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
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












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

Orders thought meete by her Maiestie and her privie Counsel, to be executed throughout the Counties of this Realme, in such Townes, Villages, and other places as are, or may be hereaster insected with the plague, for the stay of surther increase of the same.



N primis, all the Justices in every Counts tie, aswell within the tiberties as without, immediatly upon knowledge to them given, shall assemble themselves together at some one generall place accustomed, being cleare from infection of the plague, to consult howe these opers following may be buely put in execution, not meaning that any Justices divelling in 03 neere places infected, shall come this ther whiles their comming may be doubtful. And as-

certheir first generall assembly, they shall make a distribution of themselves to sunday limits and divisions, as in other common services of the Countie they are accustomed to doe for the prosecution thereof.

- richt they that inquire, and presently informe themselves by all good meanes, what Townes and Uillages are at the time of such assemblie infected within everie their Counties, and in what Hundred or other division, the said Townes and Uillages are, and howe many of the same places so infected are corporate Townes, market Townes and Uillages, and shall consider of what wealth the inhabitants of the same Townes and Parishes are, to be hable to relieve the poore that are or shall be infected, and to be restrained in their houses.
- 3 Item, thereupon after conference vied according to the necellitie of the 3 cause, they shall denise and make a generall taxation, either by charging the Towns infected with one fumme in groffe, or by charging the special persons of wealth within the fame, to be forthwith collected for the rate of one moneth at the first, and so if the licknesse thall continue, the collection of the like summe, or of more or of lelle, as time and cause that require, and the same to be every first, fecond, third, or fourth weeke emploied to & for the execution of the faid orders. And in case some of the saide Townes infected thall manifellly appeare not to be of fufficient habilitie to contribute fufficient for p charges requilite, then the taxas tion of collection thall be made of further extended to other parts, of in any other further limittes, as by them thall be thought requifice where there thall be any fuch Townes of Hillages fo infected, and bnable to relieue themfelnes, And if the fato Townes be feimated in the borders and confines of any other thire, then as the Justices that fee cause and neede for the greatnesse of the charge requilite, that the partes of the Shire iopning to the Townes infected be not A.ii. hables

Orders to be obserued,

hable, they that write their letters to the next Austices of the other Shire so confining, to procure by collection some reliefe, as in like cases they are to relieve them, in respect of neere neighbourhood of the place, and so, that the same infection may be the better stayed from the said adiopning places, though they be separated by name of the Councie.

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- 4 Item, they shall cause to be appointed in every Parish as well infected as not infected, certaine persons to viewe the bodies of all such as shall die, before they bee suffered to bee buried, and to certifie the Pinister of the Church and Churchwarden, or other principal officers, or their substitutes, of what probable disease the said persons died: and the said viewers, to have weekely some allowance, the more large allowance where the Townes or Parishes be infected, during the infection, towards their maintenance, to the end they which shall be in places infected, may sorbeare to resorting the company of others that are sounder and those persons to bee sworne to make true report according to their knowledge, and the choise of them to be made by direction of the Curate of the Church, with three or source substantial men of the Parish. And in case the said viewers either through saudur or corruption, shall give wrong certificate, or shall resuse to serve being thereto appointed, then to cause them to be punished by imprisonment, in such sort as may serve sor attertor to others.
 - s Item, the houses of such persons out of the which there shall vie anie of the plaque, being fo certified by the viewers , or other wife knowen , or where it Mall be underftood, that anie perfon remaineth ficke of the plaque, to be closes by on all parts during the time of restraint, by. Gre weekes, after the ficknesse be cealed in the fame house, in cale the faibe houses so infected thall bee within any Towne hauing houses neere adiopning to the same. And if the infection happen in houses bisperfed in Millages, and seperated from other houses, and that of necessitie, for the feruing of their cattel, and manuring of their ground, the faide perfons cannot continue in their houses, then thep to be neuerthe. leffe reffrained from reforting into companie of others, either publiquely or priwately buring the faibe time of reftraint, and to meare fome marke in their by. permoft garments, of beare white rods in their handes at fuch time as they hal goe abroade, and if there be any doubt that the maffers and owners of the houses infected, will not duely observe the directions of thutting by their doores, specis ally in the night, then that there be appointed two of three watchmen by turnes, which shall be sworne to attend and watch the house, and to apprehend any perfon that shall come out of the house contrary to the ogder, and the same persons by order of the Juffices, thall be a competent time imprisoned in the flockes in the high way next to the house infected : and furthermore, some speciall marke that be made & fixed to the boozes of every of the infected houses, and where any fuch houses thall be Innes of Alchouses, the fignes thall be taken bowne for the time of the reftraint, and fonje croffe of other marke fet upon the place thereof, to be atoken of the licknelle. 6 Item,

