





# R U L E S

FOR A

## \* S I C K R O O M. \*

- 1.—A sick room should be kept very sweet and airy, and there should never be a close smell in it; if the weather is warm enough, the door or window should be open; if cold, there should be a fire, and the chimney should never be stopped up, even in winter.
- 2.—It should be rather dark, by a blind over the window, but bed curtains should not be drawn close.
- 3.—It should be very clean. All chamber vessels should be removed as soon as used, and, if there be any bad smell, a little disinfecting powder should be put into them; some should also be kept in a plate under the bed.
- 4.—The room should be kept very quiet; there should be no talking or gossiping; more than one or two persons make it close and noisy. Friends should not be too anxious to see the sick person, unless they can do some good.
- 5.—The sick person's face, hands, and feet should be washed regularly with warm water and soap. The hair combed every day. Washing the face with warm water

will often ease head-ache, and make a restless patient sleep. Never be afraid of putting on clean sheets or clean body linen; they cannot give cold if well aired at the fire before they are put on.

6.—Never give gin, rum, or any other spirit, unless ordered by the doctor; sick people always feel weak, but yet such things given at a wrong time would only make them worse. You may always give good broth or beef tea with safety.

7.—When a person is for sometime bed-ridden, take great care that the back and hips are kept clean and dry. If any place looks red or tender, it should be moistened with brandy or spirit of camphor, and the patient's pillow so arranged as to take the weight from off the tender parts. If the skin is abraded, soap plaster spread on felt should be applied.

8.—A good way of changing sheets is to roll up lengthways half of the dirty sheet, and push the roll as far under the side of the patient as possible. Next roll up one-half of the clean sheet, and spread the other half over the side of the bed from which the dirty sheet has been removed, and, tucking it under the mattress, place the roll alongside the roll of the dirty sheet. This done, gently raise the patient at the opposite side and turn him over the rolls of sheets. Then take away the dirty sheet, unfold the clean one, and tuck it neatly under the mattress, when the patient may be turned into his old position.



## Inland Book Post.

A packet not exceeding 2 ozs. in weight can be sent for  $\frac{1}{2}$ d. It must be either without a wrapper, or in an unfastened envelope, or in a cover which can be easily removed for the purposes of examination. A book packet must not exceed 2ft. in length, or 1ft. in width or depth.
