereto two quarts of the best rectified Spirit of Wine, Shake them well together, digest twenty days in a gentle heat; then filter it through brown Faper, and keep it for use. This is an excellent Menstruum to draw an admirable tinsture of Opium withal, of which may be made a famous liquid Laudanum.

II. It cures Coughs, Afthma's, Ulcers of the Lungs, fpitting of Blood, and all external wounds, (if the wound be firft cleanfed with Spirit of Wine) and that for the moft part at once dreffing; and eafes moft external pains by bathing.

III. It is a good diuretick, and a great cooler, purifies the Blood, refifts corruption and putrefaction of the Humours; cures all forts

II. The intention of this Syrup was to open Obstructions ofthe Viscera, chiefly of the Reins and Bladder, and to diffolve, expel, and bring away fmall Stones, Gravel, Sand, Slime, coagulated Blood, or any other matter which may obstruct or stop those pallages.

CHAP. XXXV.

Syrupus Elaterii : Syrup of Wild Cucumbers.

I. T Ake the juyce of the Wild Cucumber (of which Elaterium is made) by beating them together in a Stone Mortar, and straining it out through a hair Bag by belp of a press; then depurate it: and boyl it into a Syrup with double its weight of white Sugar. Being almost half cold, strain it through Hippocrates his Sleeve, and keep it in Glasses or Pots tyed over with Leather for use.

II. This is a powerful and prevalent remedy, againft the Scurvy, Droply, and Gout, and the beft and moft effectual purge in the Vegetable Kingdom, purging and carrying off all forts of Putrid humors, chiefly flegm and watery Humors, whereby it gives a general relief to the whole Body oppreft with unnatural matter.

III. And by reafon it is found fo effectual a remedy, to free the whole Body from cold pituitous and watery humours, therefore it is alfo good againft Head-achs, Apoplexies, Falling-ficknefs, Carus, Vertigo, Lethargy, Madnefs, and all cold and moift affects of the Brain.

IV. I commend this Syrup as a most excellent purge, to be

generally used in all Families, and as a general Remedy where purging is neceffary, for that it purges both briskly and fafely, and may be exhibited to old or young in all cafes where purging is required, for that it purges all humors, and that from all parts of the Body.

II. It is a Salt of very volatile parts, digefting and cleanfing; it opens all manner of Obftructions in any part of the Body, and is a great refolver of all Slimy, Vifcous, and Tartarous matter, from whence proceed the Sciatica, Rheumatifm, Gout, Scirrhus of the Liver and Spleen, Agues, Sc.

I.T Ake the purest Salt of Tartar as much as you please, or if you please, instead thereof Oleum Tartari per deliquium: affuse thereon the best Oyl of Vitriol a sufficient quantity, viz. so much till you see the Ebullition ceases, which you may know by stirring the matter: then gently evaporate away the humidity to dryness, continually stirring of it in the evaporation with a wooden Spatula, but especially when it begins to grow dry, so will you have a most pure white Salt, which keep for use.

II. After the same manner may you vitriolate lapis prunellæ: or you may prepare it by the affassion of Spirit of Niter in like manner; so will the Salt be Nitrated, white and pure as the former, and having the same properties and virtues.

III. These two Medicaments are both of a nature, and serve both to the same ends and intentions; they cause digestion, ftrengthen the stomach, and cause a good appetite, dissolve Tartar in the Body, and open all obstructions what sever, curing Feavers, Green-sickness, stoppage of the Terms, Quartans, Co.

1V. They are indeed famous openers of obstructions; they provoke Urine, open all the Uri-

nary paffages, diffolve the Stone, and all Tartarous coagulations in the Body, and expel them being diffolved.

1. T Ake Venetian Corrosive sublimate, powder it, to which put an equal weight of purged Quick-silver; incorporate them by beating or grinding in a Marble Mortar, so long till the Quicksilver cannot be seen, to which put so much Spirit of Vinegar, as may

make the powder wet or only moist put it into a small long neck'd Matrass, but of that bigness, that there may be at least five parts empty when the matter is in ; let it not be luted, that you may see to the bottom, which place above the middle in Sand ; put first a gentle fire under it, then encrease it by degrees six bours, that the Mercury may be driven from the bottom into the middle concavity of the Matrass; which being separated from that at top and bot tom, reduce it into small Powder, sublime it the second time, and the third time, repeating the operation to the fixth time (but abating the quantity of crude Mercury) till it bas lost its acrimony, is freed from all impurity, and becomes white as Snow.

