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# PUBLIC HEALTH DEPARTMENT, TOWN HALL, WEST HAM.

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*To the Council of the County Borough of West Ham.*

MR. MAYOR AND GENTLEMEN,

“Every Medical Officer of Health appointed under order of the Local Government Board is required to make an annual report with regard to the sanitary district which is under his superintendence. . . . . The report is to be for the year ending 31st December. It should be chiefly concerned with the conditions affecting health in the district, and with the means for improving those conditions. It should contain an account of the sanitary circumstances of the district, and of any improvement or deterioration which may have occurred during the year in those circumstances.”

In accordance with the above requisition, I beg to submit my annual report for the year 1908, and in doing so, desire to point out that such report must necessarily consist very largely of a summary of my periodical reports and other matters which have been under discussion by the Council during the year, and which, therefore, are more or less within the immediate recollection of the members. The collated returns, however, and the statement of local circumstances which may appear superfluous to members fully conversant with them, serve not only as valuable statistical records for future reference, but are needed by the Local Government Board and other authorities, to whom the Medical Officer of Health is required to forward copies.

**Physical Features and General Character of the District.**—West Ham is situate in latitude  $51^{\circ} 30'$  to  $51^{\circ} 33'$  N., longitude  $0^{\circ} 1'$  W. to  $0^{\circ} 3'$  E., on the extreme west of the County of Essex, and on the eastern side by the administrative County of London, from which it is separated by the windings of the River Lea for  $3\frac{1}{2}$  miles. In shape it is an irregular rhomboid, some 2 miles from west to east and 4 miles from north to south. Its elevation is almost flat, varying from less than 5ft. to 45ft. above ordnance datum, about half of the area being not more than 10ft. above that level. Chalk may be reached at depths varying from 100ft. to 150ft., overlaid by green Thanet sands and Woolwich beds, on which rests 5ft. to 50ft. of London clay. In the higher part of the Borough 16ft. to 20ft. of river drift gravel overlays the London clay, sloping away towards the River Lea and River Thames into marshy clay and alluvium, a large part of the immediate surface being made ground.

The northern and eastern sides of the Borough are contiguous to the populated districts of Leyton and East Ham. The southern boundary is formed by the River Thames for  $2\frac{1}{8}$  miles.

## METEOROLOGY.

The observations given below are extracted from the weekly reports of observations taken at Greenwich Observatory, a course justified by the geographical position of the Borough immediately to the North of Greenwich. They show that the registered sunshine of the year was 1,633·8 hours, being 215·8 hours more than in 1907. The hottest day was 3rd July, when the temperature reached 84·0 degrees, and the coldest day was 30th December, when it sank to 12·1 degrees. The number of rainy days was 167, the total rainfall of the year being 23·84 inches. The greatest daily fall occurred on 13th July, when 1·04 inches fell.

**Chief Occupations of Inhabitants.**—West Ham is a typical industrial Borough. Large factories abound on the river frontages west and south; railway works employing thousands of regular hands are located in the north, and large docks, the staple support of casual labour, intersect the south. The rest of the area may be said to form the dormitory of artisans, clerks and others whose daily work is carried on in London. There is no particular industry calculated to specially affect the public health.

**Housing Accommodation.**—At the census in 1901 there were 41,368 inhabited houses. The dedicated roads extend to  $123\frac{3}{4}$  miles, some four-fifths of which are at least 40ft. wide, and bordered by houses of two storeys. Originally constructed as self-contained houses, they have in large measure been adapted, by alterations and additions, for the accommodation of two families, while in recent years the flat system has been very generally adopted in developing the newer estates. Very few blocks of dwellings of three or more storeys exist, and the unsatisfactory character of these require constant supervision and action by the Sanitary Staff. The erection of all new buildings are supervised by building Inspectors of the Borough Engineer's Department.

In 1908 no action was taken under the Housing of the Working Classes Act.

**Water Supply.**—Several large firms possess private wells drawing water from the chalk, but practically the whole of the Borough is supplied with water by the Metropolitan Water Board, successors to the East London Water Company, the main source of water being derived from the River Lea and the wells sunk by the latter company. During 1908 a shallow well, used for drinking, was closed by Magistrate's Order under Section 70, Public Health Act, 1875.



**Milk Supply.**—Under the Dairies, Cowsheds, and Milk Shops Orders 325 premises were registered for the sale of milk. The majority of these are small general shops retailing very small quantities of milk, the storage of which is frequently of a doubtful character. On inspection 218 were found to require cleansing, or to exhibit defects remediable under the Public Health Acts. 27 milk shops were struck off the register and 73 placed thereon.

In addition to the above 22 persons were registered as cow-keepers. 99 visits were paid to the cowsheds of these persons. Several were served with Cleansing Notices, and considerable structural improvements were carried out at three cowsheds in response to Sanitary Notices. There is still, however, much room for improvement both in the character of the buildings and the care exercised in the collection and distribution of the milk.

With a view to the detection of tuberculous disease of the udder, an annual inspection of all cows in the Borough has, for some years past, been made by the Council's Veterinary Surgeon, but in 1908 the Council decided, on the advice of the Medical Officer of Health, that a quarterly inspection should be made.

The number of cows in the sheds does not vary much. The general health and condition are good. There was some excess of "coughing," but in none of these cases was there any appearance of generalised tuberculosis. Cows in poor condition were few, and all such had sound udders. No positive case of tuberculous udder was found, but one or two remain under observation, for which the coming quarterly inspection will afford extra facilities.

The total number examined was almost identical with last quarter, although there were several shed variations. The general condition was good. Some of the cases of recent mastitis were clearly due to temperature changes, but two of them require further early observation. There are a few aged cows, lean and rough, but healthy. The milk in such cases is poor in quality and usually scanty. These instances occur only in the one or two sheds where the practice is to breed from the old cows and bring in the female calves as they mature. With these exceptions, the whole of the cows in the various sheds are changed every year, and as they become dry are fatted for the butcher. This fixes a fortunate limit to any progressive disease, such as local or general tuberculosis. There was very little coughing either in the close or open sheds.

