HE HOSPITAL OF KING JAMES Old Effab. FOUNDED IN CHARTERHOUSE IN 21 June, THE COUNTY OF MIDDLESEX, ^{1627.} AT THE HUMBLE PETITION, AND ONLY COSTS AND CHARGES OF THOMAS SUTTON, ESQUIRE : This Stile shall be inviolably observed, and expressed

in the fame formal Words upon all Evidences, Conveyances, Leafes, and Writings of Records : And all other Things ordered and enacted by the Letters Patents, for the Foundation of the Hofpital, shall be inviolably kept and observed.

There shall be an Anniversary Commemoration of the FOUNDER Old Estab. kept every 12th Day of *December* with solemn Service, a Sermon, and such Increase of Commons, as is allowed on great Festivals.

There shall be for ever hereafter Sixteen Persons, who shall be Lett. Pat. called the Governours of the Lands, Possessing, Revenues and Foun. Goods of the Hospital of King James founded in Charterbouse, in the County of Middlefex, at the humble Petition, and only Costs and Charges of Thomas Sutton, Esquire; and when, and as often as any of them shall happen to decease, or be removed from being Governour or Governours thereof, the Governours for the Time being shall, within two Months following, elect and choose such Person or Persons, in the Place, or Places of them, as to their Wifdom shall feem meet.

The Mafter of the Hofpital shall be always one of the Sixteen Lett. Pat. Governours thereof.

Every Perfon elected a Governour of the Hofpital shall, before A& Parl. he exercise the Place of such Governour, take the Oaths of Su-3 Car. I. premacy and Allegiance, which any two Governours may adminifter unto him.

The Governours, or major Part of them affembled together, may do all Corporate Acts, according to the true Intent and Meaning of the Letters Patents of the Foundation, and of the Act of Parliament in the third Year of King *Charles* the First, for the Confirmation of the Hospital.

If any Number of Governours under Nine, and not lefs than Five, fhall meet and affemble together at *Charterboufe*, for the Affairs of the faid Corporation, (Notice of Four Days at leaft of Time and Place of fuch Meeting having been firft given, and left at the ufual Place of Abode of each of the faid Governours within the City of *London*, or Bills of Mortality) and Five of the faid Governours there affembled fhall, by their joint Confent, act, or do any Matter, or Things relating to the faid Corporation, fuch Acts or Deeds fhall, to all Intents and Purpofes, be, and be deemed, and taken to be, the Acts and Deeds of the faid Corporation, and fhall be of the fame Force, Validity and Effect, as if done at a Corporate Meeting of all the Governours, any Law to the contrary notwithftanding.

Assen. 21 The first Meeting of the Governours, after the first Day of June, 1721. March yearly, shall be at Charterbouse.

Old Eftab. There shall be an Assembly in June or July, to dispose of the Scholars to the Universities or Trades, as also to determine and order any other Business.

Other Affemblies shall be accidentary upon the Occasion of the Death or Refignation of a Governour, Officer of the Foundation, or Incumbent upon any Spiritual Living of the Patronage of the Hospital, to elect or prefent another in his Place, wherein it is provided, that the Spiritual Livings be conferred on Perfons capable, and fuch as do, or have done actual Service to the House, or been Members thereof, before any others ; and fo many of the Scholars, which shall from Time to Time be brought up and taught in the faid Hospital, and every of them as shall after be fully qualified and become meet to take upon them, or any of them, the Charge of the Churches, Rectories, Parsonages, Vicarages, Chapels, and other Spiritual Livings aforefaid, shall, as near as may be, from Time to Time be by the Governours prefented, preferred and collated thereunto before any other Person or Persons whatsoever, avoiding

Any Three or more of the Governours shall make a Committee, Assemand have a Power to act in such Business, as either by Order of Re- 24 June ference from the Assembly, or otherwise by the Orders and Consti- 1713. tutions of the Hospital, are usually laid before Committees.

The Governours jointly taken make the Head of this Body Cor- Old Eftab. porate: The poor Brothers and Scholars, and * fuch Officers as are mentioned only in the King's Letters Patents, fhall be ftyled Members of the Foundation, and fhall be chosen within two Months after the Vacancy, according to the express Words of the Letters Patents.

All other Officers of the Revenue, or Houfhold, not particularly Old Eftab. mentioned in the Letters Patents aforefaid, fhall be accepted, reputed and taken as Members of arbitrary Election; and it fhall be in the Governours Power to make their Number more or lefs, and to chufe them fooner or later, as to their Wifdom fhall feem beft for the Good of the Hofpital.

The Mafter, Preacher, School-mafter, Ufher, Officers, Poor Bre- A& Parl, thren, and every of them, fhall before he exercife, or take any 3 Car. I. Benefit of fuch Place, take the Oaths of Allegiance and Supremacy, and alfo fhall take an Oath, that neither he, nor any other for him with his Privity, Allowance or Confent, hath given or fhall give, directly or indirectly, any Money or other Gratuity or Reward, for or in Refpect of the Having or Enjoying of the faid Place ; which Oath fhall be administred unto the Mafter by any two Governours of the Hofpital ; and to the Preacher, School-mafter, Ufher, Officers, and Poor Brethren, by any one Governour, with the Mafter of the Hofpital.

No Patent or Fee shall be granted for Life to any Officer what-Old Estab. foever, but durante bene placito.