II. This is a fpecifick and great fecret against the French Pox, Gonorrhœa, or running of the Reins, and all other venereal Symptoms, as Boils, Botches, Scabs, Nodes, Tophs, Gums, Scurf, Morphew, Pocky Leprofy, Ulcers, Sores, Cankers, nocturnal pains, and curing them if wifely used, to a wonder.

It is beftmixt with fome purging extract or powder, and fo made up into Pills, or a Bolus, with the pap of an Apple, ftewed Prúne, Honey, Gc. and fo taken at night going to bed, or after midnight, which is better : but if the fick has an eafy body to work upon, then it will be beft given early in the morning.

IX. But I often give it alone in very fabtil powder over night in Conferve of Rofes, or a little Syrup, and then the next morning exhibit a proper purge againft the diftemper; and fo repeat the fame in like manner again every third or fourth day, for ten or twelve times, or fo long as I fee occafion.

X. If it be taken to flux withal, you may give it from a fcruple to a dram, augmenting the dofe for four days together, with care and observation, as in that method is required. Where note, that it ought to be levigated into a most impalpable powder before it is given. Price two fhillings fix pence an ounce.

CAAP. XLI.

Aurum Vitæ: Vital Gold.

I. T Ake filings of fine Gold one ounce: diffolve it in Aqua Regis four ounces; and keep the Solution hot. Take Quick-filver four ounces; diffolve it in Spirit of Niter twelve ounces; mix them till they are black. Distil the mixture

II. Take filings of fine Gold one ounce: diffolve it in A.R. four ounces: TakeQuickfilver two ounces : diffolve it in fix ounces of good A.F. Take Butter of Antimony twelve ounces, diffolve it in Bezoardick Spirit of Salt; mix all these Solutions together, and abstract the Menstruums by degrees in a Glass Retort, often Cobobating: add fresh Spirit of Salt, or Spirit of Niter, abstract, and cobobate often. Then with a gentle Calcination, bring it to a reddish coloured pouder. This is Aurum Vitæ Sudorifick ; Or, Bezoar mineral with Gold.

V. CHAP. XLII.

Angelus Mineralis: Our Angel. Or Sudorifick Mercury.

I. TAke Quick-filver purified from all its filth, ten ounces : fine Gold purified by Antimony one ounce: mix and make an Amalgama, which put into a Retort, on an Earthen Capel, with an Ash-heat : cover it with another Earthen Pan. affixing a large receiver without Luting, make a fire in your Furnace, which increase Gradatim. When the Q is distilled from the (), let the fire go out of it felt, and all cool; then take the O out, powder it in a Glass Mortar, and Amalgamate it again with the Quick-filver, which put into the Retort, and distil as before : this work repeat o often till the () and Q will no more Amalgamate. Now note, that you cast away no powder which you may think to be faces, for then you will lose your Medicine. Tour (now much encreased in weight) beat again into subtil powder, which wash in distilled rain Water, in the Mortar with the Pestle, till the Water is bluish black, which decant, and referve: wash again in like manner, decanting and reserving of it; so often till the water will be no more blue. And these works of Amalgamating, distilling and washing, so often repeat, till all the Anima is extracted out of the Q; and that the o and Q will

will Amalgamate, though after a thou and distillations. These referved Waters, being mixed together, and well ferled; decant the clear from the pouder, which dry in a gentle fand beat. The decanted Waters evaporate in a very gentle fand beat alfo, to dryness, so will you have another pouden, which mix with the former ; This mixture put into a listle Glass Cucurbit, and distil off from it Aqua Ovorum five or fix times; till the powder becomes Red. Put it now into a broad bottomed Glass, narrow at mouth, and fo on to the belly of it, feal it up Hermetically, letting it cover the bottom of the Glass, as exactly as may be of a thickness: digest thirty days in Sand, first with a Gentle fire, and after with a stronger, increasing the beat by degrees. Then distil off from it the best S. V. five or fix times, fo have you the mineral Angel, and a Sudorifick Q which is one of the greatest Medicines that can be made out of the Mineral Kingdom.