**Food Inspection.**--Each of the twelve Inspectors of Nuisances is required to inspect the food shops and slaughter-houses in his district. In addition to these the Food Inspector, who devotes the greater part of his time to the administration of the Sale of Food and Drugs Acts, is charged equally with the other Inspectors with the duty of safeguarding the sale of food in market streets and other premises where dietary articles are exposed for sale.



**Inspection of Bakehouses and Fish-shops** is also carried out by the Inspectors, particular attention being directed to the regular removal of offal and trade refuse, which in all cases (except that of greengrocers) is carried out by private contractors.

In the appendix to this report will be found a list of unsound food seized as unfit at the time of exposure, or condemned without formal seizure under Section 117, Public Health Act, 1875.

During 1908 legal proceedings were instituted in three cases under the above section:—(1) In respect of exposure of unsound tomatoes on a barrow in the street, the defendant being fined 15s. ; (2) in respect of unwholesome bacon found in a shop, the defendant being fined £3 ; and (3) in respect of unwholesome bread exposed at the time of sale. The last summons was dismissed on the payment of £2 2s. costs, £1 1s. of which the Magistrate ordered to be paid to the purchaser of the bread.

**Slaughter-houses.**—There are now upon the Register 16 old registered slaughter-houses and one registered knacker's yard, together with 15 annually licensed slaughter-houses and one annually licensed knacker's yard.

Owing to the proximity to the London market, the amount of slaughtering carried out locally forms a small percentage of the meat sold, but the infrequency of use and scattered location of the private slaughter-houses render efficient inspection extremely difficult, if not impossible.

During 1908 an application was received for the use and occupation of No. 10, High Street, Plaistow, but the Committee, after visiting the premises, declined to grant the application.

A renewed application was made for a License for premises at the rear of No. 9, Upton Lane. This was refused last year, but the



Public Health Committee, after visiting, decided to grant the application, subject to the carrying out of certain alterations and requirements.

The Licenses for the following premises were transferred during the year :—

91 and 93, Woodgrange Road.

Chadwin Road.

A new License was also granted for premises, No. 1, Broadway, Stratford, but they are now closed. An application was also made for a License for premises in Barber's Road, Stratford. The Public Health Committee visited the proposed site, and recommended that plans be submitted of the necessary buildings.

**Sale of Food and Drugs Acts.**—Under Section 9 of the Butter and Margarine Act, 1907, milk-blended butter can only be dealt with under such name or names as may be approved by the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries.

The following is a complete list of names approved for mixtures of butter and milk or cream as on 28th October, 1908 :—Alimo, Bradlac, Brohco, Camlaw, Casa, Casana, Casmon, Casoa, Casora, Casova, Consumo, Dalphine, Debeco, Esselbee, Froco, Fromaid, Iveldale, Iveldene, Ivelette, Ivelmore, Jensa, Kingstyle, Maldar, Me-no, Nolax, Pearks' Breadmate, Pearks' Bredspred, Pearksown, Samaline, Seeandwi, Ve-vo, and Vivum.

In accordance with the Order of the Local Government Board, dated 28th December, 1907, the premises, No. 14, Martin Street, Stratford, were registered as a Margarine Factory.

Under these Acts 1,249 samples were purchased for analysis, and 92 were returned by the Public Analyst as adulterated, the number



of samples taken being at the rate of 4·6 per 1,000 of the census population. In London the samples taken during the year 1907 were at the rate of 5·3 per 1,000, and in the rest of England at the rate of 2·5 per 1,000. I applied for summonses in 58 cases, at the hearing of which fines and costs amounting to £124 6s. 6d. were imposed. The particulars of these will be found in the appendix.

**Sewerage and Drainage.**—The water carriage system of sewage removal is almost universal throughout the whole area of the district; with few exceptions all houses being provided with properly flushed modern water closets, discharging into appropriate pipe or brick sewers, which also convey the surface water and most of the rainfall. The southern portion of the Borough being isolated by the Victoria and Albert Dock, is drained into a main sewer running from west to east through a narrow strip of the southern portion of the Borough of East Ham, whence it discharges in the London County Council sewer in North Woolwich.

The north-western corner of the Borough, an area of roughly 120 acres, containing two terraces of houses, and some isolated houses and



factories, remains unsewered, the excrement disposal consisting of cesspools, and scattered cesspools are to be found here and there in a few places remote from the general system of sewerage.

The sewers draining the main portion of the district (five-sixths of the whole area) converge by means of specially constructed intercepting sewers to the Corporation's pumping station, situate near the middle of the western border of the Borough. Here the sewage is pumped into the North Metropolitan outfall sewer, whence it gravitates to the London outfall works at Barking.

The sewers are sufficient for all ordinary industrial and climatic conditions, but in the case of exceptional rainstorms complaints of flooding still occur, largely at the periphery of the system. These complaints, however, have been much less numerous since the carrying out of relief works by the Borough Engineer during the past year or two.

**Pollution of Streams.**—The back waters of the River Lea, which consist of some  $6\frac{1}{2}$  miles of tidal waterways, and intersect about a quarter of the northern half of the Borough, are subject to pollution chiefly from the urban districts of Leyton and Walthamstow, which discharge their effluents into the Waterworks River north of West Ham. The scanty flow of pure water from above and the long periods during which the beds of the stream are exposed on the receding of the tide, have frequently during the hot summer months led to serious complaints of nuisance, and the Corporation have had occasion not only to draw the attention of the Lee Conservancy Board to the nuisance arising in the Borough from the condition of the back waters, but have, also, on their own initiative taken steps to palliate as far as possible the offensive state of the river beds. No radical improvement in these waterways can be hoped for until the effluents from the other districts shall be withdrawn from the streams.