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collect the fummes affeised, or that have y custodie thereof, and out of the said collective summes affeised, or that have y custodie thereof, and out of the said collection allot a weekely proportion for y finding of victual, or fire, or medicines for the pooper sort, during the time of their restraint. And whereas some persons being well disposed to peelve almes and reliefe, will be more willing to give some portions of victual, as corne, bread, or other meate, the same shall be committed to the charge of some special persons, that will benefit the true lie preserve the same, to be distributed as they shall be appointed sorthe poore that are infected.

plouide and deliver all necessaries of victuals, of anie matter of watching of other attendance, to keepe such as are of good wealth being restrained, at their owne proper costs and charges, and the poofe at the common charges: and the saide persons so appointed to be ofdered, not to resoft any publique assemblie during the time of such their attendance, as also to weare some marks on their dupper garment, of to beare a white rod in their hande, to the end others may as bopbe their companie.

8 Item, that in the thire towns in every Countie, and in other great towns 8 meete for that purpose, there may be provision bespoken and made, of such preferuatives and other remedies, which otherwise in meaner cownes cannot bee readily had, as by the Physicians shal be prescribed, and is at this present reduced into an Advise made by the Physicians, and nowe printed and sent with the saide orders, which may be sixed in market places, by on places bluall so such publique matters, and in other townes in the bodies of the parishe churches, and chappells, in which advise onely such things are prescribed, as blually are to be had and sound in all countries without great charge of cost.

rith, that in writing certifie weekly to some of the Justices, reliving within the Hundreth or other limit where they serve, the number of such persons as are injected and doe not die, and also of al such as that die within their Parishes, and their diseases probable whereof they died and the same to be certified to the rest of the Justices at their assemblies, which during some convenient time twould be every one and twentie dayes, and thereof a particular booke kept by be Clerke of the peace or some such like.

perfons as that die of the plague, as also to give order that they be buried after Sunne setting, and pet neverthelesse by daylight, so as the Curate be present for the observation of the rites and ceremonies prescribed by the lawe, so refer ing as much as conveniently be may, to be distant from the danger of infection of the person bead, or of the company that shall bring the core to the grave.

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- 12 Item, the Justices in the hundred, where any such infection is, or the Justices next atopning thereunto, to assemble once a weeke, to take accompt of the execution of the saide orders, and as they finde any lacke or disorder, either to reforme it themselves, or to report it at the general assemblie there, to be by a more common consent resource.
- Care, and underconsidered in the control of the control of the 13 13 Item, for that the contagion of the plague groweth and encrealeth no may more, then by the vie and handeling of fuch clothes, bedding and other Ruffe as hath bene worne and occupied by the infected of this vifrafe, during the time of theire difeafe: the faide Jultices thall in the places infected take fuch order, that all the faide clothes and other fruffe, fo occupied by the bifea. fed, to foone as the parties difeated of the plague are all of them either well recouered or bead, being eicher burnt & cleane confumed with fire: or els apred in fuch fort as is preferibed in an especiall article conteined in the Avuile fet bown by the phylicians, And for that paraduenture the loffe of fuch apparel, bedding and other Auffe to bee burnt, map bee greater then the poore effate of the own. ers of the fame map well beare : itis thought berie good and expedient, if it bee thought meete it hall beeburnt , that then the laive Juftices , one of fuch collec. zions as are to bee made within their Counties for the releife of the poorer fort that bee infected, allowe also to them fuch fumme of fummes as to them thall be thought reasonable, in recompence of the loffe of their laid Auffe,
- by them at their generall assemblie shall bee devised and thought meete, tending to the preservation of her Paiesties subjects from the infection, and to the end their care and diligence may the better appeare, they shall certifie in wisting the saide orders newly devised, and if any shall wisfully breake and contemme the same or any of the orders herein specified, they shall either presentic punish them by imprisonment, or if the persons so contemning them, shall be of such countinance as the Justices shall thinke meete to have their saults knowen to her Paiestie, or to the Councell, they shall charge and bind them to appeare before us, and the contempt duely certified that there may bee a more notogious sharpe example made by punishment of the same by order of her Paiestie.