II. Or thus. Take Hungarian Quick-filver, or the best purified I three ounces ! fine Gold purified by Antimony, an ounce and balf: mix and make an Amalgama. Put this into a Glass Cucurbit, or bolt bead, two or three foot high, whose interiour part let be large, and broad, but the superiour part narrow and long. Digest with a gentle heat forty days, and let the fire be gentle and continual; so will the Amalgama be surned into a rubicund pouder : mix this pouder with Aqua Ovorum twelve ounces, which digest for a Month, afterward distil by an Alembick with sewen Cobobations, augmenting the fire towards the end, that the pou-

der may be fufficiently dryed. Then for fifteen days circulate with rectified S. V. in a gentle fand heat; and abstract the Spirit by distillation: fo have you the Angelus Mineralis, Or, Sudorifick Mercury.

III. Aqua Ovorum. Take one bundred Eggs hard boyled; bruife them and diffil in an Alembick-per Cineres, very gently to drynefs: the faces calcine and reverberate; put them into a Retort, and affufe on them the former water: diffil per arenam with a firong fire, cohobating five or fix times. Or thus. R. Spirit of Vinegar lb. 2. fiegm of Alum lb. fs. Calx of Eggshels reverberated fix ounces: mix and difiil to drynes.

IV. This Angelus is the higheft Alcalie that can be prepared in Nature, whether in the Vegetable, Animal, or Mineral Kingdoms; and performs more in iweetning the Blood, than common Bezoar mineral, or any other preparation whatfoever.

V. Its chief ule is in relifting the venom and poyfon of the French Pox, Pocky Gonorrhæa, Leprofy, Elephantiafis, and Cancers, or the malignity of other inreterate and poyfonous Difeafes: and is profitable against the Dropfy. Faundice, and Kings-Evil:

VI. It cures inveterate and virulent Ulcers, and running fores, whether proceeding from the Pox or otherwife, being inwardly taken, and outwardly applyed over the naked Ulcer dry, with a little lint, waihing the fame every time with our *Regulata*. VII. It is prevalent againft the Scurvy, and all Tartarous difeafes of the Blood and Hu-B mors;

mors; wholly deftroying that matter which breeds the Stone in the Reins and Bladder, or frony Concretions in the Joynts, in the Gout: So that in preventing those Difeases, it excells all other Remedies.

VIII. It kills Worms whether in Young or Old, moft effectually : and gives cafe in all forts of intolerable dolors or pains, whether internal or external; yea, though in the moft remote parts of the Body, whether proceeding from the Scurvy, Gout, or Pox, or from any other caule what foever: It performs its work in these Cases, even to admiration, and where Opium has been applyed in vain, as in Nocturnal pains in the Arms, Shoulders, Shin-bones, Sc.

IX. It is a prevalent Antidote against the Measles, Small-Pox, burning Feavers, Calentures, sported Feavers, Plague, pestilential Feavers, or any other malign distemper; in all which it does wonders, refists the Infection, overcomes the Putrefaction and Poyfon, and performs more in those diseases than any other Antidote whatfoever.

X. It is a high preparation of Mercury, and infinitely fafe; I have given it an hundred days together in Poxes, Leprofies, and other Defædations of the Skin, without fo much as once purging between whiles, it is fo innocent, which cannot be done with any other preparation of Mercury befides this that I know of. Norhave I yet obferved any evil-Symptoms after the ufe of it, although I have given It elievemore

than ten thousand doles of it. XI. It is a powerful fweating Medicine, if given at night in bed, and the Sick be difpoled for that purpole. And it is for the most part given Dietetically in the French Pox, pocky Gonorrbæa, Leprofy, Scurvy, or Gout, for forty, fixty, ninety or an hundred days together. But in this cafe the Sick ought to purge with fome proper Purge, once in eight or ten days, to carry off the excreted Morbifick matter.

XII. The Dole and way of using of it. You may give from ten to twenty, or thirty Grains or more; according to Age and Strength. It may be taken in a little Syrup, or in a Bolus, or Pill, which may be washt down with a little Ale or Wine. It has no fensible Operation, unless you defign it for fweating, nor need the Sick use any order of diet, but only temperance. But when it is used against Poxes, Leprofies, Kings-Evil or other breakings out of the Skin, the Patient will do well to bath outwardly with our Powers of Mercury, once or twice a day, as we have directed in Chap. 24. aforegoing. And when it is given in aGonorrhea, Our Aqua Regulata at Chap. 1. ought also to be injected into the Yard, three, four, five, or Itx times a day, as there directed. Price fifty foillings an ounce.

II. This is a real and true Arcanum against the French Pox, and virulent Gonorrhœa, and all the dependencies and evil Symptoms; for it deftroys the Poylon and malignity of the Difeafe, and univerfally carries away what is malignant and hurtful, evacuating all manner of filth and corruption in the whole Body.