Other sources of pollution are from time to time discovered by reason of the unauthorized overflow from piggeries into ditches



communicating with the back waters, but no case of this description was found in 1908.

**Collection of House Refuse.**—The house refuse of the Borough is collected twice a week, the receptacles being placed outside the houses by the occupiers, and collected by the Corporation vehicles.

The total amount collected during the 308 working days in the year amounted to 28,003 loads, a decrease of 293 loads on the previous year.

The shoots on which the above house refuse was deposited are set out below :—

## BYE-LAWS RELATING TO OFFENSIVE TRADES, COMMON LODGING-HOUSES, &c.

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**Offensive Trades.**—Upwards of thirty premises where statutory offensive businesses are carried on are located in the Borough, and include soap manufacturers, 9 ; fat melters and bone boilers, 12 ; gut scrapers, 2 ; fish offal collectors, 2 ; organic manure manufacturers, 2 ; other trades, 3.

These are subject to constant inspection, and may be said to be carried on with comparatively little nuisance to the general public.

During 1908 permission was granted for the establishment of the manufacture of toilet soap at Bow Bridge Wharf, Stratford. An application was also received for permission to establish gut scraping at No. 30, Marshgate Lane, but in consequence of the extensive repairs required to render the premises fit for the purpose, the application was dropped.

The Public Health Department were engaged throughout the whole of 1908, at considerable expense of time and labour, in dealing with one newly-established offensive trade known as the British Organic Conversion Company, Ltd. The history of these proceedings is as follows :—In December, 1903, permission was granted to Messrs. Hammersley for the erection of works and the establishment of soap-making and fat-melting at premises in Bradfield Road, Silvertown. In August, 1905, application was made to establish bone-boiling at the same premises. This application was then refused, but permission was subsequently granted in June, 1906. In 1907 the foregoing businesses were transferred to the British Organic Conversion Company, Ltd., and in September of that year an application by the Company for permission to treat blood and other organic matter was



considered and granted by the Council. Up to this period complaints of nuisance from surrounding premises had been occasional, but on the commencement of the treatment of flesh by the Company the complaining became universal. Three separate memorials were received by the Council between December, 1907, and April, 1908, the last being the result of a public meeting held in the district on the 23rd April, 1908. In the meantime constant observations had been made of the premises and in the neighbourhood by the Public Health Staff at all hours of the day and night, and, after much correspondence, the Medical Officer of Health served an Official Notice upon the Company on the 19th February, 1908, requiring them to abate the nuisance and prevent a recurrence. In spite of this Notice the nuisance continued, and at times could be detected at a distance of 300 yards from the works, so that in July the Council were compelled to apply to the High Court for an Injunction to close the premises. Although the matter was mentioned on one or two occasions in Court, the case did not come on for trial until the 3rd February, 1909, when the Defendant Company submitted to the Injunction asked for with costs, and judgment was given accordingly.

**Common Lodging Houses.** — There are 12 Common Lodging Houses in the Borough, six in the Stratford district and six in the Tidal Basin district, all of which, with one exception, were originally constructed for other purposes, such as private dwellings or warehouses, and have been adapted more or less successfully to meet the requirements of the Common Lodging House Bye-laws.

During 1908, No. 211, High Street, Stratford, and No. 72, Great Eastern Road, were in the early part of the year transferred to Mr. Peter Gallagher, of 56, Langdon Park Road, Highgate, and Mrs. Elizabeth Underwood was registered as the Deputy Keeper of the latter house. A new Lodging House was sanctioned at the premises known as the Labour Yard, Butcher's Road, Mr. Arthur Yates being registered as the Keeper. These premises were constructed for use as



workshops, with loft above. The lower storey has been converted into kitchen and lavatories, and the upper storey into dormitories and recreation rooms. Accommodation, 48. A private dwelling house, No. 1, Short Road, Stratford, having been adapted by alterations and additions for the purpose, was sanctioned as a Common Lodging House, and Mr. Henry Leader registered as the Keeper. Accommodation, 14.

**Schools.**—The Public Elementary Schools consist of 46 Council Schools and 14 Non-Provided Schools, together with 3 Council Special and 2 Higher Elementary Schools, affording in the aggregate accommodation for 68,826 scholars.

The Schools are for the most part modern, substantially built buildings, adequately supplied with water, and provided with sufficient surrounding air space. The general cleanliness of the premises appears to be well looked after, but the general sanitary condition of the lavatories, &c., requires constant attention, and in some instances might be better cared for.

With a view to checking the spread of epidemic disease, it has been the practice for many years past for the Medical Officer of Health, on receiving information of the occurrence of infectious disease in the family of a scholar, to send a red-coloured notice to the Head Teacher of the School recommending the exclusion of children coming from the infected home, subsequently followed by a white notice freeing the family from quarantine on the completion of the necessary isolation by the official disinfection of the premises.

Each School is provided with a supply of disinfectants for general or special use.

The particular action taken with regard to Schools during the year will be found under the heading "Incidence of Disease."



In January the Local Government Board issued a Memorandum on the circumstances under which the closing of Public Elementary Schools, or the exclusion therefrom of particular children, may be required in order to check the spread of disease.

**Methods of Dealing with Infectious Disease.**—Prior to the Infectious Disease Notification Act, 1899, the notification of these diseases in West Ham had been compulsory for 11 years, under special powers obtained by the West Ham Corporation Act, 1888, which provided for the notification of all the diseases specified in the general Act, with the exception of Erysipelas and Membranous Croup.

