An Act to continue, explain, and amend, feveral Laws more effectually to prevent the Spreading of the Diftemper which now rages amongst the Horned Cattle in this Kingdom.

Cattle fill continues to rage in this Kingdom: and whereas the several Laws made to prevent the spreading of the said Diffemper (which have been found useful and beneficial) are near expiring; Way it therefore please Pour Wajeffy, that it may be enacted; and be it enacted by the King's moft Ercellent

by and with the Advice and Confent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the Authority of the same, That an Act made in the Mineteenth year of the Act 19 Geo. tl. Reign of his present Wajesty, intituled, An Act to enable and the several succeeding His Majesty to make Rules, Orders, and Regulations, more Acts, made to effectually to prevent the spreading of the Distemper which mend, and connow rages amongst the Horned Cattle in this Kingdom; further continue, the same, further continue, the same, which was to continue in Force for the Space of Eight need to 1 Sept. faid laff-mentioned At, for the Space of Eight Months, from the Tenth Day of January, One thousand seven bundred and forty fir, and from thence to the End of the then next Seffion of Parliament; and which faid Atts. by an Aft made in the Twenty first Pear of the Reign of idis present Majeffy, were further continued, until the Twenty fourth Day of September, One thousand seven hundred and forty eight, and from thence to the End of the then next Section of Parliament; and which, by an Aft made in the Twenty second Dear of the Beign of Dis present Majesty, were further continued, until the Twenty fourth Day of September, Dne thousand seven hundred and forty nine, and from thence to the End of the then nert Seffion of Parliament; and also several Clauses in the faid Aft, made in the Twenty second Bear of bis prefent Majetty's Reign, for amending, explaining, and enforcing, the faid Ads made in the Mineteenth and Twentieth Pears of his present Majesty's Reign; and for preventing the Spreading of the Distemper amongst the boined Cattle; and for impowering his Majetty to prohibit the killing of Cow Calves; and which, by an Act made in the Ewenty third Dear of the Reign of Dis pies fent Majeffp, were further continued, until the Twenty ninth Day of September, Dne thousand seven hundred and fifty, and from thence to the End of the then next Sellion of Parliament; and also several Clauses in the said Act made in the Twenty third Bear of the Reian of Dis mes fent Majefip; and which, by an Ad made in the Twenty fourth pear of the Reign of Dis Bajeffy, were further continued, until the first Day of September, Dne thous fand feven bundged and fifty one, and from thence to the End of the then next Section of Parliament; and also feveral Clauses in the said Act made in the Twenty fourth Wear of his present Wajeffp's Reign, for explaining and enforcing the faid Acts, that be, and the same are hereby, further continued, until the first Day of September, One thousand seven hundled and fifty two, and from thence to the End of the then nert Seffion of Parliament.

And whereas the Continuing and Spreading of the Distemper that now rages in many Parts of this Kingstom amongst the Homed Cattle, has been occasioned by the Dziving of Infected Cattle from Place to Place, in other more secretly to dispose of the said Cattle: And whereas the Justices of the Peace of the several Counties within this Realm, at their General Quarter Sessions, or at some Adjournment thereof, have, to prevent the same, made Diders, from time to time, as the Erigency required, to prohibit the Driving of any Dr. Bull, Cow,

and whereas by an Act passed in the Twenty fourth Recital of pear of Dis prefent Bajefly's Reign, intituled, An Act Claufe in an Act of 24 Geo. for explaining, continuing, and enforcing, feveral Laws-11. therein mentioned, more effectually to prevent the Spreading of the Diftemper which now rages amongst the Horned Cattle in this Kingdom, it was, amongst other Things, enacted, That from and after the first Day of July, Dne thousand seven hundred and fifty one, no Justice of the Peace, or other Magistrate, of any Corporation, or Commissioner of the Land Tax for such Corporation, or Redoz of Aicar within any Corporation, should certify for any borned Beaff, or bide of any Beaff, unless such Beaft bath been kept within his Jurisdiction for the Time required by Law, or that the Beast from which such hide was taken, was flaughtered within his Jurisdiction: And whereas the Magistrates only were thereby subjected to a Penalty of Twenty Pounds for granting any Certificate, other than as aforesaid; be it further enacted by the Aus Commissioners thought aforefaid, That the Commissioners of the Land of the Land Tax, Rectors Tax, and Rectors and Clicars afore mentioned, that, from and Vicare, Tar, and Rectors and Aicars afore-mentioned, thall, from and Vicars, and after the Twenty fifth Day of March, One thousand Penalty for feven hundred and fifty two, be subject and liable to the granting Certificate for the forest contrary faid Forfeiture, in the same Wanner as such Wagistrate to the recited is subject and liable thereto.

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Persons granting Certificates to set forth therein by virtue of what Office they grant the same,

and be it further enacted by the Authority aforesaid. That from and after the Twenty fourth Day of June, Due thousand seven bundred and fifty two, all persons whatsoever, taking upon them to grant Certificates in pursuance of any Ad made for the preventing the Spreading of the Distemper which now rages amongs the borned Cattle in this Kingdom, or bis Bajeffy's Diders relating thereto, Mall fet forth, in every fuch Certificate, by birtue of what Office be grants such Certificate, whether as Juffice of the Peace for any County, City, or Borough, Commissioner of the Land Tax, or otherwise; and in case any Person Shall neglect to to bo, fuch Person Shall, for every fuch Offence, respectively, forfeit and pay the Sum of Cen Pounds of lawful Money of Great Britain, for every such Meglett; to be recovered by Action of Debt. Bill, Plaint, or Information, in any of bis Baiefip's Courts of Record at Westminster, with Full Costs of Suit : wherein no Elloin, Privilege, Protection, or Wager of Law, or more than One Imparlance, thall be allowed.