111. VI. It is a wonderful thing againft a flubborn and inveterate, Kings-Evil, Gout, Droply, Leprofy ; against rebellious Agues , vehement Catarrhs, Uc. It kills Worms in the Stomach, and those which are generated in the Bowels and Intestinum redum. It is a good Medicine, and ought to be effected as a Jewel.

VII. But the white precipitate is thus made: Take Quick-filver purified, or driven from Sea Salt in a Retort, one pound : Aqua fortis, (made of Vitriol, two parts, Niter one part) two pounds : make a diffolution according to Art : in a long necked matrafs, and becareful to avoid the fumes; in the mean feason prepare a Brine of Sea Salt and fair Water, which filirate, and put your folution of Mercury into it, so will a white Powder immediately precipitate, which is to be walked from all its Acrimony in warm Spring Water filtrated, then dry it: and keep it for ufe. Where note that if you use Spirit of Niter instead of the A. F. it will be the eafier dulcified : allo that the Matrals be of such a magnitude, as it may not be half full, left the ebulition should be so great, as to make the matter run over.

VIII. The Dole and may of taking it. The White pracipitate is given from four Grains to ten ; but Mr. Wileman has often give E 2 12

it from ten to twenty fix Grains, the Arcanum Coralinum from two Grains to eight, ten or twelve, mixt with fome proper Purge, let it be given in the morning, and once every fecond, third, or fourth day, with observation and care. CHAP. XLIV.

Pulvis Regalis nofter : Our Royal Pouder.

I. Ake Scammony, Cambogia, of each two ounces: Refin of Jalap, Tartar Emetick of Mynficht, of each an ounce: Elaterium, Cloves, Nutmegs, Zedoary, Cinnamon, of each two drams and a helf, make each into a fine Pouder a part, then mix them together, and keep them in a Glass close flopt.

II. It is a moft admirable thing for a Panchymagogue or Univerfal purger; fo that very few things exceed it : it purges and carries off by Stool, but fometimes by Vomit alfo, if the Stomach be very foul, all humours whether thick or thin, and may be given to both Sexes, whether Young or Old, little Infants excepted, becaufe of its fubftantial working.

III. I commend the use hereof in the Gout, Sciatica, Dropfy, and Jaundice, beyond most other Purges; for in these Discases I have had large experience thereof: I once cured a Woman of a most extream and inveterate Sciatica with four Doses of it, given

every third or fourth day, taking also in the Interval of Purging our Cordial Pills in *Chap*. 50. following, and bathing the part twice a day with the powers of Turpentine.

CHAP. XLV.

Pulvis Antifebriticus nofter : Our Pouder against Feavers.

I. Ake Antimony five parts : Common Salt four parts : Salt of Tartar one part; make all into a most subtil pouder: put it by spoonfuls into a Crucible red fire bot, and when it flows like water, take it off, so will you have at bottom, an Antifebritick Regulus which, being washed from the Salts, vomits not at all. Take of this Regulus twelve ounces, of the Pulvis Bezoardicus in the following Chapter, three ounces: the Regulus being in fine Pouder, mix them, and keep it close in a Box with Screws for use, or in a Glass stopt close with a Cork.

II. This is a famous Medicament against Feavers of all forts, having fearcely any equal. I have given it more than two hundred times with unparallel'd fuccess : it takes off the Feaver beyond expectation at three or E 3 four

four timestaking, and fometimes with a fingle Dofe, as if it was done by Incantation: nor can I tell that ever I gave it in a Feaver in vain. I communicated it to a worthy Gentleman, a Doftor of Phylick, who by Letter gave me this following account of it.

I. TAke Bezoar Mineral, Bezoar Oniental, Bezoar Animal, of each one ounce: Cochinele, Saffron, Volatil Sal Armoniack, of each two Drams: Camphir, Volatile Salt of Harts-horn, of each one Dram: all being in subtil Powder, mix them, and keep them close in a Glass, or in a Box with a screw.

H. This is an excellent Antidote against the Plague, all Pestilential and malign Feavers, as the Measles, small Pox, Purples, or spotted Feaver, the Calenture, and all other burning and continual Feavers whatsoever. It cures Agues of all sorts, whether Quotidian, Tertian, or Quartan, single or double, being given before the Fit, so long as the Sick may fall into a sweat before the cold Fit comes on.