The Hospital accommodation of the Borough consists of—

- (1) The Plaistow Fever Hospital (opened as to two wards in 1896) now contains 210 beds, allocated to the following purposes: 110 for Scarlet Fever, 63 for Diphtheria, 22 for Enteric Fever, and 15 isolation beds for Mixed or Staff cases.
- (2) Dagenham Small-pox Hospital, situate about 9 miles from the Borough, occupying a site of  $6\frac{1}{2}$  acres, enclosed within a farm of 119 acres, owned and cultivated by the Council, was opened in 1899. It consists of permanent buildings capable of accommodating 50 patients, with the administration required for their care, and temporary iron buildings sufficient to treat 300 cases. Under agreement, seven other Authorities contribute to the establishment and maintenance of this Hospital, in consideration of West Ham undertaking to receive and treat all the Small-pox cases sent to the Hospital by those Authorities.
- (3) The Manor Road Shelter, an iron building fitted so as to contain 24 beds for convalescent Scarlet Fever patients.



This will be closed on the completion of—

- (4) The Grange, Convalescent Home, situate about  $9\frac{1}{2}$  miles from the Borough, at Harold Wood, in which it is hoped accommodation may be found for 50 children. This Home consists of a residential mansion with outbuildings and 7 acres of grounds, together with  $61\frac{1}{2}$  acres of pasture land, and has required some alterations and additions to render it fit for its present use.

In connection with the Dagenham Hospital is a building containing an Equifex steam disinfector for hospital use, while attached to the Plaistow Fever Hospital is a large Washington-Lyon's disinfector, so arranged as to serve the purposes of a public Disinfecting Station for the treatment of bedding, &c., of infectious cases occurring in the Borough on removal to Hospital, or on recovery at home.

**Methods of Control of Tuberculosis.**—Down to the end of 1908 no system, voluntary or compulsory, of notification of Pulmonary Tuberculosis pertained in West Ham, and consequently very few cases of living consumptives have been brought to the knowledge of the Public Health Department. These have been chiefly through the agency of Jewish Aid Societies and, occasionally, of Poor Law Medical Officers. In all these cases a member of the Sanitary Staff has visited the home, with a view to the remedying of any existing defects in the structural surroundings of the patient, of advising him as to the necessity of properly using the means at his disposal, of aiding him by verbal converse and printed literature to appreciate the value to himself and his family of the proper treatment and disposal of his expectoration, and of teaching him the right use of disinfectants. In every case of a recorded death from Phthisis a similar visit has been paid, disinfection of the premises offered, and in most cases carried out.

During 1908, 319 deaths from Phthisis occurred, equal to an annual death rate of 1.02 per 1,000.



During the previous 10 years (1898-1907), the average death rates from Phthisis and other tubercular disease were as under :—

These rates correspond very nearly with those of England and Wales, and are lower than most towns of a similar size.

### VITAL STATISTICS.

The population of the Borough at the Census in 1901 was 267,358. The number of inhabited houses was 41,433, giving 6.4 persons to each house. The Registrar-General's estimate of the population at the middle of 1908 was 315,000.

The area of the Borough is 4,706 acres, so that at the Census in 1901 there were 56.8 persons per acre. Below is given the areas of the wards of the Borough (excluding water) and the population per acre in each ward at Census year :—

**Births.**—The number of births registered during the year was 9214, being 455 more than the previous year, and 102 more than the average number during the last ten years. The birth-rate for the year (53 weeks) was 29·4 per 1,000, while the average birth-rate during the ten years 1898–1907 was 32·3 per 1,000. After the suitable adjustments rendered necessary by the foregoing tables have been made, the net deaths of the Borough numbered 4,364 (2,281 males and 2,083 females), being 48 less than the previous year and 391 below the average for the last ten years. This makes an annual death-rate for the year (53 weeks) of 13·9 per 1,000, or 3·2 below the average death-rate during the ten years 1898-1907, which was 17·1 per 1,000.

Corrected for age and sex distribution, the annual death-rate becomes 14·4 per 1,000, the factor for correction being 1·0693.

Both the foregoing birth-rate and death-rate, as well as all the subsequent rates, have been calculated from a population estimated at the middle of the year to be 307,334, in obtaining which estimate regard has been had, firstly, to the natural increase of population (births over deaths), which in the aggregate amounted to 4,850 ; and, secondly, to the number of houses finally passed by the Borough Engineer for occupation during the previous twelve months.

**Chief Zymotic Diseases.**—The total deaths from the seven principal Zymotic diseases numbered 803, making an annual Zymotic death-rate of 2·5 per 1,000, the average Zymotic death-rate during



the previous ten years being 3·2 per 1,000. In the following tables I append particulars, so far as possible, relating to each disease separately—both notifiable and non-notifiable epidemic diseases. In the case of the latter, however, the reported cases are necessarily inexact as the numbers are chiefly obtained from the School Attendance Officers, who are unable in many cases to verify by medical certificate the nature of the illness alleged to be the cause of absence from School.

**Small-pox.**—No case of Small-pox occurred in the Borough during 1908, nor was any case of this disease received into Dagenham Small-pox Hospital from any of the surrounding districts.

