ON THE

# STATE OF THE BUILDING FUND.

WHEN the School was 'originally established, in the year 1800, upon the premises which it first occupied, and which were held of the City of London, it was hoped that the trustees of the charity would be able to obtain from the City a renewal of the existing lease, which had then about ten years to run. In this case, such additions might have been made to the buildings already on the ground, at a very moderate expence, as would have been sufficient for the accommodation of a larger number of pupils. This expectation, however, was disappointed, owing to the transfer of Bethlehem Hospital to St. George's Fields, which wholly precluded the continuance of the School on that site. It having also been found impossible to procure any house, or existing building, capable of accommodating so large an establishment, the Committee were reluctantly obliged to erect new buildings for their reception, upon the present ground near the Obelisk, which the Corporation of the City of London very liberally granted on moderate terms. These, however respectable externally, are merely plain and commodious, and have been executed at the least possible expence, consistent with the object of providing suitable accommodation for an increased number of pupils, and for the introduction of some new manufacture, when the fund for general purposes shall be adequate thereto. The removal of the School, under these circumstances, has, as might be supposed, been attended with a very heavy expence. The building fund, which had been subscribed to with a view to the enlargement and improvement of the late School, was very inadequate to the expence of a more suitable building. The greater part, therefore, of the cost of this undertaking has necessarily fallen upon the general funds of the Institution; and it is earnestly hoped, that its friends will consider this circumstance as affording a strong incitement to them to give it additional support; they cannot but see with satisfaction the establishment of the School in a permanent situation, in which it will be able to fulfil their benevolent wishes more effectually, and to admit a greater number of objects to share in the advantages conferred by their bounty, than was heretofore practicable, owing to the want of accommodation in the late School, which the Committee could not undertake to enlarge or improve for the reasons already stated.

Under the pressure therefore of a very heavy debt, the immediate discharge of which is become a matter of the most serious necessity, it was resolved, at a special general meeting, held on Thursday, the 10th of March, 1814, that a circular letter be addressed to each member, soliciting the donation of a single guinea, for the present year only, for the special purpose of discharging the debt incurred on account of the BUILDING. To this resolution the Committee earnestly beg to draw the attention of the friends of a charity, which has

hitherto enjoyed so considerable a share of the public favour, and which, under the arrangements recently made for the election of objects, (See p. xxii) will, in all probability, be extended to a considerable proportion of blind persons, of both sexes, in this kingdom.

Above all, the Committee most earnestly entreat particular attention to the melancholy fact, that upwards of sixty unfortunate objects are now upon the list of candidates, many of whom have been several years soliciting admission, but cannot be received without an augmentation to the funds of the Institution.

# NATURE AND PROGRESS

OF THE

# INSTITUTION.

THE object of the School for the Indigent Blind is, to instruct persons of that description in a trade, by which they may be able to provide, either wholly, or in part, for their subsistence; an useful act of Charity, were no other good to result from their labour, than the relief afforded by it to their poor friends or relations, on whom the cost of maintaining them is frequently a heavy charge, but of which the benefits will appear far more important, when considered with reference to the comfort of the Blind themselves, and to the effect which habits of industry must necessarily produce on their feelings and general character.-It is perhaps difficult to conceive any two situations in the infinite varieties of civilized life, more different from each other, in respect to happiness, than the condition of a blind person, with his faculties benumbed by sloth, and his spirits depressed by the consciousness of being a burthen to those about him, and that of the same individual engaged in constant employment, and feeling that he contributes, by his daily occupation, to the comforts of the family of which he forms a part.

Subscriptions were first solicited for the Institution in the month of December, 1799; but so much time was unavoidably spent in procuring a proper place for the School, in providing accommodations for the reception of the pupils, and in other necessary arrangements, that very few admissions could take place till towards the end of the following year, viz. 1800. Its effects, since that time, on the class of persons for whose benefit it was established, and the encouragement which it has received from the Public, have been such as to answer the most sanguine expectations of its friends. It has, during a period of little more than thirteen years, returned fifty-seven persons to their families, able to earn, according to their several abilities, from 3s. to 1l. 10s. per week. It has been able to increase the number of its pupils from fifteen males, with which it commenced in 1800, to forty males, and twenty-one females: and it has established a manufactory, where articles made last year, by the hands of blind persons, sold for £1300 7s. 1d.