The Common Seal of the Hofpital shall be kept in the Evidence-Old Estab. House under four Keys, to be in the Custody of whom the Governours shall appoint, provided the Master of the Hospital shall have the Custody of one.

The Keys of the Evidence-Houfe shall be in the Custody of Old Estab. whom the Governors shall appoint, provided the Master shall always keep one: And no Writings shall be delivered out to the Register, but with a Note of the Particulars registered in a Book under the

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the Master's Hand, and a Note taken from his Hand that receives them, for the Re-delivery.

What other Orders foever the Governours in Affembly shall make for the Good of the Hospital, and sign them with their own Hands in the Affembly Book, shall stand in full Force and Power during the Pleasure of the Governours.

The Orders and Conftitutions of every Affembly shall be engrossed in the Affembly Book by the Register, and figned by the Governours prefent, at or before the next Affembly.

All which Orders and Conftitutions the Mafter, Preacher, Register, and other Officers, Members and Servants of the House whom it may concern, shall observe and obey, as they will answer the Contrary at their Peril.

The Master.

THE MASTER shall have the Oeconomical Government of the House and Houshold during the Governours Pleasure, and Power to put upon any Officer a Mulct not exceeding the Value of a Week or Fortnight's Commons, which shall be continued, unless the Governours at the next Assembly shall see Cause, and give Order to the contrary : And also to fine any poor Brother a Week or Fortnight's Commons, upon any Misdemeanor, in his Discretion, deferving the same : Any further Penalty he shall not inflict (except only in such Cases, as there are especial Orders directing him) but upon Continuance of the Transgression, and Incorrigibility, he shall inform the Governours at the next Assembly, that the Offender may be by them more severely and condignly chastisfed by way of Mulct, Expulsion, or otherwise, as to their Wisdom shall seem best, and most just for his Correction, and the Terror of others.

Old Eftab.

All the inferior Servants of the Houshold shall be put in or out at the Diference of the Master, but he shall have this Power in Subordination to the Governours, and his Actions shall be alterable by their Censure and Revocation, upon just Cause of Complaint.

He

He shall not increase or decrease any Diets, Stipends, Fees or Old Estab. Wages in the House or School, under or above the Rates appointed by the Governours, as he will answer the Contrary, upon Pain of paying the Surcharge himself, and incurring the Governours Displeafure in case any Allowance be shortened.

The Preacher.

THE PREACHER shall be qualified both for his Learning and Old Estab. good Conversation of Life, to be capable and fit for the Place, aged above Thirty Years, a Master of Arts of Seven Years standing at the least, and one that has been a Preaching Minister the Space of Four Years, or more.

The first and chief Care and Charge to be imposed upon the Maf-Old Estab. ter and him, is the Service of God, that they, and all the Officers, poor Brothers, and Servants of the Houshold, frequent the Chapel daily at the accustomed Time of Divine Service: The like shall be observed by the School-master, Usher, and Scholars of the Foundation, upon every Sunday, Holiday and Vigil, and that there be a Sermon every Sunday at Morning Prayer, either by him the faid Preacher, or fome other appointed by him. And that the Scholars ² Nov. be catechized upon Sundays in the Asternoon, in the Presence of the 1674. Pensioners, and that an Exposition be then made thereupon for their better Instruction in the Fundamentals of Religion.

The Mafter and Preacher shall have in Care and Charge to see, Old Estab. that the whole Houshold, and those of the School of the Age of Sixteen Years and upwards, shall receive the Blessed Sacrament yearly at the three solemn Feasts of *Christmas*, *Easter* and *Whitsontide*, unless they be fatisfied by some lawful Excuse and just Cause of their Failing, otherwise the Party denying or delaying, shall be liable to the Master's Chastisfement, and the Governours further Censure.

The Mafter and Preacher shall have Superintendancy over the Old Estab. Chapel Clerk, Organist, and Sexton, to see if each of them carefully perform the Duties of his Place; the First in reading Divine Service at the Hours accustomed, affisting the Preacher at the Communion, and burying the Dead : The Second in teaching the poor Scholars to fing; and playing on the Organs at set Times of Divine Service : The Third in keeping the Chapel in a cleanly, comely and and decent Manner, and carefully performing all other Services be longing to fuch a Place, otherwife they and every of them shall be subject to the Master's Punishment.

The Physician.

THE PHYSICIAN shall be qualified with the Degree of a Doctor in that Profession, and shall have his yearly Fee of Twenty Pounds confirmed unto him, and shall reside and dwell in the House appointed for the Physician in the Hospital.

He shall take especial Care, that no one shall be admitted into the Hospital, whose Body is tainted with any unclean or infectious Disease.

He shall visit the fick Persons of the Hospital, as Need shall require, and prescribe Medicines fitting and necessary for their Disease and Sickness.

The Officers of the Revenue.

THE REGISTER shall be lodged and dieted in the Hospital, a Man of good Conversation, well practifed in following Law Causes, a good Pen-man, ready, diligent and faithful in all such Imployments, as the Governours or Master shall put upon him.

His Imployment shall be to fummon all Assemblies, to register their Orders and Decrees in the Assembly Book, to draw all Patents and Leases, make them ready for the Common Seal, and enroll them; to call in Arrearages of Rents and make Seizure, and Re-entry for Default of Payment by Warrant of the Governours; to take all Petitions and present them to the Table; to take Bond for the Teaching, well using and Maintenance of poor Scholars made Apprentices, and the Master's Order and Direction to put in Suit the Bonds forfeited either for Non-payment of Debts, Non-performance of Covenants, or for any other Cause whatsoever, for and concerning the faid House and Hospital.