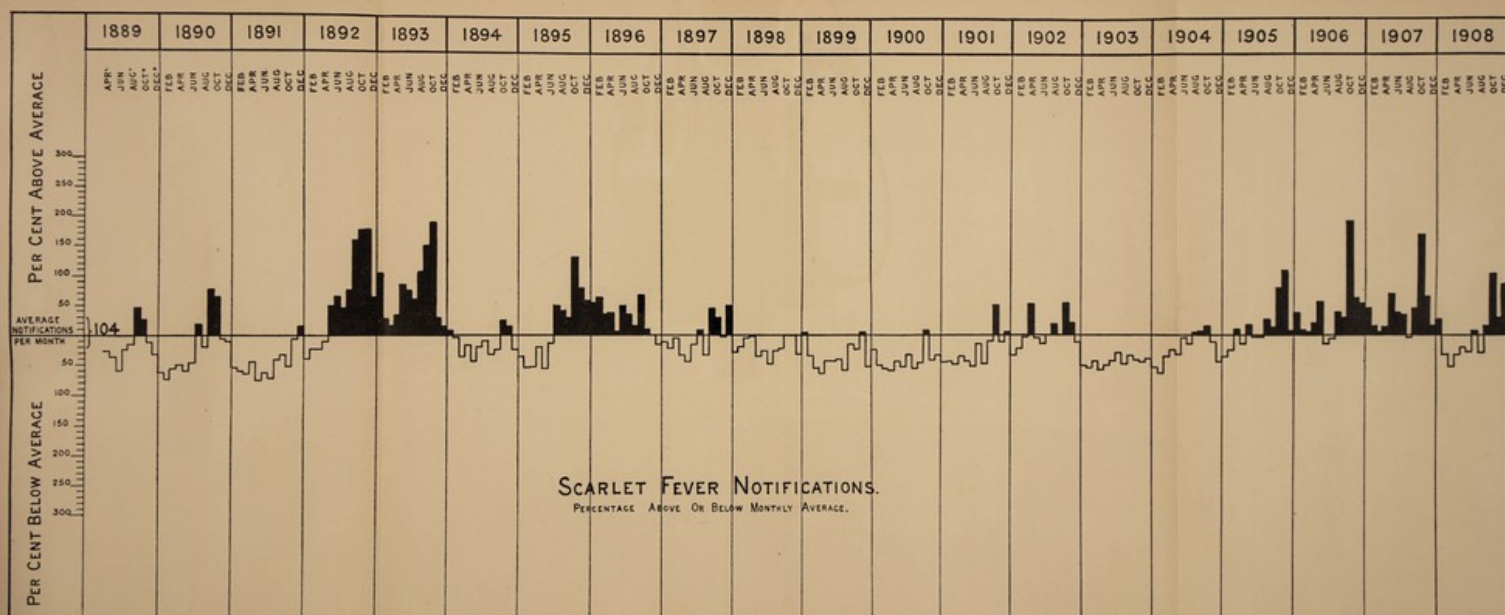
**Scarlet Fever.**—This disease, which assumed epidemic form in 1906 and 1907, abated somewhat in 1908, but was still exceptionally prevalent in the latter months of the year. 1,324 notifications were received, equivalent to an attack-rate of 4·23 per 1,000. 51 deaths from Scarlet Fever were registered, making an annual death-rate of 0·16 per 1,000, the average death-rate for the past 10 years having been 0·11 per 1,000.

Of the notified cases 692, or 52 per cent., were removed to the Plaistow Hospital. Of these, 215 cases were subsequently transferred to the Convalescent Contact Shelter, where the average duration of residence amounted to 31½ days.

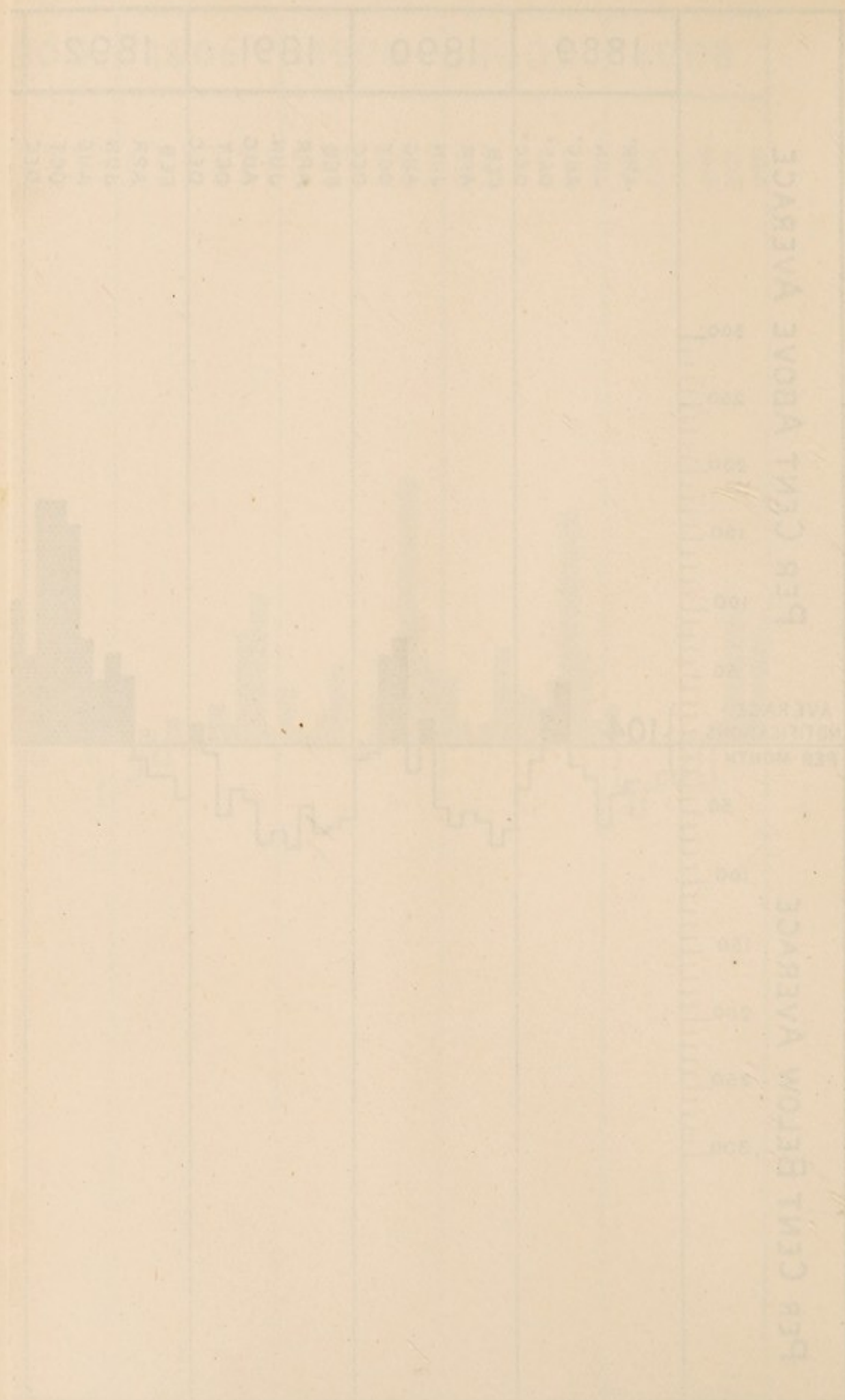
As a means of noting the epidemic character of Scarlet Fever, I have prepared the chart facing this page, which is similar to that adopted by Sir Shirley Murphy in recording the statistics of London, showing the percentage of departure from the average monthly notifications since the Notification of Infectious Disease Clauses came into operation.

