To the Council of the County Borough of West Ham.

MR. MAYOR AND GENTLEMEN,

“Every Medical Officer of Health appointed under order of the Local Government Board is required to make an annual report with regard to the sanitary district which is under his superintendence The report is to be for the year ending 31st December. It should be chiefly concerned with the conditions affecting health in the district, and with the means for improving those conditions. It should contain an account of the sanitary circumstances of the district, and of any improvement or deterioration which may have occurred during the year in those circumstances.”

In accordance with the above requisition, I beg to submit my annual report for the year 1905, and in doing so, desire to point out that such report must necessarily consist very largely of a summary of my periodical reports and other matters which have been under discussion by the Council during the year, and which therefore are more or less within the immediate recollection of the members. The collated returns, however, and the statement of local circumstances, which may appear superfluous to members fully conversant with them, serve not only as valuable statistical records for future reference, but are needed by the Local Government Board and other authorities, to whom the Medical Officer of Health is required to forward copies.

METEOROLOGY.

The observations given below are extracted from the weekly reports of observations taken at Greenwich Observatory, a course justified by the geographical position of the Borough immediately to the North of Greenwich. They show that the registered sunshine of the year was 1,421·5 hours, being 35·7 hours less than in 1904. The hottest day was July 26th, when the temperature reached 87·2 degrees, and the coldest day was January 1st, when it sank to 19·5 degrees. The number of rainy days was 164, the total rainfall of the year being 23·03 inches, being 1·5 inches less than the average. The greatest daily fall occurred on June 5th, when 1·08 inches fell.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Area.—The area of the County Borough of West Ham is 4,706 acres. Latitude $51^{\circ} 30'$ — $51^{\circ} 33'$ N. Longitude $0^{\circ} 1'$ W.— $0^{\circ} 3'$ E. Altitude, 1 foot to 46 feet above ordinance datum.

Population.—The population of the Borough at the Census in 1901 was 267,358. The number of inhabited houses 41,433, giving 6·4 persons to each house. The estimated population at the middle of 1905 was 294,997.

At the Census in 1901 the number of persons per acre was 56·8. Below is given the area of the wards of the Borough (excluding water) and the population per acre in each ward at Census year :—

Births.—The number of births registered during the year was 9,018, being 258 less than the previous year, but 16 more than the average number during the last ten years. The birth-rate for the year was 30·5 per 1,000, while the average birth-rate during the

ten years 1895-1904 was 34·6 per 1,000. Distributed to the various wards of the Borough the births were as follows :—

After the suitable adjustments rendered necessary by the foregoing tables have been made, the net deaths of the Borough numbered 4,574 (2,392 males and 2,182 females), being 262 less than the previous year and 175 below the average for the past ten years. This makes an annual death-rate of 15·5 per 1,000, or 2·7 below the average death-rate during the ten years 1895–1904, which was 18·2 per 1,000.

Corrected for age and sex distribution this death-rate becomes 16·5 per 1,000, the corrected death-rate of London being 15·8.

In the following table the foregoing deaths are distributed to the various wards of the Borough and the death-rates of the wards calculated from the estimated population at the middle of the year. In obtaining these estimates regard has been laid, firstly, to the natural increase of population (births over deaths) which in aggregate amounted to 4,444, and secondly to the number of houses finally passed by the Borough Engineer for occupation during the year 1905.

Zymotic Diseases.—The total deaths from the seven principal Zymotic diseases numbered 898, making an annual Zymotic death-rate of 3·0 per 1,000. The average Zymotic death-rate during the previous ten years being 4·0 per 1,000. In the following tables I append particulars, so far as possible, relating to each disease separately—both notifiable and non-notifiable epidemic diseases. In the latter cases, however, the returns of cases being obtained from the School Attendance Officers are necessarily inexact.

As an aid in checking the non-notifiable diseases, especially Measles and Diarrhoea in infants, the following leaflets are distributed by the Lady Sanitary Inspectors :—

1.—HOW TO PREVENT MEASLES.

Measles is a Dangerous Disease.—It kills about 13,000 children each year in England and Wales. During the past five years in West Ham more children under five years of age died of Measles than of any other single disease. Six times as many deaths occurred from Measles as from Scarlet Fever, and many more children died from Measles than from Diphtheria. It is, therefore, only ignorant and foolish people who speak of Measles as a simple childish complaint.

Measles is very Infectious.—It is easily caught by children, especially by those under five years of age. The older children grow the less likely are they to take the disease, and

the more likely are they to have it in a mild form and to make a quick and sound recovery. It is, therefore, very important that young children should be kept away from any house or room in which Measles is known to exist.

