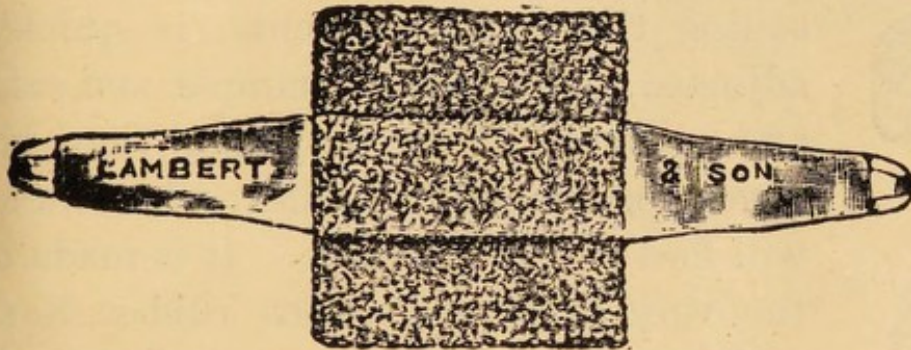

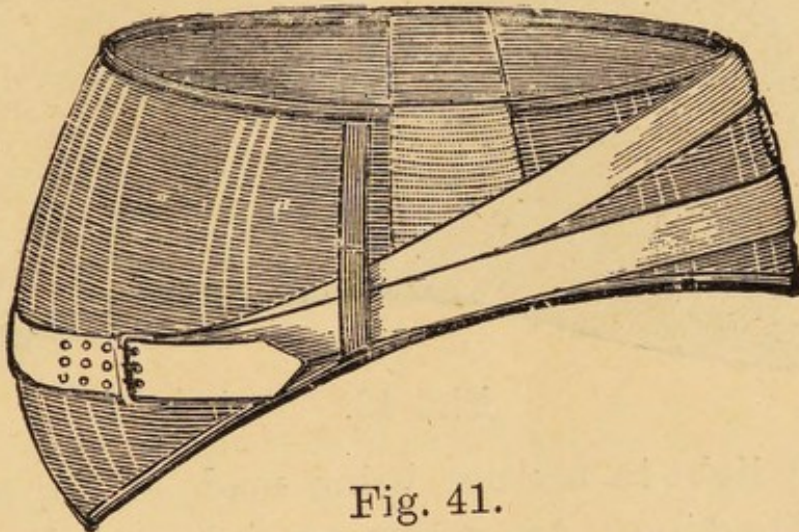

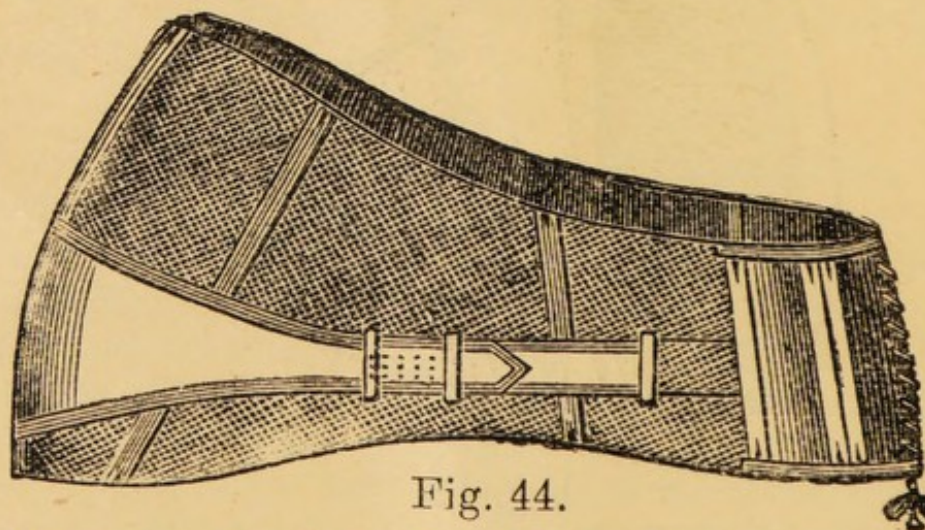

Fig. 44. Same material as Fig. 43, but fitted with Sateen supporting band. Cotton 12 6 Silk 15 0