It was a part of the original plan to set up Day-Schools in different parts of the metropolis, but there being some reason to doubt whether the advantage to be afforded by such establishments would bear a due proportion to the expences with which they would be attended, it was resolved to begin with a Day-School adjoining to the School-house, where the experiment might be tried without much additional cost; and notice was accordingly given of an intention to open a Day School of this kind, whenever a sufficient number of applications should be made to afford a reasonable hope of its being useful; the applications, however, in favour of day scholars, have not hitherto been such as to render this step necessary. A few day scholars, of good character and respectable connections, have been received into the School, and are allowed to have their dinner with the other pupils

but persons, who may wish to recommend scholars of this description, are requested to take notice, that the Committee are obliged to be particularly strict, by their inquiries into their character and former habits of life, while they are thus employed in the same workshops with the other pupils, as the care of this Institution, extends as well to the moral and religious principles of those admitted into the School, as to their skill in manufacture.

#### OF THE PUPILS ADMITTED INTO THE SCHOOL.

The benefits of this Institution are extended to the blind of both sexes, who, when admitted, are clothed, boarded, lodged, and instructed.

It was stated, in a former publication, that the Committee would prefer pupils between the ages of twelve and eighteen, having observed such to derive most benefit from the instruction they receive. Upon further experience, all objects under twelve, are now deemed absolutely inadmissible; but no age above eighteen is considered as a disqualification, while the strength remains unimpaired, and the fingers are flexible. It is proper also to observe here, that cases of extreme indigence are not those, in which admission into this School is likely to be of most use, for when the pupil is dismissed, the value of the instruction he has received, must entirely depend upon the means he may possess of putting in practice the art in which he has been instructed, and unless his friends shall be in a condition to furnish him with a constant supply of materials for the regular exercise of the skill he may have acquired, the Society will have taught, and he will have learned, to very little purpose.

OF THE ARTICLES MANUFACTURED IN THE SCHOOL.

The articles at present manufactured in the School, are, shoemaker's thread, fine and coarse thread, window sash-line, and clothes-line (of a peculiar construction, and made on a machine adapted to the use of blind persons) by the females; and window and sash-line, clothes-line, hampers and wicker baskets, rough and white rope mats, and fine mats for hearths and carriages, by the males. A large quantity of the fine thread has been woven, by order of the Committee, into cloth of good quality, specimens of which may be seen at the School, and the coarse is worked up into clothes-line and window sash-line. In the manufacture of these different kinds of line, a very material improvement has taken place, since it was commenced, and specimens of those articles have been approved of by architects of the first eminence in their profession. The sale of baskets, rope mats, and white and coloured fine mats, at the School, has also very much increased, and orders are constantly executed by the pupils to a great extent; a large assortment of baskets, of different sorts and sizes, and of rough and white, and coloured rope-mats, is always kept at the School for sale, so well made, that persons inclined to patronize the charity, will experience no inconvenience, by taking from it such articles as may be wanted for the use of their families.

THE TIME FOR WHICH THE PUPILS ARE TAKEN.

The Pupils are only kept in the School, till they have attained a sufficient knowledge of their trade, which, in general, where there is no want of diligence or capacity, will be in about three or four years; they are then discharged, to make room for others, with a portion of their earnings by way of encouragement, and a set of tools; and many have

already been returned to their friends, grateful for the instruction they have received in religion and morality, during their continuance in the School, and qualified by the skill they have acquired there, to contribute, in a great degree, towards their maintenance.\*

Such are the nature and present state of the School for the Indigent Blind; a Charity which, it may be hoped, will, in the new buildings, be conducted on a much larger scale, and prove, in no slight degree, the means of bettering the condition and increasing the comforts of a portion of the community, whose claims to compassion and assistance cannot be disputed. Those who may be desirous of seeing to what extent the situation and faculties of the Blind are capable of improvement, may easily satisfy themselves on that head by visiting the School, which will be readily shewn to them; they need not be apprehensive of meeting with any thing which can shock their feelings, or give rise to melancholy reflections ;-they will not find the pupils sitting (as is commonly the case with the Blind) in listless indolence, or brooding in silence over their own defects, and their inferiority to the rest of mankind; but they will behold a number of individuals, of a class, hitherto considered as doomed to a life of sorrow and discontent, not less animated in their amusements during the hours of recreation, and far more cheerfully attentive to their work in those of employment, than persons possessed of sight.

\* A few of those instructed in the School, have, however, been kept upon a permanent establishment, on a supposition that their earnings have been found sufficient to maintain them, and their skill being also necessary to enable the Institution to keep up the credit of its manufacture with its customers: with this view, two males and three females, who would otherwise have been some time since dismissed as having received sufficient instruction, have been allowed o remain at the School.

