- This book by Sir Richmond Palmer is the first work of any magnitude with the history of the ancient Empire of Bornu (now represented, territorially, by the North-Eastern province of the Northern group of provinces in Nigeria) as its main theme. Details of the history, which is that of the Maghumi or ruling caste, are assembled in a manner possible only by a writer whose knowledge of the people of the Sahara and Sudan is exceptional. Sir Richmond Palmer's researches cover the Tuareg and other great tribes of that region, and show to what extent the early culture of Northern Nigeria was dependent upon the Bornu people. The book opens the door to a knowledge of the pre-Islamic existence of the tribes with which it deals, and the Author puts forward, with the evidence his researches have made available, the interesting thesis that Bornu (or, more correctly, Barnu) is an ethnic term, synonymous with Barbar, denoting an Iranian group which came into Africa across the Red Sea before the Christian era.
