An Act for Lighting, Cleanfing, and Watching, the Streets, Lanes, and other Passages, of the Burgh of Canongate, and the Liberties of Pleasance and Leith-wynd, adjoining to the Royalty of the City of Edinburgh.

be REAS the Burgh of Canongate Preamble.

is the great Dutlet from the City of
Edinburgh, but has not the Benefit of
being lighted and cleanfed along with
the faid City, of the Security and Protedion arifing from the City Suard:

And whereas the Streets called Pleasance and Leith-wynd are also Parts and Dependencies of the said Burgh of Canongate, but are not lighted, cleansed, and watched, along with the Suburbs of the City of Edinburgh: And whereas it would not only be a great Advantage and Safety to the Inhabitants of the said Burgh of Canongate, and its said Dependencies, but likewise to the Inhabitants of the said Edinburgh, and of all Persons resorting to and from the said City of Edinburgh, by and through the Canongate, and its said Dependencies, that

Writings exempt from Stamp Duties.

Provided always, and be it further enacted, That no Momination, Contract, Bond, or other Ulriting what-foever, under the Hand of the faid Preses and Clerk, concerning, or in Execution of the Powers vested in them by this Act, shall be chargeable with any Stamp-duty whatsoever.

Affestments to be made for lighting the Streets,

And, in older to raise a fund for defraying the Charges of lighting the Streets, Lanes, Paffages, and others, of the faid Burgh of Canongate; be it enaded by the Authority aforesaid, That the Stent-matters of the Canongate shall be, and they are bereby impowered and required, at the Time of impoling and proportioning the Landstar or Cels of the faid Burgh of Canongate, for the Service of the Pear One thousand seven hundled and seventy-two, and annually thereafter, to affels and lay upon all Peritors, Life-renters, and other Proprietors of Boules, Lands, and Tenements, within the faid Burgh of Canongate, and its faid Dependencies, subject to the Payment of Land-tax or Cefs. an annual Affesiment not exceeding Two and an half per Centum in the Pound of the real Rents, as the same now are, or hall at any Time bereafter fand rated in the Cels Books of the faid Burgh of Canongate, or fo much of the faid Sums as the faid Magistrates, Treafurer, and Pieles of the Stent-maffers aforelaid hall judge necessary for the said Service at the Time; which annual Affestment thall be payable in the same Propoztions.

That if the aforesaid Assessment of Two and an Walf per Centum upon the real Rent of the Doules and Tenements directed to be levied by the Authority of this Aft. for lighting the Streets of the faid Burgh of Canongate, Pleafance, and Leith-wynd, thall prove infufficient for Defraping that Expence; and that the Three-fourth Parts of the Monies and Tack duties arifing, or that map arife from the Dung and fulgie of the Streets; and that the whole Fund of Annuity aforefaid, authorised to be levied by the Act of the Parliament of Scotland in the Bear One thousand fir hundred and firty-three, shall be more than fufficient for answering the Purposes of that At, and for Defraping the Expence of watching and cleanfing the Streets, Lanes, Paffages, and others, of the faid Burgh of Canongate, Pleafance, and Leith-wynd. it hall and may be lawful to the faid Magistrates of Canongate Canongate to apply the Surplus ariting from the faid Cack Duties and Annuity, towards the making up the Deficiency of the found for lighting the Streets of the faid Murah of Canongate, Pleasance, and Leith-wynd, or fo much thereof as thall be wanted to make up fuch Deficiency.

and be it further enacted, That the Sums to be raifed Expences of and levied, in virtue of this act, fhall be applied by the paid in the faid Bagiffrates, Trealurer, and Prefes of the Stent Waffers of Canongate, in the First Place, to Defrap the Charges of pading this Ad; and afterwards, wholly and folely to the Afes and Purpofes berein-befoze mention= ed, and to no other afe of Purpose whatsoever.

and be it further enafted, That the faid Bagiffrates, Accounts to Treasurer, and Preses of the Stent Wasters of Canongate, Mall keep diffind and feparate Accounts of all 200nies raised, levied, and paid, by virtue of this Act, from and upon account of the aforefaid Affesiment, Tackduties, and Annuity respectively; which Accounts thall be entered in a Book, and figned by the Prefes and Clerk of the faid respective Beetings; and the faid Clerk hall permit any Person affelled to inspett the same

at reasonable Times, paying Sixpence soz each Inspection; and shall, upon Demand, give Copies of the same, oz any Part thereof, to such Person, on his paying at the Rate of Sixpence soz every Page containing Two hundred Mords.

Saving the Rights of the City of Edinburgh. Saving and referving to the City of Edinburgh all Jurisdictions, Commodities, Rights, and Privileges, competent and belonging thereto, within or over the faid Burgh of Canongate, and its said Dependencies aforesaid, in the same Manner as the City and Community now have and enjoy, or might enjoy the same.

Publick Act.

And it is hereby further enacted, That this Aft thall be taken and allowed in all Courts of Justice as a Publick Aft; and all Judges, and others, are hereby required to take Motice thereof as such, without the same being specially pleaded.
