

An Act to enable His Majesty effectually to prohibit Commerce (for the space of One Year) with any Country that is or shall be infected with the Plague; and for shortning the Continuance of an Act passed in the Seventh Year of His Majesties Reign, Intituled, An Act for repealing an Act made in the Ninth Year of Her late Majesty Queen Anne, Intituled, An Act to oblige Ships coming from Places infected, more effectually to perform their Quarentine; and for the better preventing the Plague being brought from Foreign Parts into Great Britain or Ireland, or Isles of Guernsey, Jersey, Alderney, Sark, or Man; and to binder the spreading of Infection.



Pereas several Places in Fozeign Parts, having foz some time past been, and still continuing to be disted with the Plague, it may be judged necessary by his Majessy, foz securing his kingdoms of Great Britain and Ireland, and the Dominions thereunto belonging, from so deadful a Calamity, to prohibit or restrain the Commerce between his Majestes Subjects and those of any other Country

or Place, which is or thall be infeked with the Plague: And whereas it will be requilite to enforce such Prohibition

or Reftraint by febere Penalties; Be it therefore Enaded by the Kings mod Excellent Bajelty, by and with the adnice and Confent of the Lords Spiritual and Tempozal, and Commons in this prefent Parliament affembled, and by Authority of the same, That it, hall and may be lawful to and for the Rings Pajetty (in whole great Wisdom and Care for the Preferbation of Dis People, they bo, unber the Divine Protection, confide) by Dne 02 more 1920clamation of Proclamations to be iffued at any time or times before the Tweifth Day of December, in the Pear of our Lord. One thousand seven hundred and twenty two, unper the Great Seal of Great Britain, to prohibit or forbid all and every Derfon and Derfons to bilit, go to, or frequent any Kingdom, Country, or Place, which is or hall be infeded with the Plague; and also to probibit or forbid all and every Person and Persons, Bodies Politick and Cozpozate whatfoever, to thip, export, carry, or fend, or cause or procure to be thipped, exported, carried, or fent, directly or indirectly, from or out of the kingdoms of Great Britain and Ireland, and any the Dominions thereunto belonging, unto any Ringdom, Country, by Piace, which is or mall be infeffed with the Plague, to be fpecified in luch Perclama. tion of Proclamations, any Goods, Wares, Commodities, or Werchandizes whatfoever, tor and buring fuch time and times, before or until the five and twentieth Day of March. which chall be in the Pear of our Lord, One thousand seven hundred and twenty three, as hall be specified in such Broclamation of Proclamations, under the Penalties herein after mentioned, and in luch Manner and Form, and under fach Regulations, as in and by fach Proclamation and 1920. clamations respectively, shall be prescribed.

and be it Enaded by the Authority aforelaid, That it mail and may be lawful to and for the Kings Bajeffy, by the fame, or any other Proclamation of Proclamations, to be iffued at any time or times before the faid Twelfth Day of December, in the Pear of our Lord, Due thousand feben hundred and twenty two, under the faid Great Seal, to prohibit or forbid all and every Perfon and Perfons whatfo. ever, to come or pals from any Kingbom, Country, 02 Place, which is or thail be infeded with the Plague, to he specified in such Proclamation or Proclamations, into the Kingdoms of Great Britain og Ireland, og the Dominions thereunto belonging, or any of them; and also to prohibit or forbib all and every Perlon and Perlons, Bodies Politick and Corporate whatfoever, to import or bring, or cause or procure to be imported or brought, birealy or indireally, into Great Britain, Ireland, og any the Dominions thereunto belonging, any Goods, Mares, Commodities, or Werchan-

bizes whatsoever, from any Kingdom, Country, or Place, that is or hall be infeded with the Plague, to be specified in such Proclamation or Proclamations, sor and during such time and times, before or until the said Ewenty fifth Day of March, One thousand seven hundred twenty three, as hall be specified in such Proclamation or Proclamations, under the Penalties herein after mentioned, and in such Hanner and Form, and under such Regulations, as in and by such Proclamation or Proclamations respectively, shall be prescribed.

and be it further Enaded by the Authority aforelaid, That all and every the Goods, Wares, Commodities, and Werchandizes, which thall be exported, or thipped for Exportation, contrary to the Tenozand true Meaning of fuch 1920clamation of Proclamations, and of this Aa, and the Ships of Aesfels upon which they hall be so exported, of thipped for Exportation, and all the Tackle, furniture, and Ap. parel thereof, hall be forfeited, and hall and may be feized wherefoever they can be found; and fuch Seizures hall and may be fued for, profecuted, and recovered, by the same Ways and Means, and by fuch Rules and Remedies, and in luch Manner, as any Goods leized for unlawful Importation or Exportation, hall and may be fued for and recobered : And moreover, that all and every fuch Person and Persons, who wall have exported, or thipped for Exportation, or caused to be exported, or thipped for Exportation, any fuch Goods, Mares, or Merchandizes, contrary to the Tenoz and true Deaning of any luch Preclamation, and of this At, thall forfeit double the Claime thereof, to be afcer. tained and recovered as the Claime of any uncustomed or prohibited Goods is by Law to be ascertained and recopered.