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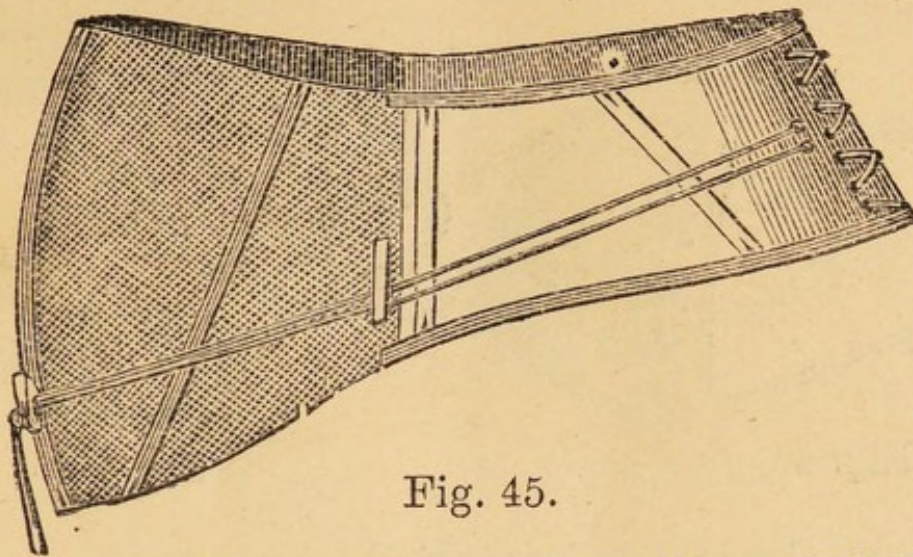