Early Symptoms.—Measles generally shows itself by producing drowsiness, loss of appetite, shivering, or perhaps a convulsion, running at the eyes or nose, sneezing and coughing—in fact, all the symptoms of a cold in the head. A child suffering from these symptoms is always infectious, and should be at once separated from all other children, be placed in bed in a warm, well-ventilated room, be fed while it is feverish with good milk, and not allowed to mix with other children for at least a fortnight from the date of the rash, and then only if apparently quite well.

After-effects.—Deaths following an attack of Measles most frequently occur from some complication associated with the disease, commonly contracted by a chill during the fading away of the rash. The commonest of these are Bronchitis, and Inflammation of the Lungs or of the Windpipe. These, if not directly fatal and if neglected, may prepare the constitution for a subsequent attack of Consumption or Diphtheria. Diarrhœa, Inflammation of the Eyes and Ears, of the Mouth, and of other parts of the body, may be caused by exposure to cold during convalescence, and should always receive proper treatment.

Rash.—The rash of true Measles is a pink or dark red, patchy eruption, usually appearing at first on the face on the fourth day of the disease, and gradually extending more or less over the body. It lasts about three days and then fades away. This is the period which is popularly believed to be the period of the disease, and as a matter of fact nearly all children suffering from Measles are confined to their bedrooms while the rash is out. But it is of the highest importance to remember that for *three days*

before the rash comes out the patient is highly infectious and dangerous to other children, and that for *ten days after the rash has disappeared* the patient is very liable to take a chill and to be attacked with a serious illness, which might have been prevented with a little care.

For the Prevention of Measles the following rules must be carried out :—

- (1) A child suffering from Measles must be isolated in a warm room away from other children, and kept there for at least 14 days. A warm room does not mean a stuffy room. Even in a very small house a child in bed can be every now and then completely covered by the bedclothes while the window and door are opened wide to change the air of the room.
- (2) All other children in the house must be carefully watched, and if any of them show the “early symptoms” previously mentioned they must be separated from the healthy.
- (3) No children, whether sick or healthy, living in a house where Measles exists may attend either a Day school or a Sunday school, and any child attending school who shows the “early symptoms” should be at once sent home.
- (4) Disinfection should be carried out during the whole course of the illness. All bed and body linen, handkerchiefs, rags, &c., used by the patient must be put in a disinfectant solution for one hour before being removed from the sick room to be washed. Disinfectants can be obtained free of charge at the Town Hall, Stratford, at the Public Hall, Barking Road, and at the Silvertown Fire Station.

Whooping Cough very frequently attacks children who are recovering from Measles, and, therefore, attention paid to the above rules may not only check the spread of Measles but of Whooping Cough as well.

By the Public Health Act, 1875—

Any person who—

- (1) While suffering from any dangerous infectious disease wilfully exposes himself without proper precautions against spreading the said disease in any street, public place, shop, inn, or public conveyance, or enters any public conveyance without previously notifying to the owner, conductor, or driver thereof that he is so suffering ; or
- (2) Being in charge of any person so suffering, so exposes such sufferer ; or
- (3) Gives, lends, sells, transmits, or exposes without previous disinfection any bedding, clothing, rags, or other things which have been exposed to infection from any such disorder,

shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding FIVE POUNDS.

2.—MEDICAL HINTS TO MOTHERS.

Breast Feeding.—The babies that do best are those fed entirely at the mother's breast, and they nearly always escape the greatest danger of a baby's life, namely, Diarrhœa during the hot

weather in the months of July, August, and September. A baby should have the breast, at first, every two hours by day, and every four hours by night. During the third month, every two-and-a-half hours by day, and after this every three hours by day, with a longer interval at night, till weaning time.

With a little patience babies can be trained to take their meals regularly, which brings health to the baby and comfort to the mother.

If the mother's milk does not appear to satisfy (very often this is due to the breast being given too frequently), do not on any account give biscuits or other food without medical advice, but give cow's milk in a bottle, prepared as described below, in turn with the breast. The two milks will not disagree.

Mother's Food.—The mother should have four good meals a day, of plain food, but intoxicating drinks such as spirits or beer should be avoided. Stout is not necessary for a nursing mother, but if taken it should only be with a meal. It is a good plan for a mother to take a cup of milk half an hour before feeding baby.

