Note.— The Botanic Garden at Chelsea was formed by the Society of Apothecaries of London, in the year 1674 for the sole purpose of promoting the Science of Botany by the cultivation of plants, both indigenous and exotic, with a special reference to such vegetable substances as are enumerated in catalogues of Materia Medica, set forth by the Royal College of Physicians; the intention of which was, to instruct the Apprentices of the Society in the knowledge of the Trees and Plants from which those articles are derived.

This Garden has been supported at the expense of that Society, for more than a century and a half, but the charges attending it have, of late years, so greatly increased as to become really burdensome, and have repeatedly caused the question to be agitated by the Managers, whether it would be prudent to continue the same or totally to abandon it. The former sentiment has hitherto prevailed, and it is earnestly hoped that the Society of Apothecaries will never be under the painful necessity of adopting the latter alternative; especially as this is the only Botanic Gurden in the immediate vicinity of the Materials. 