 White, Drab, or Pink Silk Elastic fronts 10 6

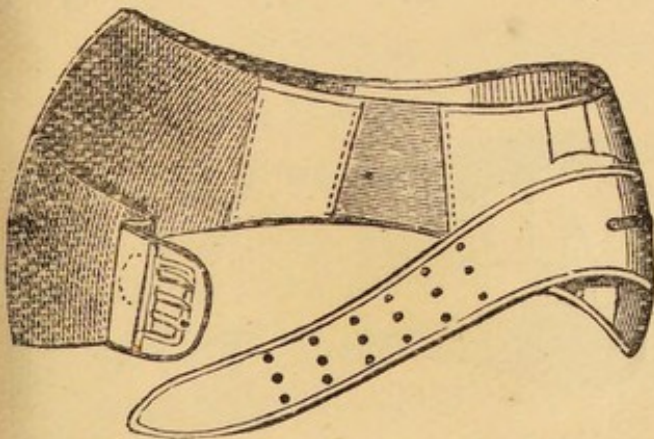

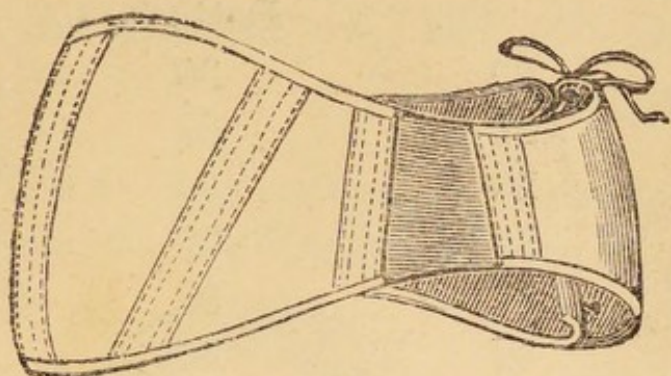

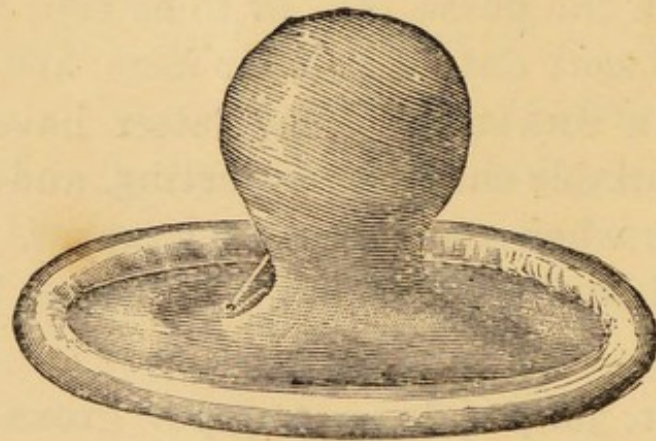

