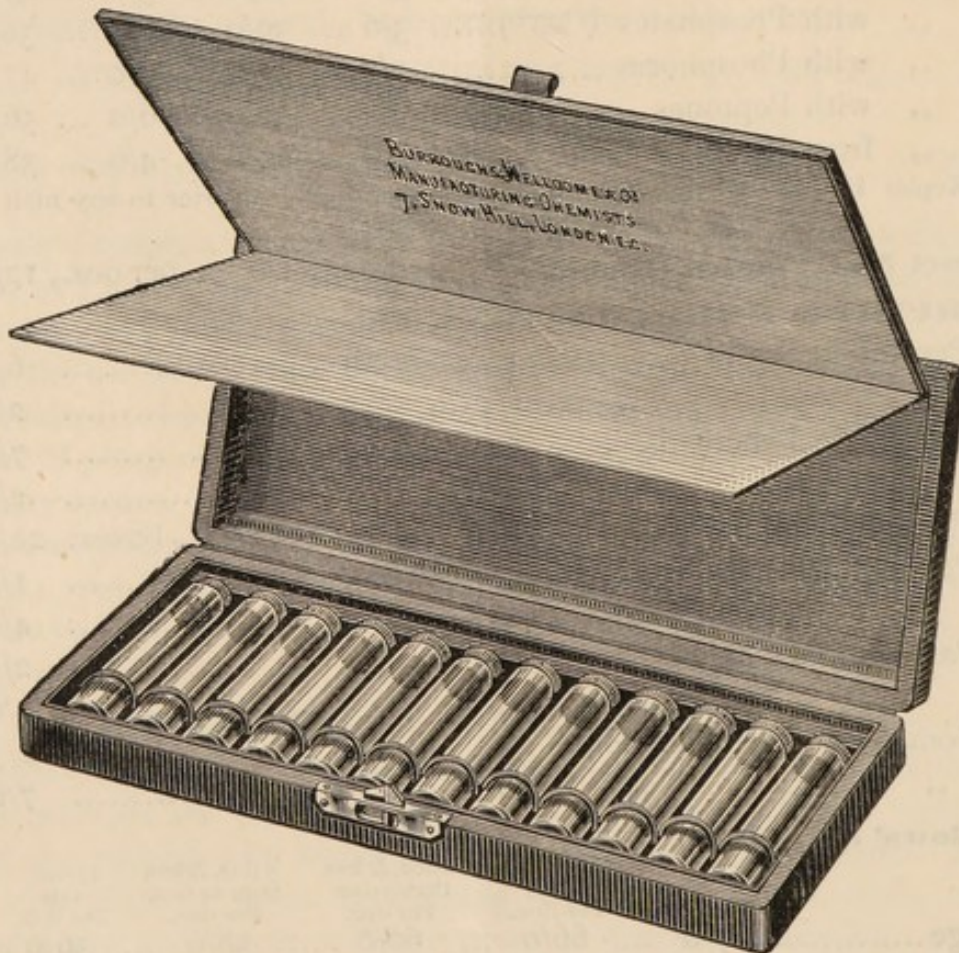

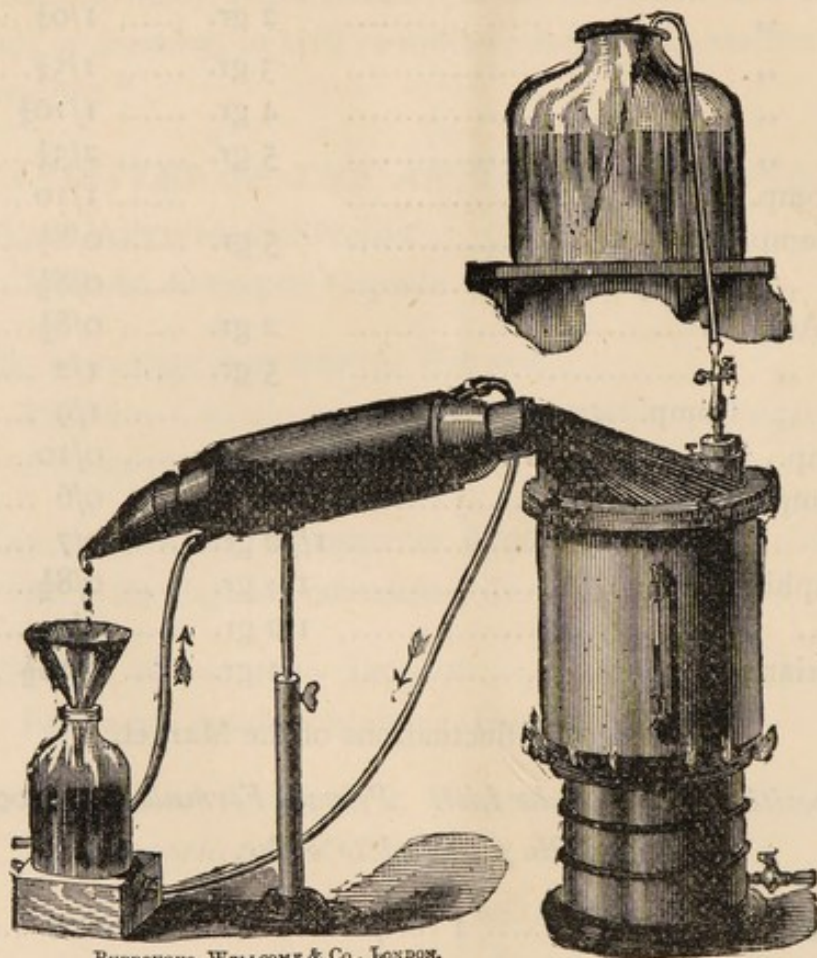

