A Vrumne, of Baruell, other wyle tearmed the fall of the Leafe, the last part, of fourth Duarter of this yeare, accordying to our

Englishe accompt, shall take place with vs the. rist. day of September, being Aleoneloay, about. v. a clotke in the moznyngt at which tyme, the Sume hauging dispatched the Sommer tyme, with the last degree of Virgo, at his fysk ingression into the fysk degree of Libra, he the seconde tyme maketh the day and night equall in length, and to procurith the A equinoctiall Autumnall : from which tyme, this Quarter is to continue and endure butyst the. ris. day of December next ensuging, to wit, unto the true tyme of the Sumes entraunce into Capricornus.

This tyme of the years is accordyng to natures operation, coulds and day, quite contrary to the naturall dispolition of the Spring, and in respect of the inequality of the temperature thereof, is tearmed of Hyppocrates. the mother or nurfe of most deadly and permitions infirmaties. Now the dayes decrease, and the nyghtes increase, now flooddes are at the hyghest, and from arms or Springes at the lowest : the face of the Earth loofeth her beautie, Plantes and Trees callyng their flownes, leaues, and fruites : Bydes take their flyght from bs into hotter Regions, Beattes betake themselues to their dennes, and Serpentes to their caues : brefely, now both the apre, and mans body, are most variable and subject to changes : the one beyng nener certayne, or alyke long togeather, the other beyng more apt to fickmelles, & more uncertayne of health, then in any other forementioned sealen.

The prefent disposed temperature of this Autumne, wyll not, I suppose, be unlyke the olde accustomed qualities thereof, for it should feeme that variable colde and drynes, wyll interchangeably beare the lway, intermingled one whyle with whysperyng lowe wyndes, another whyle with loude boysterous blastes : one whyle with mystes, and fogges, an other whyle with calme and cleere bayes : some tymes with frostes, and some tymes with seete, some, hayle, rayne, and lyke wynterlyke weather. To conclude, we are lyke to have more unsynges resemblyng the face of the Syring, mydbayes

The proper ficknesses of the tyme, are by the voctrine of Hyppocrates, the father of Philicke, wandying and uncertaine Feuers, quartane Agues, thutnes of alignde, (wellynges in the Throate, swellinges and hardness of the Splsene, weakeness of the Backe, Consumptions, Pyles, the Penwarhoydes, Tympanies, Lienveria, and Dyscenteria, the Schatica, Rewmes, Coughes, and falling Sychnes, melancholy Pallions, Madnes, allo the Plague, of some new infectious and contagious difeale, not much unlyke the pettilent Feuer, in dyuerie symptomes, fignes, and respectes.

Adue therefore you colde raw fruites, Your iuyce corrupteth luch As now without due care of health, Do thereof take too much. Health now is helped moft, by meates, Wholefappeismoyft, and hot: But vie withall ftrong exercile, For feare thou get the rotte. Vie Venus as a ftranger : keepe Thy head, and feete from colde : . Eate more, but drinke leffe then before: Yet with new wines be not bolde. Olde tweete wines are holfome now, And fometymes Spice doth well. But fyrft and laft, ferue God : yf thou In health, and peace wouldft dwell.

Of the Eclipses to be seene this yeere. 1592.

The. riffi. day of June, being Wednesoay, there thall appeare a partile Eclipte of the Poone, then appoynted in the.iff. degree of Capricorne, a figne of the division of the earthy Eriplicitie, that is, coloe & day, melancholyke, feminine, nocturnall, meridionall, moncable, domenticall, tortuous, vitious, luparious : being the house of Saturne, and the evaluation of Mars.

Such Countries and Regions as are more occidentall or wefttoaree then Englande, thall onely fee the myddeff, oz endyng of this Cicliple : but we, I Doubt net, may (albeit fomewhat hardly) oblerne enen the very entraunce.oz beginnyng thereof : foz feeing it fall not begin with us buyll. viil. a clocke, of thereaboutes, by that tyme the Soume being botone and fully fetles under our Douizon, the Spoons thall apple in the Balkafyct unblemithed in the upper part of her hour, how beit prefently ppon her whole appearance, the lower parts thereof fpall begin to be obleured, og barkened, which fhall afterwardes moze and moze increale, untyll. bill. whole Digittes of poyntes of her body be coursed with varkenes, which wyll fall out about.rr. minutes after.iv.a clocke : but piclently after that tyme, are mall begin agayne by lysle and lytle to recover her felfe, untyll it be welnygh. ri. a clocke, when the thall thene agayne in her arcuitomen bryghtnes, and be fully cleaved and bilcharged of the Carthes tha-Dowe betweene her and the Summe befoze interpoled. So that from the beginning to the ending of this Defect, there malbe. ti. whole hourse, of thereaboutes : Duryng which continuance of tyme, the Darkened partes of the Boone Gall appeare blacke, intermit with palenes,as Cyprianus Leouitius Wyrteth.

The effectes and workynges of this Ecliple, accordyng to the voctrine of Proclus Lycius (whole indocement in this cale, all later Afrologers do blually embrace) thall be many contraricties, iarres, quarrels, & fallinges out amongst men : for fuch confequentes, fayth he, hath the Occupie of the Moone in the first face of Capricorne.

But we neede not beleaue him, vnleffe we wyll, not feare his chreatninges, ercept we lyft : but this let vs beleaue, and feare, that God is able to sonfounde the cumpagest humane wylcoome, and to frustrate and bying to nothing whatfoener conceptes, opinions, or indgementes of man : whole belt and furest impiviledge and values. fanding is but fallfble, deceptfull, pacertagne, and erronious. Item, the. bili. Day of December, beyng Fryday, there malbe frene another partile Celiple of the Moone, then placed in the rroi. Degree of Gemini, a figne of the ayerie triplicitie, namely of qualities hot and moult, of complexion fanguine, also makeuline, biurnall, occidencall, common, rationall, sterfil, beyng the house of Mercury, and the evaluation of the Diagons head.

This Ecliple thall begin with us about, v. of the clocke in the ensures, and increate more and more, untyll a quarter of an houre after. vi. about which tyme thalbe the greatest varknes: the Hoone being then deputed of lyght, to the quantitie almost of halfe her body. But within halfe an houre after, vii. a clocke, the thall be fully cafed of this Eclipte, and recouse agayne, even the whole compatie of her wonted lyght, and thening. The coloures of this Eclipte, farth Leouitius, thalbe blacke, althy, and whytith.

Leouicius imagineth, that fuch Echoles wyll heave many lamentable and moofull eventes upon the necke. or tayle of this yeere: whole indgement byon the Revolution thereof, I have thought good in part to manifest to all fisch as thall have Defire thereof : and chiefly here mobileft I treate of Ecliptes, for from fuch be feemeth to fetch his where aroumentes, and proofes, of fuch fixure calamities, & horrozs. "The wordes of Leouitius in Englyth, are thefe. It is a thing (layth he) right ftrange, and woonderfull, that vnder the Reuolution ot this yeere, there floulde concurre the effectes of foure Ecipfes, namely, two Ecliples of the Sunne, and other two of the Moone : which event (lo farre as I can remember) I never read nor heard of before. Therefore fundry tragicail and rufull iffues shall now betyde : which we have more specially declared in the Reuolution preceding, from whence you may gather what is lykely this yeare to befall . But ouer and belides those Eozemen=