Bufinefs then to be laid before the Governours, and shall date the Time of fuch Summons.

He shall once every Year make a new Rental, and deliver it to Comm. the Receiver; and upon the Receiving an Account in Writing from 11 Dec. the Receiver, of any one Tenant's owing a Year's Rent, he shall 1717. forthwith write to such Tenant to pay the same; and if in two Months after the Year expires, he shall not reduce his Arrears to half a Year's Rent, such Tenant shall be proceeded against according to Law.

He shall not, directly or indirectly, contract for the Preferring of Old Estab. Poor Men, or Boys into the Hospital, nor with any of the Tenants for Renewing their Leases; such Business shall immediately be preferred by Petition to the Governours only, and then prefented by him to the Table; and if he be a Transgressor herein, he shall forfeit his Place.

He shall not cancel or deface any Orders concluded at an Af-Old Estab. fembly, and figned by the Governours there present, upon Peril of losing his Place.

He shall not presume to receive or meddle with any Monies Old Estab. accruing due to the Hospital, by Way of Fine, Rent, or Debt however.

He shall give the Governours Notice from Time to Time, when Affem. their Turns shall happen to put in Pensioners, and Scholars.

The Receiver.

THE RECEIVER shall not enter into the Execution of his Office Old Estab. before he give good Security by Ten several Bonds of Two Hundred Pounds each, wherein himself, with two sufficient Securities in every Bond, shall stand bound to the Governours for the faithful Execution of his Place, and Discharging his Account.

He shall from Time to Time, so long as he shall continue in the faid Office, do his best Endeavour to receive and collect all and fingular the Rents and Revenues of the Hospital. And whensoever any Tenant shall owe and be in Arrear one Year's Rent, he shall forthwith give an Account in Writing to the Register of the Hospital, of the Name and Arrears of every such Tenant.

There

Receiver's Indenture confirmed, 13 March, 1717. There shall be two Cash-Books, one to be kept by the Master of the Hospital, the other by the Receiver, who shall enter into his Cash-Book all and every Sum and Sums of Money paid to him or his Order, for the Use of the said Hospital, immediately after the Payment thereof, and upon every *Monday* Morning he shall attend the Master of the Hospital, or in his Absence, such Persons as shall be deputed by the Master for such Purpose, with the said Cash-Book, and shall then enter into the Master's Cash-Book all such Payments that shall not be before that Time entered therein, that the Master, or the Person in his Absence deputed by him, may see that the Entries in the two Cash-Books agree ; and the Receiver shall certify at the Foot of each Weekly Account, what Sum of Money there was then remaining in his Hands.

He shall make a just Entry in the large Leidger-Book of the Tenants Names and Rents, of all Rents and Monies received from them, and shall, as often as required, attend the Master with the faid Leidger-Book.

He shall pay, or cause to be paid, to the Manciple of the Hospital 30 *l*. on every *Friday*, for the weekly Provision and Diet of the Hospital, and shall quarterly make up, and clear Accounts with the faid Manciple.

He shall pay all the Tradesmens Bills for Necessaries delivered for the Use of the Hospital, as soon as allowed, and signed by the Master, if there be Cash then sufficient in his Hands; but if not, as soon as there shall be.

He shall pay, or cause to be paid quarterly unto the Master, Preacher, School-master and Usher, and all other the Officers, Penfioners, Members and Servants of the Hospital, all such Fees, Pensions, Wages, and other Allowances, as by any Order, Ordinances, Constitutions and Grants made, or to be made by the Governours, as are or shall be appointed to be paid to them, viz. on the Feasts of St. Michael the Archangel, the Birth of our Lord Christ, the Annunciation of the Blessed Virgin Mary, and the Nativity of St. John the Baptist, or within ten Days next after each of the faid Feasts in every Year.

He shall keep a Book of Disbursements, wherein all Payments by him made on Account of the Hospital shall be duly entered, with the true Date of such Payments. And in the same Book, at the other End thereof, he shall take Acquittances from all and every Person

Perfon and Perfons to whom he shall pay the fame, and shall carefully file up all Tradesmens Bills, and Scholars Certificates of Exhibitions by him paid, and shall attend the Master with the Book of Disbursements, as often as required thereto.

He shall make up quarterly an Account of his Receipts and Ibid. Payments, within one Month after the End of each Quarter, and in the fifth Week of each Quarter shall produce it, with proper Vouchers, before the Auditor of the Hospital, to the End that the Auditor may examine the same, and see that the Receipts agree with the Rental, and the Payments made pursuant to the Orders of the Governours: And in the fixth Week after the End of every Quarter, he shall pass such Accounts with the Master in proper Books for that Purpose, and fign the Account fo passed.

He shall yearly after the Feast of the Birth of our Lord Christ, Ibid. and before the first Day of *March*, make a true and perfect Account before the Auditor, of all and singular the Sum and Sums of Money by him, or by others by his Order received for the Use and Benefit of the Hospital, in and through all the Year last past, ending at the Feast of the Birth of our Lord Christ preceding.

He shall yearly before the 5th Day of *March*, well and truly Ibid, deliver and put into the Iron Chest provided in the Hospital for that Purpose, all such Sum and Sums of Money, as shall, upon the Determination of the aforesaid Account, remain in his Hands, above the Sum of Two Hundred Pounds, to remain in his Hands for the immediate Occasions of the Hospital.