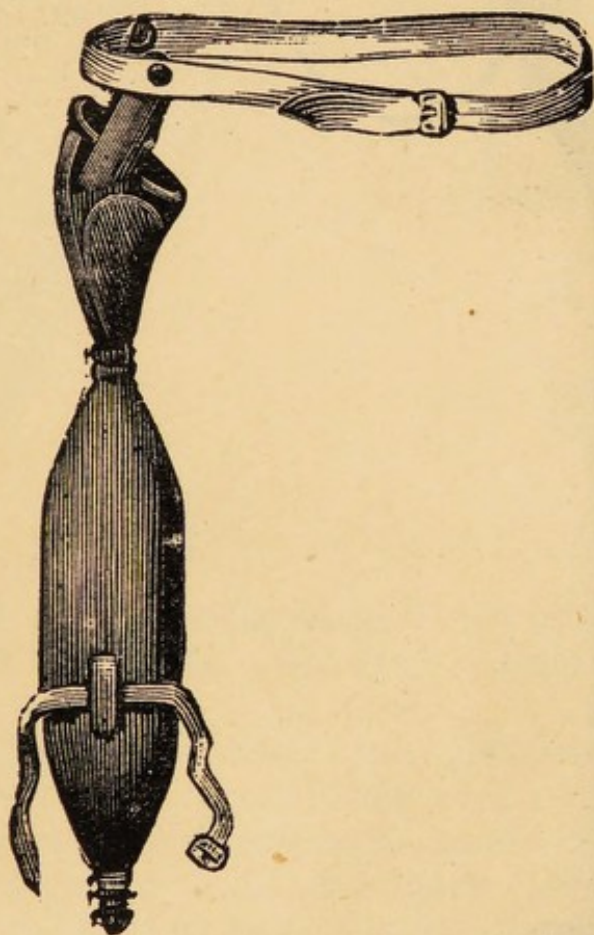

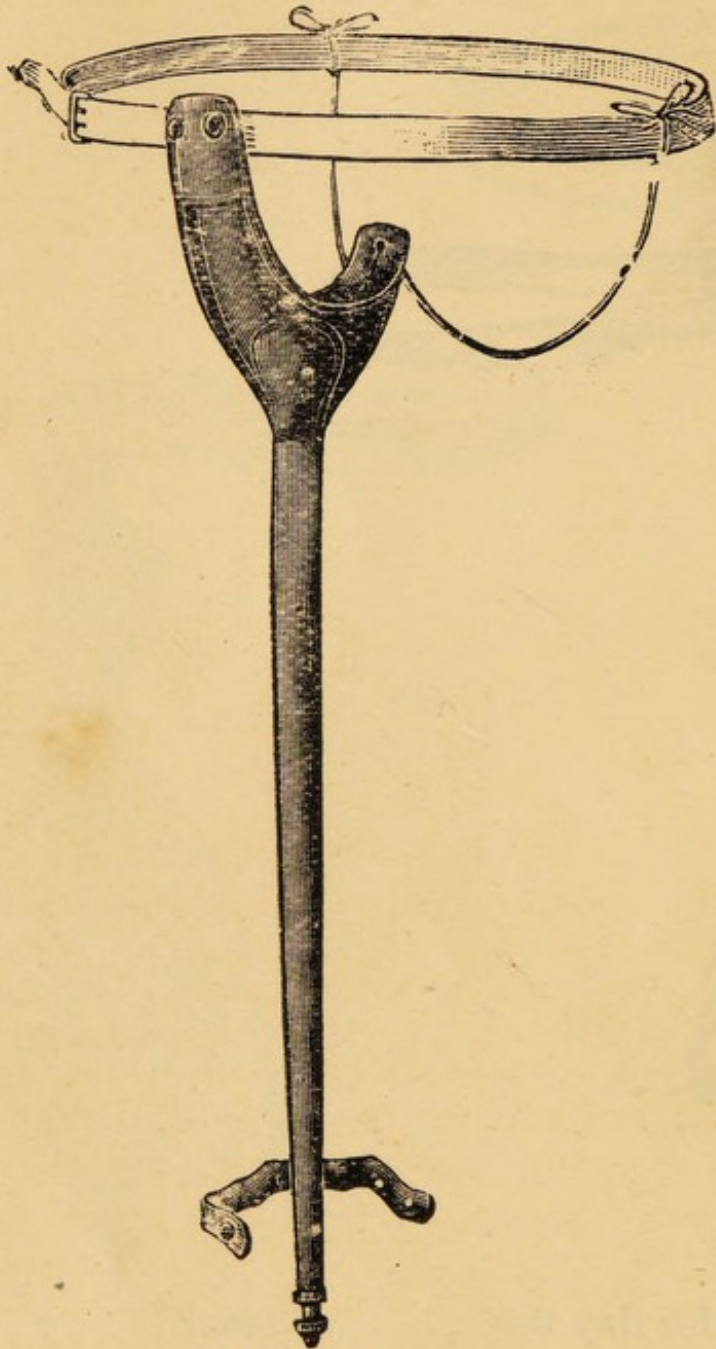

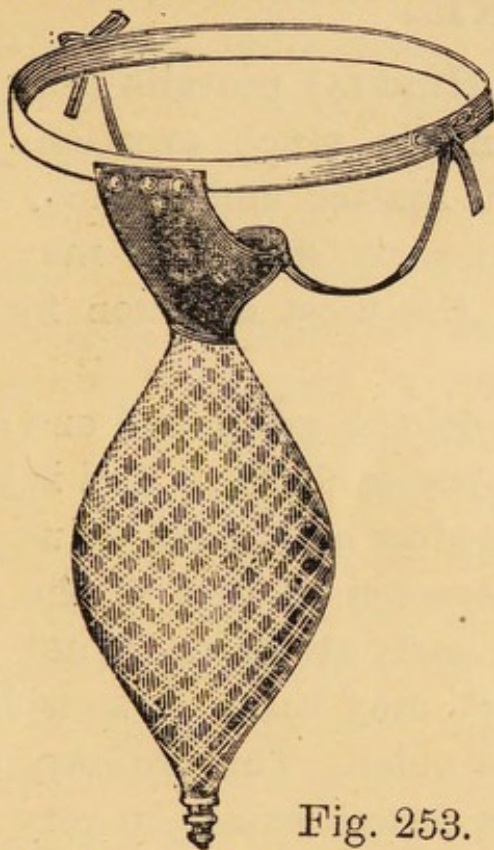

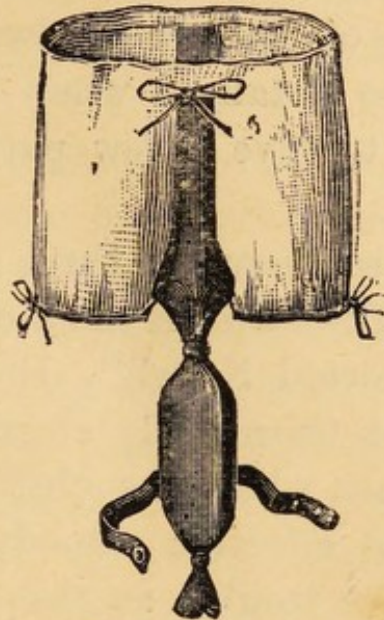

RUPTURE.