Weaning.—After eight months, if teeth be present, baby may have bread and milk, milk pudding, a little red gravy with bread crumbs, or the yolk of a slightly boiled egg, once a day at the mid-day meal, but it is unwise to begin weaning in the very hot weather.

Solid Food.—After nine months, eggs, mutton broth, bread fried in bacon fat, oatmeal porridge, bread and biscuit with milk, bread and butter, potatoes and gravy, may be gradually added to the diet. It is a good plan to vary the meal occasionally, but milk should be the chief article of diet until baby is two years old, and fish and meat should not be given till after eighteen months, and then it should be finely minced. Such food as pork, shellfish, lobster, pastry, new bread, cakes, tea and coffee, which

are liable to cause convulsions, should not be given to children under five years of age.

In no case should stimulants (wine, spirits, or beer) be given to a child without a medical prescription stating the proper dose and the time it should be given.

Bottle Feeding.—Where from any cause a baby cannot be fed at the breast, try to obtain fresh cow's milk, and use a boat-shaped bottle marked in tablespoons. To prepare cow's milk for a baby it is necessary to dilute it with boiled water or barley water, and to add sugar, as follows:—First boil the milk for one minute directly it comes, and stand it in a clean jug with a piece of muslin over it in a basin of cold water. Then prepare barley water by taking one teaspoonful of washed pearl barley (in powder), adding it to one pint of boiling water, and then boiling for five minutes; it must be made fresh each day and kept cool and covered as the milk.

Take one tablespoonful of the boiled milk and mix it with two tablespoonfuls of the boiled water or barley water, adding a quarter of a teaspoonful of white sugar; the mixture when warmed will make a meal for a baby under a fortnight old. The quantity to be given at each time of feeding should be increased as the baby grows older, in accordance with the following table:—

If the baby thrives it will gain in weight; if it does not thrive add a teaspoonful of fresh cream to each feed. Both bottle and teat should be rinsed after each feed and kept under cold water, and they must be thoroughly washed once a day at least with boiling water to which a little washing soda has been added, and again rinsed with cold water. A mother or nurse should never fail to wash her hands before preparing any food.

Machine skimmed and separated milks should never be used for children or invalids. The best brands of condensed milk may be of service for short periods, especially during hot weather, but ought not to be used alone for more than a few weeks. One large teaspoonful of condensed milk with a teaspoonful of cream (but no sugar) is sufficient when properly diluted with boiled water (see 4th column of table), for a meal up to two months. The amount may be gradually increased as age advances until a tablespoonful is given at six or seven months.

Sleep.—Do not wake up the baby for feeding, nor accustom it to be rocked to sleep, nor to sleep in bed with mother. Make baby a little cot for itself.

Fresh Air is as necessary for the baby as proper food. This can only be obtained by allowing the baby to be as much as possible out of doors in the daytime, and by remembering that windows should be open wide in Summer and never quite closed in Winter.

Flies Infect Food, therefore keep it covered; keep living rooms frequently cleansed and the back yard tidy. In Summer, water the front pavement and the back yard frequently to cool the air.

WATERCRESS BEDS, TEMPLE MILLS.

On the 30th August, 1905, the Local Government Board forwarded to the Council a copy of the report of a recent enquiry instituted by the London County Council with regard to watercress beds in the neighbourhood of the Metropolis.

The Board further asked that the Medical Officer of Health be directed to report on the watercress beds in West Ham, and that a copy of his report be forwarded to the Board, together with the Council's observations on the matter.

In accordance with your instructions I submit the following report :—

The only watercress beds in West Ham are situate at Temple Mills, and are shown on the accompanying plan.

On the 15th September, 1903, in company with Dr. King Warry, Medical Officer of Health for Hackney, I visited these beds, as Dr. Warry had been led to attribute cases of Enteric Fever occurring in his district to the eating of watercress. He promised to supply me with his report.

