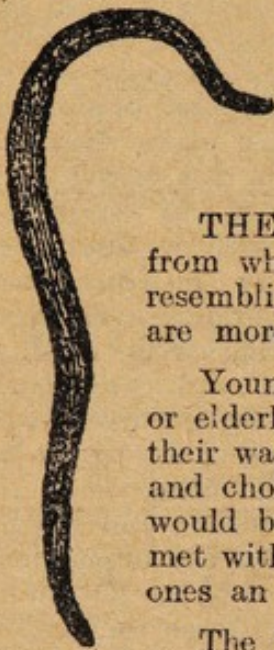
Cases of St. Vitus' Dance, melancholia, and nervous diseases, and even insanity have been referred, with the most apparent reason, to the same cause. In addition to these affections may be mentioned obstinate cough, spasms of the glottis, palpitation, languid circulation, pale or yellowish skin, sunken eyes, a livid circle about the eyelids, and general emaciation. This condition is often accompanied by fever, and is then called worm fever. THERE are various kinds of worms known to infest the bowels of the human being, and they affect all ages from the infant to the aged, and are generally the result of defective digestion, weakened constitution, impure air, and unwholesome food.

FOR ADULTS.—The usual dose is from two to four, which should move the bowels two or three times, so that the system is thoroughly cleansed. Very delicate persons should begin with but two, and increase as the nature of the case may require.

FOR CHILDREN.—From three months to one year old, half a Pill dissolved in a little water and sweetened, to be taken every night. From one year to four years, one Pill. Above that age, from one to two Pills.

It should be borne in mind that the Pills should be taken in such quantities as will operate two or three times on the bowels, otherwise you will receive but little benefit. As they are purely vegetable, they may be taken, not only without danger, but with perfect safety, and great benefit may be realised in every case.

Dr. Morse's Indian Root Pills may be administered to children in the form of a powder by crushing the Pill, and placing it in a spoonful of jam. This method is often resorted to by adults who experience some difficulty in swallowing a solid.

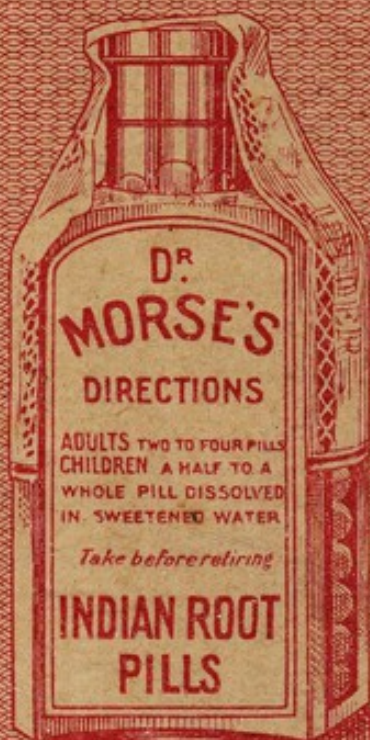