OF THE MANNER OF APPLYING FOR ADMISSION, AND OF ENGAGEMENTS TO BE ENTERED INTO BY THE FRIENDS OF THE PUPILS.

Any person (whether a subscriber or not to the Charity) desirous of applying for the admission of an object, may have printed papers of questions at the School, (agreeably to the following forms) to which answers in writing will be expected, attested in the manner therein specified, and the paper, when properly filled up, may be sent under cover, to the Rev. Dr. Grindlay, (Secretary to the Institution) at the School for the Indigent Blind, in St. George's Fields, Surrey. It will be by him laid before the School Committee for examination, and their report on the case submitted for confirmation to the General Committee; upon whose order alone the names may be placed on the list of Candidates. If the party, on whose behalf the application is made, be chargeable to his parish, it is required, that such parish shall contribute a weekly allowance towards his maintenance in the School; and if the parish be at a distance from town, then some respectable housekeeper, in or very near London, must become responsible for the regular payment of the sum stipulated. It is also expected, in all cases, that some respectable person, resident in London or Westminster, shall engage to take the pupil back again, when discharged from the School, either in consequence of being sufficiently instructed, or on account of misconduct, or for any other cause, and likewise to defray the expences of burial, if he dies there.

#### I.

What is the name, age, parish, present residence, occupation, and maintenance of the applicant?

#### II

Where do parents or friends reside; what is the number of their children, their character, condition, and other circumstances?

#### III.

Has the applicant received parochial or other relief, or the family on behalf, and to what amount?

#### IV.

What weekly allowance will the parish of the applicant contribute towards support?\*

#### V.

Is the applicant free from epileptic or other fits, and from any disorder which may be prejudicial to those already in the School?

### VI.

Has the applicant had the small-pox or cow-pox?

### VII.

Has the applicant ever wandered about as a beggar, or played on a musical instrument in the streets or alchouses?

\* If the third question is answered in the negative, no notice is required to be taken of the fourth; it not being the wish of the Committee to make persons request relief who have not become chargeable to the parish.

#### VIII.

In what manner has the applicant been usually employed?

Has ever attempted to do any kind of work with h hands?

#### IX.

Is it probable that the parents or friends of the applicant, when he or she shall have left the School, can provide the necessary materials for future employment, and find a sale for the articles manufactured?

### X.

What is the nature of the blindness of the applicant? Is it partial or total? How long has the applicant been blind?

†‡† Persons applying for admission into the School for the Indigent Blind, are desired to observe, that the object of the Institution is not to provide for the permanent support of those taken under its protection, but "to teach them the means of gaining a livelihood for themselves:" as soon, therefore, as they shall have received all the instruction of which they appear to be capable, they will be dismissed, to make room for other scholars.

\*\*\* The Committee meet on the second Thursday of every month, at the St. Paul's Coffee-house, St. Paul's Church-yard, at Twelve o'clock PRECISELY.

# LAWS AND REGULATIONS.

This Institution is under the direction of a President, eight Vice-Presidents, a Treasurer, and a Committee of Twenty-four Members.

A subscription of One Guinea annually, or of not less than Ten Guineas at once, constitutes a member, and all Subscribers to the Building Fund shall be entitled to the same privileges as the Subscribers to the Fund for General Purposes.

#### GENERAL MEETINGS

shall be convened by public advertisements, inserted five days previously in three morning newspapers, to be held on the second Thursday in March, June, and December; or (in case any accident shall prevent the Meeting from being held on that day) on the next, or any following Thursday in the same months; seven members present shall be competent to transact business. The President, one of the Vice-Presidents, the Treasurer, or, in their absence, any member present, to be then chosen, shall preside. An extraordinary General Meeting may be called, by public advertisement, inserted five days previously in three morning papers, either by the Committee, or by the requisition, in writing, of any ten subscribers, (addressed to the President, one of the Vice-Presidents, or to the Treasurer) specifying their reasons, which shall be expressed in the advertisements, and no other business shall be then discussed.

General Meetings shall have controul over the whole Institution; and shall have power to make, alter, or annul the laws.

No General Meeting shall have power to sell or appropriate any part of the funded property, until the order made by it for such purpose be confirmed by a subsequent General Meeting, consisting of not less than twelve members, of whom three-fourths, at least, shall vote for such confirmation.

