Those who prefer an acid flavour can obtain the same by squeezing a few drops of lemon into the tumbler; this will in no wise alter the beneficial effects of the Powder. Most saline aperients have a lowering and depressing tendency, owing to the fact that the principal constituent in their composition is Sulphate of Magnesia, an ingredient totally absent in Kutnow's Powder, which, on the contrary, will be found to have an exhilarating effect on the system. Whilst the Emperor Charles IV., King of Bohemia, was on one occasion out stag hunting, a deer, closely followed by the hounds, sprang from a rock into a lake beneath, and on the hounds plunging in after it, they immediately set up a wailing howl. On seeking for the cause of it, the Emperor discovered the lake was full of hot water, which issued from a neighbouring spring in the mountains. Shortly afterwards, when wounded in fighting as the ally of France against England, the Emperor was advised to bathe in the lake, which he did, and his wounds were quickly healed. In commemoration of this, there was erected on a rock, standing about 1,563 feet above the sea level, and commanding a beautiful view, a monument called the "Hirschensprung" (or Deer Leap), the design of which has been adopted as the Trade Mark of **Kutnow's Powder**, because, from a town adjacent are obtained some of the valuable Spring ingredients of Kutnow's Powder.

DIRECTIONS AND SUGGESTIONS.

KUTNOW'S POWDER is by no means merely an aperient; but, possessing the same remedial properties as the Natural Springs of the most famous European Spas, it perfectly replaces these waters, and should, therefore, be taken in a similar manner—viz.: daily—about half-an-hour or so before breakfast—for a course of from three to six weeks, the length of time and the quantity to be taken being regulated in accordance with each person's constitutional requirement. Some need more, others less, but sufficient should be taken to produce a free evacuation of the bowels at least once daily. A course of from three to six weeks is usually necessary to get the system in proper order for such ailments as Indigestion, Constipation, Biliousness, Acidity of the Stomach, Headache, Heartburn or a sense of burning from the stomach to the throat, a feeling of abnormal fulness after meals, or of emptiness with craving for food, Eructations of sour or bitter fluid into the mouth, Pain in the back or in the right shoulder, Dizziness, Specks in the field of vision, Flatulence, Sleeplessness and other derangements of the Stomach, Liver and Kidneys; also in cases of Gout, Rheumatism and Uric-Acid Diseases in general. When the Gout is coupled with Eczema, the treatment should be especially persevered with for a longer period, until the acidity in the system is perfectly neutralised. After a course of from 21 to 42 days, the use of the Powder may be discontinued, but should troublesome symptoms reappear, a further course of the Powder should be taken for a period of several weeks. As a mild and effective aperient, the Powder may, however, be taken at any time. While a strict regimen of diet during a course of taking the Powder is not absolutely necessary, it will be found more advantageous to partake of a somewhat light diet. Butchers' meats should be used sparingly and preference given to a white meat (poultry) and white fish diet. In cases of Gout, Rheumatism, Uric-Acid Diseases and Kidney Troubles in general, all uncooked vegetables, rhubarb, tomatoes in any form, as well as pastry and all sweets, should be avoided. The most desirable vegetables are spinach, spring cabbage, Brussels sprouts and cauliflower. Potatoes and all starchy vegetables, such as carrots, etc., should be indulged in sparingly. All wines, spirits, and especially malt liquors, such as beers, etc., are best avoided altogether; the least harmful of alcoholic stimulants being **good whisky plentifully diluted**. A liberal quantity of good plain or aerated water should be drunk during the day, also plenty of milk by persons who can digest it. Tea and coffee are best taken brewed lightly with at least one-half part of milk.

Dose for Adults: From a dessert-spoonful to a table-spoonful (or more if necessary) to be taken in a tumbler of either cold or hot water, stirred briskly until dissolved, and then drunk during or after effervescence. A dose of the Powder may be taken night and morning. It should not, however, be used until the stomach has had time to digest the evening meal.

Dose for Children up to 12 Years of Age: From a tea-spoonful to a dessert-spoonful to be taken in half a tumbler of either cold or hot water.

Dose for Infantile Constipation: Quarter of a tea-spoonful to be given in the milk or liquid food about three times a week.

TIME: The best time is about half an hour or so before breakfast, doctors agreeing that the greatest advantage is derived when taken on an empty stomach. It may, however, be taken at any time during the day, preferably an hour before or after a meal.

ATTENTION: In the case of delicate persons who have to breakfast immediately on rising, **Kutnow's Powder** may be taken an hour and a half after the meal.

The plethoric and those that suffer from habitual constipation are sometimes directed to take an additional dose in the middle of the day,