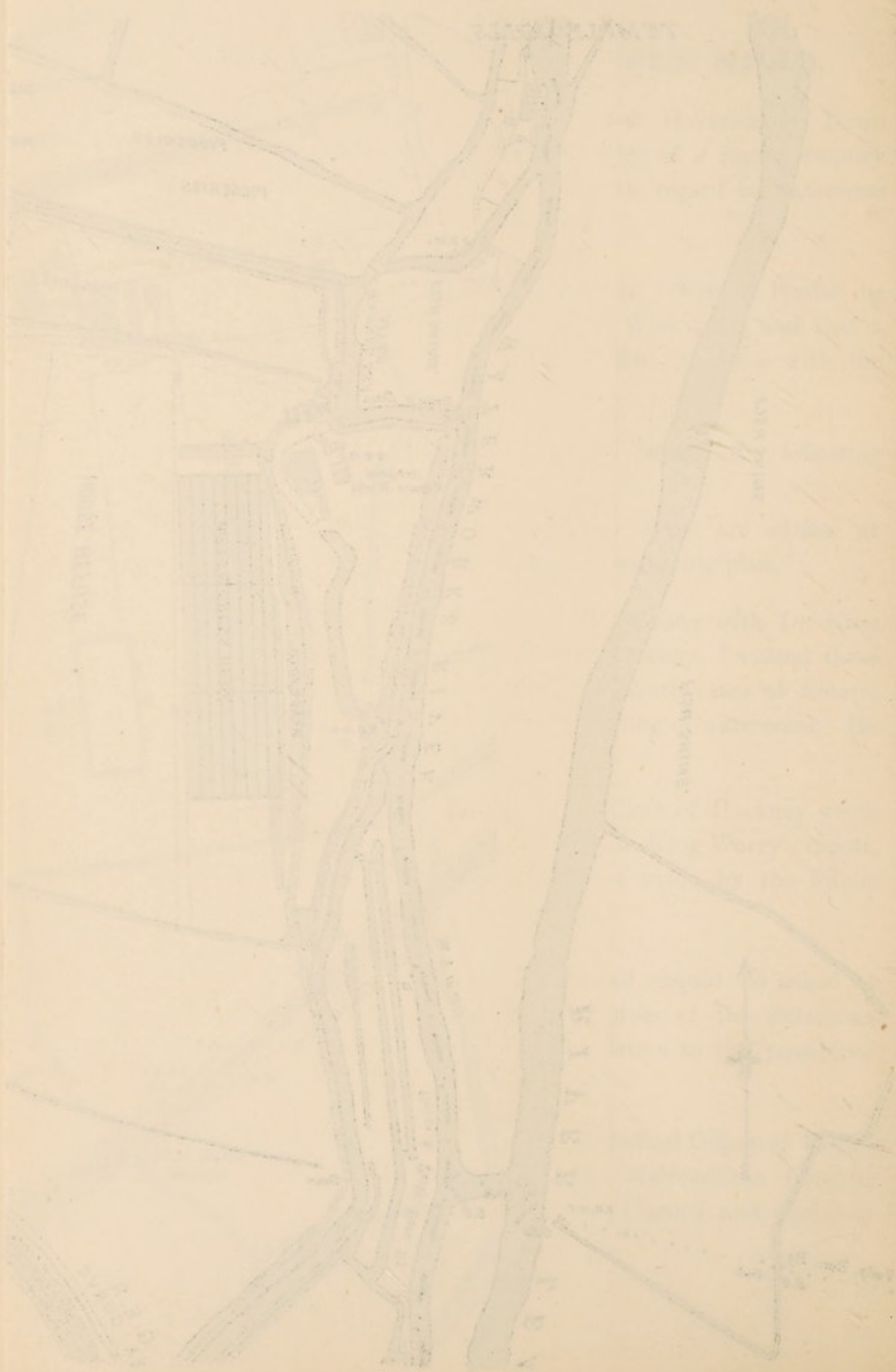
On 1st December, 1903, the Town Clerk of Hackney wrote to your Town Clerk enclosing a copy of Dr. King Warry's report, and also the following recommendations made by the Public Health Committee of Hackney :—

- (1) That the Local Government Board should be asked to make an enquiry as to the sources of the watercress supplied to the Metropolis in relation to the possibility of this article causing disease.
- (2) That copies of the report of the Medical Officer of Health should be forwarded to all the Metropolitan Borough Councils, and the London County Council, and that they

be asked to support the applications made by the Borough of Hackney to the Local Government Board.

- (3) That a copy of the report be sent to the County Borough of West Ham, and their attention drawn to the manner in which watercress is grown in that Borough, and that they be requested to adopt such measures as may be necessary to ensure that such watercress shall be free from pollution

On December 5th, 1903, I addressed the following letter to the owner of the Watercress Beds:—

DEAR SIR,

I beg to inform you that information has been received from the Borough of Hackney that the water supply in your Watercress Beds at Temple Mills is seriously polluted with sewage. This communication has not yet come before the Public Health Committee, so that I am unable to give you authoritative instructions, but I write this letter in order to give you timely warning, and save you expense which you might incur should you commence works for the coming season without taking steps to abate the nuisance complained of, that is to say, discontinuing your present water supply.

