Alphabetice exhibuit Mercurium Botanicum, & de thermis Bathoniensibus tractatulum, & una cum eo Mercurii partem alteram Majora certe præstitisset, nisi decore pro rege patriaque sclopeto transfossus occubisset. Hunc sequutus Dr. Hom, Phytologiam Britannicam Anno. 1650. edidit, auctioremq; reddidit, qui festina morte abreptus quæ ulterius destinaverat, peragere destitit.