**Diphtheria.**—The number of cases of this disease notified during 1908 was 540, being the smallest number notified in any one year during the past 14 years, with the exception of the year 1904, when 531 cases occurred. The attack-rate was only 1·72 per 1,000, while the average attack-rate during the past 10 years was 3·17 per 1,000.

Fifty-five deaths occurred from Diphtheria, equal to an annual death-rate of 0·17 per 1,000, which compares very favourably with the average death-rate of the past 10 years, which was 0·43 per 1,000.







The fatality, or ratio of deaths to attacks, was 10 per cent., while in the year 1891 it was 30 per cent.

There can be little question that this improvement in the number of recoveries from this disease is mainly due to the increasing promptitude with which Diphtheria Anti-toxin is made use of, and the advantage which is taken of the Council's arrangement for the free supply to medical practitioners of this valuable antidote.

Of the 540 cases notified, 392, or 72 per cent., were removed to the Plaistow Fever Hospital.

**Enteric Fever.**—Enteric Fever, which used to be looked upon solely as a filth disease due to defective sanitary arrangements, and, indeed, even now cannot be dissociated from such conditions, is increasingly shown to arise in epidemic form from defective methods of food preparation, especially from faecal contamination of water supplies and the layings of edible molluscs.

During 1908 no serious outbreak of this disease occurred; 153 cases were reported, of which 28 died, making an annual death-rate of 0·09, the average death-rate during the past 10 years being 0·20 per 1,000. 116 of the 153 cases, or 75 per cent., were removed to hospital or infirmary for treatment.

Prompt removal is especially desirable in the case of Enteric Fever in order to avoid the occurrence of secondary cases, but the insidious onset of the disease frequently hinders this necessary procedure; an unfortunate example of this kind occurred last year, when five persons in one family were found to be all suffering from this disease at the same time, in a more or less acute form, when the first case became known to the Department.



## MEASLES.

During the second quarter of the current year 77 deaths from Measles occurred, the largest number that has taken place in a similar period since 1899.

The epidemic commenced in the first quarter. Eight deaths occurred in January, 16 in February, 21 in March, 15 in April, 32 in May, and 30 in June, making a total of 122 for the first six months of the year.

Taking the estimate of the population at the middle of the year to be 307,334, the total deaths for the six months were equivalent to an annual rate of  $\cdot 78$  per 1,000.

During the previous ten years the annual death-rate from Measles has been as follows :—

Hence it will be seen that the death-rate experienced during the six months ended June was  $\cdot 27$  per 1,000 above the average for the past ten years, which was  $\cdot 51$  per 1,000.

The salient points with regard to the incidence of the 122 deaths may be briefly stated.

AGE AND SEX.—64 deaths occurred in males and 58 in females.

All the deaths occurred between the ages of 4 months and 7

years, by far the heaviest mortality taking place among children between 1 and 2 years of age.

SCHOOLS AFFECTED. — The School Attendance Officers' lists showed considerable variation in the incidence of the disease upon the different schools of the Borough.

Thirty-six of the schools showed absentees from Measles in varying numbers from 1 to 39, while in 13 schools the children affected ranged from 40 to 75, as is shown in the following table, in which the monthly incidence on each school is stated.

On examining the foregoing tables and statistics, it will be noted that Plaistow and Hudsons Wards suffered the heaviest attack in numbers, and were the first Wards affected in point of time. These Wards were mainly responsible for the mortality of the first quarter of the year, and the increase in the epidemic during the second quarter followed the extension of the infection through High Street and West Ham Wards to New Town Ward. A steady increase from the earlier months of the year through the second



quarter is quite in accord with the ascertained course of recorded epidemics of Measles, and it is rather for the extent of the spread of disease than in the spread itself that the recent experience in West Ham is notable.

How far climatic conditions caused or aided the rapid increase it is difficult to say. The mean temperature of the air during both the first and second quarter was distinctly below the average, and the rainfall of the second quarter was heavier than that of the earlier months, but these differences cannot be definitely associated with the causation of Measles epidemics.

It is clear, however, that the Borough was involved in conditions tending to a general increase in Measles, for on comparing the mortality of the surrounding districts it will be seen that while the deaths from this disease in West Ham in the second quarter rose 41 per cent., the deaths in London rose 27 per cent., in East Ham 25 per cent., in Leyton 100 per cent., and in Walthamstow 77 per cent.

The control of Measles by the Local Sanitary Authority, in spite of many attempts and much literature, can scarcely as yet be said to have attained any marked success. The combined operation of the early infectiousness of the disease and apathy on the part of the public in estimating its dangerous character afford ample opportunity for the sudden and rapid spread which is still characteristic of all epidemics of Measles. The three cardinal means adopted for the prevention of other infectious diseases—Notification, Isolation, and Disinfection—have to be materially modified in the case of Measles. Notification would prove of little value because the Medical profession are only requisitioned in a minority of cases; Isolation seldom takes place till ample opportunity has been afforded for the infection of other members of the same family, and Disinfection, which requires skilled application during the earlier stages of the illness—a skilled application which is generally not forthcoming by reason of the absence of a medical adviser—when administered at the termination of the disease assumes



more the character of a sanitary rite than of a preventive measure. In spite of these drawbacks, however, much can be done and much was done to limit as far as possible the spread.