is Item, if there be lacke of Justices in some partes of the Shire, or if they which are Justices there shall bee for the time absent, in that case the more nomber of the Justices at their assemblie shall make choyse of some convenient persons to supply those places sorthe better execution hereof.

16 Item, if there bee any person Ecclesiasticall of laye, that shall holde and publish

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publishe any opinions (as in some places reporte is made) that it is a vaine thing to forbeare to refort to the infected, or that it is not charitable to forbid the same, pietending that no person shall bye but at their time prefixed, such perfons thall be not onely reprehended, but by order of the Buthop, if they bee ecclesiastiall, Shall be fozbidden to preache, and being lave, shall bee also eniop. ned to forbeare to beter fuch bangerous opinions byon payne of impilonment, which thall bee executed, if they thall perfeuer in that erroz. And petit thall appeare manifeffly by thele orders , that according to Christian charitie , no perfons of the meanest degree thall be left without succour and reliefe.

17 And of these thinges aboue mencioned, the Justices thall take great 17 care, as of a matter fpecially directed and commaunded by her Maieftie bpon the princely and naturall care thee bath conceived towardes the preferuation of ber subiectes, who by very bisozder, and for lacke of direction doe in many parces wilfully procure the increase of this generall contagion.

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An aduise set downe vpon her Maiesties expresse commandement, by the best learned in Physicke within this Realme, conteyning sundry good

ple, as well for the preservation of her good Subjects from the plague before infection, as for the curing and ordering of them after they shalbe infected.

Preservative by correcting the aire in houses.



Ake Rosemarie died, of Iuniper, Bayleaues, of Frankincense, Preseru cast the same on a Chasendish, and receiue the sume of smoke tiues. thereof: Some adulte to be added Lauander, of Sage.

Also to make fires rather in Pannes, to removue about the Chamber, then in Chimneis, thall better correct the appearable Doules.

Take a quantitie of Vineger very firong, and put to it some small quantitie of Rosewater, tenne branches of Rosemarie, put them all into a basen, then take five of size Plintstones, heated in the size till they be burning hotte, cast them into the same Vineger, and so let the summes be received from place to place of your house

Perfuming of Apparel.

Such apparell as you hall commonly weare, let it bee very cleane, and per-Sume it often exther with some red Saunders burned, or with luniper. Ind It any hall happen to be with them that are visited, let such persons as soone as they hall come home, this themselves, and aire their other clothes, in openaire so a time.

Preservation by way of desence in open aire, and common assemblies to be vied outwardly.

It is good in going abjeate into the open aire in the Arcetes, to holde some things of sweete saud; in their hands, of in the corner of a hankercheise, as a sponge dipped in Vineger & Rosewater mixed, of in Vineger, wherin Worme-wood, of Kue called also Herbegrace, hath bene boyled.

Preservative by way of inward medicine.

Take a quantitie of Rue, of Wormewood, of both, and put it into a pot of blual ofinke, close stopped, let it lie so in steepe a whole night, and of the thereof in the mouning fasting.

In all Sommer plagues, it shalbe good to vie Sorrel fauce to be eaten in the moining with bread. And in the fall of the leafe to vie the suice of Barberies with bread allo.

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The Aduise

By the constitution of the heart, the vitall spirites being weake, anothe naturall heate feeble, in which case things Cordiall are to be vied.

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Guill, and then is bee to be cured with medicine purgative.