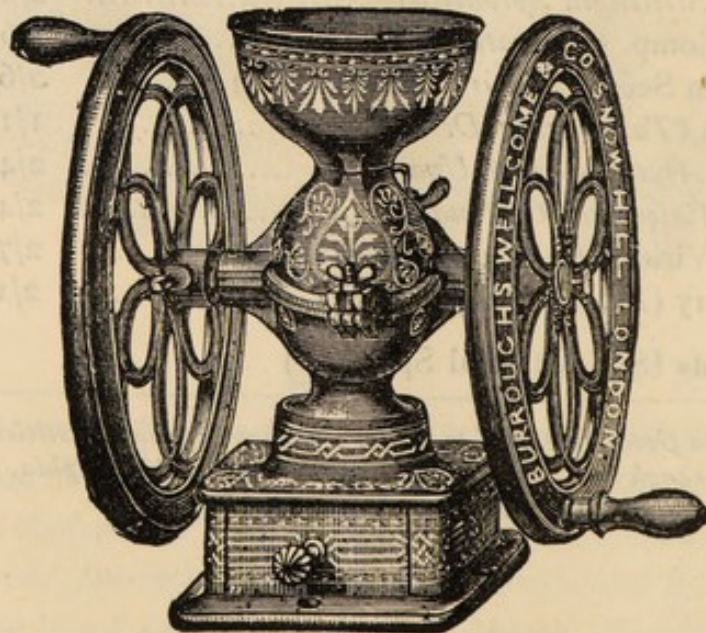


SECTIONAL VIEW OF TINCTURE PRESS.

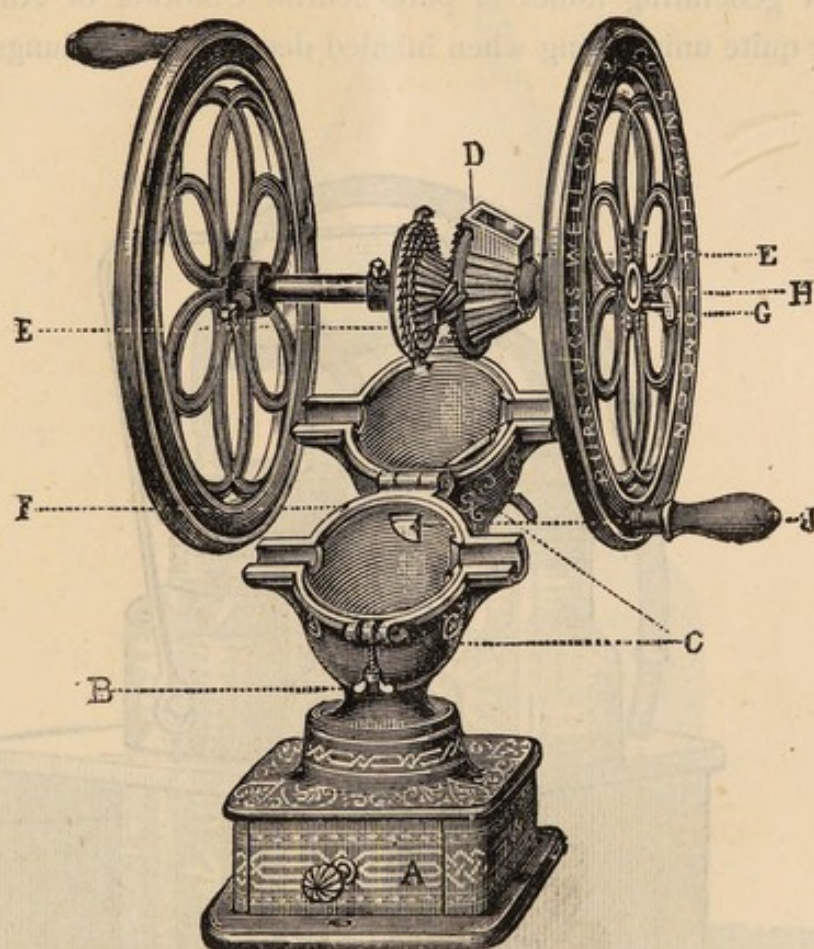