He shall yearly after the first Day of *March* send to every Gover-Assender. nour a Copy of his yearly Account to *Christmas* preceding, for their 19 Dec. private Perusal, on the going out of Summons for the next Meet-^{1721.} ing of the Governours.

He shall yearly at the first Meeting after the first Day of March, Com. lay before the Governours an Account in Writing of all the Tenants, ²⁷ June, with their respective Rents, and Times of Payment, and what was ^{1721.} in Arrear from each Tenant at Christmas preceding; as likewise an Account to what Time the Debts of the Hospital were last paid and balanced; and what Debts of the Hospital are then standing out, as far as such Account can be given.

There shall be two Iron Chests, one in the Receiver's Custody for Old Estab. keeping the Hospital Revenues, whereof he shall give an Account to the Master quarterly; another with three Locks and Keys, two (12)

tion examined, and engroffed in Parchment by the Auditor, and figned with their three Hands, and then fafely laid up in the

Evidence-Houfe.

There shall be two other Declarations fairly written and figned by the Mafter, Receiver and Auditor, whereof the Auditor shall keep one to justify the Account, and the Receiver another for his full Discharge, which shall be as good, lawful and sufficient Acquittance and Discharge, as if the same were sealed with the Common Seal.

The Auditor.

THE Auditor shall weekly examine the Manciple's Book of Old Eftab. Difburfements for Dyets, and what elfe he lays out, to fee if the one agree with the Eftablishment, and the other be done by Warrant, and upon due Examination shall approve them under his Hand, before they be figned by the Mafter.

He fhall quarterly examine the Receiver's Book of Receipts of the Revenues and Difburfements for the Hofpital, to fee if the one agree with the Rental, and the other be difburfed by the Mafter's Warrant; and upon due Examination under his Hand of every Particular, the Book shall be figned by the Master.

Every Tenant, Farmer, and Accomptant of the Hofpital, after Com. II Dec. the Payment of any Rents or Sums of Money to the Receiver of the Hofpital, shall, within three Days after Payment thereof, enter his Acquittance for the fame with the Auditor of the Hofpital, that he may be the better able to charge the Receiver with the Receipt thereof in his Account.

Old Eftab.

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Upon ballancing all Accounts of Receipts and Difburfements at the Year's End, he shall draw the three annual Declarations, that a perfect and yearly View may be taken of the State of the Hofpital.

The Steward of the Courts.

THE STEWARD of the Courts shall have the Custody of the Assemble Court-Books, and other Writings which concern the Courts 17 Nov. of the Manors, he giving Security by Bond of Two Hundred Pounds 1730. Penalty, that the faid Books and Writings, together with all others that he shall make, shall be delivered up to the Hospital within three Months after he shall leave, or be deprived of his Office by Death, or otherwife.

No Steward of the Courts shall take any greater Fee than Five Old Estab. Shillings for his Copy, and entring it into the Roll, unless it expressent Uses made over by Will; in which Case his Fee shall be Ten Shillings.

All Stewards of Courts shall bring or fend into *Charterbouse*, with-Old Estab. in three Months after the Court holden, the Roll thereof fairly written in Parchment, with the Fine set down in the Margin, and signed with his own Hand. They shall also deliver the Tenant his Copy within Forty Days after the Court holden, if the Tenant demand it, and pay for it according to the Rate aforefaid.

The Register, the Receiver, the Auditor, and the Steward of Affem. Courts, shall be four distinct Persons for ever. 1718.

Bayliffs of Manors.

NO Bayliffs shall be chosen of any Manor or Manors, unless he Old Estab. dwell there, or within five Miles Distance at the farthest.

All Bayliffs shall put in Bond of Two Hundred Pounds a-piece, Old Estable with two Sureties for paying in the Money by them levied, either for Free-rents, or Profits of Courts; and they shall not meddle with the Receipts of any Farm-rents, upon Pain of forfeiting their Bonds.

All Bayliffs shall bring in all free and customary Rents within Old Estab; Forty Days after the Quarter-day; also all Profits and Perquisites of Courts within the same Time of Forty Days after the Day assigned by the Steward for Payment thereof.

DEFORE any Matter relating to the Revenue of the Hofpital D be laid before the Governours, the Master with the Officers shall meet, and confider what is fit to be done therein, and prefent the fame to the Governours under their Hands.

In all Reports, an Account shall be given of the Quantity and Quality of the Land, and Acres of each Farm to be renewed.

When any of the Tenants shall petition to have their LEASES renewed, they shall produce a Certificate from the Bayliff of the Manor, touching the State of the Repairs of their Houfe and Farm, and their Performance or Breach of any of the Covenants contained in their Leafes, the faid to be produced to the Governours, when the Mafter and Officers shall make their Report concerning fuch Renewal.

All Leafe Rents shall be paid by Tenants at Charterhouse; and all Free and Cuftomary Rents, with Profits and Perquifites of Courts, shall be there likewife paid by the Bayliff.

No Tenant shall have Respite for Paymant of his Rent above Forty Days after the Quarter-Day, wherein he ought to pay the fame.

Old Eftab. All Leffees shall be tied to dwell upon their Farms, and not to put them over but to Wife and Children, without Licence procured from the Governours in Affembly; and no Licence shall be granted them but for the Remainder of Years limited by the former Leafe, and at the fame Rent, and enjoining the Under-Tenants to dwell thereupon.

