SECTION B.

GENERAL PROVISION OF HEALTH SERVICES FOR THE AREA. There is no change to report under this heading.

SECTION C.

SANITARY CIRCUMSTANCES OF THE AREA. Water - Sundry minor extensions of mains etc., were carried out during the year and all sources of water were maintained in a satisfactory state and free from pollution as was shown by analyses of six samples taken during the year.

Drainage, Sewerage and Sewage Disposal - The war has held up projected extensions of the Council's Sewerage System, plans of which have been prepared for the sewering of two parts of the area. The new Sewage Works at Meadowbank, it'should be noted, give a very good effluent. The Town's main Sewage Disposal Works have been maintained in a satisfactory condition. In spite of damage from subsidence no evidence of river pollution exists.

<u>Closet Accommodation</u> - During the year the number of conversions to the water carriage system was 8 and the number of houses still on the old system in built-up areas is 108.

Public Cleansing - The routine work of refuse collection and disposal and the cleansing of pail closets etc. proceeded satisfactorily throughout the year.

CARCASES INSPECTED AND CONDEMNED.

One carcase was examined in connection with the operation of the Tuberculosis Order, 1938. the entire carcase and organs were condemned as unfit for human consumption.

The Inspectors under the Diseases of Animals Act notified 4 suspected cases of Anthrax none of which were confirmed by the veterinary surgeons.

(c) The inspection of premises in which other foods are prepared has been continued during the year.

SECTION F.

PREVELANCE OF, AND CONTROL OVER, INFLUTIOUS DISLASES.

(1) Infectious Diseases (other than Tuberculosis).

Apart from the occurrence of an outbreak of Measles the year 1940 passed off well. A substantial reduction in the number of cases of both Scarlet Fever and Diphtheria is recorded in spite of the trials **cf** war-time and the wholesale movements of troops and evacuated children into the District. The Isolation Hospital accommodation proved to be adequate to deal with all Infectious Diseases needing Institutional treatment during the year.

The end of 1940 saw a successful joint "drive" with the other three Mid-Cheshire Local Authorities against Diphtheria and thanks to the excellent help received from the Headmasters of Elementary and Secondary Schools in the District, the co-operation of the Medical Practitioners, the County Health Department and the local Press, excellent progress was made, and the actual protective treatment commenced on a big scale curly in January, 1941. The fact that the Scheme was a joint effort serving the needs of four independent County Districts isd to much economy of time and effort.

15 Sputum specimens were examined at the County Council's Laboratory during the year; none were reported on as positive.

The practice of home disinfection in cases of Infectious Diseases (including Tuberculosis) and the eradication of Bed-Bugs was continued during the year. All the Schools in the Town were disinfected at least twice during the year and 9 houses were disinfested for Bed-Bugs.