Preseruatines Cordials.

Mithridates Medicine.

Take of good Figges not wormeaten, cleane walked, of Walnuts the ketnelscleane picked, of eyther of them an hundred, of the leaves of greene
Rue, otherwise called Herbegrace, the weight of it.s. of common Salt the
weight of iii.d. cut the Figs in pieces, and stampe them and the Walnut kernels
together in a morter of Parble or wood a good space, but ill they bee very smal,
and then put the Rue leaves unto them, stampe & streethem well together with
the rest, last put in the Salt and stampe and stirre these things together, but ill
they be incorporated and made of one substance. Of the which take the quantity
of it. or iti. Figs every morning fasting, to children the halfe will serve, and hee
that listeth to increase or diminish the substance of this medicine, shall easily doe
it, by taking of a greater or lesse quantitie of the simples according to a due proportion.

A wellapproued Medicine to preserue.

Take of the finest cleare Aloes you can buy, in colour like to a Liver, a there fore called Hepatica, of Cinamon, of Myrrhe, of ech of these y weight of it.

French crownes, or of rrii. d. of our money, of Cloves, Maces, Lignum Aloes, of Masticke, of Bole Oriental, of ech of these halfe an ounce: mingle them toges ther and beate them into a very fine powder. Of the which take every morning fasting the weight of a groate of this in white wine delayed with water, and by the grace of God you shalve safe from the plague. Pom in which is learned, if he examine the simples of this medicine where it consistetly, and the nature and power of them, can beny but that it is a medicine of great efficacy against the plague, and the simples whereof it is made, are rasily to be had in any good Apothecaries shoppe, except Bole Orientall, which is view in the stead of true Bosus Armenus, whereof we have seene great stope in the shoppes of master Rich the Queenes Paicsties Apothecarie, and master Morgans in Cheapeside.

Take a trie Figge and open it, and put the kernel of a Walnut into the fame being cut very small, three or foure leaves of Ruc commonly called Herbgrace,

Wakerye powder of Turmentill, the weight of bied with Sorrell of Scabious water in Sommer, and in Winter with the water of Valerian of common

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De els in one day they may take a little Wormewood, and Valerian with a graine of Salt. In another day they may take vii.of viii. berries of luniper, dried and put in powder, and taking the same with common drinke, or with drinke in which Wormwood and Rue hath bene steeped all the night.

Alfo the triakle called Diateffaroum, which is made but of illi, things of

light price caffe to be hab.

Alfothe roote of Enula Campana, either taken in powder with brinke, or banged about the breft.

Likewife a piece of Arras roote kept in the mouth as men paffe in the freets,

is very good Cordiall.

Take vi. leaves of Sorrell, wash them with water and vineger, let them lie to the epe in the sayo water and vineger a while, then eatethem satting, and keepe in your mouth and theme now of then either Stewall, of the roote of Angelica, of a little Cinamon.

Take the roote of Enula Campana being lapt and fleeped in vineger, and groffe beaten, put a litte of it in a handkercheife, and fmell to it if you refort to a nythat is infected.

For women with childe, or fuch as be delicate and tender, and cannot away with taking of medicines.

Make a tost of white of of the second bread, as you thinke good, and sprinkle on it being hotte a little good wine vineger, made with Rose leaves, and so want of it any good common of vsed vineger, and spread on the tost a little butter, and cast thereon a little powder of Cinamon, and eate it in the morning fasting. The poope which cannot get vineger not buy Cinamon, may eate bread and butter alone, so, butter is not onely a preservative against the plague, but a gainst all maner of poysons.

In that be good to take an handfull of Rue, as much common Wormwood, and byule them a litle: and put them into a pot of earth of time, with so much bineger as that court the herbs: keepe this pot close courted of stopt, and when you feare any infection, dippe into this bineger a piece of a sponge, and cary it in your hand and smelt o it, of els put it into a round ball of Yuory of luniper made full of holes of the one side, carying it in your hand we to smell thereunto, remembing it once in a day.