In every Lease hereafter to be granted, of any of the Hospital Old Eftab. Lands or Tenements, in any Manor where a Court-Baron is used to be kept, there shall be comprized, in every fuch Leafe, a Covenant on the Leffee's Part, to do Suit of Court there, and to be obedient to the Orders therein to be made touching, or by Reafon of the Lands and Tenements.

No Tenant of the Hofpital shall have Liberty to renew his Leafe, till the old Leafe shall be within four Years of expiring. Nor shall any be granted for Lives, or longer than one and Twenty Years.

The Book expressing the yearly Rent of the Farms now paid, and the yearly Value by Survey, shall be brought to the Table at every Assembly, that upon the Expiring or Renewing of Leases, the Governours may increase or abate the Rents, as to their Wisdoms shall seem best for the Good of the Hospital.

The Penfioners.

THE Penfioners, or poor Brethren, shall be appointed by the Let. Pat. Governours, and shall not exceed the Number of Fourfcore. Old Estab, They shall not be holden qualified and capable of the Place, Assention unless they can bring good Testimony and Certificate of their good 30 June, Behaviour, and soundness in Religion, and such as have been Servants to the King's Majesty, either Decrepit, or Old, Captains either at Sea or Land, Soldiers maimed, or impotent, decayed Merchants, Men fallen into Decay thro' Shipwreck, Casualty of Fire, or such evil Accident, those that have been Captives under the Turks, and fuch like.

He that hath been maimed in the Wars, either at Sea or Land, Old Effab, and not in any Fray or private Quarrel, being alfo a Subject of the King's Dominions, shall be capable of the Place at Forty Years of Age, or upwards: But if he be not maimed, though otherwife well deferving, he shall not be capable of the Place, unless he be Fifty Years old at the least: Nor shall any be admitted, whose Body is tainted with any leprous, unclean, or infectious Disease. None shall be admitted or elected, that hath competent Means to fustain him; and if at or after his Admittance, he shall be found to have an Estate, in Value worth Two Hundred Pounds, or coming in viss & modis to the Value of 241. per Annum during Life, his Place shall be void.

None shall be admitted till the next Quarter-Day after his Place is Old Estabvoid, and till he bring two Pair of new Sheets with him, or that the House provide them for him; in Discharge whereof the Receiver shall deduct the Price out of his Wages due the first two Quarters, by equal and even Portions, and upon his Account clear the House of that Charge.

When any Perfon shall offer himself to take the Oaths in order Assemito be admitted a Pensioner in this Hospital, he shall at the same 13 July,

Time be obliged to declare upon Oath, that he is not a married Man; and if he shall refuse to take the said Oath, he shall be rejected.

No Officer shall demand or take any Fee or Gratuity, for or in Respect of registring or admitting any Pensioner into the Hospital, under Penalty of losing his Place.

All the Pentioners, and the inferior Officers and Members of the Hofpital, fhall give dutiful Reverence to the Mafter of the Hofpital, wherefoever they fhall happen to be in his Prefence, or when either he fhall fpeak to any of them, or any of them fhall repair, or fpeak to him, they fhall ftand before him with their Heads uncovered, not prefuming, while they are in his Prefence, to put on their Hats, (except it be at the Table at Dinner and Supper) and none fhall give or ufe any evil reviling or railing Speeches of him before his Face, or behind his Back, upon Pain of the Lofs of one Month's Commons at leaft for every fuch Offence done. And it is alfo commanded, that they be obedient unto him in all his lawful Commands and Injunctions to them, for the Obferving the Orders and Conftitutions made or to be made by the Governours.

They and every of them shall be diligent in frequenting the Chapel of the Hospital twice every Day, at Times of Divine Service, and there behave themselves reverently, as it becomes them to do in fo facred a Place, and at fo holy a Work; and though they may ask and obtain Leave of the Master on fome Work-Day of the Week to be absent, upon fome good and urgent Occasion; yet none of them shall be absent from Service and Sermon on the *Sunday*, if he be in Health, and able to come forth of his Lodging; and every one of them shall receive the Holy Communion of the Lord's Supper thrice every Year, viz. at Christmas, Easter, and Whitsutide, unless the Master and Preacher be statisfied by some lawful Excuse, and just Cause of their failing; otherwise the Party fo wilfully neglecting, shall be liable to the Master's Chastisfements, and to the Governours further Displeasure.

Laws of this Realm; then his Place in the Hofpital shall be void, and he quite removed from the fame.

No Penfioner, nor inferior Officer, shall wear any Weapons or Assemunseemly Apparel in the Hospital, but only such as it becometh 24 Feb. Hospital-men to wear.

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None of them shall lodge Abroad out of his ordinary Lodging by Night, or permit or fuffer any Stranger to lodge in any of their Lodgings within the Hofpital : Neither shall any of them haunt Houses suspected of Incontinency, Gaming-houses, Common Bowling Alleys, Taverns, or Alehoufes, by Day or Night, (neither ufe Swearing, and taking of God's Holy Name in vain, nor abufe, by railing or otherwife, any of his Fellow Brethren, or other notorious Vice) upon Pain of fuch Punishment of fuch Offender as shall be thought meet by the Master, in the Prefence of two of the Chief Officers of the faid Houfe, whom he shall please to call unto him; and if the Party fo punished shall prove incorrigible, after he hath been twice punished, then the Master shall put fuch Offender out of Commons until the next General Affembly, and then he shall acquaint the Governours therewith, that they may inflict fuch further Punishment upon him, either by Expulsion or otherwise, as they in their Wifdom shall hold fitting.