And be it Enaced by the Authority aforefaid. That if at any time or times, after the islaing and publishing such Proclama. tion or Proclamations respectively, as aforesaid, any Perfon or Perfons hall vifit, go to, or frequent any Kingdoms Country, or Place, which is or thall be infeded with the Plague, contrary to the Tenoz and true Meaning of fuch Pioclamation or Proclamations, and of this at; then and in every such case the Person or Persons so offending, hall incur and luffer luch Pains, Penalties, and Forfeitures, as were ordained and provided by the Statute of Provision and Præmunire, made in the Sixteenth Pear of the Reign of King Richard the Second; and that if at any time of times afazelaid, any Ship of Aestel, Person of Persons, coming from any Kingdom, Country, or Place, which is of thall be inteded with the Plague, thall attempt to enter any Port or Place within the Kingdom of Great Britain 92

or Ireland, or any of the Dominions thereunto belonging, contrary to the Tenoz and true Deaning of luch Prociamation of Proclamations, and of this Ad ; It hall and map be lawfull for any Perfon of Perfons whatfoeber, and thep are hereby required to relift and oppose the Entrance of such Ship or Meffel, Perlon or Perlong, into luch Port or Place, and the Landing of any Goods of Werchandizes out of fuch Ship or Cleffel, or to oblige fuch Ship or Cleffel, Perfon or Perfong, to depart out of the same, and to use all necessary Deans for the Purpoles aforesaid, be it by firing of Suns upon luch Ship or Meffel, Perfon or Perfons, or any other kind of Force whatfoever : And in cafe any fuch Ship or Cleffel, Perlon or Perlong, coming from any Ringdom, Country, or Place infeded, as aforefaid, to be specified in such Proclamation or Proclamations, or any Goods or Merchandizes brought on board the fame, thall adually enter or be landed in any fuch Port or Place, as aforefaid, contrary to the Tenoz and true Meaning of fuch Proclamation or Proclamations, and ci this Aa, every fuch Person so of fending, and being thereof lawfully convided, chall be adjudged guilty of Felony, and luffer Death as a felon without Benefit of Cleray; and fuch Ship of Meffel, Goods or Merchandizes, lo adually entring into, or being landed in any fuch Port or Place, contrary to the Tenor and true Deaning of any fuch Proclamation, and of this Aa, mail be forfeited: and also it hall and may be lawful for Dis Majeffy, Dis Deits and Successors, by Dis or their Deber in Council, to dired, authorize, and impower any Person or Persons whatfoeber, to burn or beffroy, or caufe to be burnt or beffroped. fuch Ship or Meffel, and the Tackle, Apparel, and furntture thereof, and Cargo on board the fame, and also such Goods and Werchandizes to landed, as aforefaid: And mozeover, that all and every Person and Persons, who mall have caused and procured any such Goods or Merchandises to be imported contrary to the Tenor and true Meaning of any such Proclamation, and of this Ad, Mall forfeit treble the Malue thereof, to be accertained and recovered, as the Ma-Tue of any uncustomed or prohibited Goods is by Law to be alcertained and recovered.

and it is hereby Enafted, That Two Third Parts of all and every the faid Penalties and Forfeitures to be fued for and recovered by virtue of this Aa, thall be to the ale of Dis Bajelly, his beirs and Successors, the Charges of Profecution and Recovery being born by Dis Bajefty, and the other Third Part to the Ale of him og them, who hall

feize, inform, or fue for the same.

And be it further Enaced by the Authority aforesato, That an Act passed in the Seventh Pear of his present Dajesties Reign, Intituled, An Act for repealing an Act made in the Ninth Year of Her late Majesty Queen Anne, Intituled, An Act to oblige Ships coming from Places infected, more effectually to perform their Quarentine; And for the better preventing the Plague being brought from Foreign Parts into Great Britain or Ireland, or Isles of Guernsey, Fersey, Alderney, Sark, or Man; and to hinder the spreading of Infection, or any thing therein contained, hall not continue in Force any longer than until the said Ewenty fifth Day of March, One thousand seven hundred twenty three; Any thing in the said Accontained to the contrary in any wise notwithstanding.