On the 6th January, 1904, the letter from the Town Clerk of Hackney was brought before the Public Health Committee, when I was instructed to take a sample of the water supplying the watercress beds. Accordingly a sample was taken on the 20th January, and on the 2nd March I submitted the analysis made by Dr. Bernard Dyer, *vide* Appendix A, when the Committee adjourned the matter.

On the 19th April, 1904, I took a sample from the well, and at the same time a sample of the water from the middle of the Waterworks River where it is joined by Potter's Ditch. The results of the analyses of these samples are given in Appendix B.

I interviewed the owner of the watercress beds, who assured me that he would not use the well water complained of, having made arrangements to draw water from a deep well belonging to the adjoining works, a course which the subsequent report of my Inspector appeared to verify.

Your Committee felt that their power to take proceedings to close the watercress beds were problematical.

On the 3rd July, 1905, in company with Dr. Hamer, Assistant Medical Officer of Health, London County Council, I again visited the watercress beds and discovered the arrangement to take water from the deep well above mentioned had been discontinued and the supply for the watercress beds was again being taken from the contaminated source already examined, and I was preparing this report for your Committee when the letter of the Local Government Board arrived. Although the West Ham beds are not specifically mentioned in the report of the London County Council, they are clearly referred to in the following extract which occurs on page 6 :—

“These beds cover an area of about three acres. At the north end of the beds is a small engine-house in which a steam pump is worked, pumping about 400 gallons per minute near high tide from the river. The water is discharged into an open ditch reservoir from whence it is conveyed to the beds by pipes and open channels. At low tide the river is nothing less than semi-liquid black filth, giving off sickening and offensive odours. Within 20 yards of the north-west portion of the beds is situated an artificial manure works, which gives off most unpleasant odours polluting the atmosphere. Within

200 yards of the beds a gut-scraper's business is carried on. Within 300 yards of the beds fish-skin dressing is carried on; and the waste liquids from these various premises drain into the river. Within 10 yards house refuse of all kinds is deposited. There is also a piggery in the brickfield attached to this rubbish shoot. There are some 25 to 30 houses in the neighbourhood for which there is said to be no sewer accommodation. The effluents from two sewage farms also discharge into the river. The storage reservoir and channel are lined with black putrescent mud, and the beds are almost in the same condition. The cress has a bright green appearance, and looks even better than that grown under more favourable conditions. The proprietor states that he has cultivated these beds for upwards of 25 years, and that the surroundings when he established the beds were of a totally different character from the existing conditions."

I have marked on the plan the situation of the objectionable features referred to, and have to remind the Council that the whole of this district is without sewerage convenience, having up till recent years served as low-lying marsh land, utilized for grazing in the summer and frequently flooded in the winter, but that of late wooden structures and piggeries have been erected in various places and to an extent that the local conditions do not warrant.

The main source of pollution, however, arises from the water pumped out from the Waterworks River, which conveys the effluents from the Sewage Works of the Urban Sanitary Districts of Leyton and Walthamstow. This river is becoming increasingly foul in character.

I am of opinion that the Council should endeavour to close the watercress beds, and should also take into their consideration the other local conditions referred to.

During the year, the premises, No. 44A, West Ham Lane, originally built for and used as a police station, and subsequently occupied as a laundry, was adapted by alterations and registered as a common lodging-house with 50 beds. New keepers were appointed and registered at the following lodging-houses :—19, Oxford Road; 12, Tidal Basin Road; 72, Great Eastern Road; 11, Fulton Street.

An application to open the premises, 49, Church Street, West Ham, as a common lodging-house, was refused.

Bakehouses.—These number 177, including 46 underground bakehouses. During the year a new factory bakehouse was opened at the rear of Chaucer Road, and a new bakehouse at Hermit Road.

Slaughter-houses.—There are 12 private slaughter-houses subject to annual license by the Council, and 11 registered slaughter-houses not subject to annual renewal. A new slaughter-house was licensed during 1905 in connection with the Stratford Co-operative Stores in substitution for the Company's old premises. The visits paid to these places are shown on page 80, but it is obvious that the supervision of the killing and dressing of animals in private slaughter-houses must be of only a spasmodic character. It is only fair to say, however, that so far as the inspection goes the private slaughter-houses appear to be generally well conducted, and an examination of the meat in the shops to which slaughter-houses are attached leads one to conclude that the owners are not careless in their methods of preparation.