For as mich sche cause of the plague standeth rather in poplon, then in any putrifaction of humours as other agues doe, the chiefest way is to mous
sweatings, and to defend the heart by some cordiall thing.

anicon in 116 was the order of Suppositarie. If the same and the profit

If the patient be colline and bound in his bodie, let him take a Suppositarie made with a little bopted Hony, and a little fine powder of Sale, and so taken in at the Fundament and kept till to moone a stoole.

An excellent Medicine made without charges.

Take of the powder of good Bayberries, the hulke taken away from them, before they be dried, a spoonefult: Let the patient drinke this, well ming-led in a draught of good stale ale or Beere, which is neither sowre nor dead, or with a draught of white Wine, and goe to bed and cast himselfe into a sweate, and sorbeare seepe as is asoresayde.

An other soueraigne remedie, that is a stilled water.

Take the inwarde barke of the Ashe tree, a pound, of Walnuts with the greene outward shelles, to the number of 50, cut these small, of Scabious, of Veruen, of Petimorel, of Houseeke, of every one a handfull, of Saffron halfe an ounce, power by on these the strongest Alineger you can get source pynts, let them a little bople together by on a very soft sire, and then stand in a very close pot well stopt all a night upon the embers, afterward distill them with a soft sire, and receive the water close kept. Give but the Patient layd in bedde and well covered with clothes, two ounces of this water to drinke, and let him bee provoked to sweate, and every sire hours, during the space of privial ourses, give him the same quantitie to drinke. This Pedicine soft the worthings there of, and because it will stand the maker thereof in little charge, it shall be very well bone to distill it in Sommer when the Walnuts hang greene on the tree, that it may be ready against the time that occasion servet to ble it.

Bloud letting.

If the Patient be full of humours which be good, let him immediatly bee let blood opon the Lyuer veine in the right arme, of in the Dedian beine of the same arme (if no sole appears) in the first day.

medicine purgatiue.

Por the poore take Aloes the weight of vi.o. put in pappe of an Apple: and for the richer Pilles of Rufus to be had in eurry good Apotheraries thoppe.

After letting of blood and purging (as hall bee necotull) some of the foremained Cordials are to be vied.

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Thefe preparations thus vied the first day that the Batient that fall licke, as cause that bee to use the one of the other (no some appearing) in which case if the fore that appeare, they are both to bee forbone, the next is to vie all meanes to expell the poplon, and to befend the beart by Cordials.

3. Medicament expulfiue.

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De poplon is expelled belt by Iweatings proudked by poffet Ale, made with Fenel and Marigolds in Minter, and with Sorrell, Bugloffe and Borage in Sommer, with the which in both times they muft mire the triacle of Diareflaroum, the weight of ix. b. and fo to lay them felues with all quietnes to I weate one halfe houre of an houre, if they be firong. For they that be nepther full of humours not corrupt in humours, neede nepther purging not letting of blood, but at the first plunge map moone themselves to sweate with Cordiall things mirt with fuch things as move I weat, and are before declared.

VV hat is to be done when there is any rifing or swelling in any part.

"Den if by thefe three meanes the poplon be expelled outward by Botches. carbuncles of markes, called Gods markes, according as nature bothers pell, fo muft the further proceedings bee, proutoing ftill, that they continue ftill in the vie of the cordiall and moderate (weating now and then, all the time that the fores be in healing, which must by the Surgion be handled with great difcretion.

Medicine to be v fed in ordinarie dver.

TE is thought that the powder of harts home hath a speciall prerogative, to be vied all the time of their lickeneffe in their broths, and supping, which in Sommer muft euer haue Sorrell, Borage, Bugloffe, and in winter, Betony, and Scabious, of Morfus Diaboli, and if their habilities ove not ferue, let them ble it with Alebuties made with a little Nutmegge, of one Cloue, of with Cawdelles in like maner made with Cloues, Maces, Nutmegges, Sanders of fuch like.