III. I. TAke pouder of Vipers ten ounces: Opium extracted, Strained and inspissated with juice of Limons, eight Ounces: Campbire. fix ounces : Bezoar mineral, Saffron, Cochinele, Contrayerva, Virginian. Snakeroot ; Ginnamon , Cloves , Mace, Nutmegs, Zedoary, Cubebs, of each four ounces : Myrrb, Aloes, Ginger, Pepper, Cardamoms, Spiknard, Bayberries, Winters Bark, Elecampane, Castoreum, volatil Salt of Amber, oyl of Nutmegs by expression, of each two ounces: Chymical oyl of Anifeeds, Caraways, Cloves, Lavender, Pennyroyal, Rolemary, Sage and Wormwood, of each one ounce: Virgin Honey, melliginous extract of Funiper Berries, of each eleven pounds and a balf, these things being in (ubtle Pouder, which ought to be powdred, mix them over a gentle Fire, and make an Electuary according to Art.

II. This Antidote or Treacle has all the Virtues of Mitbridate or Venice Treacle; and much more

Take Spanish juice of Liquorice, juyce of Alkermes, solid extracts of Elecampane, Gentian, Bayberries and Zedoary, of each two ounces; diffolve them in fo much Spirit of Wine, as may make them of the tbickness of Honey. 3. Take white Poppy Seed, Contrayerva, Virginian Snakeroot, Indian Spikenard, Myrrb, Ginger, Pearl, Coral, Cochinele, red Coral, Bezoarstone, volatile sal Armoniack, of each two ounces : Musk and Ambergrife, of each one drachm, make all into a fine impalpable Pouder, according to Art, which mix with Bezoar Minerale, Bezoar Solare, & Bezoar Animale, of each two ounces. 4. Take Chymical Oyls of Anije, Saffafras, Caraways, Juniper, Rhodium, Cloves, Rosemary, Amber, Cinnamon and Roles, of

each an ounce; in which diffolve Camphir four ounces; with which mix Oyl of Nutmegs by expression, Balm of Gilead, Estence of Vipers, of each two ounces. 5. Take clarified Honey twelve pounds, put to it the disolved Opium, &c. then the disolved extracts, mixing them well; after sprinkle in the Pouders, stirring them exquisitely over a gentle heat, which may melt the Honey: Lassly, adding the Chymical Oyl, let them be also perfectly mixed, and compleat the Electuary according to Art.







XX. As to the Dole of it, you may begin with one Grain (according to age and frength,) and fo increase the dose half a Grain every fourth or fifth day, till fuch time (if the necessity and vehemency of the Difease require it as it is augmented to a fcruple or more, for by this gradual increase, the dose is given without danger: and having come to the higheft Dofe, you may continue it as many days or weeks as you fee need for; and then gradually again to diminish half a grain at a time, till you come to the loweft Duse again.

TAke Extract of Liquorice , white Sugar Candy, Lozenges of Sugar pearled, of each one pound: Extract of Hyjop, balf a pound, Las Sulphuris, Crystals of Nitre (made by difolution in Spirit of Nitre) of each a quarter of a pound: Sugared Crystal Mineral, Ginger in Jubile Powder, of each two ounces : Oyl of Cloves, an ounce: Oyl of sweet Fennel Seeds, half an ounce : mix them then if you please with glair of Eggs, a sufficient quantity, make a Mass, which form into little Pills, Rouls or Lozenges, according to Art, and fo dry them.



Note the Camphir must first be difolved in Spirit.

VIII. XII, The Dole and manner of taking it. In difeases of the Head, Brain, and Nerves, drop it upon white Sugar, and give it in Rolemary or Cinnamon Water . or in Canary. For the Stone, and other difeafes of the Reins and Bladder, you may give it in White or Rhenish Wine. For the Colick, and difeales of the Bowels, you may give it in FuniperWater. Or our Aqua Bezoardica. For Palfies, Gouts and weaknels of the Nerves and Joynts, you may give it in fome Antiparalytick Wine. If the Sick cannot take it in any proper Wine or Water, it may be mixt with any proper Syrup, and fo fwallowed, drinking a glafs of the laid Waters or Wine after it.

XIII. If it cannot be fo taken, it may be made up into a Bolus with fome Conferve or Electuary; or into Pills with fome fit pouder, as of Bay-berries, Cinnamon, Cubebs, Nutmegs, Zedoary, or what the Phyfician shall think more proper, and fo gilded : for by this means it will be taken without nauleating. You may give it from half a dram to two drams, yea, to three drams, viz. from 10. drops to 60. drops according to age and ftrength, but then you ought to encreafe the. dole by degrees ; and it may be given morning and night for a Month, or two, or three, as you shall fee occasion, and that without any prejudice.