The Sanitary Staff were not able to visit every case reported, but most of the residences of those attacked were inspected by one of the Women Inspectors, who advised the parents as to the importance of the foregoing measures for restricting the outbreak, explained the salient points in the Leaflet of Precautions (a copy of which is attached), and took the necessary steps for the abatement of any nuisance found to exist on the premises. Disinfectants were provided for use during the illness, and a check put upon the attendance of children at school while they were still exposed to risk of infection.

The question of closing the Infants' Department in one or other of the Public Elementary Schools was considered on more than one occasion, but, having regard to the intimate association of the scholars in the streets immediately surrounding the schools, and to the hold upon the departments which the disease had already attained, it was not considered advisable or beneficial to adopt this extreme measure. The West Ham High School for Girls adopted this course with success by closing the department of younger children, but in this School the children come from homes very widely separated—a factor of great importance in estimating the value of school closure.

Epidemics, such as the one under discussion, always raise the question of the relative advantages and disadvantages accruing from the attendance of children under five years of age at Public Elementary Schools. That the advantages reaped by the children are in any way commensurate with the disadvantages suffered by the children, the parents, and the State, appear to be less evident with the efflux of time.



## HOW TO PREVENT MEASLES.

**Measles is a Dangerous Disease.**—It kills about 13,000 children each year in England and Wales. During the past five years in West Ham more children under five years of age died of Measles than of any other single disease. Six times as many deaths occurred from Measles as from Scarlet Fever, and many more children died from Measles than from Diphtheria. It is, therefore, only ignorant and foolish people who speak of Measles as a simple childish complaint.

**Measles is very Infectious.**—It is easily caught by children, especially by those under five years of age. The older children grow the less likely are they to take the disease, and the more likely are they to have it in a mild form and to make a quick and sound recovery. It is, therefore, very important that young children should be kept away from any house or room in which Measles is known to exist.

**Early Symptoms.**—Measles generally shows itself by producing drowsiness, loss of appetite, shivering, or perhaps a convulsion, running at the eyes or nose, sneezing and coughing—in fact, all the symptoms of a cold in the head. A child suffering from these symptoms is always infectious, and should be at once separated from all other children, be placed in bed in a warm, well-ventilated room, be fed while it is feverish with good milk, and not allowed to mix with other children for at least a fortnight from the date of the rash, and then only if apparently quite well.

**After-effects.**—Deaths following an attack of Measles most frequently occur from some complication associated with the disease, commonly contracted by a chill during the fading away of the rash. The commonest of these are Bronchitis and Inflammation of the Lungs or of the Wind-pipe. These, if not directly fatal and if neglected, may prepare the constitution for a subsequent attack of Consumption or Diphtheria. Diarrhoea, Inflammation of the Eyes and Ears, of the



Mouth, and of other parts of the body, may be caused by exposure to cold during convalescence, and should always receive proper treatment.

**Rash.**—The rash of true Measles is a pink or dark red, patchy eruption, usually appearing at first on the face on the fourth day of the disease, and gradually extending more or less over the body. It lasts about three days and then fades away. This is the period which is popularly believed to be the period of the disease, and as a matter of fact nearly all children suffering from Measles are confined to their bedrooms while the rash is out. But it is of the highest importance to remember that for *three days before the rash comes out* the patient is highly infectious and dangerous to other children, and that for *ten days after the rash has disappeared* the patient is very liable to take a chill and to be attacked with a serious illness, which might have been prevented with a little care.

**For the Prevention of Measles** the following rules must be carried out :—

- (1) A child suffering from Measles must be isolated in a warm room away from other children, and kept there for at least 14 days. A warm room does not mean a stuffy room. Even in a very small house a child in bed can be every now and then completely covered by the bedclothes while the window and door are opened wide to change the air of the room.
- (2) All other children in the house must be carefully watched, and if any of them show the “early symptoms” previously mentioned they must be separated from the healthy.
- (3) No children, whether sick or healthy, living in a house where Measles exists may attend either a Day school or a Sunday school, and any child attending school who shows the “early symptoms” should be at once sent home.



- (4) Disinfection should be carried out during the whole course of the illness. All bed and body linen, handkerchiefs, rags, &c., used by the patient must be put in a disinfectant solution for one hour before being removed from the sick room to be washed. Disinfectants can be obtained, free of charge, at the Town Hall, Stratford, at the Public Hall, Barking Road, and at the Silvertown Fire Station.

**Whooping Cough** very frequently attacks children who are recovering from Measles, and, therefore, attention paid to the above rules may not only check the spread of Measles but of Whooping Cough as well.

**By the Public Health Act, 1875—**

Any person who—

- (1) While suffering from any dangerous infectious disease wilfully exposes himself without proper precautions against spreading the said disease in any street, public place, shop, inn, or public conveyance, or enters any public conveyance without previously notifying to the owner, conductor, or driver thereof that he is so suffering; or
- (2) Being in charge of any person so suffering, so exposes such sufferer; or
- (3) Gives, lends, sells, transmits, or exposes without previous disinfection any bedding, clothing, rags, or other things which have been exposed to infection from any such disorder,

shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding FIVE POUNDS.

The foregoing report on the first half of the year was prepared during the autumn, but not presented as the epidemic continued, and it is therefore necessary to supplement the statistics of the first six months with those of the last six.

From this it will be seen that 1,555 cases of Measles came to the knowledge of the Health Department during the whole of the year, and that 223 deaths occurred, making an annual death-rate of 0·71 per 1,000, or 0·20 per 1,000 above the average rate for ten years past.

