Both in Acute and Chronic Cafes, Fair Water is to be prefer'd: But then, let it be Thames, New-River, City-Conduit, or fome other foft Water that refembles them. By no means Pump, or any hard Water, that wont lather with Soap. The more open to the Air the wholfomer.

To a quarter of a Pint, 4°, 50 or 60 Drops, to be drank three or four times in twenty four Hours. It must be stir'd up in all Liquors.

But in any kind of Fits, or Colical Pains, 'tis to be repeated three or four times in an hour, or till fome Relief be gain'd from it, and then more remifly. Here Differention must be us'd.

In half a Pint of Water-Gruel, Barley-Water, Milk-Pottage, New Milk, Whey, or Sack-water-Whey, from 16 or 17 Drops to 24, to be ftir'd in.

In a Dish of Milk-Tea about 20 Drops, or a little Tea-Spoonful.

In Green-Tea, or Bohee, without Milk, 10 or 12 Drops.

In a Dish of Sage-Tea, 12 or 14 Drops.

In a Dish of Chocolate 14 or 15 Drops.

In a Dish of Coffee about 10 Drops.

In Affes-Milk, or Cows-Milk, for Confumptive or Weak Perfons, put 14 or 15 Drops into a Cup of half a Pint, then pour, or rather milk on it; take two half Pints in a morning.

It preferves all Milk from Curdling, or turning in the Stomach.

In a Pint of Table-Beer, or Ale, stir in 15 or 16 Drops.

Into a Glass of Mum from 15 to 20 Drops.

In a Glass of Cyder or Mead 12 or 14 Drops.

In each Glass of Wine, 6, 7, or 8 Drops. Vide Large Treatise.

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POSTSCRIPT.

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A Description of the True S. V. O. whereby it may be known from Coanterfeits.

1. IT must be transparent, shining and lustre, as the Light were its Center.

2. No Salt must settle at the bottom of your Glass, all such is of a contrary nature.

3. 'Tis to be try'd by Fire : Ours, tho very oily, yet despiseth the Flames : Others, will blaze and burn, and are pernicious.

4. It must finell only of it felf, that is, with a fost, not harsh Pungency: And in the Scent may be discern'd a Fragrancy from its sweet Sulphurs. Whatever smells of Spice, Perfume, or Spirits, is a jumble of Man's Invention, and out of the way of Nature.

5. When you drop it into Water, observe the fhivering spirituous Oil, and its Ponderosity in finking to the bottom: In Wines and Cyder obferve in its Fall how it opens an internal Redness; which, when stir'd up, rifes in a Cloud of Knits, and gives Mellowness and a full Body to your Liquors.

6. When you rub a Drop or two betwixt the Palms of your Hands, and finell quick to them, you'l find its ftronger Gas (an *Helmontian* word) or Airy Spirit rife and fpring, tho loth to roufe (till (till crush'd) from its espous'd Principle. This is the Love-Knot in Nature.

7. It must be saline, and that too with a good ftomachic Relish, fatten'd with a Saltness that is quick and exciting; yet tender and easy.

Volatile Salts, that are thin, fharp and cauffic, like Sal Armoniac, are not fit for internal Use: They may serve some for a Rouzer to their Noses.

All that's contain'd in our full Medicine of Sal Volatile Oleofum, is nevertheles but one thing.

Here is mystical Philosophy, and a sound depth of Knowledg in Nature.

Duality with us is mere Jargon, — tho it finat. ches of the Greek.

Whereas this Medicine was formerly Sold only in Five Shilling Bottles, 'tis now fold in Half Crown, Crown, and Pint Bottles, at Sixteen Shillings the Pint, for the Service of Families. They who buy the Pints will be Gainers.
