

withother Gods of the Product of England, Be it Enacted by the Kings most Excellent Da-jesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons in this present Parliament Assembled, and by the Authority of the same, That from and after the Tenth Day of May, One thousand it hundred ninety seven, there thall be Paidon any Entry of Tin to be Exported for every Hundred Meight, containing One hundred and twelve Pounds of such Tin Unwrought, the Sum of Three Shillings, A a a a a a a a a

650 Anno Regni octavo & nono,&c. and for every hundred Weight of Tin Tarought, commonly called Pewter, cons taining One hundzed and twelve Pounds! the Sum of Two Shillings, and fo in proportion for any greater orleffer Quantity of either, and no more, any thing in the Book of Rates to the contrary notwithstanding. And whereas by an Aft made in the Twelfth Pear of the late King Charles the Second, Intituled, A Subsidy Granted to the King of Tunnage and Poundage, and other Sums of Money payable upon Merchandizes Exported and Imported, which Act is to have continuance until the First Day of August, Due thousand seven hundred and sir, it is Provided. That all Dings Imported directly from the Place of their Growth in English Built Ship= ping be Rated One Third Part of what is Charged in the faid 230k of Rates, and no more; Pow for a full Recompence to fuch Persons who may have any Loan upon the faid Duty on Tin so taken off, as afore= faid: 23s it further Enacted by the Authority aforesaid, That from the said Tenth Day of May, the Sublidy to be Received for all Drugs Imported directly from the Place of their Growth in English Built Shipping, shall be according to the full Claine on the respective Species Enumerated in the Bok of Rates. and not according to the faid Abatement, and for all Dingsotherwife Imported treble fuch full Claine; any thing in the faid Re= eited Act to the contrary not Withstanding. Piobided alivays, That nothing in this Act contained Mail Extend to the Laying a further Duty on any fort of Drugs used in Dying. FINIS
