SCHOOL OF ANATOMY & MEDICINE,

ADJOINING ST. GEORGE'S HOSPITAL.

THIS School was Established in 1830, to afford the Students attending the practice of St. George's Hospital, the opportunity of studying Anatomy in premises contiguous to the Hospital. The original plan was gradually extended, till all the departments of a recognised Medical School were completed. Several hundreds of medical men have now been educated within its walls, and the present Teachers are anxious to carry out more thoroughly the practical character of the teaching which has commanded for this school so large an amount of success. In order to do this effectively, arrangements have been made to enable each lecturer to ascertain the progress his pupil is making in his studies. Every opportunity is also taken by the Lecturers to bring before the Student cases, preparations and specimens, in order that he may acquire a practical knowledge of his profession. It has often been a matter of regret, that medical students should so frequently find it necessary to have recourse to routine preparations before their final examinations. In order to prevent any necessity for extra-academical teaching, classes are formed of those students who are about to undergo their examinations. These Classes are regularly conducted by the various lecturers, who endeavour to blend the demonstrative and tutorial with the professorial character in their teaching.

FEES FOR LECTURES.—Fee for the entire Course of Lectures, FORTY-TWO GUINEAS, half of which may be paid in October, and the other half at Christmas.

Gentlemen who have previously entered to Lectures at any other recognised School in the United Kingdom, will be admitted to any of the Classes they have joined, on payment of Half the Perpetual Fee of those Classes.

FEES FOR LECTURES AND HOSPITAL PRACTICE.—Pupils at this School are within a convenient distance of several Hospitals, and on payment of a Single Fee of SEVENTY GUINEAS, or by Three Fees of TWENTY-FIVE GUINEAS each, paid at the commencement of each Session, will be free to the Lectures of the Grosvenor Place School of Medicine, and to the Medical and Surgical Practice of any of the following Hospitals:

St. George's Hospital, adjoining the Grosvenor Place School of Medicine
St. Mary's Hospital, Paddington;
Charing Cross Hospital, King William Street, Strand;
Westminster Hospital, Broadway, Westminster; and
Middlesex Hospital, Charles Street, Cavendish Square.

OPERATIVE SURGERY.

BY DR. DEVILLE.

The Pupils in this Class are divided into Series of Eight; before whom the whole of the Operations of Surgery are demonstrated by Dr. DEVILLE.

Each Series of Eight Pupils have placed at their disposal Four Subjects, on which, under the direction of Dr. DEVILLE, they will perform all the Surgical Operations included in the following Course:—1. The various kinds of Sutures.—2. Subcutaneous Ligatures.—3. All the Ligatures of Arteries on both the two upper and lower limbs, and both sides of the neck; including the Radial, Ulnar, Brachial, Axillary, Subclavian, Common Carotid, External Carotid or Lingual, Dorsalis Pedis, Tibialis Antica, Tibialis Postica, Peroneal, Popliteal, Femoral, Iliac, and any of the smaller Arteries, if required.—4. Such of the Amputations, Disarticulations, or Resections of the hand and foot, as the Pupils themselves may choose.—5. All the Amputations and Disarticulations of the following bones and joints, or Resections, should the Pupil prefer; wrist-joint, fore-arm, elbow-joint, arm, shoulder-joint, leg, knee-joint, thigh, hip-joint, and inferior maxillary.—6. The Catheterism of the Urethra, Nasal Duct, and Eustachian Tube.—7. Lithotomy.—8. Operations for Lachrymal Fistula.—9. Autoplastic Operations on the Nose, Eye-lids, and Lips.—10. Tracheotomy.—11. Operations for Cataract, if the state of the eyes allows it. The Pupils are provided with Instruments for the Performance of the above Operations; but should the Student wish to perform any other Operations requiring special Instruments, he is expected to provide these himself.

The physicians and surgeons connected with the School have made arrangements for their pupils to attend the PRACTICE of the various Institutions with which they are connected.

The MUSEUMS of Anatomy, Pathological Anatomy, and Materia Medica are constantly open to the Student for the purposes of Study, and contain every specimen necessary for his assistance.

Demonstrations with the MICROSCOPE are regularly given in the courses of Lectures on Anatomy, Physiology, Pathology and Botany.

Pupils desirous of cultivating the important Art of ORGANIC ANALYSIS will have an opportunity of doing so, under the direction of the Lecturer on Chemistry, or by attendance on the Classes at the Royal College of Chemistry.

PRIZES and CERTIFICATES of HONOUR are awarded at the end of the session to those pupils who most distinguish themselves in the Public Examinations of their Classes.

The Dissecting Rooms are open daily from 8 A.M. till dusk. Dr. DEVILLE will attend in the rooms Four Hours daily, to superintend the Dissections, and assist the students, instituting frequent examinations, in order to insure a thorough practical knowledge of Anatomy.

Mr. ERNEST A. HART is constantly in attendance in the Dissecting Room.

Some of the Lecturers receive Private Pupils to reside with them, whose studies they superintend.