Both to preserve and cure the sickenesse,

Ake an egge and make a bole in the toppe of it, take out the white and pelke, fill the thell with the weight of two french crownes of Saffron, roll the fait egge thus filled with Saffron baber the embies, butill the fheil begin to ware velow, then take it from the fire, and beate the thell and Saffron in a mozs ter together, with halfe a spoonefull of Mustard feebe, take of this powder a french crowne weight, and as foone as you fufpect your felfe infected, biffolue it into tenne spoonefuls of posset ale, and bunke it luke warme, then goe to bedde and prouoke your felfe to fmeating.

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To be yied in the first time of the Sicknesse.

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A Mother is to take five of fire handefull of Softell, that groweth in the field, of a greater quantitie according as you will distill more of less of the water thereof, and let it lie infrised of steeped in good Aineger the space of four cand twentie hours, then take it off and die it with a linen cloth put into a Limbecke, and distill the water thereof: And as assome as you since your selfe touched with the sickenesse, dinke four spoonfulles of the saide water with a little sugar, and if you bee hable, walke upon it butill you do sweat, if not, keepe your bed, and being well covered, provoke your selfe to sweating, and the next day to take as much againe of it a little before supper.

Item, to prouoke bomit with two ounces of ranke ople, or walnutte ople, a fpoonefull of the inpre of Celendyne and halfe a spoonefull of the inpre of ranke roote, so that the partie infected do walke and not sleepe, is better then any letting of blood, or any purging. For the disease neither can suffer agitation of humors, nor when one is infected, hath no time to bleede or to purge.

Outward medicines for to be applied to the fore.

The first.

Take of Scabiouse two handefuls, stampe it in a stone morter which a pestel of stone if you can get any such, then put unto it of olde swynes greate fatted, two ounces, and the yelke of an egge, stampe them well together, and lay parte of this warme to the sore.

The fecond.

Take of the Icaues of Mallowes, of Camomill flowers, of either of them an handefull, of Linescede beaten into pouder two ounces, boyle the Mallowe leaves first cut, and the stowers of the Camomil in faire water standing above a singers breadth, boyle all them together dutil all the water almost bee spent: then put thereunto the Linescede, of Wheate flower halfe an handefull, of swynes grease the skinnes taken away three ounces, of ople of Rosses two ounces, stirre them still with a sticke, and see them all boyle together on a soft sire without smoke, dutill the water be betterly spent, beate them all togesther in a morter, dutill they be well encorporated together, in seeling smooth, and not rough; then make part thereof hotte in a dish set dyon a chasinoish of toales, and say it thicke byon a simmen cloth applying it to the soze.

Another excellent medicine to ripen and bring out the fore.

Take a white Onion cutin pieces, of fresh butter iii. ounces, of Leven the weight of rii, d. of Mallowes one handful, of Scabious if it may bee had one handfull

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coentre retaione handfull, of Cloues of garlike the weight of rr.o. boyle them on the fire in fufficient water, and make a pulceffe of it, and lay it warme to the fore.

To the foreit felfe voe thus. Take two handfull of Valerian, three rootes of Danewort, a handfull of Smalledge, or Louage, if you can get it, feeth them all in butter and water, and a fewe crummes of bread, and make a pulteffe thereof, and lay it warme to the fore untill it breake.

If you cannot have these herbes, it is good to lay a loase of bread to it, hot as it commeth out of the onen, (which afterward shall be burnt or buried in the earth) or the leaves of Scabious or Sorrell rosted, or two or three Lillie rootes tosted buder embers, beaten and applied.

A generall medicine for all forts of people taken with the

Take of the roote of butter burre, other wife called petitlet wort, one onnce, of the roote of great Valerian a quarter of an ounce, of Sorrell an handfull, boyle all these in a quart of water to a pint, then traine it and put thereto two spoonefulles of Vineger, two ounces of good Sugar, boyle all these together unstill they be well mingled, let the infected drinke of this so hotte as he may suffer it a good draught, and if he chaunce to cast it up againe, let him take the same quantitie traightway by on it, and prouoke himselfe to sweat, and he shall sind great below.

Such as have bene infected, should keepe their house without being converfant with the whole, but ill the sozes shall have lest running and bee perfectly whole and sound, which in sanguine and cholericke persons will be healed sooner, then in melancholike and slegmatike complexions.
