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REGISTRATION OF LETTERS.—The fee for registration, in addition to the ordinary postage, is two-pence. Registered letter envelopes are supplied at 2¼d each, but the proper postage stamps have to be added. *If a registered letter, or a letter containing coin, be deposited in a pillar box or post office, and no receipt taken therefor, a registration fee of 8d. is charged by the Post Office authorities.*

FOREIGN MONEY ORDERS.—These are now granted between the United Kingdom and Belgium, Denmark, France, Germany, Holland, Italy, Norway, Switzerland, Constantinople, Gibraltar, Malta, Smyrna, and Cyprus; not exceeding £2, 9d.; £5, 1s. 6d.; £7, 2s. 3d.; and £10, 3s. Also to most of the British Colonies, India, Egypt, the United States, and some other countries, £2, 1s.; £5, 2s.; £7, 3s.; and £10, 4s.

LIVER DISEASES.

To a congested, torpid and diseased liver can be traced many dangerous diseases manifesting diverse symptoms, and affecting various organs.

The water is frequently scanty and high-colored, and, if allowed to stand, deposits a sediment. There is likely to be "backache," and tired feelings, lassitude, and a sense of debility, chilly sensations, rheumatic pains, and dropsical swellings, or bloating are common. There is depression of spirits and a decided tendency to be discouraged and despondent. 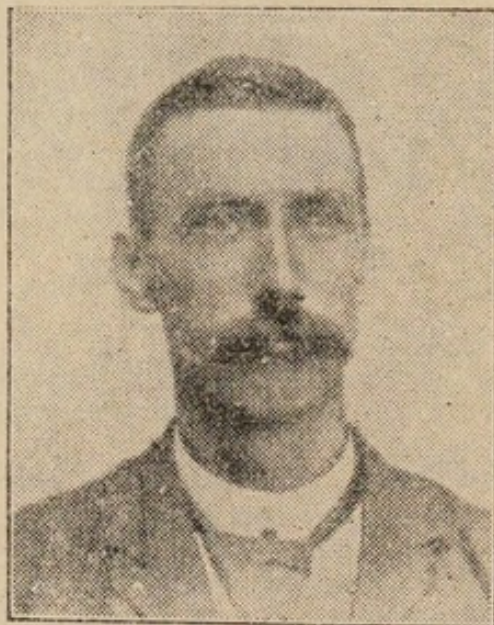

year, my health continues good. My average weight being 155 to 160 pounds, instead of 125, as it was when I began the use of the "Discovery." Some say I look younger than I did six years ago. 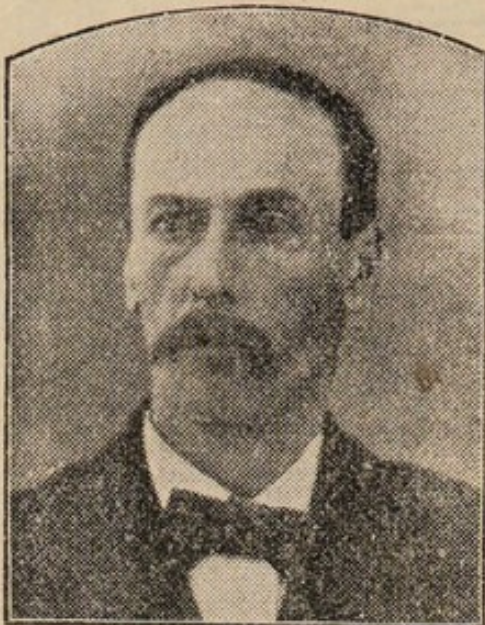