If any Penfioner shall appear in the Hall, Garden, or elswhere Assemwithin the Hospital, without their Livery Gown, he shall be pu-² March nished by the Master.

But no Penfioner of the Hofpital shall hereafter presume to go into Assemany Taverns or Alehouses with his Livery Gown on his Back, upon 22 Feb. Pain of such Punishment as the Master in his Discretion shall inflict. 1624.

If any Penfioner, inferior Officer, or Member of the Hospital Affem. fhall be drunk, the Master shall impose on him a Mulct of a Fort-25 July, night's Commons for the first Offence; for the second, a Month's 1645. Commons; and for the third Offence, the Person so offending shall be expelled the Hospital without any further Order to be taken therein by the Governours.

If any Penfioner, or inferior Officer, shall use Swearing at any Ibid. Time, or taking God's Holy Name in vain, for the first Offence so committed, he shall undergo a Mulct of One Shilling; for the Second, of a Fortnight's Commons; and upon the Continuance of such his Transgression, the Master shall put him out of Commons, and not suffer such Offender to have any Benefit of his Place, but only his Lodging in the Hospital. And then the Master shall inform the next General Assembly, that such Offender may be

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by them more feverely chaftifed by Way of Mulct, Expulsion, or otherwife, as to them in their Wifdom shall feem meet.

No Penfioner shall meddle with any Business touching the Affairs of the Hospital, but only the Service of God, and take thankfully what is provided for them, without Muttering, Murmuring, or Grudging.

They shall not undertake the Following of other Men's Causes or Suits, nor procure the Molestation, Trouble, or Expence of any one by their Suggestions or Informations, upon Pain of being punished by the Master, and abiding the Governours further Displeasure.

If any Penfioner shall have any just Cause of Complaint, he shall first acquaint the Master therewith in Writing; and if he shall not upon such Complaint have Redress, then, and not till then, he may make his Petition to the Governours, lodging the said Petition with the Register, to be by him prefented at the next Meeting of the Governours, he having first informed the Master thereof. But no Pensioner shall in any Case prefume to trouble any of the Governours fingly, or in private, or any other Person whatsoever with such Complaints, but shall proceed therein in such Manner only, as is hereby appointed and ordered.

'The Master of the Hospital, and every Officer, Pensioner, and Member of the same, shall take their Diet in the Dining-Halls appointed for that Purpose, and not in their Chambers, unless it be in Time of Sickness, or upon some urgent Occasion, such as the Master shall allow of.

Two of the Penfioners of the Hofpital, in their feveral Turns, fhall go daily to Market with the Manciple and Chief Cook, to buy the Provifions for the Diet of the Hofpital, that Choice may be made by them of that which fhall be good and fweet, and to fee ready Money paid for the fame.

Every Penfioner of this Hofpital, that happens to fall fo fick, that he cannot come to the Common Hall to take his Repaft, fhall have his Part in Diet in his Chamber, or his weekly Allowance in Money for it, as the Mafter and the Phyfician in their Diferetions fhall hold meet.

No Officer, Penfioner, or Member of this Hofpital, fhall fend or carry away any Bread, Beer or Meat, from their Tables, when they fhall be at Dinner or Supper in the Dining-Halls; but if any Bread, Beer, or Meat, fhall happen to be left, it fhall be beftowed on fuch poor Men and Women, that fhall from Time to Time be appointed, and allowed to do Service in the faid Hofpital; or otherwife, as the Mafter

The ordinary Allowance of the Hofpital being not fufficient for Affem. the comfortable Support of fuch Penfioners, who by Sicknefs fhall 24 June, be at any Time difabled from taking their Commons in the Hall;^{1664.} the Mafter of the Hofpital may give an additional Allowance, not exceeding Eighteen Pence by the Week, to any fick Penfioner, upon a Certificate first made by the Physician of the Hofpital, that the usual Commons are unwholefome for him.

Any Penfioner may be abfent from the Hofpital with the Mafter's Affem. Leave for two Months in the Year, and during fuch Abfence shall 31 May have an Allowance of two Thirds of his Commons; but if abfent ¹⁷²⁷. for two Months, or any less Time without Leave, then to have no Allowance for Commons during fuch Abfence.

If he hath Occafion to continue above two Months abfent, then Ibid. he shall fignify the Cause thereof to the Master, who shall propose it to the next Meeting of the Governours; and in the mean Time, the Allowance for Commons, and also his Pension in Money shall be stopped till his Cause of Absence be approved.

If any Penfioner continue abfent beyond two Months, without ma- Ibid. king any Application for a longer Time, or making any Application, but offering fuch Reafons as shall not be approved of by the Governours, after four Months Absence, he shall cease to be a Brother.

Other Duties to be performed by the Pentioners, fuch as their Old Effab, reverent Behaviour at Prayers, civil Fashion of Feeding, cleanly and decent Cloathing, neat and wholesome Lodging, friendly and brotherly conversing and living together, shall be referred to the Master's Discretion to direct, and to the Power given him to correct.

The School.

THE Scholars of the Foundation shall be appointed by the Lett. Pat, Governours, and shall not exceed the Number of Forty, nor Old Estab. shall any be admitted as such, whose Parents have any Estate of Lands to leave unto them, but only the Children of such poor Men as want Means to bring them up.

