

# DISPENSARY REPORT,

### FOR THE YEAR ENDING DECEMBER 31, 1845.

On reviewing the history of the past year, your Committee have had great pleasure in perceiving that the Institution has maintained its hold on the public esteem. Limited as it is, by the necessities of the case, to the reception of a certain number only, and pressed by a demand which it cannot supply, it is obvious that the test of numbers ceases to be a test of success: this test indicating only the rapidity of cure and the nature of the cases, not the demand. This observation will explain the fact, that while during the eight months ending December 31st, 1844, there had been 414 admissions, there were during the whole of the last year 332 only. The fact is that a much greater number might have been admitted, had there been the means of providing for their treatment. From the statement of accounts, it will be perceived that the income of the institution, from the payments of the extraordinary patients principally, has been such as to leave a considerable surplus over its expenditure.

This fact induces your Committee to recommend to your serious consideration the extension of the Establishment, by making a provision for the reception of a few acute cases, constituting it to this extent a small hospital. For the support of an Establishment, containing six beds,  $\pounds 100$  per annum of additional income would suffice; and such a sum, it is believed, might be easily raised by the combined exertions of the Friends of Homœopathy. The establishment of such an Institution is recommended as a measure most important to the success of Homeopathy in this Town, and to the interests of its inhabitants; and that upon the following considerations. It will, in the first place, silence, Scepticism. Much of the incredulity that exists is based on the smallness of the dose employed in Homeopathic practice. Homæopathy is, on this account, set down as a do-nothing system; and the usual question, when the subject is started, put with no wish for information, but used as a knock-down argument of the Socratic kind, is, "But what will you do in Inflammation ?" Just as, when steamers were started, the old sailor's knock-down question was ever, "But what will you do in a storm P"

The success of Establishments, such as that now proposed, has ever formed a triumphant answer to questions of this kind, and this often sarcastic, and always incredulous, spirit consequently changed into one of humble and honest inquiry. This assertion, borne out as it is by the Statistics of the Homeopathic Hospitals, has been admitted to some extent by Dr. Forbes, in the last number of his very judicious periodical, the British and Foreign Medical Review; nor can it be questioned by any candid and well-informed opponent. On the evidence then of statistics of acknowledged validity, founded upon the tables of 64 Allopathic and of 6 Homeopathic Hospitals, in different parts of Europe, and extending in some cases over a space of ten years, it is asserted, that out of every 100 patients, treated Allopathically, from 9 to 10 die; whereas, out of the same number, treated Homeopathically, from 4 to 5 only die: the mean duration of disease being in the former case from 28 to 29 days, in the latter from 20 to 21 only. These statements lead directly to a consideration, which gives the former its chief value; for, in the second place, such an Establishment will most probably shorten the duration of disease and save human life. A consideration of this nature, backed by the evidence already adduced, speaks for itself; and your Committee feel that it may be safely permitted to do so, and leave the matter in your hands, convinced that it will receive your careful consideration.

The following cases are published for the purpose of furnishing some materials towards a settlement of the question, Has medicine in the dose, given by Homeopathic Practitioners, any efficacy at all? If, in any one case, sudden or even speedy changes occur, at variance with the experience of the patient for some long period of time, attention may be fairly turned to the only variation in the circumstances which has occurred, as the probable cause of the result; the probability of our having ascertained the true cause increasing with the number of cases. About twenty therefore, have been selected, as presenting such an amount of probability, as to induce further enquiry. This much appears certain, that the evidence adduced is much superior in degree, to that which is every day being acted on by the medical world at large. Results far less striking are ascribed without hesitation, in ordinary cases, to the remedies used, and form a sufficient recommendation for their further trial in the treatment of discease. In order to afford every facility to enquiry, the Christian Name, with the initial letter of the Surname, the Residence, and Occupation (if any), of the patient are given, and any further information, if required. Considerable trouble has been taken to ascertain the present state of the persons, whose cases are detailed; and, with the exceptions noted in the cases themselves, they all remain either well or permanently improved.