The Master or prime Warden of any corporate body, at the time when any donation of Twenty Guineas or upwards, hath or shall be given to this Institution, shall be thereby constituted an honorary member for life: honorary members for life are entitled to one single vote at all elections.

The annual election of officers to this charity by the members at large, shall take place at the General Meeting in March; but on any vacancy which may happen in the offices of President, Vice-Presidents, Treasurer, or Auditors, before the year is expired, the Committee shall have power to recommend a successor to a General Meeting, and may call an extraordinary General Meeting for the election, or defer the same until the ensuing General Meeting, as they shall think fit; and such election shall be by shew of hands; or by ballot if demanded.

No Annual Subscriber shall vote at any General Meeting, convened for any other purpose than that of electing objects into the School, unless his or her subscription shall have been paid six calendar months previous to the day of election.

# THE PRESIDENT, VICE-PRESIDENTS, AND TREASURER,

shall be annually elected: they shall be members of all Committees.

#### THE TRUSTEES

shall be elected at a General Meeting; and in their joint names all legacies and donations of one hundred pounds or upwards, shall be vested in the funds, unless otherwise directed by the Donors; the dividends arising therefrom shall be received by the Treasurer. As often as any vacancy shall happen, or a change appear necessary to a General Meeting, the same shall be supplied at an extraordinary General Meeting, to be then appointed, or at the next General Meeting, and the business mentioned in the advertisement.

## THE TREASURER

shall be annually elected, and shall present his account to the General Meetings in March, June, and December. He shall pay all monies that he may have received, to some one of the receiving Bankers, quarterly; unless he be a Banker himself; in which case the money in their hands shall be paid to him quarterly, by drafts signed by any two of the Committee, when assembled, counter-signed by the Secretary. All drafts upon the Treasurer shall be signed by the Chairman in Committee, and counter-signed by the Secretary.

## THE COMMITTEE

shall be elected from such of the members as are members for life, or subscribers of not less than two guineas yearly. Six vacancies shall be made annually (by ballot in the Committee, if necessary) on the second Thursday in March. The vacancies to be supplied by the General Meeting.

Their Meetings shall be held on the second Thursday in every month, or oftener, if necessary; and three members shall be competent to transact business. The President, one of the Vice-Presidents, or the Treasurer, or, in their absence, any other member of the Committee, shall take the chair.

They may be summoned to meet on any Thursday by the Treasurer, or Visitors, whenever they may think it necessary, giving three days previous notice of the same.

They, upon report of any legacy received, may elect to be honorary members of this Institution, the first named Executor, where the amount is £100 in money or stock, the two first named Executors, where it is £300 in money or stock, and the three first named Executors, where it is £500 in money or stock; and where Executors, Trustees, or others, shall exercise a discretionary power of distribution, by appointing a sum of Twenty Guineas or upwards, in favour of this Institution, the Committee may elect one or more of them honorary Members for life, provided that not more than one person be elected for every Twenty Guineas.

They shall form regulations for the internal management of the Institution, and for the instruction and moral discipline of the pupils. They shall hire, suspend, or discharge, the instructors and servants; order all the proper supplies, payments, and salaries, and take the general superintendance of the Institution, subject to the controll of the General Meetings.

No officer, instructor, or servant, shall accept of any fee or gratuity, from the pupils or their friends, or from any other person not authorized by the Committee, on pain of dismission. They shall elect three Visitors half-yearly, and Sub-Committees\* when necessary; the members of which may be chosen indifferently from the Committee itself, or from the general list of Subscribers.

Any Subscriber may be present at the meetings of the Committee, and give his opinion; but cannot vote, unless he be a member of it.

#### THE CHAPLAIN

shall be annually elected on the second Thursday in February, by the Committee. He shall perform divine service at the School once on every Sunday, and attend twice in every week, for the purpose of giving religious and moral instruction to the pupils.

### THREE VISITORS

shall be elected half-yearly by the Committee. It shall be their duty to visit the School from time to time, to inspect the conduct of all persons employed for the Institution, and of all the pupils; to enquire into the circumstances of the persons applying for admission when necessary, and into any other incidental affairs, and report the result to the Committee.

## THREE AUDITORS

shall be elected annually; all bills and demands shall be examined and audited by them, or one of them, previous to

\* A Sub-Committee, called the School Committee, appointed for the purpose of inspecting the weekly accounts of house expences and trade, of arranging the internal economy of the School, and of giving such directions as may be proper on the spot, is held on Mondays, at the School in St. George's-Fields, at ten o'clock PRECISELY. the Committee's order for their payment; as shall also the Treasurer's accounts, previous to their being laid before the General Meetings.