RUPTURE (by medical men termed HERNIA) prevails principally amongst adults whose occupation entails much exertion. The existence of rupture is always a serious matter, and medical advice should be obtained when it is in an early stage. It may be of interest to give a few particulars of the most common forms of rupture.

Of these there are three: two occur in the groin, and one at the navel. The latter is most common in young children, and is known as "Distorted Navel." It occurs soon after birth, and is due to the navel not thoroughly closing. A protrusion of part of the bowel takes place when the child cries. If early attention is not given, and some effective remedy applied, it may cause a considerable amount of trouble as the child grows older. The ordinary baby's binder will prevent the protrusion to a certain extent in very young children; but when they get a few months old, and the protrusion still exists, the best remedy is a soft Belt with a pad in the centre, as shown on page 20. Of this Belt we have four patterns, the most comfortable and useful being Fig. 60, and, as they are shaped, they are not so liable to shift out of position.

When rupture occurs in the groin, with young children, it is sometimes of a considerable size, and too painful to permit the wearing of a spring Truss with safety. In such cases the India Rubber Truss, with soft inflated air pads, should be used until the child becomes strong enough to bear the others. India Rubber Trusses (as Figs. 240 and 241) are made for single and double ruptures, and will be found the most comfortable for very young children. The next patterns of Trusses for children are Figs. 238 and 239. These are made with a very light body-spring, covered with india rubber to prevent the spring from being rusted by damp,

and are fitted with air-inflated pads. These Trusses can be worn in the bath, as the india rubber protects the spring.

When a child reaches the age of two or three years, the leather-covered Truss, with expanding spring or moveable pad, is the most useful, as the size can be regulated as the child grows, and thus often saves the expense of new Trusses.

Rupture in the groin in adults is of two kinds, known as Inguinal in males and Femoral in females. In the former, the protrusion appears in the fold above the groin, and, in the latter, below it. Rupture may come on gradually. When its formation is slow, it is preceded by a slight pain before the swelling appears; but when it is sudden, through some over-exertion, a decided swelling shows itself very soon, and, in most cases, is more or less painful when the person coughs or sneezes. As soon as the symptoms appear, some support should be applied to the part. If the patient is living far from a town, and cannot conveniently procure a Truss, the best and simplest remedy is to apply a bandage, two or three folds of the bandage being laid over the affected part, and underlaid with a pad of wool or a piece of linen, or any convenient material that may be at hand to form a pad to compress the protrusion and keep it back. This will be found a safe plan, and will prevent the rupture becoming serious until medical aid can be obtained.

In selecting a Truss for neglected rupture it is best to consult a medical man; but for ordinary rupture the simple form of Trusses (as Fig. 221) is the most useful for males, and one with the deep pad for females.

A most comfortable Truss for both males and females is the Moc Main. These are made of soft padded leather without the body spring, but the pad is fitted with a small spring to support the rupture. They are the best Trusses for persons who cannot wear one with a body spring.

It may be important to persons who have not before worn a Truss to know that they do not always feel comfortable at first; but after a few weeks the flesh of the body will adapt itself to the shape of the spring and pad, and its presence will not be noticed. Therefore it is important that old Trusses should not be discarded, as no matter how old the Truss may be, so long as the spring is sound, it can be re-covered and made as good and more comfortable than a new one. Repairs receive our prompt attention.

When ordering send circumference round hips, and state whether double or single, or whether for right or left side.