The SCHOOL-MASTER shall be of Twenty-feven Years of Age at Old Estab. the least, a Master of Arts, of good Reputation both for his Life and Learning in the Latin and Greek Tongues. The USHER shall likewife be well qualified for his Place, having taken the Degree of Batchelor of Arts two Years at least before his Election, aged Twenty-

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four Years: And if there be fuch in either University, (no Difcontinuers) that have formerly been Members of this Hospital, they shall (cæteris paribus) be chosen before others.

Affem. 27 No Gift nor Fee shall be taken by any Servant whatsoever, at the June, 1739. Admission of any Scholar into the Hospital.

The School-mafter shall have Charge to admit no Scholar without one new Suit of Apparel besides that he wears, two new Shirts, three new Pair of Stockings, three new Pair of Shoes, and Books for the Form he is to be in, or Money to buy them; and if he fail therein, the Charge of repairing the Wants shall be discounted out of his own Wages.

> He shall have Certificate, by good Proof, from the Place whence they come, of the just Age of every Boy to be admitted, and he shall admit none under the Age of Ten, or above the Age of Fifteen.

> He shall keep a Book of all such Admissions, and also of all Scholars fent to the University, or Trade, with a particular and punctual setting down the Day and Year of their coming in and going out.

> The Names of the Scholars shall be called over at Nine of the Clock in the Evening, and the Monitor shall give the School-master an Account of such as are absent : The Usher shall go round the Galleries, and see the Scholars in Bed at Ten of the Clock.

> They shall keep the accustomed Hours of Six in Summer and Seven in the Winter for their coming to School, and of Six in Summer and Winter, if the Time will permit for their leaving off, not failing, both Morning and Evening, to begin and end their Studies with the *Latin* Prayers and Collects now used.

> He shall read none but approved Authors, Greek and Latin, as are read in the best esteemed Free Schools, and shall see those of the Upper Form furnished with Greek Testaments for their Use in the Chapel.

Twenty Pounds a Year shall be paid quarterly by the Receiver, to an able Master of Writing and Account, to be appointed from Time to Time by the Master of the Hospital and the School-master; and he shall diligently attend to teach all the faid Scholars, at such Hours as the School-master shall appoint.

Befides the Scholars weekly Exercife, they of the Higheft Form fhall every Sunday fet up in the Great Hall four Greek and four Latin Verfes a-piece, upon any Part of the Second Leffon appointed for that Day, for the Mafter of the Hofpital, or any Stranger to view and examine; as alfo two fhall be weekly appointed for reading the Chapters and faying Grace at every Meal in both Halls.

Such Scholars as are not apt for Learning shall be put forth Ap- Com. prentices at or before they attain the Age of Eighteen Years, but 8 April fuch as by their Learning shall be ready for the Universities, shall 1665. be continued in the School at the Charge of the Hofpital, till Exhibitions at the Univerfity shall fall to their Share.

Twenty Pounds shall be given with each Scholar that shall be put Affem. 24 March forth Apprentice. 1684.

The Number of Exhibitions at both Universities shall be Twenty- Affem. nine.

An Exhibition of Twenty Pounds per Annum shall be paid quar-Affem. terly, in equal Portions, to them until the End of Eight Years, 15 March, from the Time of their being elected to the Universities, if they 1637. abide there fo long following their Studies; but in Cafe they shall difcontinue fooner, their faid Exhibition shall ceafe.

The Scholars to be elected to the Universities shall be examined Assem. before every Election, by one or more Perfon or Perfons, whom the 2 Feb. Lord Archbishop of Canterbury shall think proper to join to the Mafter of the Hofpital in making fuch Examination fome Time between Easter and Whitsontide, as his Grace shall appoint.

Every Exhibitioner of the Univerfity shall fend up quarterly a Com. Certificate of the Time of their Refidence, and of their being ftu- 21 Dec. dious and of good Behaviour, figned by the Head, or two chief 1653. Officers of the College they are Members of.

The Exhibition of every Scholar, for the first four Years, shall be Com. paid to the Tutor for the Scholar's Ufe, provided the Scholar shall 5 April, be fo long under Tutorage.

If any Exhibitioner at the University shall in any Year absent him- Assem. felf from the University, and discontinue thence for the Space of 24 June, four Months together, or at feveral Times in one Year shall be ab- 1734. fent thence fo long, as that the Whole put together will amount to four Months, unlefs it be in Cafe of Sicknefs, fufficiently attefted in due Time to the Master of the Hospital, he shall forfeit his Exhibition.

To every Petition on Account of Absence from the University Affem. through Sickness, an Affidavit shall be annexed of the Truth thereof. 1713.

If any Scholar shall prefume to affault any Officer, Penfioner, or Affem. Servant, belonging to this Hofpital, fuch Scholar shall, befide the I Dec. All fuch Scholars of the Hofpital, who fhall be elected to the Univerfities, or are to be placed out Apprentices, fhall conform themfelves, and be fubject to the Rules and Orders of the School, until they fhall leave the Hofpital.

The School-mafter and Ufher shall be diligent in the daily Attendance on their Charge, and shall not journey into the Country without the Master's Leave : Nor shall they take into their Tuition above Sixty other Scholars, unless they entertain another Under-Usher out of their own Means, who shall be dieted and lodged out of the Hospital : Nor shall they receive, for teaching those of the Foundation, any Fee or Wages from their Friends.