### THE SECRETARY

shall be appointed by the Committee; and upon his appointment, join with some other person, to be approved of by the Committee, in a bond, with the penalty of £200, to the Treasurer, for his fidelity: he shall summon and attend all meetings of the Committee, and General Meetings, and prepare and enter their Minutes; keep their books, papers, and accounts; receive donations and subscriptions and other incidental monies, and pay the same to the Treasurer previous to the Committee's Monthly Meetings.

### THE ELECTION OF OBJECTS.\*

The election of objects shall be by majority of votes, given by the Members at a public election, in the following manner, and subject to the following regulations:

- 1. Annual Subscribers shall have the privilege of one vote applicable to each vacancy, for every annual Guinea they subscribe; and each member for life, one vote for every Ten Guineas. Donations and subscriptions shall give a title to an immediate vote, but this privilege does not extend to any question but the election of objects into the School.
- 2. A printed list, containing the names and circumstances of the several Candidates, shall be prepared and sent, with a polling paper, at least one month before the election, to every Subscriber, and to the friends who have signed the certificate of each Candidate.
- \* On June 2, 1814, three males and four females were elected, and it is intended to elect five males and five females, on Thursday, February 2, 1815.

- 3. To secure the admission of proper objects only, no one shall, under any circumstances, be admitted into the School, whose name has not previously been inserted by the Committee on the list of Candidates.
  - 4. Previously to the circulation of the said list, the General Committee shall fix the time and place of election; and shall determine, according to the state of the funds and other circumstances of the Institution, the number of objects to be elected; and order the same, with the list of Candidates, to be printed, for the information of the Members.
  - 5. The Committee shall, at every election, if they think fit, recommend to the notice of the members at large, those Candidates who may have been unsuccessful at any preceding elections, by stating such circumstance upon the list of Candidates.
  - 6. The polling paper to be filled up by inserting against the name of each Candidate intended to be voted for, the number of votes to which the voting member's subscription is entitled, and signing his, or her, name to the said paper.
  - 7. Members vote by delivering the polling paper, properly filled up, to the Member of the Committee receiving the poll.
  - 8. All gentlemen, who are members, residing within two miles of the place of election, and not included in the following exceptions, are required to vote in person.
  - 9. All Ladies; all Noblemen; all Members of Parliament; and all Gentlemen whose usual place of residence,

is more than two miles from the place of election, are permitted to vote by proxy.

- 10. Every Subscriber voting by proxy, must fill up the polling paper as before, and in addition, appoint, by his or her signature, some member, by name, to deliver the said paper at the election.
- 11. No proxy vote admitted, unless delivered by a member, to the member of the Committee receiving the poll.
- 12. No vote, either in person or by proxy, shall be admitted from an Annual Subscriber whose subscription may be in arrear, until such arrears be paid.
- 13. The members of the Committee attend and undertake the charge of receiving the poll and conducting the election.
- 14. The election-room to be prepared with tables, and one or more letters of the alphabet, in large characters, exhibited at each table; at which a member of the Committee shall preside, to take the votes of all members whose Names begin with the letters so exhibited.
- 15. So much of the printed list of Subscribers as is contained under the initial letters of each table to be cut out and pasted upon a sheet of pasteboard, for the use of that table; and the member of the Committee receiving the votes, to check off the name of each vote received, to ascertain that no member votes more than once.
- 16. Pasteboard boxes to be provided for each table to receive the polling papers.

- 17. The polling papers to be taken from the boxes into another room, and strung together in parcels of fifty each.
- 18. Some members of the Committee attend in the second room to cast up the poll.
- 19. A competent number of large sheets of paper to be provided with the names of the Candidates, printed in their order in the margin, and the sheet ruled into partitions of ten lines or divisions each, to facilitate the casting up, and upon which the numbers voted for each Candidate are to be entered from the polling papers.
- 20. When the numbers polled for each Candidate are ascertained, and reported by the Secretary, the Chairman of the Committee to declare the successful Candidates.
- 21. The Chairman of the day, assisted by the Secretary, to determine all doubtful cases; answer enquiries, and direct references to the books of the Charity, when necessary.
- 22. The Secretary, or his assistant, to circulate the lists of Candidates, and prepare all the papers for the election.
- 23. The Secretary, or his assistant, and the Collectors to attend in the room at the time of election, to assist in taking the poll, and to give receipts for new subscriptions.