CHAP. LXI.

Vehicula Generalia: General Vehicles for conveying the foregoing Medicaments into the Body.

I. T / Ehicles for the conveying of Medicaments down the Throat into the Body, are either Natural, and always ready at hand ; or Artificial, and to be prepared for fuch like occafions : and each of these are again either Liquid or more Solid.

II. Those which are Liquid and always ready at hand are. 1. Fair Water. 2. Lime Water. 3. Beer or Ale. 4. Metheglin. 5. Wines, as French, Rhenifb, Mallago, Sherry, Canary. The more folid Vehicles are. 1. The yolk of an Egg. 2. Honey. 3. Pulp of an Apple. 4. Pulp of Prunes. 5. Wafers, or White-bread. Where note, that where fair Water is used for aVehicle, it may be fweetned with fine Sugar, if the fick fo pleafes.

111. The Liquid Artificial Vehicles are. 1. Hippocras. 2. Syrupus Sacchari. 3. Syrupus Volatilis. 4. Syrup of Limons or Vinegar. 5. Cinnamon Water. The more folid Vehicles are. I. Saccharum Tabulatum. 2. Conferve of Barberries. 3. Sapa fimplex. 4. Diacydonium. 5. Diamorum.

IV. To make the Hippocras an forenamed.

forenamed. Take choice Canary , 1 white Wine, of each fix quarts : Cinnamon two ounces : Cortex 4) d. Winteram half an ounce. Cloves Mace, Nutmegs, Ginger, Galangal, of each a drachm: fine Sugar, forty ounces : digeft clofe ftopt for two or three days: then decant-the clear, and bottle it up.

V. Syrupus Sauchari. Take Damask role water, or Spring wa-W. tera Gallon : fine Sugar fixteen pounds : mix, and make a Syrup by melting the Sugar : to which add spirit of Wine a quart, shake them well together in a glafs, and keep the mixture for ufe.

> VI. Syrupus Volatilis. Take the beft rectified spirit of Wine a gallon: white Sugar as much as the Spirit will diffolve over a gentle heat : being mixt and diffolved, keep the Syrup for ule.

> VII. Syrup of Limons or Vinegar. Take the beft white-Wine-Vinegar, or juyce of Limons a gailon : double refined Sugar fixteen pounds: mix, melt and make a Syrup by a gentle ebullition.

VIII. Cinnamon Water. Take rectified Spirit of Wine three pints: Cinnamon bruifed: four ounces: infule them together for a week in a large Glass close ftopt, fhaking the Glafs twice a day: then take Damask Rofe Water three pints ; diffolve therein white Sugar-Candy three quarters of a pound : mix both these liquors together ; and hang therein Musk, eight or ten grains (in fine powder, and tyed up in a Rag).

IX. Saccharum Tabulatum. Take Damask Role-Water, or Spring

Water, two quarts, Gum Tragacanth an ounce, diffolve it in the water : pure fine Sugar eight pounds: boyl them together to double the thickness of a Syrup.

X. Conferve or Rob of Barberries. Take juyce of Barberries ftrained fix pounds : white Sugar three pounds: with a gentle heat (if it may be of a B. M) boyl to the just thickness.

XI. Sapa simplex. Take Wine newly prefled from white and ripe Grapes; boyl it fo long over the Fire till two third parts are confumed, or till it is as thick as Honey, and then keep it for ule. Where note, That if you add a fixth part of white Sugar, the Sapa will be never the worfe.

XII. Diacydonium. Take juyce of Quinces depurated fix quarts ; boyl it to the confumption of four quarts: then add a pound of fine white Sugar, and by repeating the boyling, make Quiddony, which keep clofe tyed over for ule.

XIII. Diamorum. Take juyce of Mulberries twelve quarts : fine white Sugar three pounds : or inftead thereof as much Honey: clarifie the juyce, and boyl to a Rob or Quiddony : which keep in a Gally pot close tyed over with Parchment or a Bladder, for ufe.

XIV. Alfo in the ufe of thefe things observe, 1. That you give all Medicaments of an Alcalious Nature in a fweet Vehicle, not in a tart or fowre. 2. That no acid Vehicle be made ale of in the exhibition of Mercurials, left you provoke the Dragon to an unufual Violence. 3. That Opi-ALMS