The disease was least prevalent during the third quarter, but rapidly increased towards Christmas, the epidemic wave spreading through Hudsons, Canning Town, and Tidal Basin Wards, and falling most heavily upon Holy Trinity, St. Margaret's, and Clarkson Street Schools.

There appear to have been many other large English towns similarly afflicted during 1908, and unfortunately epidemiology has not yet supplied exact knowledge of the causations of such widespread outbreaks, which vary little in their course in the several towns attacked.

**Diarrhœa.**—Epidemic Diarrhœa, which is always responsible for the greater part of the zymotic death-rate and generally accounts for a considerable share of the death-roll in young children, was less prevalent throughout the whole country during 1908 than in previous years. In West Ham 305 deaths occurred, making an annual death-rate of 0·97, the average death-rate for the last ten years being 1·39 per 1,000.

**Puerperal Fever.**—14 cases of this disease were notified during the year, and 11 cases proved fatal, giving a case mortality of 78 per cent. The attack-rate (·04 per 1,000) was slightly under the average rate for the previous ten years (·05 per 1,000), while the death-rate (·03 per 1,000) was slightly above the ten years' average (·02 per 1,000).

That this is essentially a preventible disease is admitted and the hope of markedly lessening its incidence led to the passage of the Midwives Act of 1902. It is too early yet to expect great improvement, but within a few years the increasing adoption of thoroughly



aseptic precautions in midwifery practice must produce the desired effect, as is shown by the fact that no case occurred among the births attended by the midwives attached to the Plaistow Maternity Charity.

**Midwives Act, 1902.**—The Midwives' Roll for 1908 contained the names of 193 Certified Midwives residing in West Ham.

Only 48 midwives sent in notice of their intention to practice during the year in accordance with Section 10 of the Act.

358 records of sending for medical aid were received from 37 midwives, and 122 notices of still-birth.

Of the total 9,214 births, 4,238 were attended by certified midwives attached to the Institutions of the Plaistow Maternity Charity, as under:—

About 1,000 births were attended by Certified Midwives in private practice, of whom 10 qualified for certification on the Midwives' Roll by examination, and 13 were enrolled in consequence of their having been in active practice at the time of the passing of the Act. Some of the latter will soon by reason of age cease their calling.

**Infant Mortality.**—The deaths occurring in children under one year of age have given rise, during the last few years, to much comment and agitation among all classes interested in the Public Health. National conferences have been held with a view to gaining and



spreading knowledge, and to inspiring interest in the subject among those mostly concerned—the fathers and mothers of the infant population.

Although not great, there has been steady progress in the decline of the Infant Mortality rate throughout the country, and even if a great part of the recent fall must be set down to favourable summer climatic conditions, it is none the less satisfactory to record the fact that last year the rate, which in 1904 was 165 per 1,000 births, fell to 128.

The total deaths in infants numbered 1,185, and of these one-third died during the first month. Broadly speaking, one may say that one-fifth died of premature birth and congenital defects, one-fifth of diarrhoea, one-fifth of chest affections, and one-fifth of wasting diseases, probably more or less due to faulty methods of feeding. The municipality can scarcely at present hope to deal with premature birth, except very indirectly by advice to the prospective mother, but there is little doubt the visits paid after birth have resulted in some reduction of the deaths from the latter diseases.

**Notification of Births Act, 1907.**—The above Act was adopted by the Council on the 14th January, 1908, and after the necessary formal proceedings had been taken by the Town Clerk, the Local Government Board sanctioned the operation of the Act in the County Borough as and from the 9th March, 1908.

The Act provides for the notification in writing of every birth, whether still-born or otherwise, to the Medical Officer of Health within 36 hours of its occurrence, by the father if he is actually residing in the house, or by any person in attendance upon the mother at the time of or within six hours after the birth. The Act also provides for the inspection by the Registrars of Births and Deaths of the register or notifications received.

Every medical practitioner and midwife practising in the Borough



was supplied with prepaid postcards as provided for in the Act, and the following are the figures up to the end of the year :—

Included in the above 5,981 births are 157 still-births.

There can be no question that the above Act has proved a great assistance to the Registrars of Births and Deaths in checking false information and addresses, but whether it will prove of equal value to the Municipality is not quite so clear. The Sanitary Official (Health Visitor or Inspector) in tendering advice to a mother on the nurture of her baby, must direct her attention to all the conditions likely to prove inimical to the well-being of the child. Unfortunately, in the houses of the poor these conditions too often include want of cleanliness in the home, its occupants, and its effects. Under these circumstances, however tactful and kindly the visitor may be, her advice must inevitably be associated with some suggestions of a mildly fault-finding character—suggestions highly beneficial if given at the right time, but scarcely appropriate if given to a woman who has not recovered her strength after a recent confinement, and who is very naturally inclined to despond at arrears of work which such occasions usually entail. For these reasons, it is probable that a too early visit may, and often does, produce less fruitful results than a later one.

Of the total births, 171 were illegitimate, and of the total deaths, 82 were illegitimate, so that the infantile mortality among illegitimate



children was 479 per 1,000 births, while that among legitimate children was only 121 per 1,000 births.

**Factory and Workshop Act, 1901.** — Section 132 provides that the Medical Officer of Health of every district council shall, in his annual report to them, report specifically on the administration of this Act in workshops and workplaces, and he shall send a copy of his annual report, or so much of it as deals with this subject, to the Secretary of State.

### **Shop Hours Acts and Seats for Shop Assistants**

**Act.**—A special Inspector has been appointed to investigate or discover infringements against these Acts.

The above observations were made by the Council's Inspector under the Shop Hours Act, but in addition 21 lists of observations were received from the Coal Smoke Abatement Society and considered by the Public Health Committee.

**Mortuaries.**—The three mortuaries received 344 bodies during 1908, the number during the previous year being 369. The circumstances connected with their admission and retention are set out below :—