Dairies, Cowsheds, and Milkshops Orders.—In this connection I give the report of your Veterinary Surgeon :—

Cows are again being kept at Globe Crescent, but not now at Maryland Street, High Street, Stratford, Randall Street, and Abbey Lane. The above 298 were examined and the general health and condition were very satisfactory. Twenty-eight were found with indurated teats (dead quarters). Six were affected with acute or sub-acute mastitis, and were not being milked pending recovery. Four cows had indications of constitutional tuberculosis, but the udders were unaffected and the milk was good. In none of the cases where milk was drawn did a bacteriological examination appear necessary.

The number of cows kept within the Borough is constantly varying, according to the state of the markets. At the first week in June, 1905, when all the cowsheds were visited to ascertain the number, only 274 cows were found in sheds giving accommodation for 400. This may to some extent account for the favourable report of Mr. Glover, as the general condition of some of the old cowsheds in the Borough leaves much to be desired both in structure and management, and the Inspectors, although frequently visiting them, find it difficult to inculcate cleanly habits in many cases.

The Home Work Orders of 11th December, 1901, and 14th July, 1902, were revoked by the Home Work Order 15th August, 1905. This did not, however, make material alteration in the previous provisions affecting industries carried on in West Ham.

Shop Hours Act and Seats of Shop Assistants Act.

—The offences under these Acts are : (1) Employing a young person under 18 years of age for more than 74 hours (including meal times) in a week, (2) Non-exhibition in the shop where young persons are employed of the Statutory Notice, and (3) Non-provision of suitable seats for female Shop Assistants.

Hairdressers and Perfumers.—In January the Clerk of the Incorporated Guild of Hairdressers, Wig Makers and Perfumers, wrote to the Council, calling attention to the arrangements made in the City of London whereby the Medical Officer of Health shall make inspection and give to the Guild Certificates in respect of the premises of all hairdressers and barbers within the district who apply for registration, and asking the Council whether they would be prepared to aid the Guild by making similar arrangements. The Council agreed to give the assistance desired and empowered the Medical Officer of Health to inspect and grant the Certificates. Up to the present time no application has been received from the Guild.

Removal of Offensive Matter.—Owing to the nuisance arising from the collection of fish offal an application was made early in the year by the Green Street Traders' Protection Society, asking the Council to take steps to vary the hours during which offensive matter may be collected or moved within the Borough. The Council were unable to accede to this request, having decided in January, 1904, after full consideration, to agree to no change. At the time of writing a Bill is before Parliament, promoted by the President of the Local Government Board, for repealing the Metropolitan Police Act so far as the provision relating to the Removal of Offensive Matter is concerned. The effect of the passing of this Bill will be that, pending the making of bye-laws by the Council, no offence will be committed in West Ham by the removal of offensive matter at any hour of the day or night, and it is highly probable that the Local Government Board will not sanction bye-laws on the subject unless the hours assimilate to those of the Metropolis.

Offensive Trades.—During the year two applications were received for permission to boil bones (1) from Mr. W. Poel, of North Street, Romford, to establish the business at Magnet Works, Pudding Mill Lane, and (2) from Fred Hammersley & Co., to establish the trade at their soap works in Bradfield Road. In both cases permission was not granted.

Midwives Act, 1902.—The current Midwives' Roll contains the names of 122 midwives as resident in the Borough. During the year 1905 I received notice of intention to practise from 80 midwives. Of these 22 were non-resident in the Borough, and 19 of these were attached to a nursing home situate some distance away from the Borough, so that their attendance in the district is very slight indeed. Of the 68 resident midwives 38 were attached to the Plaistow Maternity Charity and its Branch at Victoria Docks. 364 records of sending for medical help were received during the year, and 60 notices of still-birth during the same period. No complaint in connection with any midwife was made.

The Central Midwives' Board has under consideration the question of revising the Rules made under the Act.

Sale of Food and Drugs Acts.—In consequence of the death of Mr. T. A. Pooley, Mr. W. C. Young, F.I.C., was in March appointed Public Analyst for the Borough.

The Maypole Dairy Company were registered as wholesale dealers in Margarine at their premises in High Street, Stratford.

Under these Acts 1,017 samples were purchased for analysis, and 17 were returned by the Public Analyst as adulterated, the number

of samples taken being at the rate of 3·4 per 1,000 of the population. In London the samples taken were at the rate of 4·7 per 1,000, and in the rest of England at the rate of 2·3 per 1,000. I applied for summonses in 83 cases, at the hearing of which fines and costs were imposed by the Magistrates amounting to £309 0s. 6d. The particulars of which will be found in the appendix.