They shall be careful and difcreet to observe the Nature and Genius of the Scholars, and accordingly instruct and correct them. In Correction they shall be moderate, in Instruction diligent, correcting according to the Quality of the Fault in Matters of Manners, and according to the Capacity of the Fault in Matters of Learning.

All other Duties of their Place they shall faithfully perform; namely, to see that the Scholars be of modest and mannerly Behahaviour, well and decently clothed, orderly and feasonably dieted, cleanly and wholesomely lodged; and that the Matron, Butler, Taylor, and Groom, perform their Duties to these Purposes, otherwise their Tutors to be cenfured by us the Governours, and their Servants to be punished by the Master of the Hospital.

THE MANCIPLE shall put in Bond of One Hundred Pounds, with one sufficient Surety for discharging himself by a just and allowed Account of all such Sums of Money as the Receiver shall from Time to Time impress unto him for the Affairs of the Hospital.

He fhall receive weekly on *Friday*, from the Receiver, Thirty Pounds to buy the Provision for the Week enfuing, and shall pay ready Money for all Provisions bought at Market; to which he shall be accompanied daily by the Chief Cook and two of the Pensioners in the Hospital, to see that the said Provisions are sweet and good.

He shall attend his Service in the Kitchen till all the Tables be ferved, and the Meat taken away; and then he shall take his Meals with the inferior Officers and Grooms, at their accustomed Table, and the Rate established in the Hospital.

He shall keep a Book of the weekly Expence in Diet, and carry Old Estab. it to the Auditor to be examined; and within four Days after the Week is expired, he shall bring it to the Master to be perused and figned by him, and whom else the Master shall call.

Inventory of all the Goods, Moveables, and Utenfils of and throughout the Hospital, and give Account thereof to the Master, that he may lay the Embezzeling or Loss to every Officer, Groom, or Penfioner, to whom it was intrusted, fatisfying the Houfe out of their Wages at his Discretion, and giving Order for Repairing and Renewing such Stuff as shall be so lost, or by long Wearing become no more useful.

The Caft Houshold Stuff, that from Time to Time shall be found Com. to be of no further Use to the Members of the Hospital, shall be ²⁶ Nov. laid up in a Storehouse, to the End that the same may be disposed ^{1658.} of in Exchange for new, as Occasion shall require.

The Cooks and other Servants in the Kitchen fhall diligently Affem. perform their Duties, and drefs the Victuals and fend them up to $^{8}\mathcal{J}uly$, the Tables in a clean and decent Manner; and they fhall not cut ¹⁷¹⁴. off any Pieces, or Pieces of Joints of Meat, under Pretence of Kitchen Fees.

The Pantlers shall give due Attendance in the Pantries and Halls, Assen, and take Care that the Baker serves the Hospital with Bread of the ¹ Jan. finest Wheat Flower, and that each Loaf weigh fix Ounces Troy ¹⁶¹⁸. Weight, (Half a Pound) and that no more Bread be spent, than the stated weekly Allowance, viz. two Loaves a Day for each Person in Commons.

The Butlers shall give due Attendance in the Butteries and Halls, Affem. and take Care that the Brewer deliver wholfome and good Beer, ac- ¹Jan. cording to the Price stated, (8 s. 6 d. per Barrel) and not exceed the ordinary weekly Allowance, viz. two Quarts a Day for each Person in Commons.

The Gardiner shall take great Care to keep the Wilderness and Assemthe Gardens in a neat handsome Manner, by pruning the Trees, 4 July, sweeping and weeding the Walks, and by doing all such other 1724. Things as properly belong to the Office of a Gardiner, for the Beautifying of them. And he shall open the Door for, and permit all fuch Perfons to walk in the Wildernefs, as the Master and Officers shall think direct.

He shall furnish the Master's Table with such Fruit and Salleting as the Gardens shall produce; and the Pensioners and Scholars Tables with fuch Salleting as the Gardens shall produce, or he shall be directed by the Master to purchase for them.

The Grooms of the Hall shall diligently attend in the Halls at Dinner and Supper, and fweep and keep clean the Halls, and make and look after the publick Fires in the Halls, and duly attend all fuch other Services concerning the Hofpital, as the Mafter shall lay upon them.

The Porter shall constantly attend his Service at the Great Gate, and observe the Persons coming in and going out of the Hospital; as likewife what Things are carried out thereof.

He shall fuffer to enter the Hospital none but Persons of sober and orderly Behaviour, who come about Bufinefs, or to vifit fome of the Members of the Hofpital, or to walk in the Gardens at the proper Seafons; all common Beggars, rude and diforderly Perfons, he fhall utterly repel.

He shall observe when the feveral Members of the Hospital pass and repais the Gate; and if he shall see any of them difordered in Liquor, he shall acquaint the Master therewith; as likewife, if he shall suspect, upon good Reason, any of them to lie out of the Hofpital, or to retain any Stranger therein.

He shall permit no Scholar of the Foundation to go out of the Gate without Leave under the School-master's Hand, or fome other deputed by him.

He shall lock the Gate at Ten a-Clock every Night, and shall carry the Keys to the Master of the Hospital.

All the other inferior Officers and Servants of the Hofpital shall diligently and duly perform their Duties, or they and every of them shall be punished for the fame, at the Discretion of the Master of the Hospital.
